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

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TO THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF ALLENSTOWN, IN THE COUNTY OF MERRIMACK IN SAID STATE, QUALIFIED TO VOTE IN THE TOWN AFFAIRS:

You are hereby notified to meet at the municipal building in said Allenstown on Tuesday the 12th day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- To see if the Town will vote to accept the Budget as submitted by the Budget Committee, or pass any vote in relation thereto.
- To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow in anticipation of taxes.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to give one percent (1 percent) discount on all 1968 property taxes paid within thirty (30) days after the tax rate is approved.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit of the Town accounts made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit. (Funds therefore are included in the Budget.)
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six hundred eighty thousand dollars (\$680,000.00) for the purpose of financing and constructing a municipal sewage disposal system, includ-

ing sewerage, interceptors, pumping stations, treatment works and such other related facilities, inclusive of land acquisition, casements and rights of way as are required, such sums to be raised by the issuance of not exceeding Six hundred eighty thousand dollars (\$680,000.00) in Serial Bonds or Notes under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (RSA 33 as amended) and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other actions as may be necessary to effect the issuance, negotiation, sale and delivery of such bonds or notes as shall be in the best interests of the Town of Allenstown, and pass any vote relating thereto. (This Article is approved by the Budget Committee.)

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply, negotiate and do all other things necessary to obtain such Federal, State or other assistance as may be available in the construction of a sewage disposal system, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of Chapter 252 of the Revised Statutes Annotated relative to the construction and operation of sewers and sewage treatment facilities in the Town of Allenstown.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey all the land lying

northerly of the northerly side of the Bartlett Street sidewalk to the abutters of said sidewalk; and to give a deed to said land in the name of the Town to such abutters, provided they shall bear the expense of such conveyance.

- 10. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to have a three year term for the Town Clerk.
- 11. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to have a three year term for the Town Treasurer.
- 12. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to have a three year term for the Collector of Taxes.
- 13. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to authorize parking on the south side of Ferry Street only and to prohibit parking on the north side of said street on that portion of said street lying easterly of the old Ferry Street Bridge; and to see if the Town will provide for the assessment of a fine for parking in violation of this parking regulation, and further to instruct the Selectmen to erect signs on said street designating the areas where parking is forbidden.
- 14. (By Petition) To see what action the Town will take relative to the establishment of a zoning law relative to the raising of pigs in the Town of Allenstown.
- 15. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to rescind its adoption of the Non-Partisan Ballot System and adopt in lieu thereof the Australian Ballot System as provided in RSA 59:72.
- 16. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to accept and maintain as a Town street that strip of land known as Martinson Lane, said roadway being forty feet (40') wide and approximately Four hundred (400') long and is in compliance with all Town regulations relative to streets.
- 17. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to accept and maintain as a Town street

- a tract of land forty feet (40') wide and running southerly from the southerly side of Ridge Road a distance of Two hundred feet (200') said tract of land being an extension of Notre Dame Avenue.
- 18. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to accept a gift of deed from Henry and Murphy, Inc. of a piece of land for a right-of-way fifty feet (50') wide and extending southerly from River Road a distance of Six hundred feet (600') to a de sac, and to be known as Heritage Drive. Said street having been bulldozed to grade, graveled, and sewer and water installed as per Town specification by Henry and Murphy, Inc.
- 19. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to accept a gift of deed from Henry and Murphy, Inc. of a piece of land for a right of way fifty feet (50') wide and extending southerly from River Road a distance of seven hundred feet (700') and intersecting proposed Heritage Drive and to be known as Meadow Lane. Said street to be bull-dozed to grade, graveled, and sewer and water installed according to Town specifications by Henry and Murphy, Inc.
- 20. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to accept and maintain the existing sewer on River Road, said sewer being approximately Eight hundred feet (800') in length.
- 21. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125.00) to install a catch basin in front of the Robert Clement residence on River Road. (This Article is approved by the Budget Committee.)
- 22. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One hundred seventy-five Dollars (\$175.00) to install a drain pipe across River Road to drain water from Letendre Plumbing and Raymond Cirard land to the drainage

- ditch on the opposite side of the road. (This Article is approved by the Budget Committee.)
- 23. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for the purpose of installing a culvert or drainage system to divert the overflow of water which comes from the property of Raymond Bean on Campbell Street and which covers the lower portion of Campbell Street, causing a seriour driving hazard when it freezes. (This Article is approved by the Budget Committee.)
- 24. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-four hundred dollars (\$2,400.00) for the purpose of extending a six inch (6") sewer line on Letendre Avenue from the property of Lucien Bonenfant southerly a distance of Eight hundred feet (800') to the residence of Roger J. Saucier. (This Article is approved by the Budget Committee.)
- 25. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Nine hundred fifty Dollars (\$950.00) to gravel, grade and roadmix Notre Dame Avenue for a distance of Two hundred feet (200') southerly of the southerly side of Ridge Road. (This Article is approved by the Budget Committee.)
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the purpose of purchasing a Tractor equipped with Loader and Back-hoe. (This Article is approved by the Budget Committee.)
- 27. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five hundred Dollars (\$500.00) to help support the operation of the Emergency Ambulance by the Veterans' of Foreign Wars, Post No. 2860, Pembroke, New Hampshire. (This Article is approved by the Budget

Committee.)

- 28. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Thirty thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) for the purpose of building a new fire station, said funds to be raised by the issuance of Serial Notes of the Town, in the sum of Three thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) per year, under the provisions of RSA 33. (This Article is disapproved by the Budget Committee.)
- 29. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The polls will be open until six o'clock in the afternoon.

In accordance with the vote of the 1958 Town Meeting a motion will be made in order at 10:00 A. M. to adjourn the reading of the Warrant to 7:00 P.M., Saturday, March 16, at the Municipal Building.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

January 17, 1968

Board of Selectmen

Allenstown, New Hampshire

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Allenstown for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1967, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Municipal Court, Trustees of Trust Funds and Library.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets - December 31, 1966 - December 31, 1967: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1966 and December 31, 1967, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt decreased by \$2, 190.65 in 1967.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures -Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1967, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net overdraft of appropriations of \$5,147.14, less a net revenue surplus of \$3,837.79, resulted in a net budget deficit of \$1,309.35.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1967, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1967, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of records. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus - (Deficit):

The current financial condition of the Town changed from a current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) of \$481.75, to a current deficit (excess of current liabilities over total assets) of \$827.60 in 1967, as shown herewith:

Overdraft of Appropriations and Application of Municipal Budget Law:

It is noted that there was a net overdraft of appropriations in the amount of \$5,147.14 - in other words, total expenditures exceeded total appropriations by this amount as indicated herewith:

On November 20, 1967 a certificate of emergency was issued by the Tax Commission authorizing the expenditures of \$10,000.00 in excess of the appropriations in the following accounts:

Town Maintenance Highways Town Construction of Streets Forest Fires Interest on Loans

Thus it may be stated that the Board of Selectmen stayed within the provisions of the Municipal Budget Law while incurring a net overdraft of appropriations of \$5,147.14 during the fiscal year ended December 31, 1967.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184, of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Allenstown for their assistance during the course of the audit.

CIVIL DEFENSE REPORT ALLENSTOWN, N. H.

For the past several years, I have been reporting to the people of Allenstown, the importance Civil Defense plays in our community. I have attended several instruction courses made possible by the Office of Civil Defense, Concord, N. H. Reading material is made available to me, but experience is also the best teacher as I found out at the "Shelter-Stay" of last January.

Friday night, January 27, 1967, at 5:30 P.M., a group of local residents assembled at the fire station to participate in a nuclear-age experiment. At exactly 6:00 P.M. we entered the basement of the Dole-Suncook plant.

We kept busy Friday night getting our allotted space liveable. We swept the floor, cleaned the lavatory, arranged our cots and set up a kitchen because this would be our home for the next 46 hours. Our only contact with the outside world was via a two-way radio with the Allenstown Fire Station. We were also visited by a watchman of the Dole-Suncook factory, and a reporter from a local newspaper just before the test ended.

Some of the minor ill effects of the "Shelter-Stay" were headaches, toothache, a cut finger and one had a stomach ache. Being supplied with many remedies, these ills were taken care of.

All the bunks were located in one section. After we were accustomed to the noises of our surroundings, sleeping was found to be satisfactory, under the circumstances.

The entire group agreed that the C-D biscuits were OK, but not for a steady diet. We were allowed to bring in a few food supplies, so we had biscuits with jam and peanut butter. We also had canned soups and canned beans, and of course a pot of coffee was always ready. The children had Kool-Aid for their beverage.

During the recreation period, the adults played scrabble, checkers and cards. The children were allowed to bring one toy, but after a while sharing came as quite an effort to them. After a few hours, the kids were out from running around. To ease the tension, movies that had been supplied by the Office of Civil Defense were shown. The movies were in cartoon form and showed the children what to do in the event of a nuclear attack. After showing a few of these films the projector broke, and we had to make the best of the few games and toys we had brought.

A mounted tandem bike with a fan in front was supplied by Civil Defense. As the adults pedaled for excercise, they also kept the air circulating inside the walled room.

The group had several comments about their "Stay", such as missing family and friends, favorite TV programs, shaving and showering, visiting the fire station, and even a regular bottle of beer. I must admit that we were all glad to see $3:00\ P.\,M.$ Sunday afternoon come.

I found this "Stay" to be very helpful in my personal study. Many conditions arose which were not mentioned in the manuals. Even though a small group participated in this exercise, I feel that I have somewhat of an idea of the different problems that might arise, should the shelter be filled to its capacity of 4, 900 persons.

In concluding, I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who gave up their week-end to participate in this experiment.

TOWN MEETING RECORD OF ANNUAL

Election - March 14, 1967.

The Polls were opened at 10 o'clock by the Moderator, Frank Noel. After the Polls were open a motion was made that the reading of the warrant and the Budget be put off until Saturday, March 18, 1967 at 7 P.M.

On Saturday the 18th, the Meeting was opened at 7 o'clock by the Moderator, Frank Noel.

Article 1 was taken care of on Election Day.

Article 2 - A motion was made and seconded to act on the Budget after the warrant. Motion carried.

Articles 3, 4, 5, and 6 were adopted as read.

Article 7 - There was an amendment to this article that the Chairman of the Board of Selectmen name a committee of 8 and report to the Fire Chief at the end of 30 days. The Committee named was as follows: Jesse Welch, Fire Chief Robert D. Chevrette, Herve Verville, Raymond Gagne, Treffle Noel, Albert Petit, Michael Chroniak, and Louis Gagne.

Article 8 - The town council told the voters that any article not approved by the budget committee cannot be acted upon, therefore this article was dismissed.

Article 9 - Was dismissed for the same reason as Article 8.

Article 10 - Was adopted as read.

Article 11 - Was dismissed for the same reason as Articles 8 and 9.

Articles 12, 13, 14, and 15 - Adopted as read.

Article 16 - Was dismissed.

Articles 17 and 18 - Adopted as read.

Article 19 - On this article the subject of last year on article 17 came up. To see if the town will vote to have the Planning Board draw up a set of Ordinance for the town within the next year, so that they can present them to the voters at the 1967 Town Meeting. There was a lot of misunderstanding on this article. The Fire Chief was waiting for the Planning Board and the Planning Board was waiting for the Fire Chief. After a lot of discussion they finally came to some understanding.

When the budget came up, the Fire Department was raised \$2,500.00. Town dump and garbage removal was raised \$1,500.00. Town Maintenance - summerraised \$1,000.00. Town Maintenance - winter - raised \$1,000.00.

Total Budget - \$84,428.86.

Chapter 15, Laws of 1959 amends RSA 76 by inserting after section 11 the following new section: 76:11-a Information Required. The tax bill which is sent to every person taxed, or his agent, if known, as provided in section II, shall show the rate for municipal, school and county taxes separately. Any town, through its selectmen, may request that the tax commission compute the rates which will appear on the tax bills as provided hereunder and upon said request the tax commission shall furnish the required information.

A combined or total rate is shown above for those towns with a single school district and with no precincts or village districts. It is recommended that the combined rate be shown on each tax bill in addition to the separate rates. Precinct and multiple school district towns and cities should also arrange their tax bills so that each taxpayer will know his total tax rate as well as the rate breakdown.

To the Residents of Allenstown:

I am pleased to report that 1967 saw eleven less fires in town than we experienced in 1966. Your Fire Department earnestly hopes this trend will continue into 1968.

I am also happy to report that the revised "Red Phone" system we arranged last year has proven to be effective. We now feel we have good coverage throughout the town and that this will speed the response when a fire does occur.

We initiated a "Fire Prevention Program" in 1967 and believe it is contributing to the betterment of our community. Lieut, Donald Connor was assigned responsibility for the program and has received excellent cooperation in carrying it out. He arranged participation in parades and other demonstrations to bring the need for fire prevention to your attention and the good reception has contributed to the morale of the department.

We continued to stress training in the past year and were able to arrange to take part in several joint training sessions with other departments. We participated with Pembroke on one occasion and on another went to Concord and worked with that department in a house fire training situation.

I recommend that we continue the practice of purchasing new equipment as this will contribute to the effectiveness of the department. Equipment that can be relied upon to do its job is a must for any good fire department. It was necessary to carry out major repairs on the tanker when the pump broke last year. Members of the department contribute their time and work toward keeping the vehicles in repair but a planned program of purchase and replacement should be continued.

The station floor and furnace required repair this year. If we are to remain at the present station, we have been advised that it will be necessary to replace the furnace in the near future.

I am sure all the members of the department join me in expressing my appreciation to you for the vote of confidence given the Department by your approval of the pay raise at the last Town Meeting. We appreciate it and will continue to try to provide Allenstown with good fire-fighting service.

SUPERINTENDENT'S

REPORT

With an ever-increasing number of pupils to be accommodated, local school districts are confronted with the problem of trying to provide quality education in the face of a teacher shortage destined to continue for at least a few more years. Because it is nation-wide, the matter of attracting competent teachers to a community has had to assume a new dimension in recruiting. Compared with an era when teachers applied directly for a position, the school superintendent now must spend much time and energy in directing a campaign designed to focus the attention of teachers on a particular community. Failure to go to sources of supply leaves a town with little choice but to fill its classrooms with individuals who are teachers in name only.

In the spring of 1967, the superintendents of New Hampshire were in the process of attempting to fill nearly 1900 vacancies, over 800 of which were at the elementary level. These vacancies represented a 44 per cent increase over 1965, when it already was apparent that the supply of teachers was critical. The problem was further compounded with relatively small classes of teachers being graduated from New Hampshire colleges; only 132 elementary teachers were granted degrees by the state colleges at Keene and Plymouth in 1967.

Never before has it been as imperative that an entire town bend its efforts in the

quest for capable teachers. School boards and administrators need sympathetic support in staffing, equipping and maintaining schools. Additionally, teachers are sensitive to community attitude; they have little inclination to seek employment in a district where there is only minor regard for education. In the final analysis, all of the inhabitants of a community exert a direct influence on the kind of an educational program that is offered. Failure to render support will lead to inferior instruction in the school system. Ultimately, society in general will be the real loser, for those children who have been shortchanged in school will be unable to make contributions in keeping with what was their potential.

Submitted herewith is the report of the examination and audit of the Allenstown School District for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1967, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the District. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the School Board and the School District Treasurer.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: (Exhibit A)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of June 30, 1966 and June 30, 1967, are presented in Exhibit A. As indicated therein, the Net Debt decreased by \$10,297.08 during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1967.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit B)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the School District during the fiscal year is made in Exhibit B, with the factors which caused the change incicated therein.

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures - Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits C & D)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1967, are presented in Exhibits C and D. As indicated by the Budget Summary (Exhibit D), a revenue surplus of \$1,390.69, plus a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$592.16, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$1,982.85.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit E)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1967, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit E. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of June 30, 1967, is indicated in Exhibit F.

School Lunch Program Account: (Exhibit G)

A statement of the School Lunch Program account is included in Exhibit G.

Statement of School Tax Account: (Exhibit H)

A statement of the School Tax account is presented in Exhibit H. As indicated therein, as of June 30, 1967, the School District had received from the Town of Allenstown the total of the 1966-67 School Tax in the amount of \$116, 107, 40.

Statement of Bonded Debt: (Exhibit I)

A statement of the outstanding bonded indebtedness of the School District as of June 30, 1967, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit I.

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased by \$1,297.08, from \$685.77 to \$1,982.85, during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1967, as shown herewith:
