TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Seabrook, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To elect a town clerk, one selectman for three years, town treasurer, collector of taxes, three constables, highway agent, three overseers of the poor and all other necessary town officials for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the expense of the general government, for the protection of persons and property, for health and sanitation, for highways and bridges, for the support of the town poor and all other necessary expenditures for the year ensuing.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and to renew and refund town notes.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of seventy-five (\$75) dollars for the observance of Memorial Day.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the observance of Old Home Day and to appoint committees for same.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred fifty (\$250) dollars to defray the expenses of collecting garbage from the

residents of Seabrook Beach, the same being left in the hands of the health officer.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred (\$500) dollars for the construction of a cement bridge, the location to be left in the hands of the selectmen.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred (\$400) dollars for the repair of the "Causeway Bridge" so called.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to buy a 5-ton tractor for an amount not to exceed thirty-seven hundred and fifty (\$3750) dollars and raise and appropriate money for the same.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to buy a snow plow and raise and appropriate money for same.

Article 11. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the repair of that part of the U. S. Mail Route road between the Hampton Falls town line and the Kensington town line.

Article 12. To see what action the town will take in regard to oiling the town roads.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred (\$300) dollars for the repair of the Back Road, so called, that leads by the Felch and Gove estates.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred (\$100) dollars for the repair of road leading from Walton Store, known as Old Camp Meeting Ground Road.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred (\$200) dollars for the repair of Boynton Lane Road.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to sell to Ernest F. Felch three-fourths of the land recently

purchased by the town from the heirs of the late David F. Boyd, the price to be paid, one hundred and fifty (\$150) dollars.

Article 17. To transact all other business that may legally come before said meeting.
