To the inhabitants of the Town of Conway qualified to vote in town affairs, your are hereby notified to meet at the Town House at Center Conway, N. H., March 11, 1930, at 8:30 a. m., to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers.

ART. 2. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes:

Section A. Town officers' salaries.

B. Town officers' expenses.

C. Election and registration.

D. Municipal court.

E. Town Hall and office expense.

F. Police department.

G. Fire department.

H. Breaking roads.

I. Health department.

J. Vital statistics.

K. Trunk line maintenance.

L. Town maintenance.

M. Libraries.

N. Town poor.

O. Memorial Day.

P. Parks and playgrounds.

Q. Interest.

R. Tarvia maintenance.

S. Damage and legal expense.

T. Auto permit expense.

U. State tax.

V. County tax.

W. Memorial Hospital.

ART. 3. To see what action the Town will take in regard to discounting taxes.

- ART. 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the blank inventories at the time they examine and appraise the property to be taxed.
- ART. 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire upon the credit of the Town the sum of \$60,000, if needed.
- ART. 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to obtain State aid for the permanent improvement of its highways as provided by law.
- ART. 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or appropriate and hire a sufficient sum of money to put in condition and tarvia Mill Street in village of Center Conway, commencing at the junction of Main Street and extending to the junction of Davis Hill road.
- ART. 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to grade and tarvia Wilder Street and Chase Ave., in Conway Village, agreeably to a petition signed by James F. Drown and others, and recommended by budget committee.
- ART. 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to build a bridge to accommodate public travel at Conway village across the East Branch of Pequaket Stream at the junction of land of Dr. C. M. Wiggin and Fred A. Towle and lay out a new street from the south side of Main Street along or near said junction across said bridge to the east side of Quint Street, so called. Agreeably to petition signed by Fred E. White and others.
- ART. 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000), to prepare and tarvia the road from Main Street in North Conway, N. H., across Saco River to the residence of Judge Chester W. Barrows. Agreeably to petition signed by Arthur O. Lucy and others.

- ART. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250 to prepare and tarvia Mechanic Street, North Conway, N. H., from the foot of Mechanic Hill, so called, to Kearsarge road, agreeably to a petition signed by Andrew J. Meikle and others and recommended by budget committee.
- ART. 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to repair and tarvia Seavey Street, North Conway from Warren's Drug store to residence of W. A. Currier. Agreeably to petition signed by Fred G. Leighton and others, and recommended by budget committee.
- ART. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to repair and tarvia Grove Street in North Conway Village, from Main Street to the M. C. R. R. Agreebly to petition signed by W. S. Mayo and others.
- ART. 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to tarvia Oak Street, North Conway. Agreeably to petition signed by George A. Farnham and others.
- ART. 15. To see what sum of money, not to exceed \$75.00, the Town will raise and appropriate for the repairs of highway leading from West Side road, near Lucy Farm, to Diana's Bath, so called, in Town of Conway, and instruct highway agent to lay out same, and to break road in winter. Agreeably to petition signed by Henry J. Hatch and others.
- ART. 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to repair and tarvia Kennett Street, Conway. Agreeably to petition signed by John P. Seery and others.
- ART. 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum to widen and tar Oak Street, Conway. Agreeably to petition signed by Chester C. Russell and others.

- ART. 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00, for a suitable memorial to the World War Soldiers of Redstone. Agreeably to petition signed by Ralph L. Crockett and others.
- ART. 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000, to rubble the north side of Saco River near Smith's Bridge. Agreeably to suggestion of budget committee.
- ART. 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$500, to repair Mill Brook Bridge, Conway Village. Agreeably to suggestion of budget committee.
- ART. 21. To see what action the Town will take in regard to buying land and building a building to house trucks and equipment and raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to carry this article into effect. Agreeably to suggestion of budget committee.
- ART. 22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay on Town debt.
- ART. 23. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the Citizens of Conway:

Since the last report was given of the Conway Public Library, several outstanding improvements have been made. The stack room has been redecorated and the floor refinished, similar repairs have been made in the librarian's office. A new light has been installed on the book table and minor repairs made to the building.

As regards books, the Duplicate Pay System has provided sixty volumes of modern fiction. A most worthwhile collection of two hundred and fifty books including standard literature, poetry, drama, history and travel was presented to the library by Mrs. Julia Webster in memory of Harriet O. Thoms. Miss Marion Goulding gave twenty-five volumes for the juvenile book shelves. Several of the townspeople and summer guests have given money for the purchase of books. At Christmas, Mr. Eastman of Pasedena, California, sent One Hundred Dollars for the purchase

of books. The Conway Woman's Club sponsored a summer reading course for the children of the grammar grades and gave suitable awards to the winners of this group.

This winter on Wednesday afternoons a Boys' Book Club meets at the Library under the supervision of Arthur W. Evans, Director of Camp Wonalancet. That this club might be of more value to the boys, Mr. S. A. Everitt, of Garden City, N. Y., added to the juvenile book section a generous collection of worthwhile books.

The Library at Center Conway has also had a prosperous year. H. S. Chadbourne, Mrs. Comstock, Mrs. J. H. Garland, and Mrs. C. N. Trundy have given valuable books to the library. Mrs. Comstock also gave money for the purchase of books. At the Conway Center Library there is need for recataloguing of the books. Many of the books are worn out past repair, and it would appear an economy to purchase a reprint of these books rather than attempt to rebind them. This means an additional sum of money for the Center Conway Library.

The brief report of our town libraries shows that a bigger and better service is each year being given, and it is the desire of the Conway Library Trustees that this service may be considerably increased in 1930.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

School Board of Conway:

The length of the school year is by law thirty-six weeks. A school week has five days and consequently the length of the school year is 180 days. If schools are in session for thirty-six calendar weeks only, the losses for holidays and other no-school days give us a school year of 34 or 35 weeks. We are therefore making our contracts not for a specified number of calendar weeks, but for a school year of 180 teaching days. Last year we did not quite attain this ideal but we did secure a total of 177 days in the high school and 176 days in the elementary schools. This year we shall do better.

During the past summer we completed the shingling of the school house at Center Conway. The interior of the grammar school at Conway has been completely renovated, and at the North Conway school the halls and one room were painted. A ventilating stove was installed at West Side and is a great improvement over the old arrangements. It was found necessary also to retube the boiler at North Conway and to lay a new floor in the gymnasium of the high school. These last two jobs were not foreseen but had to be done.

The school houses of the district are insured for \$127,500. In addition to the usual estimates for minor repairs, an adequate sum should be annually appropriated for special repairs. This is better business than to let property deteriorate to a point where extensive repairs must be made.

There were eight teacher-changes at the beginning of the year. This is a higher percentage of turnover than we expect as an average. On the other hand only one teacher-change was necessary during the year which is a desirable record. This year unfortunately we have had some mid-year changes on account of resignations.

A very interesting innovation was made at the Conway grammar school which was possible on account of an extra unused room. The four upper grades are in some respects organized as one school and the two teachers do departmental work. As Mr. Lawler and Miss Kimball have had specialized training for junior high school work, the plan has been successful. Just before the Christmas vacation it was decided on account of the unusually large number of pupils in these grades, that we employ a helping teacher for the remainder of the year.

I have always believed that a high school teaching staff should represent different points of view and modes of thought acquired in different training schools. In our present high school corps we have representatives of these institutions: University of Maine, Bates, Radcliffe, University of New Hampshire, Keene normal school, Plymouth normal school and Salem normal school.

I have noted in particular this year that the Kennett high school is in practice a two-session school. A large percentage of the pupils take part in the extracurricular activities of the afternoon. Our present view of education is that these socialized activities are as valuable a part of school as the formal discipline of the class room.

Unfortunately many of the pupils who stay over for the afternoon provide themselves with an inadequate or an improper mid-day lunch. It is very desirable that some agency under school supervision should undertake to furnish proper food at a reasonable price and that the authority of the school be exercised if necessary to insure that those who remain for the afternoon are not made unfit for work by inattention to the need of a wholesome mid-day meal.

It has been truly said that a good janitor is worth

as much to a school as a good teacher. In the death of William Sargent on January 6 we lost a faithful and loyal employee. In his long years of service Mr. Sargent never lost a day nor failed to do his job as it should be done. He was a favorite with the children and commanded the respect of his employers.

A great deal of information will be found in the tables appended to this report, and in the reports of the headmaster and of the nurse.

#### REPORT OF THE HEADMASTER

Superintendent John H. Fuller:

In compliance with your request I am submitting a statistical summary of the past year's work at Kennett High School. I believe that it has been a year of progress, and that the town of Conway has every reason to be proud of her young folk and their institutions.

The registration for the year has been 167, 92 boys and 75 girls, a very unusual distribution. In classes there were at the beginning of the year 4 post graduates, 24 seniors, 30 juniors, 62 sophomores, and 49 freshmen. We have lost 16 members: 1 senior, 3 juniors, 4 sophomores, and 8 freshmen; of whom 4 have transferred to other schools, while 3 left because of illness. The other 9 have left on account of lack of interest, scholastic difficulties, or to seek employment.

A number of pupils facing need for more credits toward graduation, or because of ability and ambition, are registered for more than four courses, i. e. 16 boys and 8 girls. There are a few registered for only 3 subjects for varying reasons.

The above table shows that the greater part of our failures occur during the first two years. This is to be expected, since the first year is one of adjustment, and since it is in these years that we find the majority of those pupils who fail persistently. These latter seldom accumulate sufficient credits to enter the upper grades before they drop out of school.

Our honor list is based upon certificate grade, 85%, which is not difficult to attain by the diligent student, in some one or two courses. However, when it is the average of all courses, or when it is exceeded in four or even five courses, it becomes a real achievement. Theory would place the ideal number of failing and honor students at approximately the same number. I should judge that our failures exceed our high honors, but not greatly. We are weeding out the persistent failures by suspension, and hope to see results reflected in general work of the student body.

I believe that few people realize the magnitude of the financial problem concerned with supporting our student activities. I offer a tabulation of expenses of 1928-1929.

There seems to be some misunderstanding in regard to the function of the Kennett High School Athletic Association. Indirectly I have heard that we emphasize athletics to too great an extent. It is, of course, true that our competitive sports do consume a great deal of our time and financial energy. I believe our teams are as safely and attractively equipped as any in the state, and I am sure none would have it otherwise. It is true that winning teams alone, and those only when composed of boys, can expect to pay expenses. One notable exception was our football team of last fall, which finished with a credit balance of about \$50.

All activities cost money to run, and the expense must be met whether we win or lose. In fact a losing team should be rather better equipped than a winning one, both from the psychological and the physical demands of the game. Some of the expenses borne by the Athletic Association during the past six years have been outside of competitive athletics. These figures are given in round numbers as follows:

### REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

John H. Fuller, Superintendent of Schools:

The number of children receiving the routine examination this year was five hundred and eighty-three, with about the usual number of defects found.

A great deal of dental work was done during the 1928-1929 school year and summer vacation, but there is much more to be done. In one room, of two grades and about forty-five children, eighty-six corrections were made, including testing of eyes and correction of vision, care of teeth and removal of tonsils and adenoids.

Only a small percentage of children are ten per cent or more underweight, and these are due to family tendency in most cases.

We hope, with the aid of moving pictures, to call special attention of parents as well as of children to correct posture, means of prevention of communicable diseases and care of the teeth.

With the exception of seven, who have been tem-

porarily excused by the Board of Health, all of our children have been vaccinated, so that in case of small pox exposure they are splendidly protected. But, I regret to say not more than sixty per cent are protected against the most deadly of all the diseases to which they are apt to be exposed, diphtheria.

Later in the year, Toxin Anti-Toxin clinics will be held, and I hope that when the series of three treatments are completed we can say that every parent or guardian has done his or her part in protecting their community.
