[L.S.] | *To the inhabitants of the Town of Cornish, qualified to vote in Town affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said town, on the second Tuesday, being the fourteenth day of March next, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose by ballot and major vote a Town Clerk.
2. To choose three Selectmen, Treasurer, Auditors and all other necessary Town officers, and Agents for the ensuing year.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to make and repair highways and bridges for the ensuing year, and determine whether the same shall be paid in money or labor.
5. To see if the town will vote to dispense with the service of a Liquor Agent for the ensuing year.
6. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen not to deliver the blank invoice bills until the first of April, agreeable to the amendments of Chapter 55 of the General Laws.
7. To see if the town will vote to raise fifty dollars for Memorial Day.
8. To see if the town will raise the sum of twenty-five dollars to finish rebinding and indexing the town records.
9. To see if the town will elect a board of library trustees and appropriate the money necessary to receive the gift of one hundred dollars worth of books from the State.
10. To see what action the town will take in regard to its Cemetery trust funds.
11. To see if the town will raise the sum of one hundred dollars for the repairs of Cemeteries.
12. To see what action the town will take in regard to making up any deficiency in the interest of the Foss fund, and raise money therefor.
13. To see if the town will raise the sum of one hundred dollars to build two snow rollers.
14. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of fifty dollars for the purpose of repairing the tomb at the Powers cemetery, so called.
15. To hear the report of Officers, Agents, Auditors or Committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote in relation thereto.
16. To transact any other business thought proper when met.

6. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise for the support of schools in addition to the tax required by law.
7. To see what sum of money the district will vote for permanent repairs of school houses, including furniture and apparatus.
8. To see if the district will vote to raise a sum of money sufficient to pay two outstanding notes of three hundred, and one hundred dollars respectively, with accrued interest, held by Windsor Savings Bank, and appoint a committee to pay the sum.
9. To hear reports of officers, auditors or committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
10. To see if the district will vote to accept the lease or deed of the school house and lot in Div. 12, from Edwin T. Ayers.
11. To see if the district will vote to expend the balance of the money raised and given to build the school house near South Cornish Post-office and not legally expended on the house and grounds for additional outside improvements to the house.
12. To choose Agents and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

Report of the School Board.

The statistics of our schools the past year vary but little from those of the preceding year.

We have had 26 terms of school in 13 different houses, employing 13 female, and 2 male, teachers ; the number of weeks of the schools aggregating 227.

The number of different pupils registered is 145, whom we have sought to grant as near equal privileges as possible. Under the present system 40 different scholars have, in the aggregate, received 338 additional weeks of school the past year. This is equivalent to giving nearly $2\frac{1}{2}$ extra weeks of school to every scholar in town, or would give 28 weeks of school to a school of 12 scholars. The average cost per scholar for the year has been \$8.77. The number of visits of citizens and others, 322.

Appended to this brief report is the usual statistical table, also a very commendable roll of honor.
