2000 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay on the Town debt.

yes 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire upon the credit of the Town the sum of ten thousand dollars if needed.

To see if the Town will vote to require the Maine Central Railroad Company to maintain gates, or station flagmen at the crossings on Kearsarge and Mechanic streets in the Village of North Conway, N. H., and also the crossing at Intervale near the Bartlett line, the entire year as provided by Sec. 15, Chap. 159 of the Public Statutes.

The Andrew Dinsmore Cemetery Trust Fund of \$150, is still on deposit in the savings department of the North Conway Loan & Banking Co., interest accrued to January 1, 1910, \$7.60.

At no time since I have been Treasurer, have conditions been as favorable as during the past year. The notes given for temporary loans were all paid in September with one exception, which is about four months earlier than usual. There has been money in the treasury at all times during the

year, which has earned 3 per cent. on daily balances. Money for temporary loans has been hired for  $4\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. The Collector of Taxes for the year of 1907 paid into the treasury previous to September 1, \$2800.

## *Report of Public Libraries.*

### LIBRARIAN'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 1909.

It is gratifying to report that the interest in the Library has increased throughout the year. The Library has been open 310 days with a daily average of 26 books. There were over one thousand more books let out this year than the preceding, which shows that the public are using the Library more and more each year.

There were 92 books added to the Library by the Eastman fund, mostly Fiction, a few Juvenile and Biographies. Mrs. Homer Bates and C. A. Silloway have given a number of reference books. Mr. Scott has also given a book. Wish we might have a larger sum for the purchasing of books that we might have more reference books and also books for the younger readers.

The reading tables have a good collection of reading matter both for the young and old. Mrs. Orcutt gives the Christian Science Sentinel; Miss Clough, Service; Mrs. H. B. Field, Ladies' Home Journal, Literary Digest, and Good House Keeping; and Mrs. J. D. Bickford, Sacred Heart Review. The Cosmopolitan, Munsey, Technical World, Delineator, St. Nicholas, Little Folks, American Boy, Youth's Companion, The Reporter and daily papers are found regularly on the tables.

# *Report of the School Board and Superintendent.*

---

Mr. H. Boardman Fifield, Esq., whose term of office as member of School Board expires in 1911, submitted his resignation as member of Board, Feb. 10, 1910, the same to take effect at the coming annual meeting, and the resignation was duly accepted.

The School Board respectfully submits the Superintendent's report as submitted to them, and indorse the recommendations therein contained.

## *Report of Superintendent of Schools.*

---

TO THE SCHOOL BOARD, CONWAY, N. H.:

Although supervision was voted a year ago, your Superintendent has served only about six months, and the report that he herewith submits to the school district of Conway, is for the fall and winter terms of school.

If there were those who expected radical changes by the adoption of supervision, they have probably been disappointed. However, the Superintendent believes that he has a strong grasp of the school situation in the town of Conway, and the recommendations that this report embodies have been made only after mature deliberation.

The chief work of a Superintendent must always be to visit the schools, and already your Superintendent has made over 200 visits in Conway. The length of these visits have been all the way from ten minutes to two hours. In addition to these, many visits have been made at the close of school for the sake of conference with the teachers.

One might naturally think that about the first thing for a Superintendent to do, would be to grade the schools on a common basis. Now this cannot be done all at once without considerably injuring some of the schools, which of course would be unjustifiable, and not until the conditions in the several villages are similar. However, this is a very important matter, and it will continue to receive a great deal of attention.

Children have been allowed to enter school for the first time, whenever their parents have had the impulse to start them. Consequently the first year of the primary school has been much broken up, and the teacher's time and energy drawn upon to the disadvantage of the most concerned.



Every parent, if they will pause to consider this point just a moment, will see just why this is so. In view of these facts, it is recommended that the School Board make a ruling that children entering school, for the first time, must do so at the beginning of the fall term. It is also recommended that children be not allowed to enter school for the first time before they are six years of age. There is a financial reason for this, but the chief reason, and the only one that ought to be considered, is, that the children progress much faster, and in the end are farther advanced and much better qualified if they wait until they are six years old, instead of starting in when they are only five. Every experienced primary teacher will testify to the truth of this statement. The majority of parents already prefer to have their children wait until they are six before going to school, and probably the reason that this preference is not shared by every parent, is that under the present system there is apt to be the feeling (although it is erroneous) that unless their children start in when they are five, they will be a year behind other children of their ages. Now the ruling recommended will obviate this factor, and all parents will be receiving a more equal treatment.

The surplus books and supplies have all been gathered together in the Superintendent's office. A card system has also been inaugurated, whereby the Superintendent knows where every one of the several hundred text books are, not once or twice a year, but at all times. The accuracy of this system depends on the Superintendent himself, and not on a large number of teachers, and now that it is in working order it requires very little attention to keep it up to date. All of this is simply a business method applied to our school work. It throws the responsibility of the whereabouts of the books upon the Superintendent, who is in touch with all of the scholars, as compared with the responsibility and conscientiousness of the individual teachers in reporting the book situation to the School Board.

Hereafter, the parents of pupils of the intermediate and grammar grades should receive a report card from the teacher five times during the school year, containing the rank of such pupils. One card answers for the year, and after parents have consulted it, they should sign their name and the date to the back, and return at once to the teacher. This system is in operation in most of the cities and towns, and is the only business-like way of keeping the parents informed of the quality of work done by their children in our schools.

The state places a bonus on good schools. The better the attendance at school, the more money we receive from

the state, so that every time pupils miss a half day of school the district loses just so much money. The longer the schools keep, the more money we receive from the state, and for every teacher who is a normal school graduate, or who holds a state certificate, the district draws two dollars per week. Since September, Conway has had five normal graduates, four graduates of colleges, and one teacher holding a state certificate. This record will probably be doubled next year. Already quite a number of the teachers are preparing for the state examinations, which come March 25 and 26. The superintendent has obtained permission to hold such an examination in Conway.

In regard to our teachers, the Superintendent would like to say, that as a whole, they are well qualified and efficient. As to qualification, there are but two in the whole town who have not at least completed a high school course, and in each of these cases the teachers have had many successful years of experience.

Truant officers have been appointed for North Conway and Conway, and it will be recommended that one be appointed for Redstone before the opening of the spring term. In some sections of the town, the per cent. of attendance is not as good, as it is reasonable to expect that it should be. This should be remedied.

During the Christmas vacation, arrangements were made to close the Echo Lake school, and transport the few scholars to the West school. All of the parents involved in this change have shown a hearty spirit of cooperation and now after several weeks of our winter weather they are well pleased with the change that has been made. The benefit to the children of attending a larger school is very apparent, even in so short a time. One pupil, who had lost all interest in school, has regained that interest, and is attending school very regular, not because he has to, but because he wants to, and when a boy or girl goes to school because they want to, they always progress rapidly.

The South Conway school is now reduced to seven scholars, all of grammar school age, and this school ought to be discontinued and the pupils transported to the Center. All schools that are so small lack enthusiasm, and it seems a pity to deprive the few children of South Conway the advantage of a larger school when there is no need of it.

The Superintendent has given a few examinations to the schools, for the sake of comparison, but not nearly as much has been done in this line as would have been desirable, had time permitted.

Pamphlets on practical hygiene of the school room, and Snellen's test cards have been placed in the schools, and the teachers instructed to use them. If parents receive a written statement from the teacher saying that their children's eyes need attention, they can feel reasonably sure that the teacher's information is correct, for she has probably based it on the tests that she has made with Snellen's test letters for measuring the acuteness of vision, which are in universal use.

Two Conway-Madison teachers' meetings have been held, one at the Center and the other at Conway. There will be two more such meetings during the spring term. The importance of these gatherings can not be over estimated, for they are inspirational to the best teachers, and little short of a revelation to the others.

The Four Corners school house is entirely too small and in a very bad condition. It should be enlarged and placed in good repair. It will have to be made over so completely that it is suggested that it be made as near like the West school as possible, which is the best model of an inexpensive one-room school house that we have in Conway. This school house has two entrances, and two outhouses which are entirely separate, and the walls of the school room are high posted. These are fundamentally important matters. All of this is necessary to place the Four Corners building in a suitable condition for school purposes, but better than this, the Superintendent would recommend, if suitable arrangements can be made, to discontinue the school and transport to Conway village.

The Kearsarge school room is in a very dingy and dismal condition. The walls need to be replastered, and the ceiling cleaned and varnished. At present there is not a single picture of any value whatever on the walls. Probably after the school room has been placed in good condition, the teacher, pupils and parents will unite to make it an attractive school room. The school room and outhouses open into a very small hallway. Of course this is unhealthy. However, this is a matter that can be remedied at a small cost by connecting the portion nearest to the school house with the open air by means of lattice work.

For some time the windows have remained broken in the outhouses of the McMillan school, but now that the destruction of property there appears to have stopped, it seems advisable to place these four windows in good repair, and thereby save the more rapid decay of the woodwork.

The ceiling in the hallways at Redstone need to be sheathed, and the plastering of the schoolrooms patched.

The most pressing need is at Conway Village. This building was probably never made for so many pupils, and although new rooms have been added from time to time, it is now entirely inadequate for present conditions.

A comparative table showing the number of pupils registered for the last three years in the two largest villages:

Every room in the grammar school at Conway is occupied, and a very small class will graduate this June, while a large class will enter from the intermediate room. An extra teacher, for the grammar school is very essential if the best work is to be expected.

It is extremely necessary that another school room be added to Conway, and the Superintendent would recommend that two such rooms be added. Also that another room be finished off at North Conway, where there is also somewhat of a congestion. These three extra rooms are necessary for our schools to do their best work.

#### REPAIRS.

At Conway Village, the Board recommend the addition of two rooms with furnishings for the same; and new shed and out houses in connection therewith. That the building be repainted; and that other such repairs as are incident there-to be made. That two thousand five hundred dollars be appropriated to defray the expenses of the same.

At the Four Corners, if the school is continued, it will be necessary to enlarge and refurnish the building; to build a shed and new outhouses; and the grounds graded and put in order; at a probable cost of a new building. And instead thereof, we think that the Superintendent's suggestion, to transport to Conway, the better solution of the problem.

At North Conway, the addition of another room is recommended, to relieve the congestion there. Also that a new blackboard be added to the intermediate room. We estimate that this will cost about five hundred and sixty dollars.

At Kearsarge Village, the walls should be replastered and the interior refinished; and the connection between outhouses and schoolroom be broken by a latticed walk. New blackboards should be added, as the present ones are in such shape that they cannot be further used. The probable cost of this should be about one hundred and twenty five dollars.

The board recommend that the broken windows at the McMillan school be replaced.

At Redstone, it is recommended that wooden ceilings be placed in the hallways; and plaster where broken in the schoolrooms be patched. The repairs at the two latter schools at an outlay of about fifty dollars.

#### HIGH SCHOOL TUITION.

Last year the sum of one thousand dollars was appropriated for high school tuitions, for pupils attending high school within the state, and Fryeburg Academy. Reference to the financial report will show that there has already been paid, eleven hundred and ninety-five dollars and thirty-two cents. From present prospects, a larger amount will be needed next year.

#### TEXT BOOKS AND SUPPLIES.

The attention of the district is respectfully called to the fact that three hundred dollars was appropriated at the last annual meeting for text books and supplies: and the same being insufficient, the board, under the law passed at the last Legislature, recommended to the Selectmen the assessment of three hundred dollars additional. Owing to the excellent condition in which the text books were; the supplies on hand and an economical management of the same, the board has been able to furnish the above at an outlay of three hundred and sixty-six dollars and forty-six cents; which leaves a balance unexpended of two hundred and thirty-three dollars and fifty-four cents.

It might occur to the citizens that our schools might have been continued two additional weeks, there being a balance of \$673.97; but this sum is made up of \$233.54 under the text book and supply account, which must be carried forward; \$150 of the salary of the superintendent which remains unexpended for ahe purpose raisen; and likewise the sum of \$74.08 under the head of repair fund; which sums, deducted from the total would leave only \$216.35 which is less than the cost per week of maintaining schools.

In accordance with Chap. 52 session laws of 1909, the School Board recommend to the Selectmen that the following sums for the following purposes are necessary for the ensuing year. 1. High school tuitions, \$1500. 2. Text books and supplies, in consideration of the overlay under this head, \$250.

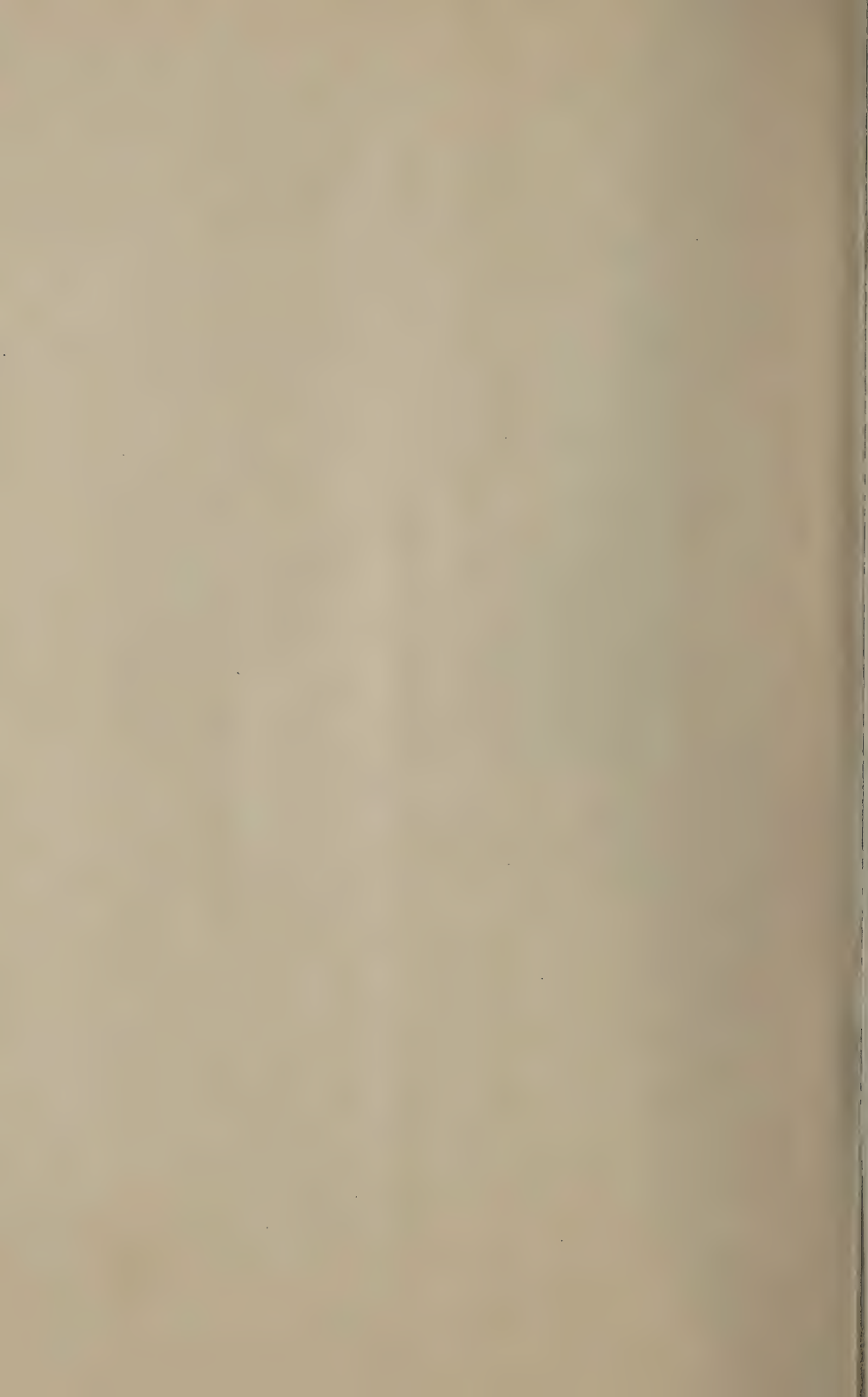
