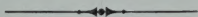

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of Alexandria in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Alexandria on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see how much money the town will raise for highways and bridges.

4. To see if town will vote to build a new bridge over Smith river, near G. B. Simmons', in co-operation with the town of Hill, and appropriate money for same.

5. To see if town will vote to accept State aid construction and raise \$622.50 for same.

6. To see if town will raise \$500 for State aid maintenance.

7. To see if town will raise \$450 for Trunk line maintenance.

8. To see if town will raise \$400 for unimproved Trunk line maintenance.

9. To see if town will vote to buy a new road machine and appropriate money for same.

10. To see if town will vote to discontinue, subject to gates and bars, that part of the Perkins Hill road, from the Hodgkinson bungalow to the end of the road.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise any money for the control of the White Pine Blister Rust.

12. To see if town will vote to allow a discount on taxes paid before July 1.

13. To see if town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of receipt of taxes.

14. To bring in your votes for the election of Delegates-at-Large, alternate Delegates-at-Large, Delegates and alternate Delegates to the National Conventions of the Republican and Democratic parties to be held to nominate party candidates for President and Vice-President of the United States.

15. To act on any other matter that may legally come before the meeting.
