Winston A. Wright

January 15, 1937 – October 9, 2022

Dedication

This year's town report is dedicated to Winston A. "Win" Wright, who passed away on Sunday, October 9, 2022. Win was a longtime community servant and friend to many. His parents, Ray A. and Abbie F. (Crane) Wright, welcomed their son into the world on January 15, 1937, in Keene, NH. He grew up in Keene and was a 1955 graduate of Keene High School.

Winston attended Orange Coast College receiving an Associate Degree in the Arts. He later received a Bachelor Degree in Education from Keene Teachers College and his Master's Degree in Education from Fitchburg State. He was an educator in the middle school system in Winchendon, Massachusetts for 33 years and also served as Assistant Principal. His students cherished Mr. Wright as their teacher. Win will be remembered for his selfless dedication to his community, protecting many as a member of the Fitzwilliam Fire Department, beginning his fire service career in 1960, moving through the ranks to Sr. Captain and later as Chief. He also served as a member and Assistant Chief of the Meadowood Fire Department.

Of the many accolades for Win; he was one of the first to obtain the level of EMT in Southwestern NH in the early 70's. He was also a nationally registered EMT until 2014, a certified Firefighter 2 and Hazmat Deacon, an Emergency Management Director until 2014, a senior staff instructor with the NH Fire Academy, a Fire Warden, and a member of the Fitzwilliam Emergency Preparedness. Win was also an emergency dispatcher from 1965 until 2014 with the Southwestern NH Fire Mutual Aid. As if this wasn't enough for Win in serving his community, he was also a very proud member of the Monadnock Regional School District Board.

Following Win's retirement, he and his wife, Jane, enjoyed taking over twenty cruises, creating wonderful memories together. He, Jane and the family created many wonderful memories at their seasonal camping site at Surry Mountain Dam Campground for many years.

He will be greatly missed by many, especially his son, Kenneth A. Wright and his wife, Sherry, of Fitzwilliam; two grandchildren, Kenny Wright II and his wife, Taryn, stationed at the Schofield Army Base in Hawaii, and Kyle Wright and his wife, Natasha, stationed at Ft. Drum Army Base in NY; three great-grandchildren, Brady Wright of Hawaii, Colton Wright and Kyia Wright of Ft. Drum; a sister-in-law, Sharon Wright of Keene, NH; his nephews and nieces including his niece, Debra Beach of Keene; and many other extended family members. Winston's wife of 61 years, Jane R. (Wyman) Wright died on November 9, 2019. A brother, Douglas Wright, a brother and sister-in-law, Morgan and Sandra Wright, and two sisters-in-law, Carolyn McLeod and Shirley Cheever, predeceased him.







2022 REPORT OF THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN

The year 2022 was another challenging year for the town, with ever increasing inflation, which impacted expenditures and the budgets for 2023.

The town was a beneficiary however, of federal funds through ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) and from the agency FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency). The monies will be used to undertake repair or upgrade activities in town properties, without having to raise taxes to do so. The selectmen have made several visits to town facilities to create a list of needed tasks. Further visits will be made as tasks are completed and the task list revised as further needs are determined. A few of the items that have been undertaken or planned for the immediate future are: purchase of a police vehicle, acquisition of a water filtration system for the public safety building, and repair of the town hall roof. The Board of Selectmen will provide continuous updates on the town website and the town newsletter.

If an effort to lessen increases in the 2023 budget, the Board of Selectmen asked the town departments and boards to make purchases at the end of 2022 if they had funds remaining, and reduce their 2023 requests accordingly. The Board of Selectmen would like to thank all the departments, and boards & commissions, that submitted budgets, and to the Capital Improvement Projects Committee and Budget Committee, for all their hard work, in creating what we feel is a lean budget, but one that will still meet the needs and expectations of the townspeople.

There were several things of note in the past year. The installation of broadband was completed throughout the town. Final internal repairs were made to the town hall steeple, and further repairs made to other parts of the building. Additional monies were received from FEMA, both as a reimbursement for flood damage that occurred in 2021, and for disaster relief. This was applied to road projects, both to offset expenditures occasioned by the flooding, and to reduce new year expenditure requests. The Board of Selectmen arranged for LED lamps to be installed at the public safety building and DPW to increase light output while at the same time reducing our energy consumption.

We have a new shared relationship with the Town of Troy to provide 24 hour ambulance service, 5 days a week. This increase over our previously provided service of 12 hour service 5 days a week, features much quicker response time for emergencies. Quicker response time equals better outcome in many cases. We thank our Chief and Assistant Chief for creatively organizing and making arrangements for this service.

Special thanks goes to Sheryl White, our secretary, for her hard work throughout the year. We value her help and input. We especially want to thank our Town Administrator, Debbie Favreau, for all the effort she puts forth throughout the year, but especially at budget time, assisting all involved in the budget process, and for creating the town report. Many do not realize the amount of dedicated time she expends throughout the year, but the selectmen do recognize it and want to make note of it. The selectmen could not do what we do without her.

2022 REPORT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

The Highway Department saw several changes in 2022. Chris Rocheleau and Chris Silvia both retired after many years and contributions to the Town.

Chris Rocheleau could always be seen patching, mowing with the Town's roadside mower and helping other departments. He was also known for his practical jokes and bantering with other departments.

Chris Silvia worked with Ryan Chamberlain cutting brush, trees and other various labor-intensive tasks. Chris was a very clever and productive employee.

Rich Williams, who mowed the cemeteries and Town properties, has filled Chris Silvia's position. Dedicated to the Town, Rich fulfilled both positions at the same time during the summer. He's very hard working, and keeps us all entertained.

Keith Atkins, our newest co-worker, joined us in November, replacing Chris Rocheleau. Previously with NH DOT, Keith's experience with plowing, culvert and ditch maintenance make him a valued addition to our team.

Ryan Chamberlain was promoted and is our new foreman. Ryan has been with us 13 years. His experience and patience help him be a good teacher to the newer crew members. Ryan's mechanical and fabrication experience has saved the Town money, as we don't have to outsource many needed vehicle repairs.

Mary Kisinger joined us in the office on a part-time basis, enabling Director Glenn Smith to be in the field more often. In addition to office duties, Mary is working on securing additional grants for the Department.

Accomplished tasks in 2022 include:

- Replaced culverts on Sandy Hollow, East Lake Road, Brigham Hill South;
- Cleared ditches and cleaned culverts;
- Cut trees and brush for contracted paving for Collins Pond Road, Templeton Turnpike, Holman Road, and Webber Lane;
- Spread stone & gravel for town dirt roads;
- Repaired heavy equipment and aging trucks;
- Removed ledge and installed under drain on Collins Pond Road to help an ongoing ice problem; and
- Grader-shimmed Abel Road, part of Cross Road, and Sandy Hollow.

- Fitzwilliam was awarded several grants in 2022:

 \$19,945 was granted for a message board for road maintenance and closures, or for emergencies.
 - Over \$98,000 was reimbursed by FEMA for road flooding and required repairs.
 - A couple additional grants are pending approval from the State and Federal grantors.

We cannot summarize 2022 without a huge "Thank You!" to Lori Nolan in the Town's Land Use Office for her assistance with wetland permits.

In February, after many years of service to the Town of Fitzwilliam, Prosecutor Martha Jacques, retired. We would like to thank her for her years of service and wish her the best. We were fortunate to fill this vacancy with Michael Beausoleil, of the Regional Prosecutor's office.



We are proud to announce that Brandylyn Mitchell graduated from the 282nd Academy on December 30, 2022. Pictured on the left are: Sergeant Jeffry Clark, Officer Daniel Moore, Officer Brandylyn Mitchell, Officer Gene Cuomo, and Chief Leonard DiSalvo. With many local police departments struggling with staff shortages we have been fortunate to retain our current staff of nine officers, an administrative assistant, a prosecutor and an animal control officer.

This spring, the Fitzwilliam Police Association proudly gave a scholarship to a resident furthering her education in Law Enforcement and a second donation to the PSU Sunshine Scholarship. As summer approached, FPA members visited Emerson and gifted the students with a journal/pencil set. In August, our energies were put into hosting our 7th Annual Car Show, which was another huge success! In the fall,



we collaborated with the NH AG's office to host an event in recognizing scams and how to protect against them. To wrap up 2022, we once again teamed up with Monadnock Firearms and Toys-for-Tots to collect toys for Fitzwilliam families, at our Stuff-a-Cruiser event held at Monadnock Firearms.



The department and ACO fielded over 126 animal related calls this year, again mostly pertaining to lost or found dogs. To help reduce stress on your pets, and to insure a quick and safe return home, please license your dogs with the town and attach their tags to their collars.

2022 REPORT OF THE TRANSFER STATION

2022 saw the Transfer Station employees checking vehicles for dump stickers, and reminding residents that these free stickers are available at the Town Clerk's or Selectmen's Offices, and are mandatory. We can only accept household waste or construction debris from Fitzwilliam year-round or seasonal residents, as it is our taxpayers who fund the Transfer Station's waste disposal and hauling costs.

Working to make the Transfer Station more appealing and useful to both residents and staff, we have been filling low areas to create more useable space. Several shipping containers will replace the deteriorating trailers. Knotweed and bittersweet are being removed, and control of these invasives will continue to be on our agenda for the coming year.

Safety is also paramount for staff and residents. Children may be running from vehicles to the recycling windows, and our workers may be crossing the traffic lane, so please remember to slow down. We don't want anyone hurt!

We extend a big thank you to Richard, Alan, Dicky, and Ray for everything they do for us at the Transfer Station.

2022 REPORT OF THE FIRE WARDS

The Fitzwilliam Fire and EMS personnel responded to 620, of the 683 calls received in 2022. This is the busiest we have ever been, by almost 200 calls!

In 2022, Fitzwilliam formed a partnership with the Town of Troy. With the hard work of both select boards and the leadership of both departments, we developed a unique agreement that received approval from the Attorney General. In November, the 24hr ambulance service became a reality. The ambulance is now staffed with 2 licensed personnel from 6am Monday morning until 6am Saturday morning.

In October, the interior of the Public Safety Building went through another major metamorphosis, adding 2 bedrooms to the fire station. This was done almost completely with donations and fundraising.





The Fitzwilliam Fire Department teamed up with the Fitzwilliam Police Association again this year to host the 2nd Annual Daniel Baker Memorial Cornhole Tournament, which was a great success! We also collaborated with the Troy Fire Department and received \$100,000.00 in grants for EMS equipment, which we expect to receive in February.

March of 2023 marks the end of an era. The department will no longer be overseen by the Fire Wards. As the department grows and becomes busier we are better suited to being overseen by the Board of Selectmen, as are the rest of the town departments.

One of our biggest challenges in 2023, will be hiring and retaining staff. - 3,297 audio and e-books were downloaded to Fitzwilliam users.
- We held 62 meetings in the Library, with 306 attending.
- 505 people subscribe to our weekly newsletter.

YOUTH SPORTS

2022 REPORT OF THE CEMETERY TRUSTEES

Work Force:

In 2022 we had hoped to operate with two part-time workers in a cooperative arrangement with the DPW. Unfortunately, due to almost no response to our ads and internet postings that did not happen. One of our past workers came back to assist on a very limited basis and we were very grateful for that unplanned help. As a result, there were times that the cemeteries looked pretty shaggy. Hopefully, we will have better luck in attracting workers in 2023.

The Trustees continued handling the administrative work, dealing with the funeral homes, monument companies, families and retained the overall cemetery responsibility.

Recurring Work:

Other than the routine mowing and trimming of the grass, we really did not take on any other maintenance this year. We were able to accomplish a good fall cleanup.

Flower Planters:

We need to again thank the Lions Club for their support this year in planting and maintaining the flower barrels at both cemeteries. Our part of the agreement is that the cemetery purchases the flowers. The Club has been helping us for a number of years and we appreciate their efforts that result in many compliments.

Equipment Issues:

The equipment continued to have more use in 2022 since it was also used for the maintenance of other Town properties including the ball field and tennis court areas, the Village and Depot Commons, the Library and Town Hall.

We replaced a 15-year-old backpack blower with a more powerful unit and replaced a string trimmer that was also worn out.

Our other equipment held up well.

Trees and New Plantings:

We used contracted tree services to remove and trim trees in the Village Cemetery. This became a major project which involved a crane, bucket trucks, and a number of workers. A large tree in Section One (the oldest section) of the Village Cemetery was removed with great and careful work. Their safety precautions ensured that none of the old markers were damaged that surrounded the tree on all sides. They continued on to trim and remove dead and dangerous branches in all of the remaining trees inside the Village Cemetery in an effort to remove hazards and prolong the lives of the trees.

Cemetery personnel trimmed a few plantings at both cemeteries and several overgrown or dying plantings were removed this year. We need to remove some stumps as time permits. There are several dangerous trees that need to be removed at the back of Pine Grove Cemetery as DPW resources are available.

Grass and Leveling:

We did not accomplish any work to maintain or repair the grass in the cemeteries as we had planned. The grass at Pine Grove has been declining the past few years so we need to apply lime to the full cemetery, do some spot insect control since grubs and ants have been taking over, and consider applying fertilizer and seed in some areas as needed. This has normally been part of our recurring maintenance plans that have been curtailed due to our worker availability shortfalls.

2022 REPORT OF THE CEMETERY TRUSTEES - continued

Projects:

We were unable to accomplish project work in 2022 due to the limited availability of our staff.

Sunken Markers – We were only able to raise a very small number of sunken flush markers this year and this work will continue in 2023.

Granite Curbing – We were not able to level and raise any granite curbs in the Village Cemetery. These curbs have settled and became uneven and out of level over many years. This misalignment affects the stability of numerous memorial stones and has resulted in damage to some stones.

Tomb Repairs – We had hoped to do some work on the town tomb in 2022 but that did not happen. Hopefully we can accomplish this in 2023. We would then move on to the worst of the smaller tombs if possible in 2024.

Marble and Granite Cleaning – After great progress during 2021 we were unable to clean any stones or curbs this year. We hope to get back to that continuing project in 2023.

CIP: We submitted two CIP funding requests for 2023.

We requested that maintenance funds be placed in a capital reserve account for potential future tree trimming or removal as necessary. We would have access to these funds throughout the year if there is unforeseen tree damage or if serious deterioration presents a hazard to people or the grounds and stones. The second funding request is to cover preservation of deed records for the Pine Grove Cemetery. We have preserved documents and maps for the Village Cemetery and we want to accomplish the same for Pine Grove. This involves page stabilization including reducing acid levels and repair, scanning to pdf files and placing the originals in protective mylar page protectors. The originals will then be placed in the town vault for storage. Copies will be printed from the scans and used for normal reference when required. The scans can also be placed on the Town web site like some of our other documents. We had previously submitted this request in 2022.

If you would like to try the ereg option but are unsure please feel free to contact us at the office. We are still only processing CASH and CHECKS in this office. Please plan accordingly.

In March was our Local Election. We had 300 ballots cast during the Election. Thank you to all the Election workers and those who came out to vote.

We processed dogs as is required by State law. Please get in before April 30 to license your dog(s). There seems to be an issue with this; people are thinking it is an option. It is NOT. Please come in and license your dog(s). In 2022 we processed 566 licenses. Thank you to those who follow the law.

Please remember to bring your driver's license into the Clerk's office when doing any Motor vehicle transaction—we will ask for it. Also, remember your registration when doing a renewal or transfer. It is required and we will not be able to complete your transaction without a lot more work (and money). A lot of things have changed in this office. We are only following the State Law and trying to make everyone happy.

In September we held the State Primary Election. We had 244 Republican ballots cast and 150 Democratic ballots cast. The day went well as we geared up for the General Election.

In November the State General Election was held and there were 1,131 ballots cast – which represented a 68% voter turnout. Way to go voters of Fitzwilliam!

We made it through another year! Looking forward to a happy and productive 2023!

2022 REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD

Planning Boards are established to provide for the orderly growth and development of the municipality. Planning Board regulatory duties include the review and approval of all subdivisions, boundary line adjustments, voluntary mergers, conditional use permits, and site plan review applications for commercial uses or multi-family residences. The Planning Board may recommend and take public input on amendments to the Zoning Ordinance. The Planning Board, in a process which involves input from the people of Fitzwilliam, is also responsible for preparing and amending the Town's Master Plan to guide the development of the municipality.

This year, like the previous two years, was a very busy and challenging year. Due to changes by the Governor when the COVID Emergency Order ended, all meetings were held in-person, with the option to participate through Zoom. The Land Use Department plans to continue to offer remote meeting accessibility, providing more flexibility and opportunities for the public to attend meetings.

Following Town elections in March, Ed Goodell was elected to the Board. This is his first term. Suzanne Gray was also re-elected to the Board. Both will serve three year terms. In the Board vote for Officers that takes place after Town Meeting, the Board re-elected Suzanne Gray as Chair, Robin Peard Blais as Secretary, and Paul Haynes as Vice Chair. Nolan Buonomano resigned due to a geographic change and Tom Rothermel, who was previously an alternate, was appointed in his place.

For the third year in a row, the Board had an abnormally large number of cases. They heard ten cases this year, including four Conditional Use Permits for activity within the wetlands buffers, four Boundary Line Adjustments, one Site Plan Review for a Home Business, and one Site Plan Review for Multi-Family Housing. There were also twenty-two Preliminary Consultations providing guidance regarding changes of use, home occupations/businesses, subdivisions, and construction within the wetlands buffers that proved useful in determining whether formal applications for Site Plan Review and/or Conditional Use Permits were required. Time was also dedicated toward updating the Master Plan. The Board oversees and provides guidance and resources to the citizen-based Master Plan Steering Committee. The updated Master Plan is expected to be presented and adopted in 2023.

The Board also worked on updating the zoning ordinance, proposing two changes. The ordinance changes propose defining group business within the sign regulations and clarifying frontage exceptions when creating a new lot. These ordinance changes will be on the ballot for vote by the residents of Fitzwilliam in March 2023.

The Planning Board values input from Town residents and welcomes you to attend meetings; and encourages interested volunteers to serve on the Planning Board as members or alternates. The Planning Board meets on the first and the third Tuesdays of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Town Hall.

2022 REPORT OF THE ZONING BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

The Zoning Board of Adjustment hears appeals for relief from zoning ordinance requirements. The Board considers the unique circumstances of each case and decides to grant relief, if warranted, based on specific criteria. They consider the impact of the proposed action on the neighborhood and the land, and whether it is in harmony with the purpose and intent of the zoning ordinance. The Board can't change zoning ordinances but is empowered to grant appeals in accordance with State Statute and local law as specified in the Land Use Code.

The Board considers appeals for Variances, Special Exceptions and Equitable Waivers of Dimensional Requirements, Appeals of Administrative Decisions and Motions for re-hearings.

2022 continued to be a very busy and challenging year for the Board of Adjustment. Due to changes by the Governor when the COVID Emergency Order ended, all meetings were held in-person, with the option to participate through Zoom. The Land Use Department plans to continue to offer remote options, giving the public more flexibility and opportunities to attend meetings.

The Board deliberated on fifteen cases, including ten Variances, four Special Exceptions, and one re-hearing request. The Board is still deliberating on one case at time of print.

The Zoning Board of Adjustment meets at 7:00 p.m. on the second Tuesday of the month at the Fitzwilliam Town Hall when they have an application before them. The Board invites and encourages all interested parties to attend hearings and meetings as noticed.

2022 REPORT OF THE HISTORIC DISTRICT COMMISSION

The mission of the Historic District Commission is to preserve historic structures and places of historic and architectural value; preserve a district in the municipality that reflects elements of its cultural, social, economic, political and architectural history; conserve property values; foster civic beauty; and maintain the existing architecture of the district. The Commission reviews all exterior construction/renovation located within the Historic District of Fitzwilliam through an application process and public meetings. They are also responsible for amendments to and adoption of regulations in accordance with State statutes.

In 2022, the Historic District Commissioners met nine times and used the design guidelines to review twelve applications including: exterior modifications and repairs for residences and installation of solar panels and yard fencing. The Commission also reviewed applications for new exterior structures including a deck, porch, garage, and a single family cape style dwelling. Additionally, the Commission dedicated time to updating and streamlining the design guidelines to reflect the inclusion of new and modern materials.

Applications for all exterior changes within the Historic District come before the Commission for consideration and approval. The Commission meets on the second Thursday of each month at 4:00 p.m. in the Town Hall when there is a case before it. All meetings are open to the public and we encourage participation from all those interested.

2022 REPORT OF THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The Conservation Commission continued working on its mission to protect the natural resources of Fitzwilliam. We thank voters at the 2022 town meeting for contributions to the Conservation Land Fund. With these funds, the Town was able to purchase the Schupack Easement property (a portion of the Pinnacle). We greatly appreciate your continuing support.

The Commission completed new hiking trails in the Katie Metzger Town Forest. These new trails will provide additional options for residents and visitors to get out into nature. New maps and signage will be added throughout 2023, with a formal dedication in the spring. Over the past year the Commission continued to monitor, maintain, stock maps, and update markers along the Widow Gage Town Forest trails, which remains a popular hiking location. The Commission also maintains the dog waste station at the Templeton Turnpike rail trail

The Commission is working with Moosewood Environmental to update the town's Natural Resource Inventory (NRI), last updated in 2009. An NRI provides a basis for natural resources conservation in town and can be used to develop conservation priorities, aid in land-use decisions, and protect essential surface waters, aguifers, and soils.

The Commission hosted a workshop for town employees and citizens on Japanese knotweed control presented by the NH Invasive Species Coordinator, and we continue to monitor the occurrence of invasives and the development of control strategies for knotweed and other species in town (e.g., bittersweet, purple loosestrife).

The Commission also hosted a well water testing workshop that resulted in the distribution of 65 water test kits to town residents. The Commission expects to repeat this program every 3-5 years.

The Commission continued to work with the Cheshire Rail Trail group, organized by the Southwest Region Planning Commission, to plan improvements to the old rail line between the Massachusetts border and Keene. We continue to represent the town on the Monadnock Advisory Committee, and members were once again able to attend the in-person annual meeting of the NH Association of Conservation Commissions (the first since the pandemic began). The Commission continues to research and explore opportunities for land purchases and conservation easements that will support conservation of the many scenic, recreational and wildlife habitat features of Fitzwilliam.

Corinne Marcou joined the Commission in 2022, and we are now at a full complement of seven members. We continue to work closely with the Planning Board, Master Plan Steering Committee and the Board of Selectmen, as well as advising groups, applicants, and agencies on town conservation matters. The Conservation Commission meets every third Monday at 7:00 p.m. We invite you to join us as a guest or new member.

2022 REPORT OF THE CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICE

The Code Enforcement Office enforces regulations of the Fitzwilliam Land Use Codes, issues permits for construction, and occupancy permits for new home occupation after completion of construction.

Upon receipt of a written complaint, the Code Enforcement Officer performs an investigation, ensures compliance of construction permits to applicable zoning requirements, dedicates Emergency 911 numbers, and reviews all Construction Permit Applications and plans. This review ensures safety from fire, flood and establishes that all other public requirements are met. Once a permit has been granted, the Code Enforcement Officer, if necessary, visits the property prior to the start of construction to determine that all setback requirements have been met. In the absence of a Code Enforcement Officer, those duties are handled by the Board of Selectmen and staff in the Selectmen's Office.

If you should have any questions with regard to permitting for construction, please contact the Selectmen's Office to obtain a copy of the Construction Permit regulations. Please remember that all construction, renovation, demolition and changes to buildings require a permit. We continue to see construction being completed in town without first obtaining a construction permit approval. It is always best to check with the Land Use Office or the Selectmen's Office prior to construction to determine if a permit is required. When applying for a permit, please remember to allow yourself enough time for the paperwork to be processed prior to the start date of construction.

In 2022, 72 construction permits were issued. A sampling of permits requested were for: 8 new single-family homes, and 13 solar panel installations - roof and ground mounted. In addition, Construction Permits were approved for interior renovations, additions, an above ground pool, many sheds, decks and two garages as well as a barn. Again this year, COVID-19 has certainly had an impact on the construction work done in Town and we don't see a slowdown of Construction Permit Applications going into the new year.

The Code Enforcement Officer was also busy with occupancy inspections, verification of setbacks, and following up on complaints, as needed. 2022 has proven once again to be a busy year for this office.

2022 REPORT OF THE COMMON COMMITTEE

The purpose of the Common Committee is to provide oversight for the activities and plantings that take place on the Common. This Committee maintains a calendar of yearly scheduled events as well as individual requests. All requests are submitted to the Selectmen, shared with the Common Committee, and approved by the Selectmen.

Traditional Common events include the Memorial Day Celebration, Antique Show, Garden Club Plant Sales, Farmer's Market, Historical Society Strawberry Social and Apple Crisp Social, Christmas Carol Lighting, and Elliot Concerts on the Common.

The Common Committee sought donations for tree plantings and received monies from the public at the Fitzwilliam Library and the Town Hall. Fitzwilliam's membership, along with that of over 400 other municipalities, businesses and individuals throughout the Northeast, helps support our mission of "partnering, to make recycling strong through economic and environmentally sound solutions." NRRA, is one of only a handful of nonprofits in the country that enables communities to manage their own recycling programs by providing cooperative marketing and purchasing programs, along with education and technical assistance.

Through your continued support and dedication, NRRA has assisted our members to recycle over 64,106,463 pounds of recyclable material in 2022.

The Town recycled 5,365 pounds of tires. The environmental impact is that Fitzwilliam conserved the equivalent of 2,717.14 pounds of coal being burned (carbon dioxide emissions). This is the equivalent of removing .20 passenger cars from the road for an entire year.
