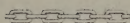

## TOWN WARRANT

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Derry, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby instructed to meet at the Adams Memorial Building in said Town on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To elect one selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Collector of Taxes, Library Trustees, Trustees of the Trust Funds, Auditors, and all other necessary Town officials for the year ensuing.

2. To vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools, maintenance of the poor, for laying out and repairing highways, for building and repairing bridges, for the maintenance of trunk line and state aid roads for the suppression of moths, for the police department and municipal court, for hydrant service and electric lights, for salaries of town officials, for the Board of Health, for the expense of town halls, for the support of libraries, for payments to the sinking fund, for state and county taxes, for the use of Upton Post, No. 45, G. A. R. for aid to the Derry Visiting Nurse Association, for play ground purposes, for cooperating with the state and federal governments in control of the white pine blister and for all other necessary charges arising in said Town and pass any vote relating thereto.

3. To hear the reports of agents, auditors and

committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to sprinkle or oil the streets and pass any vote relating thereto.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of co-operating with the State in the construction of a portion of the Derry-Raymond Road, and pass any vote relating thereto.

6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes on the negotiable notes of the Town and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To see if the Town will direct the Collector of Taxes to allow a discount to all persons paying their taxes within such period as the Town shall limit, to fix the rate of such discount, and pass any vote relating thereto.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of eight hundred dollars for the purpose of repaying a loan of that amount to Mrs. Henry F. McGregor, said loan being made for the purpose of constructing a drain through McGregor Park, and pass any vote relating thereto.

9. To see if the Town will vote to accept from Frederick W. Poor, sufficient land on which to construct a highway which will eliminate the dangerous curve now existing on the East Derry Road, between his home and that of Frank Dumont, and pass any vote relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the highway known as the King Hill Road leading from

the residence of Frank W. Bean Northerly to the Londonderry line near the Goat Farm so-called, and pass any vote relating thereto.

11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and instruct the Board of Selectmen and Road Agent in the removal of snow from the highways, to leave a proper and sufficient amount thereon to permit of the hauling on runners or sled, of lumber, wood, farm products, and the like, and pass any vote relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to exempt the Tileston-James Shoe Company from local taxation upon its machinery and stock in trade for a period of five years and pass any vote relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to exempt the new factory building of the Derry Associates from local taxation for a period of five years and pass any vote relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will vote to exempt from local taxation for a period of five years a new factory building which may be erected by the Derry Associates on Crystal Avenue in said Town and pass any vote relating thereto.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of refurnishing the Court-room and two small rooms connected therewith and pass any vote relating thereto.

16. To see if the Town will vote to exempt from local taxation for a period of five years the buildings, machinery and merchandise of the Derry Toy Manufacturing Company and pass any vote relating thereto.

17. To see if the Town will vote to erect a Memorial



Building in memory of its citizens who have seen service in any war; to raise and appropriate money therefor, and pass any vote relating thereto.

18. To see if the Town will vote to issue serial notes or bonds of the Town to an amount not exceeding thirty thousand dollars for the purpose of erecting a Memorial Building for its ex-service men and women; to fix the kind and denomination of such bonds or notes; the time and place of payment, the rate of interest, and the time when such interest shall be paid, and the manner of payment, all to be done in accordance with the provisions of the Statutes of New Hampshire, and pass any vote relating thereto.

19. To appoint any necessary committee on any article embraced in this warrant.

## BOARD OF HEALTH

The Board of Health wishes to report a general healthy condition in Town. We have, the past year, had cases of scarlet fever and other infectious diseases, but they were quickly eased for with no loss of life. Our clinics have examined many children and they have been examined for their general health and many have been treated both surgically and with medicine and a great improvement and restored health in many cases has been the happy result.

The question of sewerage is not what it should be. There are many "cess pools" that are source of trouble to the tenant and property owner and it is impossible in many cases to keep them from causing trouble by overflowing and contaminating the ground surrounding them and making a dangerous field for the growth of bacteria. The open drain and sink spout, emptying upon the ground is in strict violation of State Law and all are cautioned to empty them only under ground. The habit of spitting in Public Buildings and on Sidewalks is to be severally condemned and all must be cautious and not continue in that habit. The time is not far distant I hope when the Town will vote to construct a sewerage system and all will be obliged to connect. We certainly will, soon in my opinion face a serious condition if we do not act in the matter. The Health Board wishes to thank all for their hearty co-operation in matters pertaining to this department.

The fact that its many facilities have been appreciated, is by the greater number of grown people who make use of the pleasant reading rooms. And that the students find the new quarters much more convenient is a self evident fact; also it is very unusual not to find the childrens' room well filled.

The basement is put to a good use by the local band boys, who are using it for rehearsals every Wednesday evening after the closing of the library.

It has been necessary to erect a covering over the rear entrance to prevent the water and snow from entering the basement; also to give the floor a coat of varnish. In order to keep the building in a creditable condition, and a source of pride to the townspeople, certain minor repairs will have to be made each year.

Our thanks are due Miss Lillian B. Peor for the kindergarten table and chairs which have added greatly to the childrens' room, and to Mrs. George H. How for a fernery which was much needed; also to all those who have so kindly contributed reading matter. All the articles of furniture which have been donated are now marked with suitable inscriptions. The local papers have been most generous in allowing us the use of their columns.

## LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

February 1, 1928

To the Trustees of the Derry Public Library:

The 23rd annual report is herewith presented:

The first year in our new library building has been a busy one. It has in many ways been a year of readjustment. New patrons have come to us who seldom had used the library in its old quarters and others have not found the new location so conveniently situated and have discontinued their patronage. A special room for the children containing about 1800 books suitable for their use through the grades has caused new regulations to which some of the children at first found it hard to adjust themselves. New arrangements of the stacks made it difficult for the public to locate a desired book or author without the assistance of the one at the desk. But our many benefits have greatly overbalanced the minor difficulties. Discipline, one of the hard parts of the work in the former location has greatly improved. We are not so much bothered by the roving groups of boys who used to wander in and out of the rooms looking for amusement. We now have a special table and more room for the reference student where he can work under better conditions. With larger rooms there is less confusion and the library work is carried on with less friction.

The circulation has remained practically the same. Last year we reported the highest circulation ever reached and for the entire twelve months, this year's circulation has varied only 25 volumes. In a recent library periodical it was stated that a model town library should have "An income of \$1.00 per capita (minimum).

One assistant for every 20,000 books circulated.

A circulation of 5 books per capita of population.”

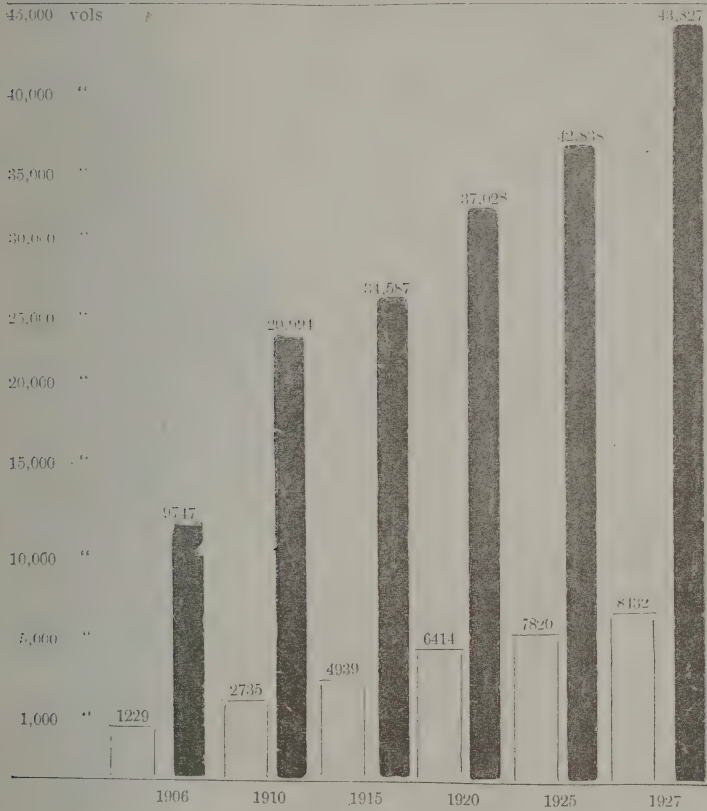
Our library has neither the minimum income considered necessary, nor the assistance that is thought should be required but we have had a circulation of 43,827 volumes which is 60 per cent greater than the model library” it being 8 books per capita, which record has been maintained for the past four years.

We have received during the year several gifts which have added to the usefulness and beauty of the library rooms. Foremost among these was the gift of Miss Lillian B. Poore, of a table and four chairs for the children's room. These are suitable for the smallest children and were made to order to match in style and material the other furniture of the room. Miss Poore also has given during the year twenty new children's books for the youngest readers. Your own gift as Trustee of the Library, of the fireplace frames has added to the charm and convenience of the fireplace. Mrs. George A. Howe, the assistant librarian for 16 years has given a fernery which has been kept full of growing plants and has been greatly admired.

There has also been many gifts of books, especially appreciated was the gift by the Linn's Club; also several lots from Mrs. G. H. Hood which included some of the recent fiction.

There have been added by purchase a larger number of new books than for some years back. These additions must continue to increase if the net gain is to increase, for we are continually having to discard many books which our large circulation rapidly wears out.

A vacation reading Club was conducted among the school children during the summer months and in September it was my privilege to give certificates to 42 children for reading ten or more books from a prescribed list.

Children's Book Week was observed in November. There were about 80 new children's books added to our collection and the children were enlisted in a poster contest, the prizes for which were awarded to Lucy Boisvert, Norman Rogers, Martha Ross, Helen



Blanchard, and Henry T. Wheeler, Jr. It is our endeavor to co-operate with the schools in all possible ways and in this many of the school teachers have assisted to the betterment of both institutions.

On Sept. 29th, we entertained 30 neighboring librarians and trustees representing 13 libraries. A profitable afternoon was spent meeting these interested in the library profession and discussing mutual interests.

In June your librarian attended for the second time the sessions of the American Library Association where were gathered Librarians from all parts of this country and Canada. These were held for one week at Toronto, Ontario, The University of Toronto acting as hosts. It was a week that will be long remembered and I trust the inspiration received will be of lasting value to the work in Derry. She also attended the New Hampshire Library Association in the new library at New London.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see if the district will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the school board in its annual report.

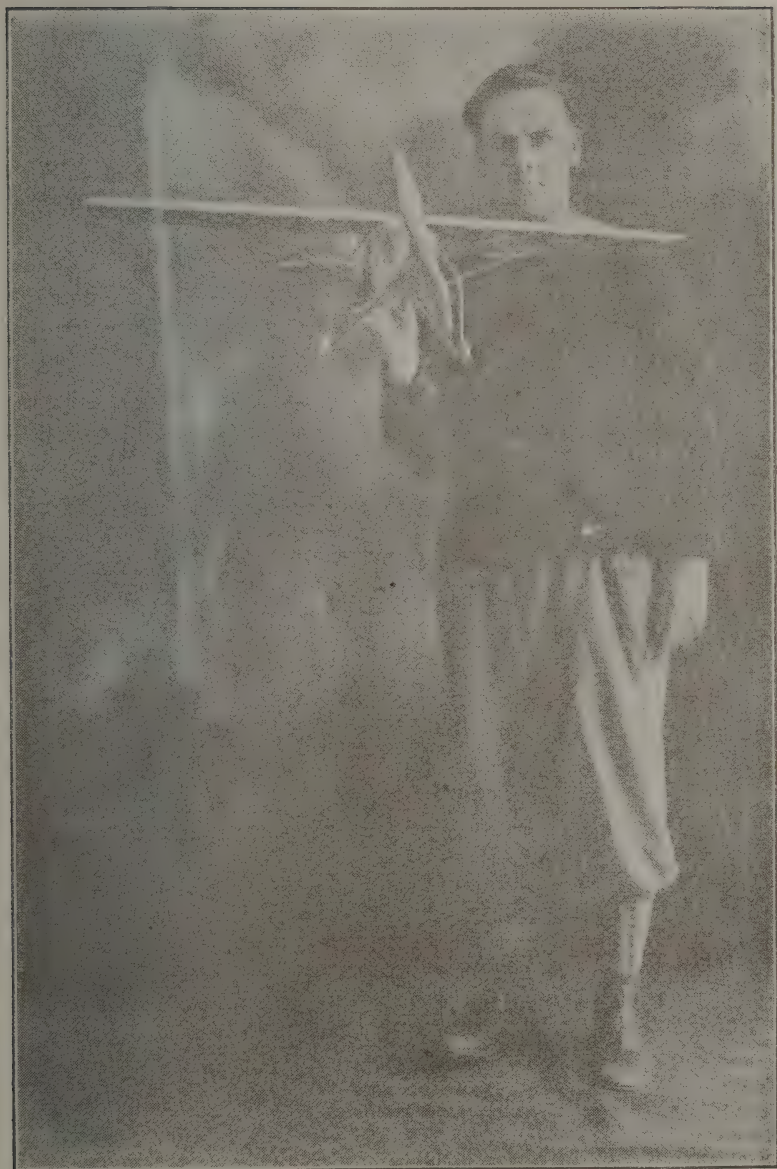
## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Derry School Boards:

I take pleasure in presenting to you my eighth annual report. The teachers and superintendent are making a sustained effort to continue the aims of education along the lines of the natural development and growth of the child. We take the child where he is, guide him by the best available methods to maximum power in intercourse, and give him the opportunity to understand and take part in the progress of society. In order to accomplish these aims we are bringing as many life experiences to the school as possible. When diminishing returns upon projects brought to the school forbids their use, we undertake the organization of projects that carry the school out into life after the necessary work.

### Retardation in the Grades

A full discussion of retardation in the grades was printed in last year's report. Two years ago, an analysis was made of the number of pupils moving in and out of town. Some years as many as twenty-five percent of the school population has moved either in or out of town. Children who move from one place to another contribute more frequently than others to the retarded children in our grades.

A special teacher has been employed the past two years to deal with this problem. It is interesting to note from a study of the age grade table that this type of instruction is having its effect in reducing the amount of retardation. In constructing this year's age grade table, nineteen cases were noted that had been brought up to grade during the present year. Comparing last year's age grade table with this year's it is noted that retardation has been reduced from 35.67 per cent to 29.33 per cent or approximately 5 per cent. This is the largest reduction we have had in any one year. Theoretically our retardation should be below 20 per cent. This theoretical standard we cannot hope to achieve with so many children moving in and out of town. It is hoped, by a program of diagnosis of the special disabilities children suffer early in school life and by testing generally in the grades to ascertain the instructional needs of the children, to keep the amount of retardation well below 30 per cent. The instruction that is now being given both by the special teacher and the teachers in general, is praiseworthy.

#### Teachers

Eight teachers attended summer school. Three attended Keene Normal School, one Gorham Normal School, one Fitchburg Normal, one in Paris and one

at Harvard. The attendance at summer normal school has been good the past few years. Many teachers attend not merely to comply with the school ruling but upon their own initiative.

There were only three changes in the teaching force. Their places were filled by Miss Evelyn Thereau of Plymouth Normal School, Miss Lucille Nevers of Salem Normal School and Miss Mildred Stratton of Keene Normal School.

### Measurements

Measurements have been made to ascertain the difference between the progress of rural school children and the children of urban schools. The achievement of the pupils was determined by a power test given last November in spelling, reading, arithmetic, history fundamentals, history thought, geography fundamentals, geography thought, arithmetic fundamentals and arithmetic problems. The progress that the children make will be determined by making another test in the spring. The difference between the Spring tests and the Fall tests will show the gain in achievement on the part of the pupils or the progress that the pupils have made.

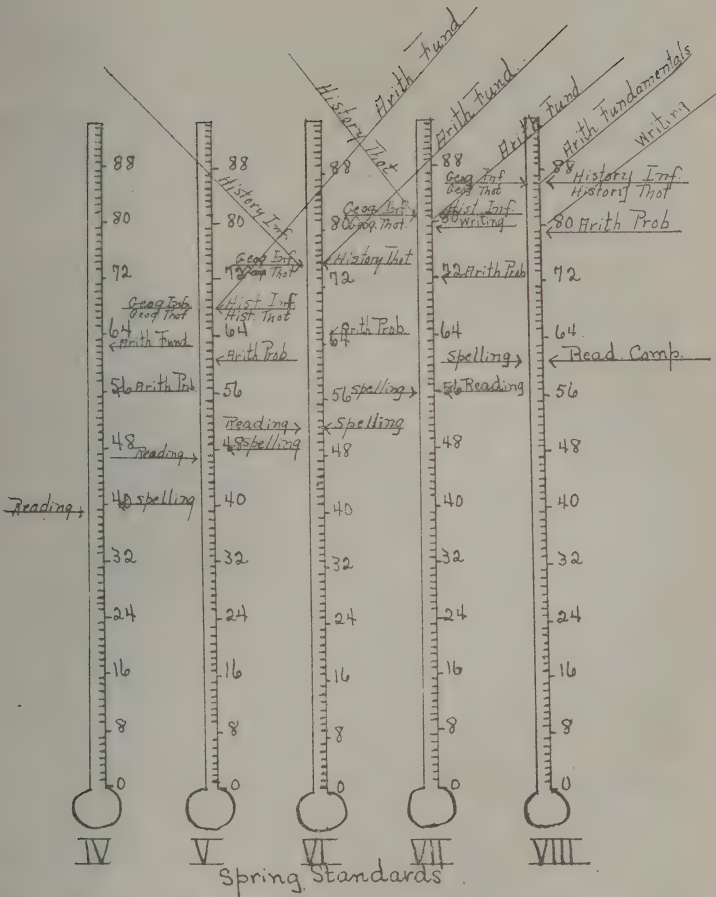
In order that a fair comparison of the progress made by rural and urban children may be made, an equal number of children having the same achievement power or mental age have been selected from the third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth grades. The side increasing its score most will be the winner in the contest.

The tests made last Fall, indicate that the rural school children are holding up to as high a level of achievement as the urban children in nearly all subjects. In some subjects, notably spelling, the rural

school pupils excelled the pupils in single grades. I attribute the success of these pupils, who are handicapped by a less fertile environment, (they have less books, less supplies, less equipment, less conveniences than the urban children) to a well organized course of study, frequent checking of the progress of the children by tests and the report card and the presence of character qualities such as persistence and industry which rural life fosters. None of this progress could have been achieved without the guidance of skilled teaching.

To those who are in doubt about the validity of the tests given the children last Fall and at other times to determine the progress of the children through the grades, I would call attention to the chart below which shows the standards required for the children to comply with in each grade. The thermometer is utilized for the purpose of comparing the achievements of the pupils in several of the fundamental subjects, arithmetic, spelling, reading, history, and geography. A thermometer is shown for the third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth grades. The heights indicated upon the thermometer show what score the child should achieve next spring when the test is given. Thus in arithmetic fundamentals, the third grade child should score 49, the fourth grade child 56, the fifth grade child 60, the sixth grade child 64, and the seventh grade child 72, and the eighth grade child 78. In like manner the other subjects and their several standards, in the grades mentioned above, are noted upon the thermometers. Those interested may study the details of the other subjects for themselves.





Frequently teachers make educational thermometers either on charts or blackboards. These charts enable the pupils to compare their marks with the grade standards and thus determine their several standings in the grades. Much rivalry may be developed between pupils of the same and different schools through the use of these charts.

#### Health

The school nurse reports that the customary measurements for sight, hearing and weight have been made. The heart and lungs of each child has been tested. The local physicians, Dr. Ralph Barker, Dr. Walter Sanders, Dr. J. C. Tappan and Dr. Samuel Cogswell and Dr. Frank B. Perkins gave their services free of charge in completing the examinations for diseases and physical defects.

One hundred and ninety one children were under weight. All of these have been examined by a specialist, Dr. Kerr of Manchester, in the underweight clinic. Fifty-six children have been operated upon for tonsils and adenoids. A number of cardiac cases have been found. Cardiac trouble is often due to defective teeth and tonsils. Parents should see to it that the defects noted upon the cards are corrected.

The Derry Woman's Club is sponser for the milk clinic in the urban schools during the winter months. The recent entertainment for the benefit of this clinic was largely attended. Approximtaely one hundred and twenty-five bottles of milk are served each day to school children.

Hot lunches are served in the rural schools. The sanitation and health of the rural school children are receiving equally as much attention as in the urban schools.

Several children have been taken to Dr. Jones' Clinic in Manchester for orthopedic work.

A clinic to administer the Schick test, which will determine whether those children who took the toxin antitoxin treatment one year ago are now immune from diphtheria, will be held soon.

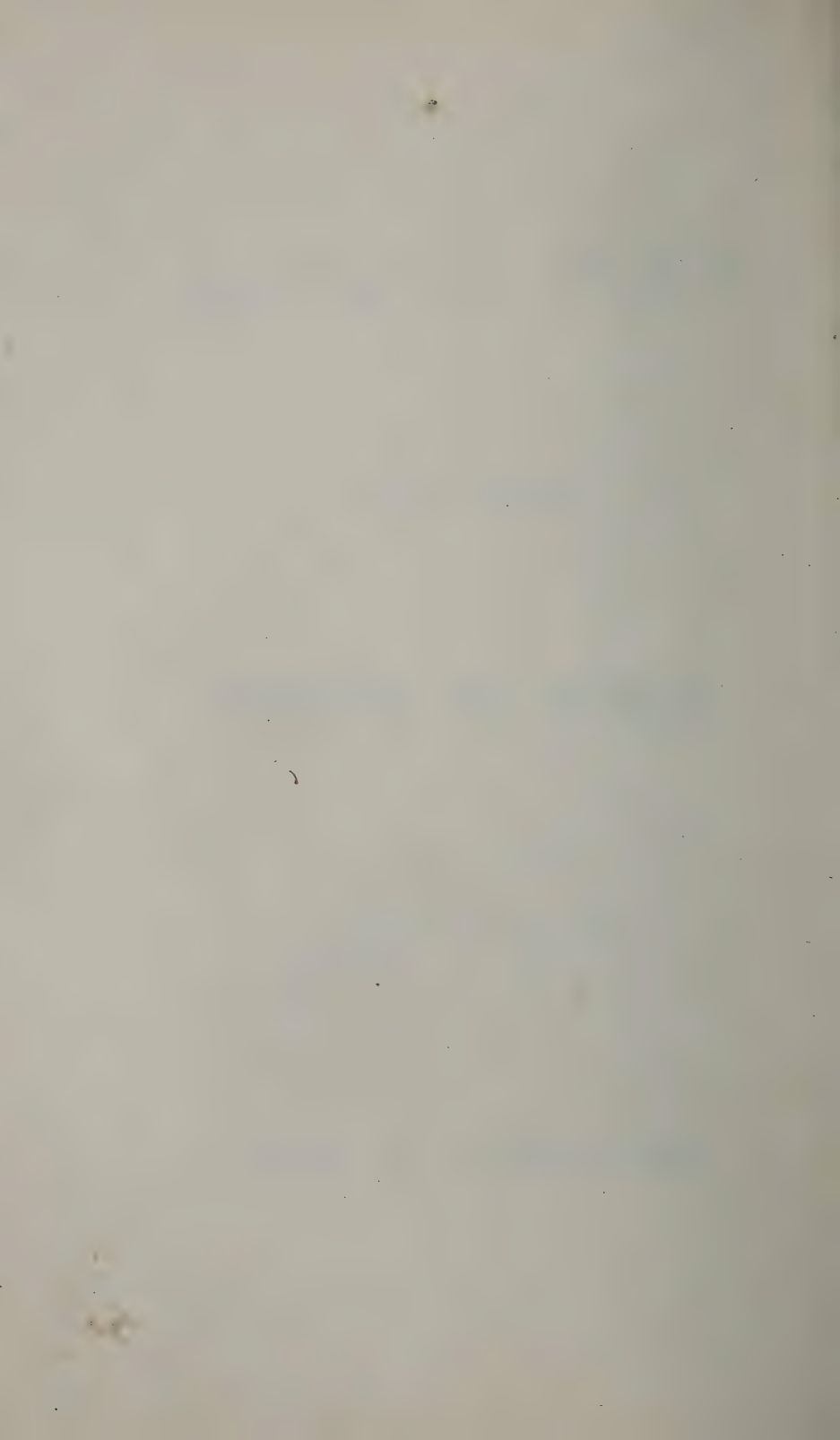
