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SHAHEEN - BROWN RACE HEATS UP

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
DURHAM, NH – Senator Jeanne Shaheen continues to lead all Republican challengers, but her favorability ratings have slipped in recent months. Former Massachusetts Senator Scott Brown is the strongest challenger, but is viewed unfavorably by Granite Staters.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and seven (507) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between April 1 and April 9, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent. The sample includes 387 likely voters (with a +/- 5.0 percent margin of sampling error).

2014 U.S. Senate Election


In one of the most watched races in the country, New Hampshire Senator Jeanne Shaheen could be facing former Senator Scott Brown, a recent transplant from Massachusetts. And while there has been considerable media attention to Brown's decision to run, very few voters have decided who they will vote support. Only 17% of likely voters say they have definitely decided who to support, 13% are leaning towards someone, and 70% are still trying to decide.

If the election were held today and Shaheen and Brown were the candidates, 45% of likely voters say they would vote for Shaheen, 39% would vote for Brown, 2% support someone else, and 14% are undecided. One interesting thing to note about this matchup is that Brown leads in residents who have moved to the state from Massachusetts (50%-37%), while Shaheen has a slight edge in lifelong New Hampshire residents (44-42%) and a big lead among those who have moved here from other states (50%-31%).



Former Senator Bob Smith, who lost a primary for this seat in 2002 to John Sununu, is running to win back his old seat. If Smith were the Republican nominee, 48% of likely voters say they would vote for Shaheen, 34% would vote for Smith, 1% support someone else, and 17% are undecided.




If former State Senator Jim Rubens were the Republican nominee, 48% of likely voters say they would vote for Shaheen, 28% would vote for Rubens, 1% support someone else, and 23% are undecided.



And if conservative activist Karen Testerman were the Republican nominee, 48% of likely voters would say they would vote for Shaheen, 25% would vote for Testerman, 2% support someone else, and 25% are undecided.


US Senate - Shaheen vs. Testerman



As would be expected in hypothetical matchups this early, Democrats and Republicans largely support their party's candidate while many Independents are undecided. Shaheen trails among independent voters to every challenger except for Rubens. It is also important to note that the incumbent Shaheen does not crack 50% against any Republican challenger.

Favorability Ratings - Senator Jeanne Shaheen

The senior member of the New Hampshire congressional delegation and a three-term governor, Democratic Senator Jeanne Shaheen, has long been one of the most popular politicians in New Hampshire. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 49% of New Hampshire adults say they have a favorable opinion of Shaheen, 35% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 7% are neutral and 9% don't know enough about her to say. Shaheen's net favorability rating, the percentage who have a favorable opinion of her minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion, is +14%. This is a slight drop from her +16% net favorability in January and is her lowest rating in three years, but it is typical for candidates as they enter a re-election period. Shaheen is still viewed very favorably by Democrats (net +70%) and very unfavorably by Republicans (-34%). Shaheen's favorability has dropped significantly among Independents (from +21% to -8%) since January.





GOP Challengers for U.S. Senate


Brown enters the race with by far the most name recognition of any Republican challenger but he remains unpopular in the state. Currently 29% of New Hampshire adults say they have a favorable opinion of Brown, 39% have an unfavorable opinion, 11% are neutral and 21% don't know enough to say. His net favorability is -10%, which is up from -11% in January. Brown is very popular among Republicans (net +41%, which is up from +25% in January), but is unpopular among Independents (-27%) and very unpopular among Democrats (net -46%).




Despite being a three-term congressman and two-term senator, it has been more than a decade since Bob Smith has been active in New Hampshire politics and he remains somewhat unknown in the state. Currently, 21% of New Hampshire adults say they have a favorable opinion of Smith, 21% have an unfavorable opinion, 9% are neutral and 49% don't know enough to say. His net favorability is 0%, which is up from -6% in January. Smith is somewhat popular among Republicans (net +17%), while Independents are neutral about Smith (0%) and he is unpopular among Democrats (net -17%).



Despite campaigning for over a year, Jim Rubens remains largely unknown in the Granite State. Currently, only 7% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Rubens, 8% have an unfavorable opinion, 7% are neutral and 78% don't know enough to say. Rubens' net favorability rating is -1%, which is the same as it was in January.



Former gubernatorial candidate Karen Testerman, who announced her run last fall, is also largely unknown in the state. Only 6% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Testerman, 6% have an unfavorable opinion, 6% are neutral and 83% don't know enough to say. Testerman's net favorability rating is 0%, which is up from -3% in January.

To get a better sense of how Granite Staters feel about Scott Brown and Jeanne Shaheen, we asked what one word voters associate with each of them.


For Brown, 15% said carpetbagger or outsider, 7% said Massachusetts, 5% said untrustworthy, 4% said Republican or conservative, 3% said honest or trustworthy, 3% said independent or bipartisan, 3% said opportunist, 3% said moderate or middle of the road, 3% said possibilities or ambitious, 2% said RINO or liberal, 1% said intelligent or capable, 1% said hardworking or dedicated, 1% said experienced, 16% had something else positive to say, 10% had something else negative to say, 13% had a neutral comment and 10% were unsure.

For Shaheen, 6% said honest or trustworthy, 6% said dedicated or hard-working, 6% said untrustworthy, 5% said experienced, 5% said Democrat, 4% said intelligent, 4% said liberal, 4% said New Hampshire, 3% said consistent, 2% said she should retire, 2% said Obama or healthcare, 2% said follows party line, 1% said moderate, 18% had something else positive to say, 14% had something else negative to say, 11% had a neutral comment, and 8% were unsure.

Favorability Ratings - Senator Kelly Ayotte

The favorability ratings of New Hampshire's junior senator, Republican Kelly Ayotte, have improved since January. Currently, 49% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Ayotte, 28% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 9% are neutral and 15% don't know enough about her to say. Ayotte's net favorability rating is +21%, which is up from +13% in January. She remains very popular among Republicans (net favorability rating of +54%), popular among independents (+14%) and somewhat unpopular among Democrats (-9%).



Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and seven (507) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between April 1 and April 9, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, age, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may sum to just above or below 100%. Respondent numbers in each demographic may not equal the total respondent number due to respondents choosing not to answer some demographic questions.
