REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

The history of the Pembroke schools for the past year is very similar to that of other years; the measles and other ills that flesh is heir to, as well as the inclemency of the weather, have caused many breaks in the attendance; also in the winter term the general vaccination of the pupils occasioned many absences.

The Borough school was closed one term on account of the small number of scholars, and the North Pembroke school lost one term while the new building was being erected, but in each case transportation to the nearest school was furnished to all wishing to attend.

The new building, for which \$1,000 was voted, was completed at a cost of \$953.35, leaving a balance which it is intended to use in further grading and fencing the grounds in the spring. The building was well constructed and equipped, and is both useful and ornamental.

Needed repairs have been made and we have endeavored, in all ways, to keep things up to as high a standard as possible.

Last summer the village school was presented with a handsome flag by Mrs. J. H. Dearborn; the gift was much appreciated, and we extend thanks to the donor.

We were unable to form a supervisory district, as we intended, as there were no neighboring towns with which we could combine; however, we hope the plan may be given a trial, as we feel confident that it would be of great benefit to our schools.
