THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

L. S.

*To the inhabitants of the town of Weare qualified to vote in town affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said town on Tuesday, the twelfth of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

*First.* To choose by ballot a town clerk, selectmen, road agents, and an overseer of the poor for the ensuing year.

*Second.* To choose by ballot all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

*Third.* To see how much money the town will vote to raise to defray town charges.

*Fourth.* To see how much money the town will vote to raise to repair highways and bridges and rail dangerous places along the highway.

*Fifth.* To see if the town will appropriate fifty dollars to Stark Fellows Post, G. A. R.

*Sixth.* To make provision for the collection of taxes.

*Seventh.* To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of money necessary to secure state aid for the permanent improvement of highways under the law passed at the January session, 1905.

*Eighth.* To see if the town will vote to buy four or more oxen to work on the road machine.

*Ninth.* To see what action the town will take toward putting on a new bridge by John Melvin's.

*Tenth.* To see what action the town will take in regard to buying stone crusher, engine, roller, and state road outfit.

*Eleventh.* To transact all other business that may properly come before the meeting and raise any required sum of money for that purpose.

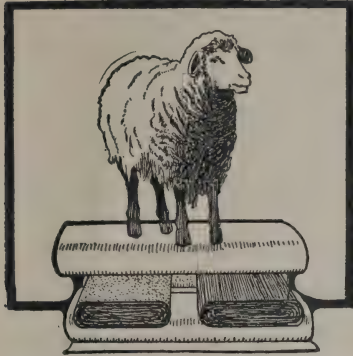
