## Warrant for Annual Meeting

L. S. To the inhabitants of the Town of Enfield, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said town on the Second Tuesday of March next, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

1. To choose by ballot and major vote, a Town Clerk, three Selectmen, Treasurer, Overseer of the Poor, one Library Trustee for three years, one or more (not exceeding three) Highway Agents.
2. To choose all other officers and agents as the town may judge necessary to be chosen.
3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for support of highways for the the ensuing year.
5. To see if the town will take any action in regard to the delivery of blank inventories.
6. To see if the town will appropriate a sum not exceeding fifty dollars for the proper observance of Memorial Day.
7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for repair of Shaker Bridge.
8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for maintaining street lighting by electricity for the ensuing year.
9. To see what action the town will take in regard to collection of taxes for the ensuing year.
10. To see if the town will vote to raise and approp-
riate the amount necessary to secure State aid for the permanent improvement of highways under the law passed at January session 1905.
ir. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for support of the public library for the ensuing year.
11. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto, and transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

\section*{REMARKS}

In reporting our schools we do not claim that all have been up to the standard the past year, some have come very near what we would call nearly perfect, while others have not reached a very high rating. Poor discipline, system and lack of tact on the part of the teacher. In some of our schools there are not enough pupils for healthy competition and advancement.

If there is any expense in conveying children to school on almost every hand there are complaints concerning our school system. If a school is held where there are only a few scholars, criticisms and opinions are freely given, these criticisms vary according to location and environment, but the tone is similar and the school board is blamed for what they can in no way remedy under our present school system. No school to achieve the best results, should number less than fifteen pupils and it is the duty of the school board to so consolidate that the schools shall be of respectable size.

In some of our schools we find the teaching none to thorough, scholars skimming merely the surface for grades. We most earnestly recommend that every scholar in town, who shows exceptional mental ability, be carried on up through the higher grades into the high school of this town or some other town, and thus prepared for the scholastic and educated lines of life's work. While those who cannot pass an intelligent examination for the higher grade be carried along in the lower grade until they show a capacity for promotion.

Our observation of the schools in town has convinced us that for the best interest of our schools a superintendent is needed, yes demanded. When we touch upon this the cry is raised, "High taxes," "The schools cost too much as it is," "Leave things alone," etc. Strange as it may seem, the dollars and cents aspect of increasing the usefulness of our schools is the first, last and only phase that appeals to many people. If
our schools are to keep pace with the progress along other lines supervision is necessary.

It is seemingly hard for some people to realize the change that has come over our schools in the United States during the last twenty-five years. If we talk with some of the people who always live in the past educationally, they will tell you about the schools of their youth, how well they were managed and how little they cost. We have no desire to disparage the work of those schools or estimate lightly their output.

The methods of our schools of twenty-five and forty years ago are obsolete and we are living in a new school age. We have church "extension work," let us have more school extension work by employing a good superintendent. The church and school are one in the great work of education. The school board may do much to benefit the schools, but they often cause confusion in the schools, they all want their "say" and the ideas of school management are not the same, and often times unintentionally they confuse a school by their conflicting opinions. With a competent superintendent all the varied interest of our schools would come under his critical observation, having full control of all the details, there could be no antagonism and he would do both teacher and children good. The state pays a part of the expense, and we could unite with some town and the expense to Enfield would be small. The one essential to build up our schools in our opinion is a superintendent.

The financial condition of the district is given by the treasurer. We give what we think the expense for the present year should be: Money required by law,
