TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Derry, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby instructed to meet at the Adams Memorial Building in said Town on the second Tuesday of March next, at Ten O'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To elect one selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Collector of Taxes, Library Trustees, Trustee of the Trust Funds, Auditors, and all other necessary town officials for the year ensuing.

2. To bring in your votes for the election of Delegates-at-large, Alternate Delegates-at-large, District Delegates, Alternate District Delegates to the National Conventions of the Republican and Democratic Parties, to be held for the purpose of nominating party candidates for President and Vice-President of the United States.

3. To vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools, maintenance of the poor, for laying out and repairing highways, for building and repairing bridges, for the maintenance of trunk line and state aid roads, for the suppression of moths, for the police department and municipal court, for hydrant service and electric lights, for salaries of town officials, for the Board of Health, for the expense of town halls, for the support of libraries, for payments to the sinking fund, for State and County taxes, for the use of Upton Post No. 45 G. A. R., for aid to the Derry Visiting Nurse Association, for co-operating with the State and Federal Governments in control of the white blister, and for all other necessary charges arising in said Town and pass any vote relating thereto.

4. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, and com-

mittees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the permanent improvement of highways in accordance with the provisions of Sec. 4, of Chapter 35 of the Laws of 1905 and any amendments thereto, and pass any vote relating thereto:

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to sprinkle or oil the streets and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of Chapter 117, Laws of 1917, on a section of the Derry-Raymond Road, so-called, and appropriate or set aside from the amount raised for highway work the sum of \$300.00 for this purpose, and pass any vote relating thereto.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of co-operating with the State in the construction of a portion of the Derry-Raymond Road, so-called, and pass any vote relating thereto.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes on the negotiable notes of the Town and pass any vote relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town will vote to accept a bequest under the will of Luella S. Parshley providing a sum of money for the care of her cemetery lot, and pass any vote relating thereto.

11. To take the sense of the voters as to a change in the layout of the Derry-Raymond Road in the Town of Derry, and pass any vote relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to appoint a committee to investigate the feasibility of establishing a town forest and make recommendations at the regular town

meeting in March, 1925, and pass any vote relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to be expended upon the Alexander Play Ground, and pass any vote relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will direct the Collector of Taxes to allow a discount to all persons paying their taxes within such period as the Town shall limit, to fix the rate of such discount, and pass any vote relating thereto.

15. To appoint any necessary committee on any article embraced in this warrant.

BOARD OF HEALTH REPORT

In the early months of 1923 Derry was visited by an epidemic of measles which resulted in there being nearly two hundred cases, beside many which were not reported. As far as known only one case of scarlet fever was reported, and three of diphtheria.

There were a few cases of whooping cough.

Many people seem to have little regard for the health of their own families and neighborhoods, and rather than be quarantined, or advised in regard to the care of infectious diseases, will refrain from reporting them.

This is particularly so in regard to measles and whooping cough, both of which make the patient more susceptible to worse trouble.

It cannot be, after all that has been written and taught concerning public health, that people are entirely ignorant of these matters.

The matter of a sewer system has again been looked into, and a survey made. It is hoped that an adequate system may soon be installed.

At present a meat inspector here is only authorized to inspect animals slaughtered in town. Consequently, there is no way of preventing the sale here of meat which is diseased and cannot be sold in the neighboring cities, owing to their inspection of imported meat, as well as that locally killed.

I think the town should wake up to the fact that it does not care to use meat that might be unhealthy, and should appropriate money to provide for proper inspection.

Report of Trustees of Public Library

The support and patronage of the people of Derry has enabled the library to continue its work for another year, which in interest and usefulness, we think, compares favorably with that of any previous year, as can be learned from the reports of our librarian and treasurer, whose continued efficiency in those positions none will question. As will be seen several new features have been added to the work of the library which tend to increase its interest and value. The trustees are grateful for the appreciation of our citizens as evident in the generously increased appropriation for its financial support which has been carefully used, and which we trust will be continued, as greatly increased expenses have to be incurred. The gift of \$500 by Mrs. Jennie McGregor, in memory of her mother, is also gratefully acknowledged, and has been well invested by the trustees of the town's trust funds, and a year's interest has been received and applied to the purchase of books as requested by Mrs. McGregor. Her example might well be followed by others whose interest in the library would thus be practically manifest.

When there are hard storms the rain finds its way into the library rooms causing damage to furniture, reading matter, walls and ceilings giving them an un-

sightly appearance. Repairs on the building, exterior and interior, are certainly much needed.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

To the Trustees of the Derry Public Library:

The 19th annual report for the year ending Jan. 31, 1924 is herewith presented.

The work of the Library has continued along similar lines as in past years. A few features stand out as especially worthy of note. During the summer the system of reserving books was established. By this means a person may request any book reserved for him and when the book next arrives in the library he is informed either by telephone or mail and given twenty-four hours in which to get the book. For this service he pays 2 cents. If he does not come for the book in the time specified it passes to the next in order or if there are no other requests into the regular channels of circulation. This service has been highly approved by those who have taken advantage of it and as others avail themselves of the privilege I believe it will continue to be satisfactory.

The vacation reading course was received with even greater enthusiasm in this its second season. 75 pupils entered the club and 32 completed the course of 10 prescribed books and received diplomas for good reading.

Children's Book Week was again observed and in addition to the exhibit of new books a poster contest added interest to the occasion. Pupils of the 6th, 7th, and 8th grades competed for cash prizes by making posters appropriate for Children's Book Week. Forty-two posters were received and exhibited at the Library, attracting much attention and receiving many favorable comments. The Derry Woman's Club at this time presented the library with a fine illustrated volume of "Peter Pan and Wendy" by Barrie. The Woman's Club also made it possible to have a Story hour Saturday afternoons from Children's Book Week until Christmas. This was held in the Court Room, the attendance ranging from 15 to 35.

Owing to the increased appropriation granted us a larger number of new books have been purchased than usual. It has also helped us to buy some more expensive books than otherwise we could have afforded. Among these are a four volume set by J. Arthur Thompson entitled "Outline of science", a new unabridged dictionary, Life and Letters of Walter H. Page in 2 volumes, some illustrated holiday editions of standard works and other fine editions. Eleven books were purchased with the interest from the "Sarah A. Gibson MacMurphy Fund" given by Mrs. Jennie MacMurphy and appropriately marked.

The circulation is slightly under last year's record, due to a decrease the early part of the year. The last three months have however shown large increases. The percentage of non-fiction loaned is larger than ever before which is gratifying as I feel it shows the Library is meeting the educational needs of the community as well as the recreational.

Your Librarian attended the annual meeting of the N. H. Library Association, also conducted a class in Book repairing and Library Economics at the Library Summer School held at the State University, Durham.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Derry School Board:—

It gives me pleasure to present to you my fourth annual report of the schools of Derry. Derry has always been active educationally. From the very first beginning of the town education has been the most significant factor in the town's activities, as evidenced by the early town reports. The people hold the Board of Education to a high degree of responsibility in educational matters and not only pride themselves on the past educational achievements but they jealously guard the preservation of these standards. It is accordingly a great privilege to work with such a community and such a School Board.

The subject matter and methods used in school work are matters of common knowledge to all people. All people are ready to comment on them and are likely to draw the conclusion that the type of education they received is the type all should receive except in special cases.

On the other hand the limited cycle of existence and scope of an individual's activity leads every one to feel the importance of doing a little better by the future generation and of giving every child a fair chance to find himself and his occupational level. Such a course of procedure works, not only to the advantage of the child, but to the economic advantage of the community. In short the schools should have the responsibility of finding the child whose earning capacity by traditional methods of education would normally be \$1,500 per year when such a child, by a fuller exposure to some of the major activities of life and the finding of a higher level of occupation, would be capable of earning \$5,000 or more per year.

MANUAL TRAINING

Manual training, as such, has become obsolete as a subject to teach. It is too formal in character and but little related to the occupational needs of children. Dr. Brewer, an expert in vocational guidance at Harvard, says, "if over half our workers are to enter agricultural callings, must there not be a radical expansion of exercises related to those occupations and should we not, through industrial and agricultural arts give the child an exposure to the major activities of life? The work of the school should be to offer worthy and appropriate samples of life activities by means of which we may discover the abilities of children. Such projects should reveal to the child his aptituded interests and accomplishments and discover his value to himself and others."

Such courses are called tryout courses. In our own system of schools, we may give the boys and girls, without great expense, sampling exercises such as soldering, printing, pipe fitting, varnishing, jewelry making, clay products, cooking, cement work, caring for animals, carpentry, machine work, sewing, gardening, janitor work, general repairs, home mechanics, electric wiring, painting and house-keeping.

METHOD OF SUPERVISION

The same method of supervision has been employed. Evaluations of the results secured in the instruction have been made. The necessity of emphasizing a particular subject or phase of school work is based upon the character of the results secured.

Tests have been given in reading, writing, spelling and elementary number work, or the fundamentals, and in history, geography, arithmetic, English and grammar for the content values.

An interesting examination in spelling and arithmetic, issued by the State Board of Education, was given to the eighth grade in October being the same examination that was given at Springfield in 1846.

The results are summarized below. The inferences that may be drawn are obvious. The work of city, village graded and rural schools comes in direct comparison.

Dr. Newell, Dr. Coggsell and Dr. Barker assisted by the School Nurse, Mrs. Elizabeth Davey have made the usual examinations of the children except at Oak Street which will be done as soon as the weather is mild enough to use the clinic room.

This year's record compared with last year's indicates that good progress is being made in the health department. The smaller number of cases of malnutrition recorded is due to the adoption of a different method of diagnosis.

Follow up work is planned in dentistry as well as the other defects enumerated. Thirty applications have already been made for a dental clinic. The Rockingham Farm Bureau has promised to send the clinic about April first.

A CO-OPERATIVE POLICY

It is the policy of this department to foster all of the contacts possible between the schools and the public and among the different teaching units. Such a policy provides better articulation and co-ordination as the pupils pass from grade to grade and unit to unit.

In the teachers meetings ample opportunities are afforded for the teachers to raise problems and express their opinions. The development of novel methods and experimental work of a practical and constructive nature is fostered.

Co-operation in the administration and supervision of the schools is a safe and sane method of securing the greatest amount of development and growth. It is not meant by this statement that co-operation is of an optional nature to be exercised or not according to the inclination of the teacher, but it is a responsibility located so as to insure the production of results. Without the imposition of responsibility for results being located as a part of a co-operative policy the general results are apt to be poor.

It is a characteristic of the day for every one to feel free to participate in public affairs in a democratic manner. When a sufficient number of citizens take a constructive attitude of this nature toward the schools, the schools are bound to prosper. The democracy fails however when the people refuse to co-operate.

If our co-operative plan is to function properly the teachers of the elementary, junior and high schools should actually co-operate. The high school teachers should visit the junior schools, become acquainted with the pupils, find out if they are fitted properly for the courses offered. They should see if there are not some pupils who would profit by special courses of a type not now offered. Such a plan would make the high school work articulate better with the junior schools.

Some of the problems the teachers of these schools may raise relate to the necessity of a greater flexibility in the course of study. Would an examination of the educational quotients of each child disclose marked individual differences in the pupils? Is there necessity of providing material for the motor minded child as well

as the abstract minded child? Should we have a minimum course of study for those who make slow progress and a maximum course of study for those who make rapid progress? Is the problem of freedom for the pupil and teacher a problem common to both the high school teacher and the grade teacher?

These are only a few samples of the problems we have on hand for solution. The assistance of all teachers is solicited and the advice of any parent or citizen will be appreciated by the teachers, superintendent and school board.

Such advice has already been solicited of the Trustees of the Academy and any suggestions they may have to offer relative to the improvement of our school system as a whole will be greatly appreciated.

Some one is responsible for the solution of these problems. If it is a co-operative process of solution the price of the solution is your time and your thought, the time and thought of the school teachers and the time and thought of the School Board and Trustees.

In conclusion I wish to express to the School Board my appreciation of their generous assistance and spirit of helpfulness in conducting the work of the schools.


