TOWN WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Boston, in the
County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote
in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Boston on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, 1933, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same:

- a—For the maintenance of roads and bridges.
- b—For the general expense of the highway department.
- c—For the removal of snow.
- d—For Memorial Day and care of soldiers' memorial.
- e—For the support of schools.
- f—For town officers' salaries.
- g—For town officers' expenses.
- h—For election and registration expenses.
- i—For the expense of the town hall.
- j—For police department.
- k—For fire department.
- l—For health department.
- m—For vital statistics.
- n—For street lighting.
- o—For town poor.
- p—For old age assistance.
- q—For interest.

3. To see if the town will vote to sell the school house in old district No. 5, or act in relation thereto.
4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Wason Memorial Library.
5. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay town debt.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$400.00 for the purpose of co-operating with the State in the control of the White Pine Blister Rust, or act in relation thereto.
7. To see if the town will vote to purchase any new road machinery, raise and appropriate money for the same or act in relation thereto.
8. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the money from the sale of schoolhouses to the use of the school district.
9. To see if the town will vote to tar the surface of any class V highway, raise and appropriate money for the same or act in relation thereto.
10. By agreement with the Selectmen of Amherst, to see if the town will vote to close, subject to gates and bars, the road known as the Campbell Road from a point where it leaves the road leading past Calvin White's to the Amherst town line.
11. By request of the State Tax Commission, to see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds.
12. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to hire money to meet the necessary expenses of the town.

13. To hear the reports of agents, officers and committees heretofore chosen, or act in relation thereto.

14. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of New Boston:

In the report for last year certain information regarding expenses and salaries, and operating costs was given. While the same items might be pertinent now, there is no point in repeating as there has been practically no change since.

Schools are carried on at No. 2 with 9 pupils, at the Village with 47 (total enrolment) in High School, 35 in grades seven and eight, 29 in the intermediate room and 28 in the primary room. At No. 13, Miss Dorothy Crowell is teaching with 13 pupils. Miss Crowell graduated from the Wheelock School in Cambridge last June.

For some time there has been question and discussion about more classrooms for high school and grades seven and eight. The new room added last fall makes more difference than one might suppose, so that at present, quite ample classroom accommodations are afforded.

A piano for the use of the elementary rooms is another expression of community interest. Also a fire escape, which should guarantee, as far as can be guaranteed, safety for pupils on the second floor, has been put in place. Here's hoping it will never have to be used, as a fire escape. But safety is provided.

Also, it is noted, with appreciation, that the Women's Club has arranged to provide a "hot drink" for pupils who must "carry lunch". This is a substantial addition to that brought from home, and meets a real demand.

You will note, it is hoped, that the budget asked for by the School Board for next school year is considerably less than this year's. The item for books and supplies is one item that has been lowered \$50.00 from this year. The amount for elementary books and supplies is \$175.00. With approximately 100 pupils to provide for this allows less than \$2.00 per pupil for the year's supply. The State's

average per pupil on these items has been about \$3.00 or more. Not a whole lot can be done with less than \$2.00 per pupil.

Also the High School amount for these same items has been reduced \$25.00, to \$225.00 or about \$5.00 per pupil as compared with a State average of about \$7.00 per pupil. This isn't a complaint. It only suggests that we need to guard against cutting too far. These amounts, if allowed, may suffice for the next year. But they are not sufficient over a period of years. But the years after next year can be cared for as they come.

All concerned in the conduct of the schools have tried and are trying to adapt "ways and means" to these times—endeavoring to provide as well as we may, for the growing lives of your young people.
