To the Inhabitants of the Town of Washington, in the County of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Washington on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To elect a TOWN CLERK, TOWN TREASURER, one SELECTMAN for three years, ROAD AGENT, TAX COLLECTOR, AUDITOR, FIRE CHIEF, one member of the committee for three years, one member of the PLANNING committee for five years, and other necessary town officers.

committee for five years, and other necessary town officers.

2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$572.84 and accept State Aid of \$4,391.74 for Town Road Aid in said Town.

- 3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to be used for improving the South Stoddard Road, so-called.
- 5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Capital Reserve for Permanent Bridges a sum sufficient to purchase steel girders when necessary to rebuild Town Road Bridges.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Charges for the ensuing year.
- 7. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Shedd Free Library for the ensuing year.

- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Fire Department for the ensuing year.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for a fire alarm.
- 11. To hear the report of the Planning Committee about cemeteries.
- 12. To see what action the Town will take in regard to purchasing or developing any cemetery land in East Washington.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw any or all of the General Cemetery fund, and to raise and appropriate what other sum may be necessary for purchase or improvement of said cemetery land.
- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay on the long term Garage notes, \$1,000.00 of which is due Oct. 1, 1958.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to use \$1,000.00 received from sale of tax acquired property to apply on long term garage notes.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 to pay Highway Equipment note due June 24, 1958.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to refinance the long term garage notes at a lower rate of interest, if possible.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for blister rust recheck for 1958.
- 19. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.
- 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
- 21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for band concerts.

- 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be transferred to Capital Reserve for Permanent Bridges.
- 23. To what action the Town will take in regard to the old town garage.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Non-Partisan ballot system for electing Town Officials at Town Meeting.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to deed to Robert W. Crane the Thissell gravel pit, so-called, and the right of way thereto.
- 26. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

FOREST FIRE PREVENTION IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS

New Hampshire faces a continuing challenge in its forest fire problem — 97 percent of all our forest fires being man-caused and preventable — a serious indictment of interest in our welfare and that of our neighbor. Both the State and the towns are striving diligently to effectively meet the challenge through education of the public to the threat fire presents to our woodlands; by maintaining a well trained corps of wardens and deputy wardens in every community and by providing ample opportunity for all who wish to dispose of unwanted waste materials. Careless and perverseness, however, continue to be the big hurdles.

Thoughtlessly discarded lighted cigars, cigarettes and matches from moving vehicles by hikers, hunters and fishermen; careless burning of debris during hazardous periods in dangerous locations; illegal burning; improperly extinguished debris, camp and cook fires all result in serious loss of property disruption of industry and farm work and unnecessary expenditure of town and state funds.

To meet the challenge successfully, the state, your community and your local forest fire warden need YOUR thoughtful and cooperative effort — The rules are simple.

- 1. If you burn, be sure to secure a written permit from your local forest fire warden when the ground is not covered with snow. Permits are required for open debris fires, home incinerators, outdoor fire places and camp fires. Your warden is instructed to permit burning if weather conditions, site and type of burning are safe.
- 2. Be sure that all lighted material cigars, cigarettes and matches are completely out before discarding them.
- 3. Make certain that your debris, camp and cook fires are completely out before leaving them.
- 4. Insist that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.
- 5. Call the warden promptly when fire is detected and aid him to extinguish it.

REMEMBER — the fire you prevent might be the one which could burn your property.

TRUSTEE REPORT

Our library has over 2,500 books, 19 different magazines and 3 weekly newspapers for its borrowers, and is used more than any other public library in New Hampshire, according to the latest (1956) figures compiled by the State Library.

The statistics show that each person in the state borrowed about five books a year from the more than two hundred public libraries. In only twenty-six libraries did they borrow more than ten books each, while here in Washington the 187 official population borrowed an average of THIRTY-FIVE books and magazines each. The next highest per capita circulation was Piermont with 25.8 books.

During 1957 our library circulated over 4,000 books and magazines, with nearly 700 of these taken out by the 37 young people who use the library.

Such figures as these justify the library's existence. The librarian and the trustees welcome any suggestions that you may have to make the library more useful to us all.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Washington Center School in said district on the eighth day of March, 1958, at 8:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
- 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the District.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.
- 8. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to sell the East Washington School at their discretion or to pass any vote relating thereto.
- 9. To see what sum of money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between

the estimated revenue and the appropriation which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Washington:

I am pleased to present my fourth annual report for your consideration.

Mrs. Vivian McClenning found our northern winters a little too severe and after long deliberation decided to resign and take up residence in Florida. To find a replacement for a one room school is next to impossible today, but the Board was extremely fortunate in obtaining the services of Mrs. Madeline Basto, a former resident of Washington, who agreed to try it for a year.

Mrs. Basto has worked extremely hard and has the school organized on a very efficient basis and the pupils of the Washington Center School are being offered educational opportunities which are rare in a one room school.

The registration at the beginning of the school year are as follows:

It is expected that three will graduate and at least four will enter the school next year, thus slightly increasing the enrollment.

The number of pupils attending high school is increasing Six are attending the Hillsboro-Deering Cooperative School while one is attending Keene High School.

The above enrollment, although now slightly reduced, is too much of a load to request a teacher to carry and some consideration should be given to relief.

There are various ways in which this relief could be given, but my recommendation is that consideration should be given to the possibility of sending the seventh and eighth grade pupils to a school which has a departmental set up. Thus the work load would be reduced for the teacher and equally as important, if not more so, the Washington pupils would be able to start their high school career on an equal basis with the other members of the freshman class. It has been quite firmly established that pupils coming from a one room school

find the work much more difficult than those who have had the experience of working in the departmental system.

It has been a pleasure to work with a school board so vitally interested in the education of its youth and an equally interested citizenry and I wish to express my appreciation for their cooperation.

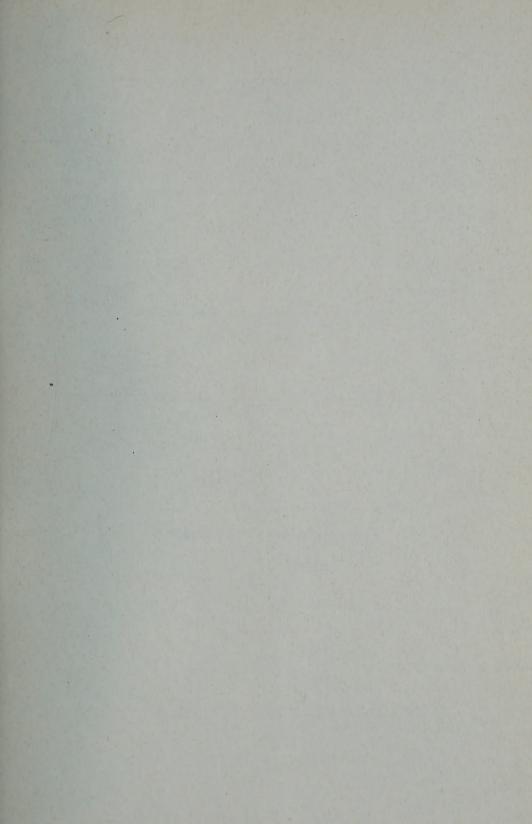

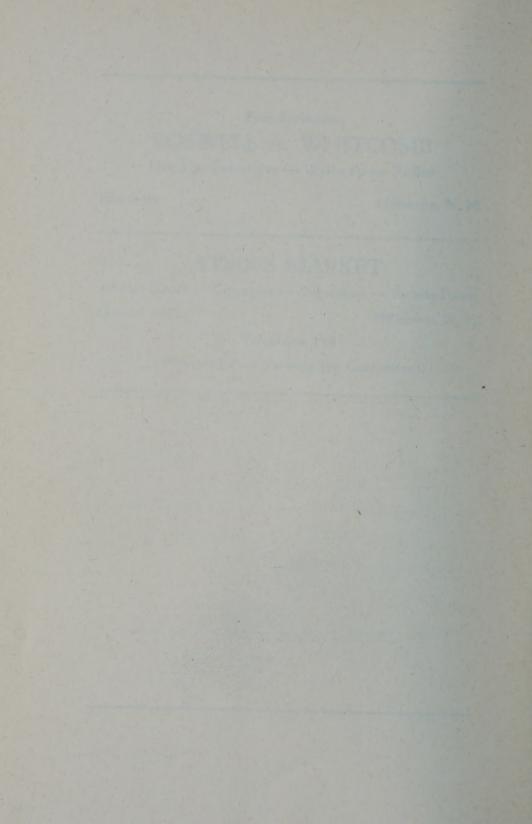
