STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Meredith qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

- 1 To bring in your ballot for Town Clerk, three Selectmen, Treasurer, two Auditors, Collector of Taxes and Police Officer.
- 2 To bring in your ballot for one delegate to a convention to revise the Constitution of this state.
- 3 To choose all other necessary town officers
- 4 To raise such sums as may be necessary for the support of schools
- 5 To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for

the repairs of highways and bridges, and specify how the same shall be laid out

6 To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for town charges

7 To see what sum the town will vote to raise to defray the expenses of Memorial Day

8 To see what sum the town will vote to raise for the use of the Town Library

9 To see what action the town will take relative to leasing the Town Hall

10 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of firemen and the protection of property in the Meredith Village Fire District

11 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the payment of outstanding notes against the town

12 To see what action the town will take in relation to the new road law, so called, and if its requirements be adopted, to raise money therefor

13 To see if the town will vote to guarantee to pay the deficiency, if any, in the rental of a steam road roller over and above the earnings from the state and other sources

14 To see what action the town will take relative to repairing the town hall and raise money therefor

15 To see what action the town will take relative to the offer of Miranda C. Packard to buy or lease the small lot of land adjoining her land which is part of the land devised to the town under the will of Thomas Leavitt

16 To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting

The past year has been a busy one in the library, as the circulation is larger than ever before, an average of 150 books being let out every Saturday. The circulation has nearly doubled in ten years and it is hoped it will continue to grow until every home is reached.

The library hours are from 2 to 5 in the afternoon and from 7 to 9 in the evening on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday. Visitors will find warm, well lighted rooms and twenty-two of the leading periodicals on the tables.

The fourth new supplement was printed in the fall and the books are now catalogued up to date. New catalogues are for sale at ten cents apiece and will be found a great convenience to those who cannot come to the library in person. There are now on the shelves 5,400 numbered books, besides works of reference, reports, etc.

Through the kindness of Mrs. D. W. Coe and Miss Virginia Ladd, a cabinet of valuable minerals owned by their father, Seneca E. Ladd, has been placed in the library. The collection includes many antique articles of local interest and is greatly appreciated. It is hoped that many others who have in their possession historical relics will present them to the library, where they can be safely cared for and enjoyed by all. A small collection of ancient books is started and if added to by gifts will sometime be of great interest.

The equalized valuation per pupil for 1910 was \$7,183.00. The whole number of pupils was 94 and the average daily attendance was 71. A study of these conditions and reference to Sec. 1, 2 and 3, Chapter 158, Session Laws of 1909 relative to the State Aid School Fund, will show that we missed securing the State Aid by a small margin, on account of a low average attendance. If those having the care of children of school age exercised due regard for the law and were more deeply concerned in the welfare of the schools, we should not fail to receive this aid from the state.

The Registers give the names of only 32 parents of children who have visited the schools during 1911. The best schools in the District are those in which the parents have co-operated with the teachers in maintaining a high average attendance and in promoting a good healthy school spirit.

Primary and 1st grade, Miss Helen E. Hawkins teaching the 2nd and 3rd in the room at Baptist Chapel. The Board was again obliged to rent this room at \$100 dollars per year. An addition to the present building must be made as if a four years course is established a High School building must be erected

Our last enumeration of scholars totals 151 and with our tuition pupils has made our enrollment winter 1912, 178.

Almost without exception the pupils in all grades have made satisfactory progress, and a comparison of our work with that of adjoining towns shows equality of work.
