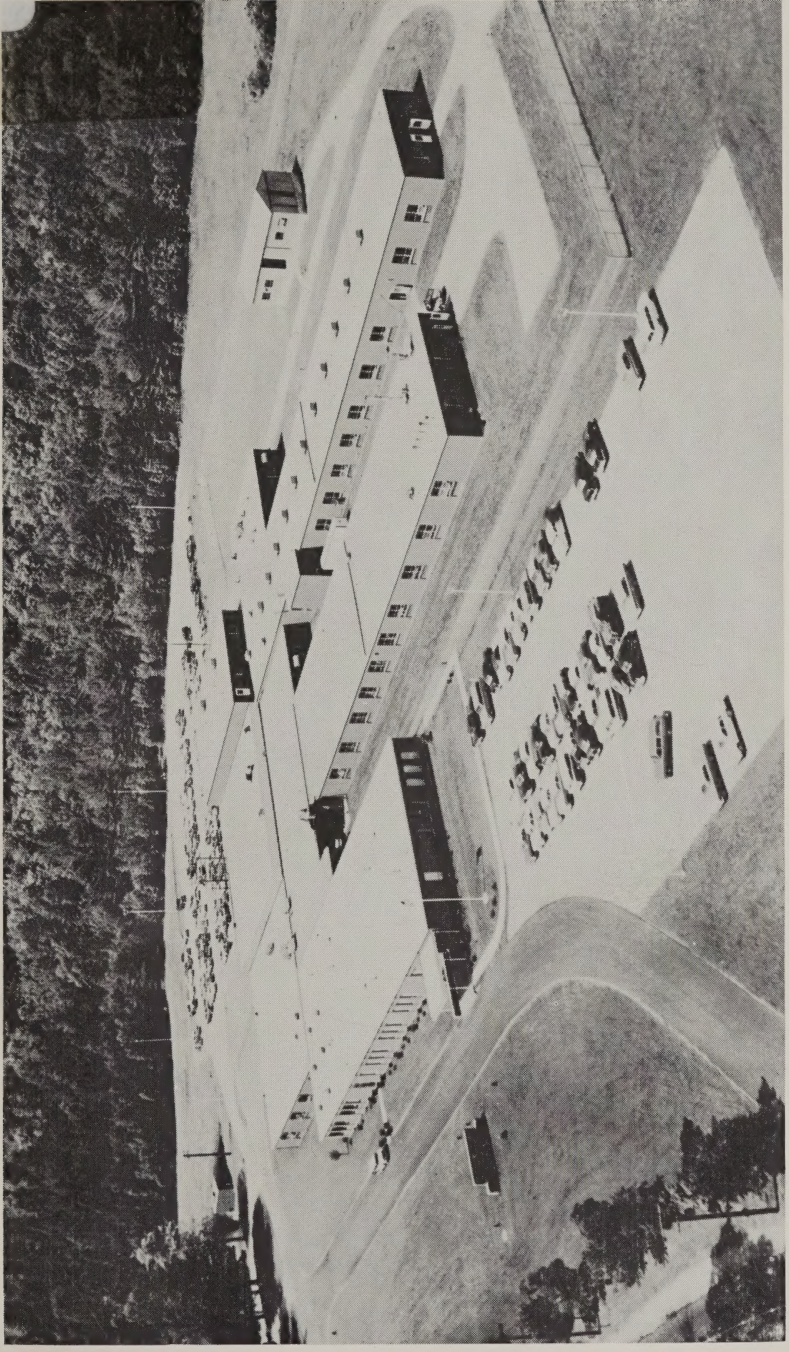

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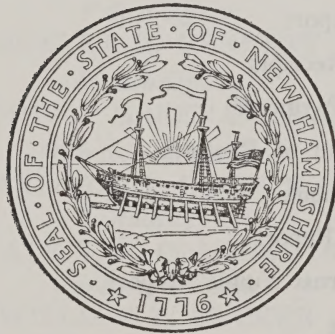

BRISTOL TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bristol in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Bristol on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. Action on the following articles to begin at eight of the clock in the afternoon.

2. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the construction of a sewer on Fourth Street and a portion of Prospect Street.

(Recommended by the Budget Committee)

3. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the reconstruction of portions of Hall Road and Bristol Hill Road.

(Recommended by the Budget Committee)

4. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the purchase of a Police Car.

(Recommended by the Budget Committee)

5. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Budget as submitted by the Budget Committee and raise and appropriate the sums set forth therein to be raised by taxation.

6. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Town Conservation Commission as set forth in R.S.A. 36A. (By petition)

7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

8. To transact any other business that may come before said meeting.

The Library is open Monday, Wednesday and Saturday from 1:00 to 5:00 and 6:00 to 9:00.

As you will note we have again come up with an increase in circulation over 1964. It has been a tough year for all of us due to unforeseen illness and inability to attend some of the Book selection meetings. Minot-Sleeper is now a Charter Member of the North Country Library District with a Trustee on the Governing Council. When this district becomes completely operational it will have many advantages available to its members. Already we are realizing an additional 2% when buying Books. Incidentally the cost of new Books like everything else is on the way up.

This year we have increased our Insurance coverage to a more realistic figure. For 1966 we have ap-

proved a one hundred dollar increase for our Librarian and are also asking the Town to assume the modest salary of our Treasurer. Due to the fact that the North Country Library District covers a large territory the question of mileage is becoming a problem for the Librarian and Book Committee. We hope to have more information next year. The parking problem for our present Library location is quite serious and far from ideal. Perhaps we should begin to consider providing parking space in the rear of the Library. We might investigate costs and then set aside a percentage for two or three years to cover this expense.

Ed., Junior and Senior Archery, Open Houses, Adult Pistol Shooters, Kuskequa Indian Dancers, Elementary School Square Dancing Classes, Grades 7 and 8 Girls' Basketball, Fatman's Club, Open House Badminton, Teen Dances and Rock 'n' Roll Band Rehearsals.
