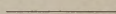

Report of the Board of Education.

The Board of Education submits the following report for the year ending March 1st, 1898 :

Whole number of children between the ages of five and sixteen, as enumerated by the Board, April 1, 1897, 108 ; boys 58, girls 50.

Whole number of scholars, five years of age and upwards, who have attended school in town during the year, 103.

Again we are called upon to report the condition of the schools in town. The past year the schools have followed the usual course, and have been under the care of faithful teachers, who have labored earnestly for the children in their charge. And in some instances, marked progress has been made for the amount of schooling provided. But, under the present system, it is not advisable to continue the schools into the winter. As we visit the schools during the latter part of the year, we can but notice that there are three classes of children in town : 1st, the small ones who cannot attend after the cold weather and snow comes ; 2nd, those who would rather be skating than in the school-room, (and it seems to make but little difference to their parents where they are) ; 3rd, such as are anxious to get an education and are willing to brave the storms and cold that they may be present at every session. To these children, we should give every possible advantage. How to do this is a question that meets us. Surely, it would be too expensive to maintain four schools to accommodate thirty or forty scholars, but if we could provide a High school at some convenient place, we could give this third class the privilege they so much need, at a very small expense. Another thing we noticed is, that few of the parents buy school books. This should not be, but more books should be bought and thus give the scholars an opportunity to review their studies during the long winter vacations.

We would not advise anyone to take the whole list of studies, but take one special study ; for instance, the scholar may be backward in Arithmetic ; let such a one buy the book and take up that study.
