



During the past year your selectmen have had many complaints relative to the high rate of taxation in this town, and at the commencement of this present year, when the appropriations are to be considered and voted upon, it behooves each and every one of our citizens to give the matter deep thought and careful consideration. Look well at the appropriations of last year and consider how they have been expended.



As can be seen by this report, the two largest amounts appropriated were for school purposes and the repairing of highways. The sum of \$4,898 65 was expended for educational purposes. At the taking of the inventory there were 224 scholars, thus making a cost of more than \$21 to the town for the education of each pupil.

Now in relation to highways, we have 90 miles of roadway, divided into 22 districts, to be kept in repair, and the total amount expended was \$1946 30. The rate of expenditure per mile amounts to about \$21 63.

During the past year the sum of \$540 78 have been expended for bridges and culverts. Of this sum \$229 19 was paid for rebuilding the bridge on River street at Union, and also repairing another at the same place. The lumber for these bridges cost \$164 33, and the labor \$64 86.

This number of miles of roadway is a good many for a small town to keep in a safe and passable condition, with the almost numberless culverts which are always needing more or less attention, to say nothing of the larger bridges to be taken into consideration, and if our citizens will but give the matter even a slight examination, we predict that they will agree with us that this sum has been judiciously expended by our surveyors. This amount is sufficient to keep the highways of our town in a fairly good condition, but will not allow of any permanent improvements.

We are pleased to report the town in such good condition financially, entirely out of debt and with a surplus of some \$4500 in the treasury. We have carefully calculated the expenses to be incurred for the coming year, and, provided that the sums appropriated for schools and

highways do not exceed those of last year, we estimate that the sum of \$9000 to be raised by taxation, will be sufficient for all purposes, and leave a surplus of \$2000 for a working capital. This amount would be about one-fourth less than the sum raised last year, which was \$11,900, thereby reducing the rate of taxation about twenty-five per cent.
