## REPORT OF LIBRARY TRUSTEES.

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During the year just passed we feel that we have added a good number of worth while books, entertaining as well as instructive for all ages.

We find it a problem to select fiction which is interesting, wholesome and decent. The novel that is most satisfying and most read is the one which idealizes life. Popular fiction of the day forms often the only reading for many a man and woman worn out with the day's work and worries. From ancient times the story has been the most popular means of imparting information, and giving moral and religious instruction. Story books have a powerful influence in molding character, and ex-President Eliot has said, "A youth has determined the way he faces before he is eighteen years old," so it behooves parents to know what their children are reading, as every story cheap in quality helps to lower the moral tone and turn the child from what is fine, true and honest, and, it should be our great concern, as trustees, to choose with the utmost care.

Let us select books in which children respect their elders, speak correctly and grow up well mannered. We sincerely regret that some books that could be of help never leave the library shelves. Parents with a growing boy can hardly afford to have left all this year Gibson's "Boyology" to only one reader. Mr. Gibson has worked for over twenty-five years daily with the young boy just entering manhood, and his experience is not without value. On page 148, he says: "Help him to see the value of education, and that no matter what may be his future vocation, with an education his earning capacity will be more than doubled and his chances for success trebled."

Another matter of great importance is that the books

should be handled not only with care but kept clean. More than once have books been seen carelessly thrown, without any wrapping, on the floor of a carriage or automobile.

Harry Lauder's "A Minstrel in France" is our most fascinating war book, and at the present moment "The Little Grandmother of the Russian Revolution," by Madame Catherine Breshkovsky, is of timely interest, as the author, Russia's most famous woman, has just come to America with two objects: first, to make known the truth about the present condition of Russia; second, to get help for the four million orphans and half orphans in that country. For years she has been preaching that the most important task of every country is to bring up its young properly and give them a good education.

We are very grateful to Mr. Howard P. Moore for an autograph copy of his most valuable book, "The Descendants of Ensign John More," which is an evidence of his indefatigable zeal, a labor of love covering years of painstaking search, both in this country and abroad.

Mrs. Annie M. Jackson, of Denver, Col., has presented to the library a copy of her "Family of John Lovejoy," which traces her ancestry to the seventh generation from Thomas Gibson and Jemima Shepard, old Canterbury families, and we extend our thanks for this worthy addition to our local history.

The branch library at the Baptist has been a success, and we hope to further extend the usefulness of the library.

It is to be hoped that during the year 1919 that definite plans will take form toward the building of the Elkins Public Library, or, at least, a site purchased and forward steps taken toward a reality.
