WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

[L. s.]

To the inhabitants of the Town of Boscawen in the County of Merrimack in said state, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Boscawen on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing, and one Selectman for three years.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.

3. To bring in your votes for the election of Delegates-at-Large, Alternate Delegates-at-Large, District Delegates, Alternate District Delegates to the National Conventions of the Democratic and Republican parties, to be held for the purpose of nominating party candidates for President and Vice-President of the United States.

4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways.

5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for sewers.

6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for interest.

7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial day.

8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Old Home Day.

9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Library over and above the amount required by law.

10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the control of Pine Blister Rust.

11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the spraying of trees on the principal streets of the town.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate Thirty-two hundred twenty-four dollars fifteen cents (\$3,224.15) their share above the original appropriation spent on trunk line construction in 1922.

13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of trunk line.

14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for trunk line construction.

15. To see if the town will vote to change the location of the whistle and switch on the Muchido Hose House and raise the necessary money to carry any vote taken under this article into effect.

16. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

Dear Sirs:

In accordance with conference between Mr. James, representing the Selectmen of Boscawen, and the State Highway Commissioner, the State Treasurer and a representative from this department, I am notifying you that the sum of \$2,107.23 is due the state from the town of Boscawen, this amount representing the balance due the state in adjustment of the state proportionate tax of \$2,392 plus the special highway tax of \$3,224.15 less the corporation tax balance due the town; and that this sum must be paid on or before the first of April. This date is fixed as the latest which should be given to enable the State Treasurer to issue his extent (in compliance with chapter 66 of the Public Statutes) in order that the money may be received before the end of the present fiscal year.

The State Treasurer duly and seasonably (on May 21, 1923) issued his warrant to the Selectmen, directing them, in accordance with the statute, to add to regular state tax the sum of \$3,224.15 as a special highway tax, the town having failed to comply with section 8, chapter 35, Laws of 1905, as amended by chapter 192, Laws of 1911. The state tax not having been paid in full, there seems no other course for the state to follow.

I trust the town, at the meeting on March 11, will take such action as is proper to arrange for the immediate payment of the balance due and thus prevent

the necessity of issuing the extent and distraining the goods, property and estate of the selectmen.

In the construction of a federal aid project the state has to submit an estimate and plan of a certain section of road, and then in reality enter into a contract with the Federal Government to build this section at the estimated cost.

After this estimate has been approved by the Federal Government, the federal apportionment cannot be changed. It is impossible to exactly estimate the cost of work of this kind. The state, therefore, will estimate as near as possible the cost before entering into the contract and if for any reason, the cost should exceed the amount estimated, the state and town will be obliged to finance this overdraft. The State is prepared to finance the extra cost this year but will ask the town to raise in 1925 its share of such an overdraft should one accrue.

In accordance with the terms of an agreement executed between the the town of Boscawen and the New Hampshire Forestry Commission, we are herewith submitting the report of work conducted in your town during 1923 in the control of the White Pine Blister Rust.

Object of Undertaking

This work was undertaken for the purpose of continuing the removal of currant and gooseberry bushes, which are the only means of preventing the spread of the Blister Rust disease.

There is enclosed herewith a map upon which has been shown the areas covered previous to 1923 and those worked during the past year. It will be noted by referring to the report of 1922 that the Department made to the Selectmen that the possibility of completing the work in 1923 was predicted. However, this proved to be an impossibility owing to the large number of wild currant and gooseberry bushes which were found in the territory covered. During the course of control work 156 pine infections were found and the locations of these has been indicated upon the enclosed map by the usual symbol of triangles.

Plans For 1924

The distribution of wild currant and gooseberry bushes, even in localities where some investigation has been conducted is so uncertain that often the predictions of one season are not realized, when the ground is actually gone over another season. It is owing to this fact that the Department's estimate in 1922 of the length of time required to complete the town of Boscawen proved to be wrong. The Department feels that in view of the large amount of infection found in the northern half of the town of Boscawen and the fact that wild currant and gooseberry bushes are unquestionably very abundant, the work of removing these bushes should be continued so that all pine areas should receive similar protection. It, therefore, recommends that an article be inserted in the coming town warrant calling for an appropriation of \$400.00. This amount will, as formerly, be increased 25 percent from state funds. The Department suggests that this report be read at town meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

March 3, 1924

To the School Board and Citizens:

During the past year nothing extraordinary has been attempted in the schools. All the teachers, I believe, have daily been doing painstaking, thorough work.

On tests in arithmetic and spelling, given to eighth grade pupils in November, Boscawen pupils did not secure so high marks as those in some other towns in this union. Steps have been taken to correct this seeming weakness and I trust that the results of later tests will show improvement.

The attendance table, printed on another page, shows that the membership last year was a little higher than at any time since the new school law went into effect, in 1919. The per cent of attendance was as high as for any year during that period. The amount of tardiness has decreased, but still is greater than seems necessary.

The total expenditure for schools was highest in 1920-21. Since that time it has been decreasing somewhat, while in the item of teachers' salaries there has been an increase.

During five years (including the current year ending next June) the district has received nearly \$7,500 in state aid, which is an amount greater than 37 per cent of Boscawen's entire school tax for that period.

The increased expenditure for repairs last year has made the schoolrooms much more attractive. No steps have yet been taken to carry out the plan, formulated several years ago, of opening up more windows on the south side of each schoolroom at the Plains School and making the rooms narrower by partitions on the north side.

The condition of the grounds at the Plains certainly demands some attention. These grounds must be used for play and we cannot attempt to have a smooth grassy

lawn, but the sand might be covered with a thin layer of soil bound together by such grass roots as could get a start during the summer vacation. It is with this needed improvement in mind that the sum of two hundred dollars has been recommended to be raised under article 7 of the warrant.
