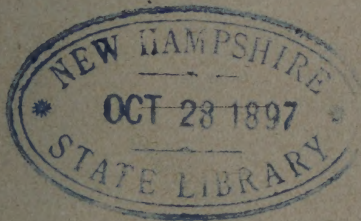

TOWN WARRANT.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

[L. S.] *To the inhabitants of the town of Derry, qualified to vote in town affairs.*

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said town on the second Tuesday of March next, at 10 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:—

1. To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting.
2. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools, for the maintenance of the poor, for laying out and repairing highways and building and repairing bridges, and for other necessary charges arising within the town.
4. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to the use of Upton Post, No. 45, Department of N. H. Grand Army of the Republic to defray the expenses of Memorial Day.
6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to the use of the committee on Soldiers' Monument, (to be erected according to the provisions of the will of the late Emma L. Taylor, deceased;) to defray the expenses of dedicating said monument, when completed.
7. To see if the town will vote to retain the committee on Soldiers' Monument as now constituted.

8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to provide a suitable place for the safe keeping and preservation of the public records and other documents where they may be deposited and safely kept.

9. To see if the town will vote to pay one third of the expense of concreting the sidewalk in front any or all dwellings and places of business in the several villages in said Derry, whenever the owners or occupants of said premises pay the other two thirds.

10. To see what action the town will take towards establishing a Branch Library at Derry Depot.

11. To take the sense of the qualified voters whether the alterations and amendments of the constitution proposed by the constitutional convention shall be approved.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH.

To the Selectmen of the Town of Derry.

It is a matter for congratulation that the town has been so free from contagious and malignant diseases during the past year.

Several samples of water were examined, six of them were taken at Derry Depot from wells and cisterns, which either supply many persons with drinking water, or are quite as unfavorably situated as any. The results were published in the local paper. All the samples were found to be good or fair.

Official action for the abatement of nuisances was necessary in but few cases.

It has been proved again and again that many diseases are contracted from filthy surroundings; foul emanations from decaying vegetables in the cellar; stench from a vault, cesspool, or filthy drain; poorly ventilated apartments, especially sleeping rooms; and worst of all, drinking-water polluted with organic matter or lead.

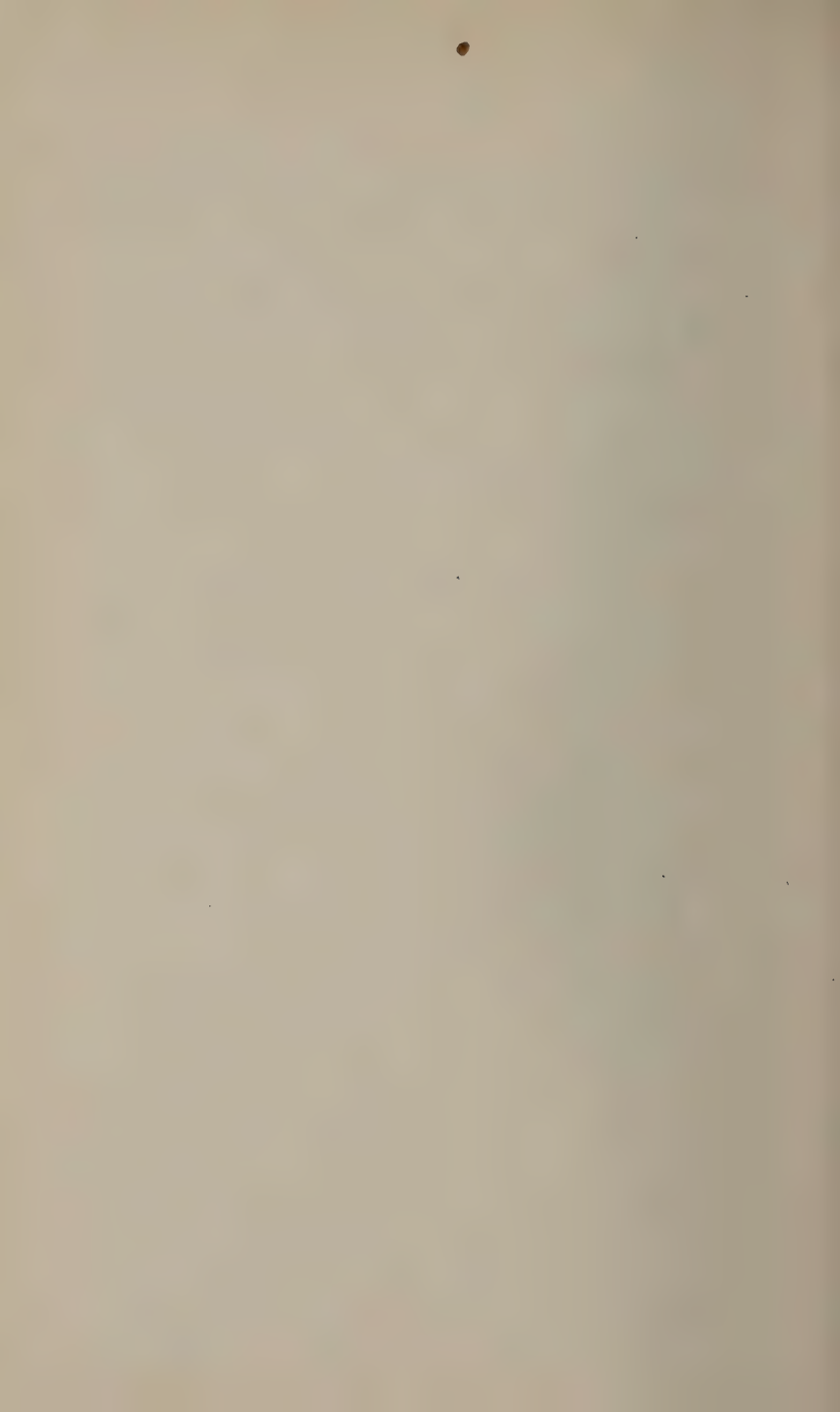
The purity of various articles of food should not be ignored.

Many lives are lost each year from preventable diseases.

By a careful examination, all should satisfy themselves that danger is not lurking in the surroundings of their dwellings. Because our grandfathers enjoyed a hale old age, is no reason that our habitations are sanitary; the grand children may be poisoned by the accumulated filth of the past.

The Board urge upon all the importance of sanitation, and solicit their aid in bringing to notice whatever may be detrimental to the public health.

ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

SCHOOL BOARD.

The following report of our doings the past year is respectfully submitted :

The length of the school year has been twenty-five weeks,—one week more in No. 11, and one week less in No. 9.

The addition to the school house in No. 11 was occupied the last of September, and has been a substantial relief to the hitherto crowded condition of the school.

Only such repairs have been made as were absolutely necessary and the amount (\$100) voted for repairs remains in the town treasury.

Arbor Day was observed in No. 8 by an assembling of the citizens at the school house. Several trees were planted around the building, some grading was done, a new and substantial fence was built round the school lot, and was afterward painted, the material for painting being furnished by the town district.

We have noticed a general advance in studies and attainments in the schools, and good feeling between teacher and pupils in almost every case. Irregular attendance is a hindrance to the prosperity of some of our schools, in some cases caused by sickness ; in many it might be avoided by combined effort on the part of parents and children. The result of such effort is shown in the following list of names of pupils perfect in attendance for one or more terms, which we find recorded in our registers for honorable mention and commendation.
