WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L.S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Webster in the
County of Merrimack in said State, qualified
to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Webster Central
School in said Webster on Tuesday, the tenth day of
March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to
act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the
year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be neces-
sary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and
make appropriations of the same.

3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money
as may be necessary for the maintenance of high-
ways and bridges.

a. Summer Maintenance

b. Winter Maintenance

c. Tar Roads

d. General Expense of Highway Department

e. Street Lighting

4. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$524.50
for Class V road construction.

5. To raise and appropriate such sums of money
as may be necessary for public welfare.

a. Town Poor

b. Old Age Assistance

6. To raise and appropriate such sums of money
as may be necessary for the support of the Town
Library.

7. To raise and appropriate such sums of money
as may be necessary for patriotic purposes.

a. Old Home Day

b. Memorial Day

8. To raise and appropriate such sums of money
as may be necessary for the support and maintenance

of the Hy-Mar Fire Department, including forest fires.

9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for use in connection with the state program for the eradication of White Pine Blister Rust.

11. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 toward the operating deficit of the Concord Hospital, this amount being based on the number of patients admitted from Webster.

12. To authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to borrow for the town, by issuance of notes, a sum not exceeding \$30,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the year, 1964, said notes payable from said taxes within one year from date of issuance, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof.

13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the maintenance of the playground.

14. To see if the town will vote to raise \$25.00 to be expended in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission for the opening and maintaining of old trails and the old roads for forest fire protection. The New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission to provide a matching sum.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate and sum of \$5,000.00 to be used in a State Aid Reconstruction Project on Rte. 127. The state to put in \$10,000.00 making a total of \$15,000.00.

16. To see if the Town will vote to build a new Town Hall on land now owned by the Town adjoining the Central School at a cost of \$45,000.00, and to authorize the Selectmen, with the advice of the building committee, to make all necessary contracts for construction.

17. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$45,000.00 for the purpose of the preceding article, the said sum to be raised by taking \$18,459.69 from the "Town

Hall Sale Fund" and the sum of \$4,540.31 from the Reserve Fund for Future Town Buildings and the balance amounting to \$22,000.00 by borrowing on the credit of the Town through the issuance of serial notes or bonds in said sum in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act as amended. (Standing vote or ballot vote required, with 2/3 majority to adopt).

18. To instruct the Selectmen and the Town Treasurer over what term of years such serial notes or bonds shall be repaid.

19. To extend the term of the present Town Hall Building Committee of eight members for one more year, any vacancies caused by refusal to accept reappointment to be filled at the meeting; and to authorize such Committee to procure plans for a new Town Hall building for presentation to the next annual meeting, and to appropriate for this purpose from the Reserve Fund for Future Town Buildings the sum of \$1,000.00.

20. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

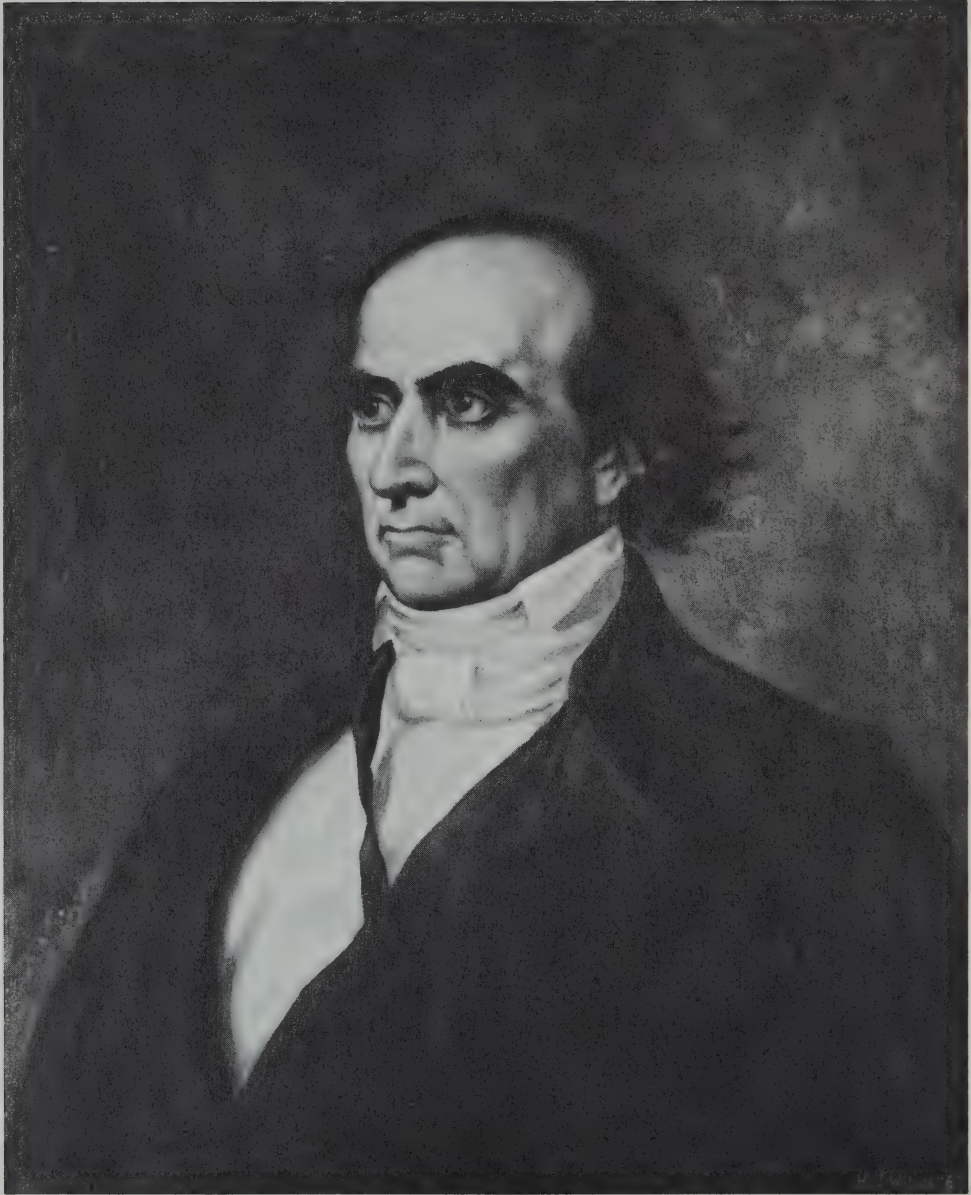

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The year of 1963 is now history and many things have happened in the Town of Webster which we feel should be brought out to the people of the Town and thanks brought out and placed in its rightful place.

Probably our biggest event was the launching of the submarine U.S.S. Daniel Webster at Groton, Connecticut. Several of the townspeople were able to go to Groton to witness this inspiring event. While there, we were also given a tour of the submarine base and a tour through a submarine.

Captain Marvin S. Blair, prospective Commanding Officer of the U.S.S. Daniel Webster, came to Webster and spoke to the children of the Central School and to adults in the evening. Captain Blair returned to Webster for Old Home Day and again spoke, in the evening, to the people of Town. At this time he presented to the Town of Webster the Flag which flew from the submarine at the day of launching. His only request in regards to the flag being that it would be flown at the day of commissioning of the submarine which will be sometime early in 1964.

At this time the Board of Selectmen would like to extend our heartfelt thanks to the two people who were greatly responsible for bringing the Town of Webster, the U.S.S. Daniel Webster and Captain Blair together — Mr. and Mrs. Sydney J. Taylor.

The people who went to the launching felt that the Town should present a gift to the submarine, at which time Mr. Herman J. Wibel agreed to do a portrait of Daniel Webster, for the Town, free of charge. The result of his work turned out to be an exceptionally fine painting and will be presented to the ship at the time of commissioning. A great deal of thanks is due Mr. Wibel for an excellent job.

Once again from Mr. Wibel, the Board of Selectmen accepted for the Town, a very nice oak office desk, two large oak chairs and a large oak filing cabinet. These are now in the Selectmen's Office. Again, for the Town, our thanks to Mr. Wibel.

Due to the extreme dry conditions in the spring and again in the fall, a fire watch was put on duty at the fire house and during the worst of conditions in the fall a road patrol was put into effect over the weekends. Part of the cost of this operation has been reimbursed to the Town by the State of New Hampshire.

Another job done by the Fire Company during the drought in the summer was to water gardens with the fire trucks. This was done with no labor charge to the Town. Thanks are due the firemen for their efforts in this project.

Once again our road agent has done a good job in maintaining our roads.

The T. R. A. money was spent on the road from Clothespin Bridge to the Concord City Line. A great deal of gain was made on this project as the unspent appropriation of 1962 and the 1963 appropriation were used in one operation. We expect in 1964, part, if not all of the portion that was worked on, will be oiled.

As usual our cemeteries were kept in very good shape. This, we feel, our Town can take a great deal of pride in.

A new furnace has been installed in the fire house. Some new duct work had to be done. This should prove to be a good unit for years to come.

Right after Town Meeting the land at Sweatts Mills which takes in part of the ball field and the swimming hole was purchased from Public Service Company.

Something on the sorrowful side in the past few years has been the small attendance at Town Meeting. Your town officials are spending your money and we feel that all of you should voice an opinion as to where, when and how much should be spent. A major issue which will be voted on this year is the building of a new Town Hall. Why leave it to just a few to decide such an important item? Whether items are big or small we are asking each and everyone of you to turn out for Town Meeting on March 10th to vote and express your opinions.

In summary it has been a busy year and we feel that considerable has been accomplished—at least this has been our hope and ambition.

REPORT OF THE TOWN HALL BUILDING COMMITTEE

The Town Hall Building Committee held its first meeting on June 13, 1963. Plans for a future town hall were discussed and tentative proposals and requirements were suggested by the committee, as follows:

1. Building to be 125' x 45', one story, basement.
2. 1st floor to contain coat rooms, hall, and stage.
3. Basement to contain furnace room, toilets, selectmen's office, library, kitchen, and dining room.
4. Ceiling in basement to be 8 1/2'; 1st floor ceiling 11 1/2-12'.
5. Comparative costs of wooden vs. brick vs. cement block construction to be considered.

It was pointed out that we should aim for a building that will not be outgrown in a few years; this accounts for the larger size building suggested.

On July 7th, the committee visited several town buildings of various types to help us better select the type of building for our town. On this date, it was decided by those present that if we expect to present plans for a building which will be acceptable to the townspeople, the building will have to be less expensive than the one first suggested; therefore, we cut the prospective size requirement from 125' x 45' to 100' x 40' and made several minor changes. It was planned to contact the Selectmen before our next meeting to see if a small sum of money could be made available to pay for having plans drawn up by an architect, with the idea of having something to present to the townspeople at Town Meeting in March 1964.

At our next meeting, August 2nd, it was reported that no funds were available for having plans drawn by a professional architect; that such a plan, if one was to be provided, would have to be financed by the building committee itself.

On January 10, 1964, the committee put much time and thought into discussing just what was wanted and needed for a building, the type of construction, finish, etc. One of the committee members, William Lake, offered to prepare a drawing which would include the general ideas suggested by the group.

At a meeting on January 14, 1964, this plan was submitted to the committee. It was found generally acceptable, practical, and satisfactory to the three contractors and/or builders represented on the committee. This plan, with a few minor changes is the one which will be presented to you at Town Meeting, March 10, 1964.

To the inhabitants of the School District in the town of Webster, qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Webster Central School in said district on the 10th day of March 1964, at 1:30 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subject:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees of Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
6. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
7. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

8. To see if the district will authorize the school board to make application for and to receive in the name of the district such advances, grants-in-aid or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the U. S. Government and/or State Agencies.

9. To see if the district will authorize the creation of a Cooperative School District Planning Committee of three persons, including at least one member of the school board, to study the feasibility of the Webster School District becoming a member of a Cooperative School District and report to the next annual meeting; such committee to have all the powers of a planning committee under State Law: and to choose three persons for such committee.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Last year I mentioned the Interim Commission Study of the Educational Problems in the State of New Hampshire, and I questioned what the Legislature would do about the report. Well, the Legislature did just about what I thought they would do. They accepted the report and adopted most of the provisions and recommendations with a notable and characteristic exception. They neglected to appropriate any money to carry out the provisions of the so-called "Area Schools".

There was also a great deal of talk in the newspapers about the great increased amount of State Aid. The effect of this tremendous increase that they were talking about was zero in this Supervisory Union. As a matter of fact, it was minus zero, because the one town which received some State Foundation Aid last year was cut from the list this year. Some day it will dawn on the Legislature and others, that the burden on the local property owner cannot continue to increase

each year as it has for the past sixteen years, and as it will continue to increase if some help is not given from the state level.

There is no question but what the educational picture in New Hampshire and throughout the United States has been changing rapidly over the past five years, and the next ten years are going to see even bigger changes. There is much to be said about the cooperative school districts, particularly on the level from grades seven through twelve. However, I would be less than honest with you or myself if I said that it wouldn't cost the people of Webster more on a cooperative basis. Your own board discovered this when they investigated the possibility of sending out grades seven and eight as tuition pupils. To meet the objections of costs, states where cooperative movement has been most successful have made it financially attractive. I am sure some day this will be true in New Hampshire. The big question is when?

The supply of teachers continues to be scarce. Although we are graduating a slightly larger number of teachers the additional number of pupils in the state more than uses up these extra teachers and the fact still remains that these new graduates do not want to come into rural communities with multiple grades nor do they have to. It is not unusual for these people to have four, five and six offers for positions. This is a bit different than thirty years ago when the girls from the teachers colleges were happy to get a one room rural school. Many of the graduates were not getting jobs at all. Our best hope is to get women who have had their families and are interested in coming back into the teaching profession. They have done good work in this Union and I am happy to have them work for me.

I continue to enjoy my work with the people of Webster.

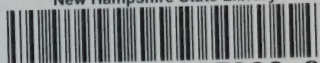
