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SUPPORT RISING FOR LEGALIZING POT IN NH, MOST SUPPORT TAXING IT AT LIQUOR LEVELS

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DURHAM, NH – Opposition to legalizing marijuana for recreational use continues to decline as a growing majority of Granite Staters favor the idea. Support for marijuana being sold and taxed similar to alcohol is also on the rise.

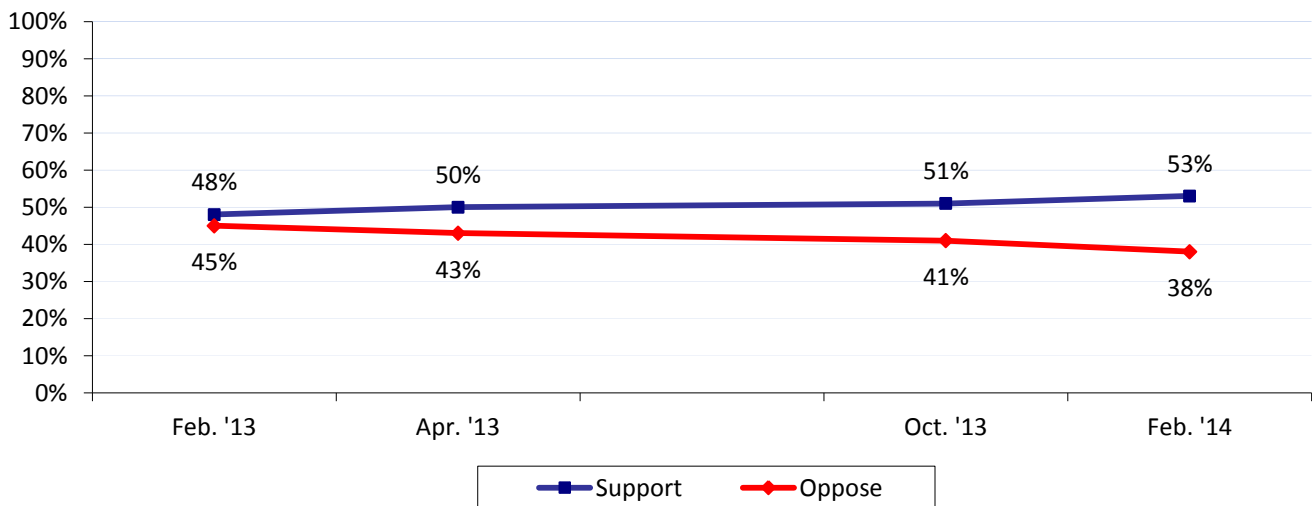
These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and sixty-eight (568) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between January 28 and February 2, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.1 percent.

Recreational Marijuana Legalization

Last year, New Hampshire became the 19th state to legalize marijuana for medical purposes and last month, the New Hampshire House passed a bill to legalize marijuana for recreational use. There is modest support for legalizing recreational marijuana in New Hampshire -- 53% support legalizing marijuana for recreational use (35% strongly and 18% somewhat), 38% oppose (24% strongly and 14% somewhat), and 10% are neutral or don't know. One important trend to note is the softening of opposition over the past year. While overall opposition to legalizing marijuana dropped 7 percentage points in the past year, the percentage who strongly oppose legalization has dropped 13 percentage points from 37% to 24%.

Support for recreational marijuana legalization is strongest among liberals (67%), NH Public Radio listeners (63%), residents between the ages of 50 and 64 (62%) and Democrats (61%). Opposition is strongest among Tea Party supporters (57% oppose), older residents (55%), conservatives (51%), and Republicans (48%).

Support/Oppose Legalizing Marijuana For Recreational Use



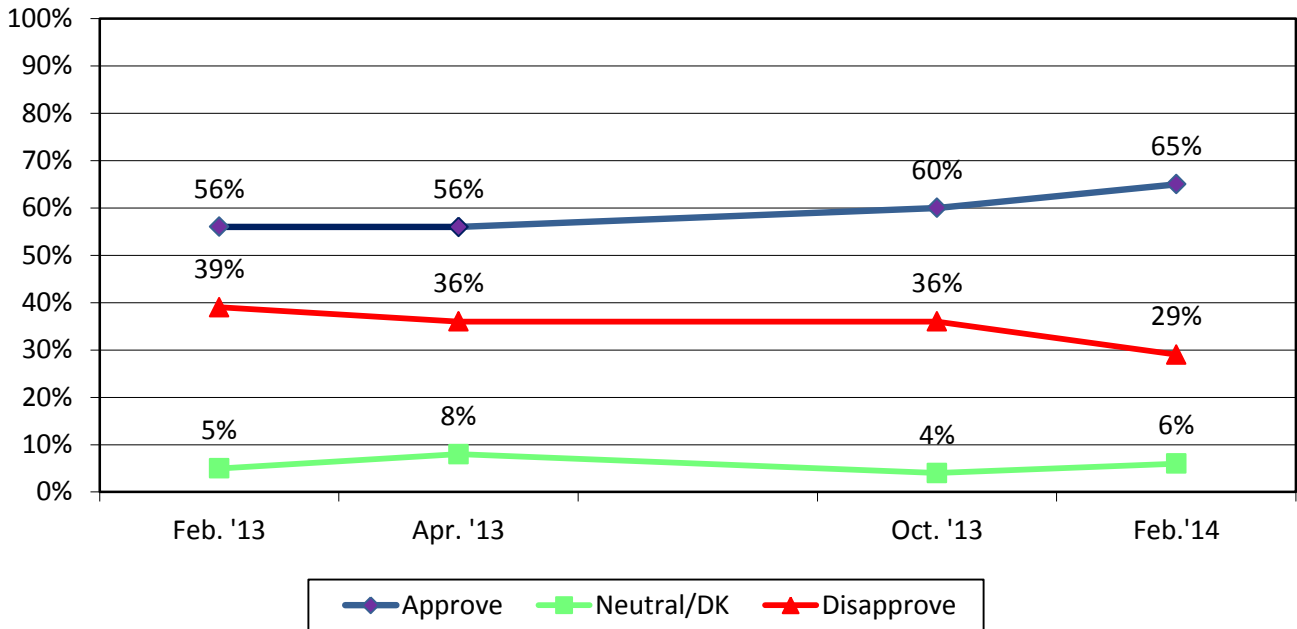

Approve Of Marijuana Sold At Licensed Outlets

If marijuana were legalized in the Granite State, nearly two-thirds (65%) of New Hampshire residents support the concept of selling of marijuana at licensed retail outlets and being taxed similar to alcohol, 29% oppose this idea, and 6% are unsure. Support for this idea has increased since February and April 2013, however in those polls residents were asked about marijuana being sold at state liquor stores.

Liberals are most likely to support this concept while older adults and conservatives are most likely to oppose.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and sixty-eight (568) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between January 28 and February 2, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.1 percent.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, age, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.

"If small amounts of marijuana were legalized for personal use in New Hampshire, would you approve or disapprove of marijuana being sold at licensed retail outlets (*In Feb-April 2013 "state liquor stores"*) and taxed at levels similar to alcohol or tobacco?"

Asked in October 2013 "The New Hampshire House is currently considering a bill that would make possession of small amounts of marijuana for personal recreational use legal. Retailers would be required to get a yearly license from the state in order to sell marijuana. The state would collect a 15 percent tax on all marijuana sales. Based on what you have heard would you support or oppose this bill?"
