Warrant for Town Meeting

[L. S.] STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Canaan in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said town on the second Tuesday of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose by ballot and major vote a Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, Town Treasurer, Overseer of the Poor, Tax Collector, one Library Trustee for three years, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, three Highway Agents and two Auditors.

Art. 2. To choose by major vote Surveyors of Lumber, Fence Viewers, Constables, Measurers of Wood and Bark, Weighers of Hay and Straw, Cemetery Agents, Town Agent to sell and convey property, and such other officers as the town may judge necessary to be chosen.

Art. 3. To see what compensation will be paid the town officers, and what limitation of time the Tax Collector may have to settle with said town.

Art. 4. To see if the town will give a discount on taxes, and how much.

Art. 5. To see if the town will raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the town's expenses, including all departments.

Art. 6. To see if the town will raise the sum of (\$700.00) seven hundred dollars, for Trunk Line maintenance.

Art. 7. To see if the town will raise the sum of (\$1,720.50) one thousand seven hundred twenty dollars and fifty cents, for State Aid construction.

Art. 8. To see if the town will raise the sum of

(\$2,750.00) two thousand seven hundred fifty dollars, for State Aid maintenance.

Art. 9. To see if the town will raise (\$500.00) five hundred dollars, in addition to the amount required by law for the support of the library and branches.

Art. 10. To see if the town will raise the sum of (\$313.16) three hundred thirteen dollars and sixteen cents, for the control of blister rust.

Art. 11. To see if the town will raise the sum of (\$120.00) one hundred twenty dollars, to defray the expense of town officers' bonds, as required by Chapter III, Laws of 1931, Town Clerk, Treasurer and Tax Collector.

Art. 12. To see what action the town will take, and what amount of money it will raise, to improve the new part of Canaan Street Cemetery.

Art. 13. To see if the town will approve the by-laws and ordinances adopted by the Selectmen permitting and regulating retail business, plays, games, sports, and exhibitions on Sunday as provided by Chapter 155, New Hampshire Public Statutes, approved May 6, 1931.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to borrow the sum of (\$10,520.25) ten thousand five hundred twenty dollars twenty-five cents from the State of New Hampshire and pay the same according to the provisions of Chapter 50, laws of 1929, for the purpose of paying the town's share in Trunk Line Construction in the town for the years 1930 and 1931.

Art. 15. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters, to see if the town will vote to raise the sum of (\$200.00) two hundred dollars, to be paid to the Treasurer of Verne H. Weld, Post Number 55, American Legion, to defray the cost of a fitting Memorial Day observance in 1932.

Art. 16. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, to pay necessary expenses.

Art. 17. To hear reports of Agents. Auditors and

other officers, heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

There was received by the Agent from the Selectmen tax bills for unpaid taxes amounting to \$6,388.01. There has been collected by the Agent \$3,455.26 and abated for different causes \$270.36, making a total cancelled from the town books of \$3,726.62.

Tax deeds were taken by the town and in some instances the town took possession and padlocked the buildings. In one instance the property was rented and the rent applied upon the taxes due. This property was not assessed for collection on the Tax Collector's book, but will be charged against the redemption. The amount of taxes to be collected for the year 1931 on the tax deeded property is \$753.24. This makes a total of uncollected taxes for the year 1931 of \$2,543.67, an increase of \$211.30 over what was reported uncollected for the year 1930. The uncollected taxes of 1929 were \$176.04 less than 1930 and \$424.55 more than 1928. The uncollected taxes of 1927 were \$974.58 more than 1926. Of the year 1925 there was uncollected \$593.89. The uncollected taxes have gradually increased until they have reached the present amount.

To the total above \$4,834.60 should be added the interest due, \$425.74, and the cost of notices and searches, \$83.00, and taxes on tax deeded property, \$753.24, making a total to be collected at the beginning of this fiscal year of \$6,096.58.
