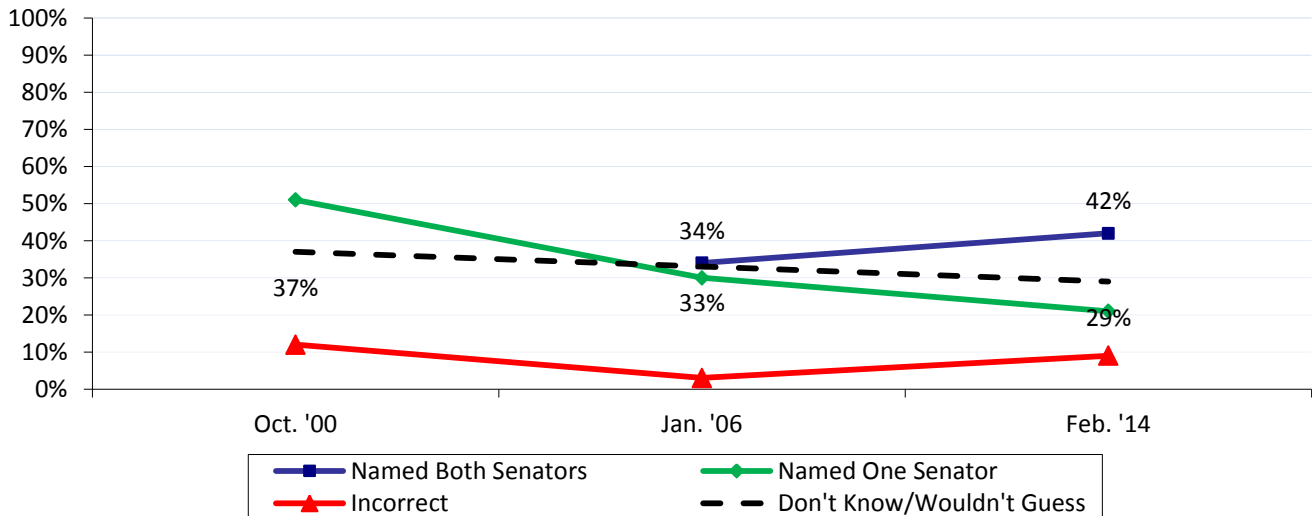
DURHAM, NH – Less than half of New Hampshire residents can name both of their U.S. Senators. Even fewer can name their member of Congress, State Senator or State Representative.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,\* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and sixty-eight (568) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between January 28 and February 2, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.1 percent.

### Who Are Your U.S. Senators

New Hampshire has a reputation of having an informed and engaged electorate, but results from the most recent WMUR / Granite State Poll suggest they need a civics lesson. When asked to name their two U.S. Senators, only 42% of New Hampshire residents could correctly name both Jeanne Shaheen and Kelly Ayotte, another 21% were able to name one of their senators (13% named Shaheen and 8% named Ayotte), 9% were incorrect, and 29% admitted they did not know. The percentage of New Hampshire residents who could name both senators is slightly higher than in the Winter, 2006 Granite State Poll when 34% correctly named both senators.

Know Names of NH Senators

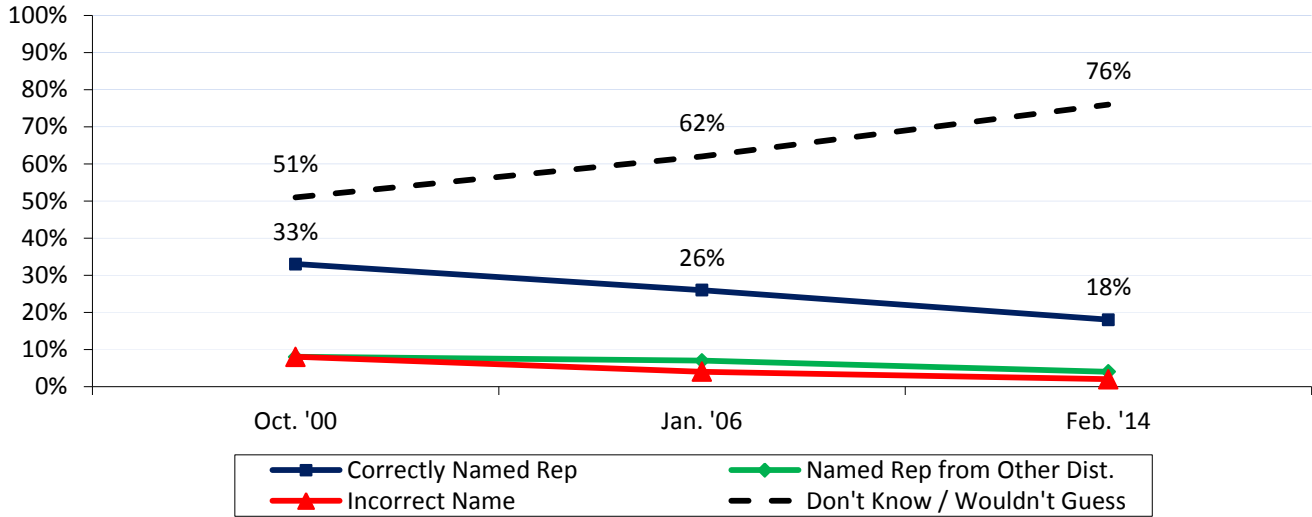

### Who Is Your U.S. Representative

While the percentage of Granite Staters knowing their U.S. Senators' names has increased somewhat, they are even less aware of their congressional representatives. Only 18% of New Hampshire residents could correctly name Carol Shea-Porter or Ann Kuster, 4% incorrectly named the congresswoman from the other district, 2% incorrectly guessed someone else, and 76% didn't know. The percentage who could correctly name their member of Congress has risen in recent years. This may be in part due to Kuster being elected for the first time in 2012 and Shea-Porter being elected, then defeated in 2010, and then re-elected in 2012.

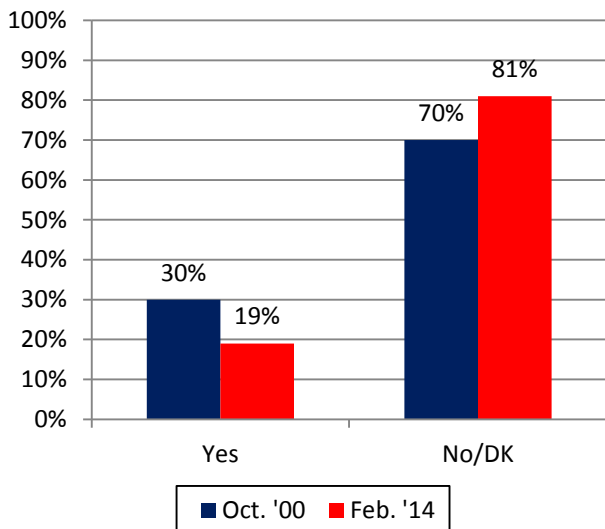
Know Name of US Representative



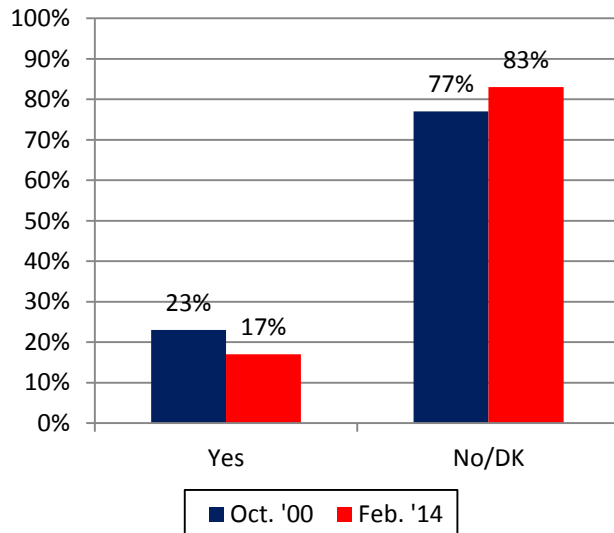
### Who Are Your State Legislators

Despite electing state senators and representatives every two years, few Granite Staters know who they are represented by. Just 19% were able to provide a name of their State Senator and 81% could not (we did not follow up to see if they were correct), down from 30% in the Fall, 2000 Granite State Poll. The New Hampshire of Representatives is the largest in the country with 400 members. Many argue that this puts representatives closer to the people, but the people of New Hampshire don't appear to be too close to their representatives -- just 17% said that they knew the name of one of their representatives (many districts have multiple representatives) and 83% could not, which is down from 23% in 2000.

### Subgroup Analysis

Older residents and those with postgraduate degrees are more likely to know their Senators and Representative in Congress. Younger people, residents who have moved here in the last 10 years, and those who did not vote in the 2012 presidential election are less likely to know them. With state legislators there are no significant differences across groups.

### Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and sixty-eight (568) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between January 28 and February 2, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.1 percent.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, age, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
