BELKNAP SS.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Belmont in the County of Belknap, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Community Hall, in said Belmont, on Tuesday, the 12th of March next, at 9 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To choose one Selectman for three years, one Trustee of the Trust Funds for three years, and one Trustee of the Public Library for three years.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray all expenditures as listed in the Budget and make appropriations for the same.
4. To see what the Town will vote to do with its Parsonage Fund.
5. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount on all taxes paid on or before July 5th, 1935.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of one new truck.
7. To see if the town will vote to legalize Sunday baseball.
8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for a Town Doctor.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to meet the requirements of the State for the construction of the Province Road, provided the State shall appropriate a sum for the same purpose; it being understood that if said appropriation is made by the State and the Town accepts said special aid, that the Town shall not be entitled to State aid for Class II roads.

11. To see if the Town will accept state aid for the construction of Class II roads, and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$1,365.00, or or will vote to accept state aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$731.21.

12. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Water Committee to continue in its capacity whenever necessary.

13. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the municipal budget act.

14. To transact any other business that may come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Belmont :

I herewith submit my annual report as superintendent of your schools. This is the twentieth time I have submitted such a report to you.

The Tilton-Northfield Supervisory Union has been enlarged by the addition of Canterbury. This was made necessary by a further reduction of the number of superintendents in the state and the consequent reorganization of many of the unions. This union is now made up of Tilton-Northfield, Belmont, Canterbury, Gilford, and Gilmanton. There are forty-five teachers and approximately one thousand one hundred fifty pupils.

TEACHERS AND ENROLLMENT

Miss Ruth E. Lewis, teacher in grade seven and eight of the Gale school and assistant in the high school, resigned in June. Miss Lewis had been with us several years. She was succeeded by Miss Isabel Meader, a grad-

uate of Tufts College. This has been our only change in the teaching force during the year.

This total enrollment of 235 is four less than the enrollment a year ago. In addition there are 20 Belmont pupils for whom tuition is being paid enrolled in Laconia schools, eight in the high school and twelve in the Junior high and elementary grades.

HIGH SCHOOL

A large increase in enrollment in the high schools of the state and nation during the last few years is significant. It is probable that this larger enrollment is not a temporary condition. It is doubtful if with the return of prosperity industry and business will find places for boys and girls of high school age as formerly.

Our high school has had a slow but steady growth. The need of more room has, I believe, reached the point where something must be done to provide more adequate accommodations. There is need too of adding to the courses offered, of making it possible for pupils to have a somewhat wider choice. Among other things the school ought to train our girls to become better home-makers. We certainly need courses in domestic arts. This, of course, means additional teaching force.

The per pupil expenditure in our high school last year was \$69.30, the lowest in the state. There were

several schools, however, in which the net cost per pupil to the district was less than in Belmont. These schools had large tuition pupil enrollments.

FINANCES

The school board's budget calls for an appropriation of \$11,949.85. This is \$717.15 less than was appropriated a year ago. We may expect to receive as state aid next year \$4,286.15. This is \$641.78 larger than the amount received this year.

IMPROVEMENTS

The installing of a new ventilating stove and a generous thinning out of the trees in the rear of the Plummer school have greatly improved the conditions in this school.

New water pipes were laid last summer from the Gale building to the water main.

I wish again to express my appreciation of the help which has been given me during the year by the members of the school board, the teachers and many others.
