(L. S.) STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hampton Falls in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hampton Falls on Tuesday, the Tenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) to care for the cemeteries in the town not otherwise provided for.
- 4. To see what action the town will take towards repairing the chimneys and painting the cloak room in the town hall and raise and appropriate the money for same.
- 5. To see what action the town will take in regard to painting the Public Library and raise and appropriate the money for same.
- 6. To see what action the town will take in regard to putting in traffic lights at the junction of Lafayette and Exeter roads and raise and appropriate the money for same.
- 7. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand, Five Hundred, Thirty-One Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$1,531.50) to liquidate town debt.

- 8. To see if the town will vote to pay weekly all road workers.
- 9. To see what action the town will take in regard to putting in a pipe line from the fire hydrant at the bridge to a hydrant at Whittier Park and to raise and appropriate the money for the same.
- 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

To the School Board of Hampton Falls:

I have the honor to present herewith, my first report as Superintendent of your schools.

It is a source of satisfaction to report that the percent of attendance in Hampton Falls has increased from 92 to 95.7 This mark is well above the state average. This is one proof of the earnest endeavor on the part of the pupils and of the constructive cooperation of parents.

Standardized tests have been given during the current year the results of which are satisfactory. These tests show that your pupils, at the present time, are doing all that could be expected. Especially is the work of the fifth and sixth grades to be commended. There is no doubt but that the pupils of these grades will be competent to do the work of their contemporaries when it becomes their turn to transfer to another school.

The newly purchased play ground equipment is much used and furnishes an orderly and healthy form of exercise. More equipment of a similar nature can very profitably be used.

The chemical toilets installed in the school have proven satisfactory in every way. These as a health measure, are necessary to the well-being of your children. The school board and townspeople are to be congratulated upon their installation.

Hampton Falls is facing a serious situation in the overcrowding of its school. The total registration this fall was 36. It is possible to handle thirty-six pupils if they are in the same grade but thirty-six pupils in six grades is a serious handicap to any teacher who works seriously for the welfare of her pupils. The condition of the East school is such that it could very easily be remodelled into a two-room school. If this were done a skilled primary teacher could be employed for the three lower grades and a teacher trained in middle grade work would be in charge of those special grades. In this way the efficiency of your children's education would be much improved. The necessary remodelling would consist mainly of a dividing of the present room with added entrance rooms and added windows. The expense involved would be very little and the returns in the education of your children great.

In these days when so much stress is being placed upon town advertising it is well to keep in mind that a modern school house is a town's best advertisement. The traffic over the Lafayette highway and in front of your school is heavy. Can we not impress upon the visitors that our town cares for its children in a modern and efficient manner?

During my six months' service in your schools I have become convinced that Hampton Falls can have one of the best little schools in the State. You have a fine school location with plenty of room, you have children above the average in intelligence and critical townspeople carefully watching your school achievement. With the backing of these same people advancement is not only possible but probable.

I wish to thank your board for its kindly advice and help during the first months of my office.
