SHAHEEN FAVORABILITY SLIDES, BUT LEADS ALL GOP CHALLENGERS IN RACE FOR NH SENATE SEAT

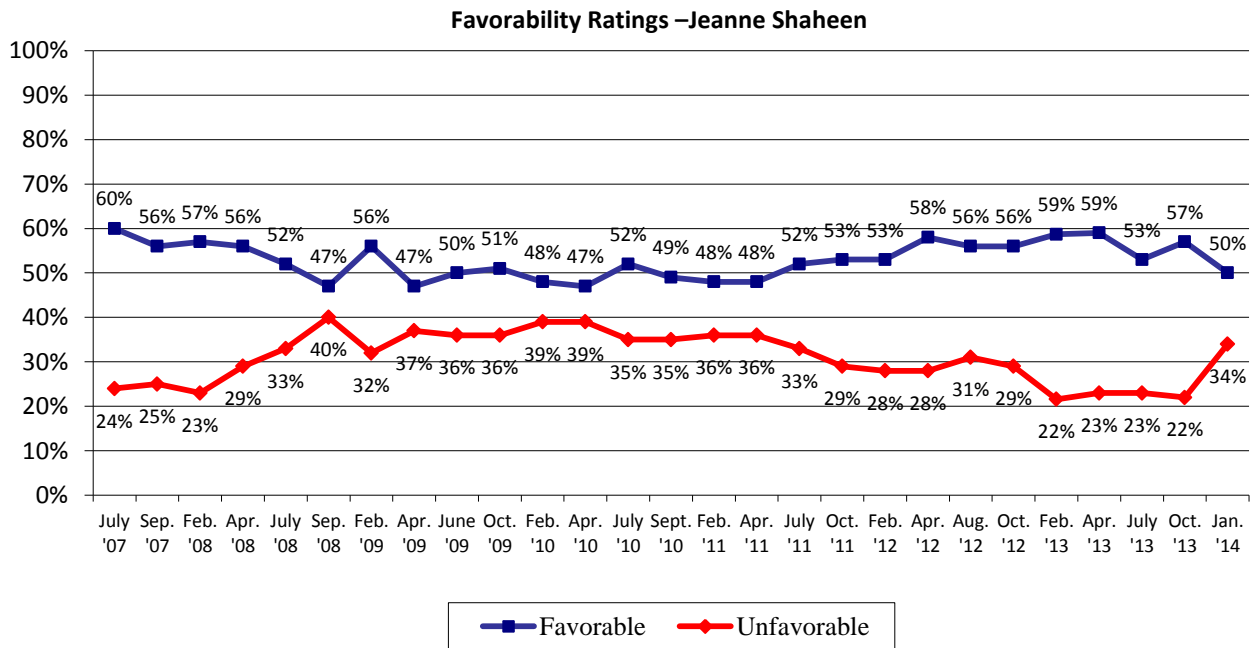

DURHAM, NH – Senator Jeanne Shaheen’s favorability in the Granite State have slipped in recent months, but she enjoys double digit leads over four potential Republican challengers for the 2014 election. Former Massachusetts Senator Scott Brown currently matches up the best against Shaheen, but is viewed unfavorably by Granite Staters.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and eighty-four (584) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between January 21 and January 26, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.1 percent.

Favorability Ratings – Senator Jeanne Shaheen

The senior member of the New Hampshire delegation, Democratic Senator Jeanne Shaheen, has long been one of the most popular politicians in New Hampshire. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 50% of New Hampshire adults say they have a favorable opinion of Shaheen, 34% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 7% are neutral and 9% don’t know enough about her to say. Shaheen’s net favorability rating, the percentage who have a favorable opinion of her minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion, is +16%. This is a drop from +35% net favorability in October and is her lowest rating in nearly three years, but it is typical for candidates as they enter a re-election period. Shaheen is still viewed very favorably by Democrats (net +64%), and favorably by Independents (+21%), but is viewed very unfavorably by Republicans (-38%).

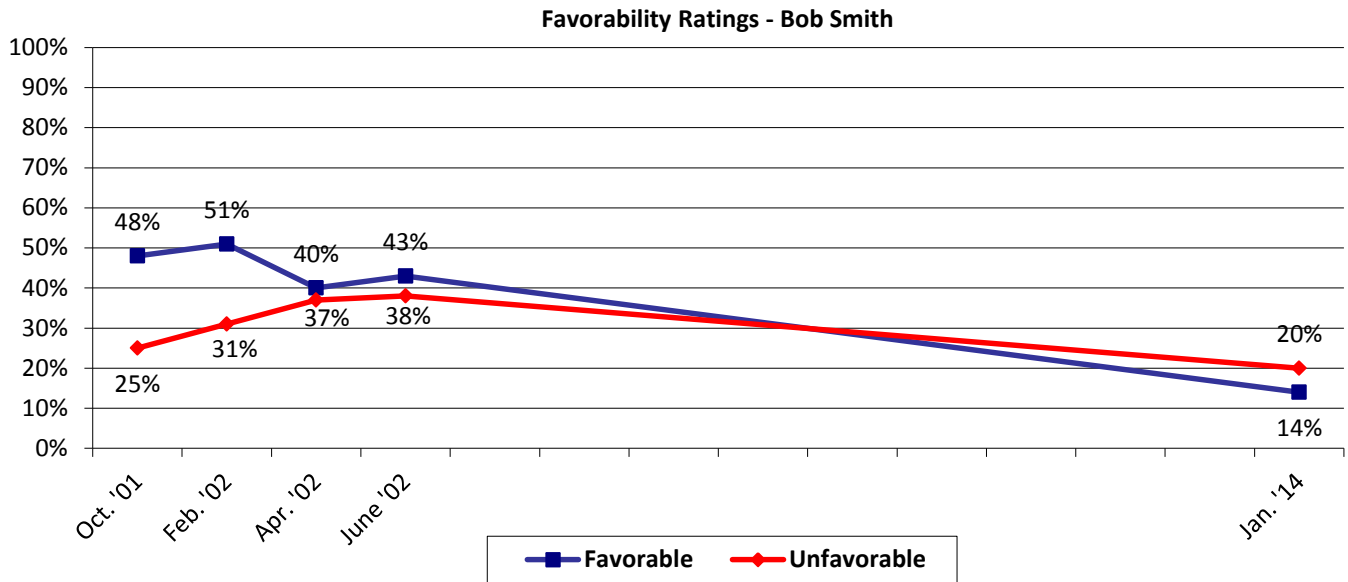

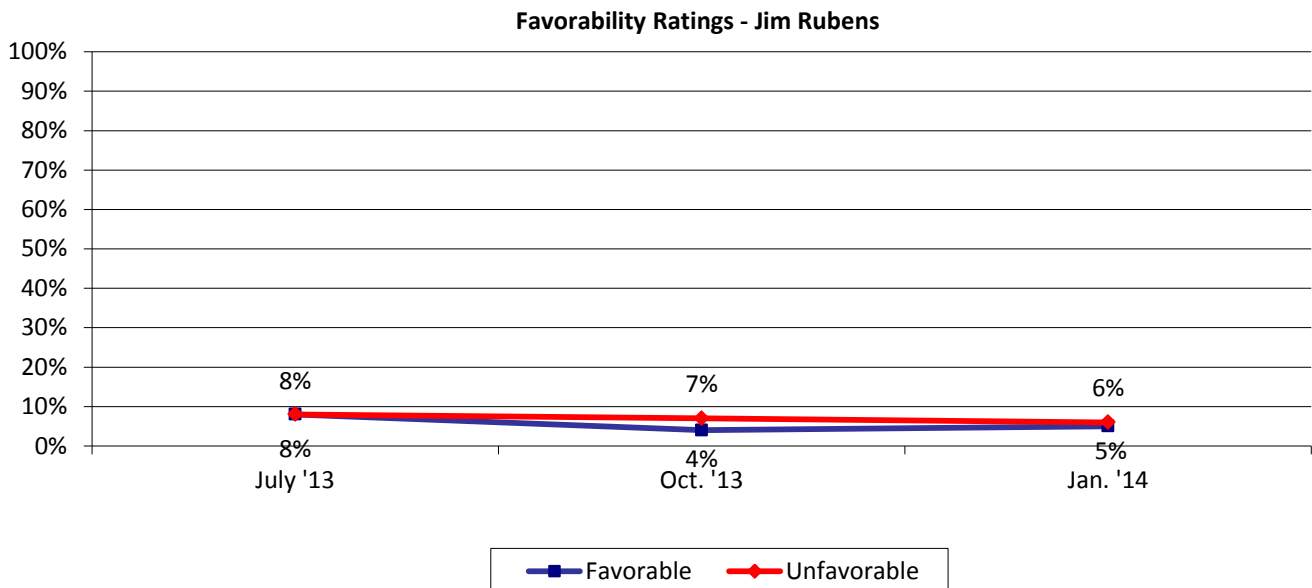
GOP Challengers for U.S. Senate

Over the last few months, three challengers have officially announced their intentions to run against Senator Shaheen: Former Senator Bob Smith (R-Tuftsboro), political activist Karen Testerman (R-Franklin), and former State Senator Jim Rubens (R-Hanover). The big question is whether former Massachusetts Senator Scott Brown (R-Rye) will also get in the race.

It has been more than a decade since Bob Smith, a three-term congressman and two-term senator, has been active in New Hampshire politics and the time away from the state has hurt Smith. Currently, only 14% of New Hampshire adults say they have a favorable opinion of Smith, 20% have an unfavorable opinion, 11% are neutral and 55% don't know enough to say. His net favorability is -6%. Smith is somewhat popular among Republicans (net +6%), while Independents are neutral about Smith (0%) and he is unpopular among Democrats (net -21%).

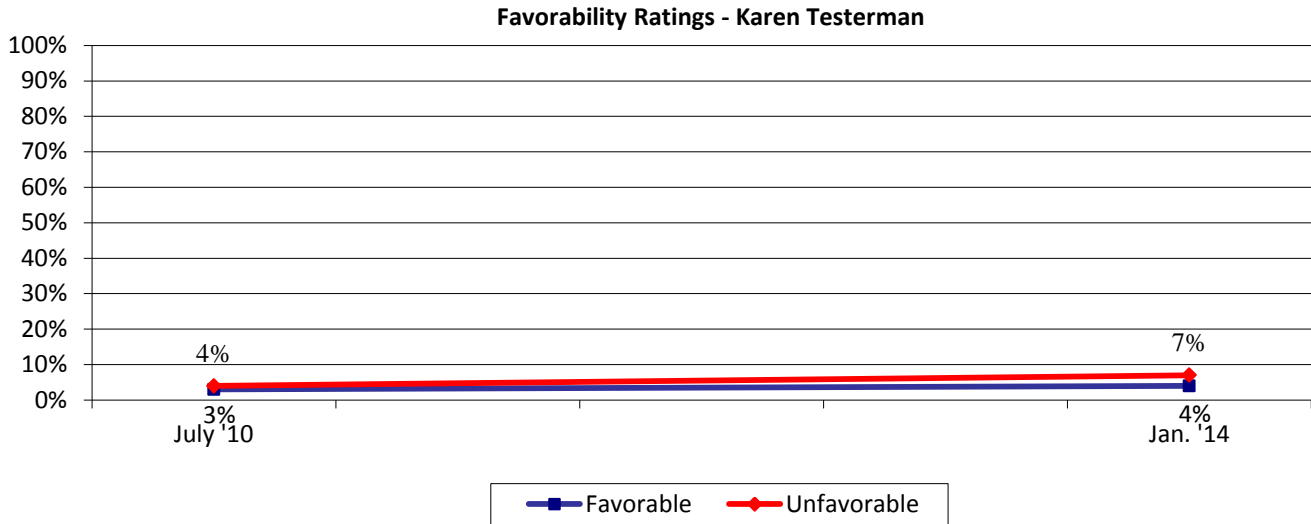


Despite campaigning for several months, Jim Rubens remains unknown in the Granite State. Currently, only 5% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Rubens, 6% have an unfavorable opinion, 12% are neutral and 76% don't know enough to say. Rubens' net favorability rating is -1%.

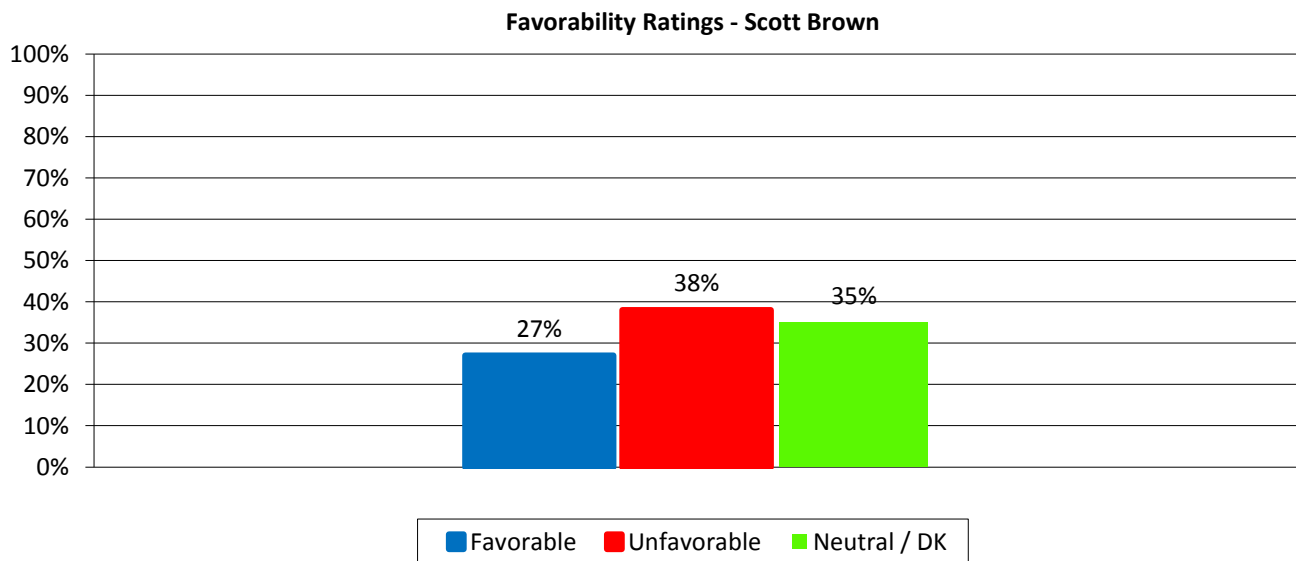


Karen Testerman, who is running her second statewide campaign in four years (she finished 3rd in the Republican primary for Governor in 2010), is also unknown in the state.

Currently, only 4% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Testerman, 7% have an unfavorable opinion, 9% are neutral and 80% don't know enough to say. Testerman's net favorability rating is -3%.



Scott Brown is an enigma in New Hampshire politics. He has left Massachusetts and established residency in New Hampshire and is actively involved in Republican politics in the state. However, he has been coy about running for senate, so far resisting calls from Republicans to challenge Shaheen. Brown is the best known of potential challengers to Shaheen, but he is not very popular. Currently 27% of New Hampshire adults say they have a favorable opinion of Brown, 38% have an unfavorable opinion, 8% are neutral and 27% don't know enough to say. His net favorability is -11%. Brown is only modestly popular among Republicans (net +25%), but unpopular among Independents (-8%) and very unpopular among Democrats (net -50%).

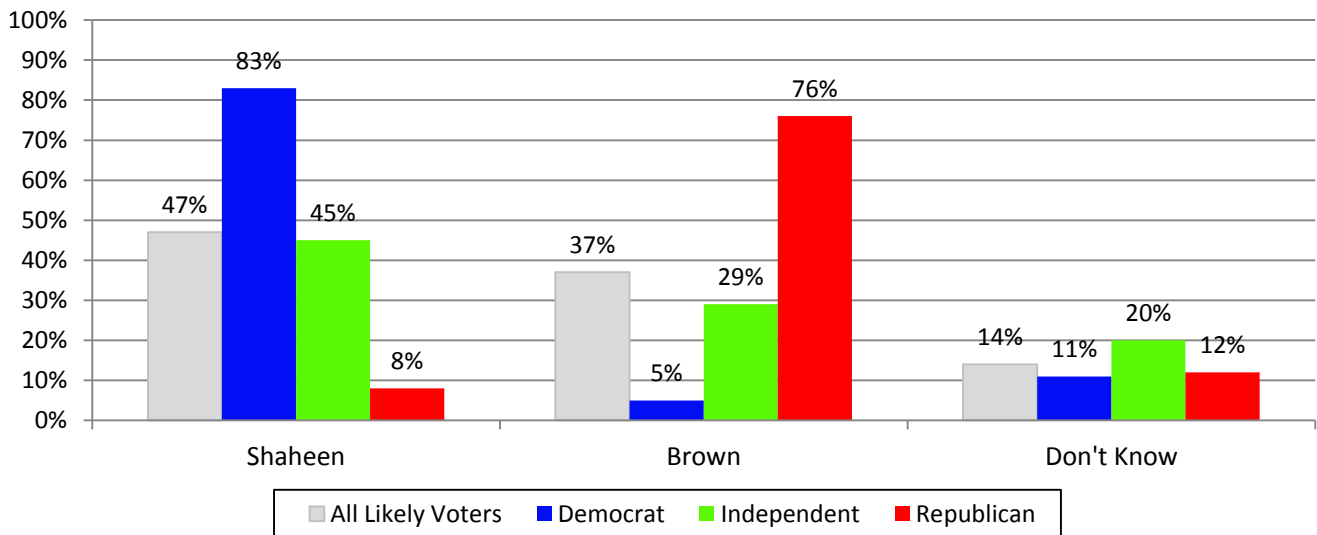


2014 U.S. Senate Election

The 2014 senate election is less than a year away, but very few voters have decided who they will vote support. Only 10% of likely voters say they have definitely decided who to support, 9% are leaning towards someone, and 81% are still trying to decide. Despite greater name recognition, Brown fares no better than Smith in matchups with Shaheen.

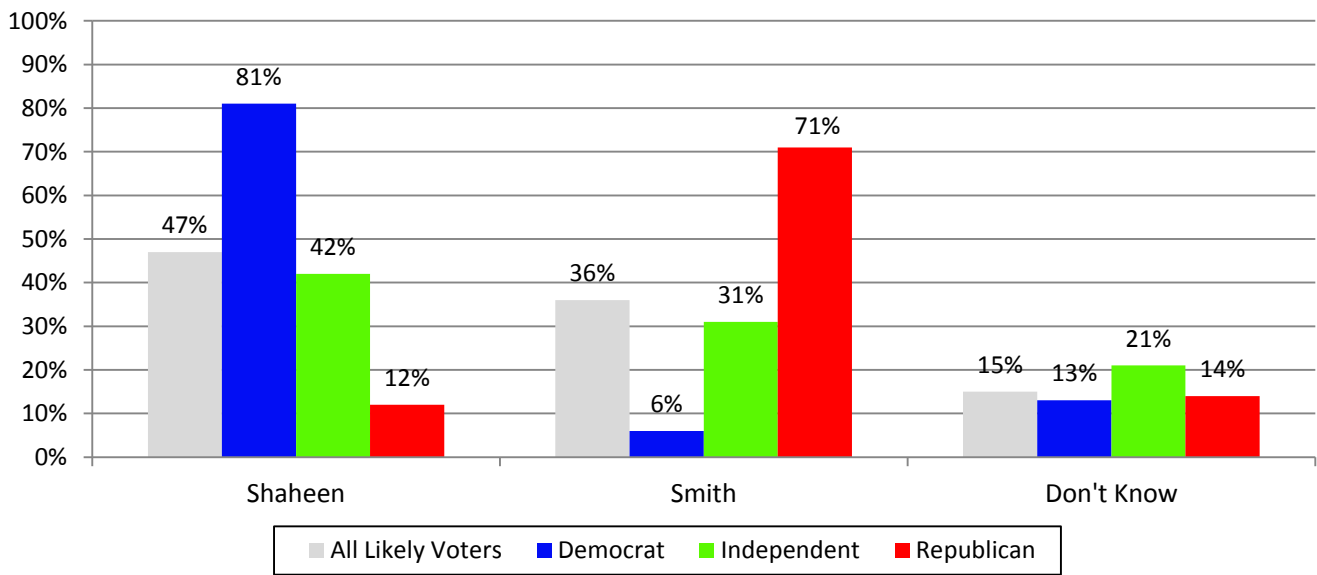
In a matchup between Shaheen and Brown, 47% of likely voters say they would vote for Shaheen if the election were held today, 37% would vote for Brown, 3% support someone else, and 14% are undecided.

US Senate - Shaheen vs. Brown



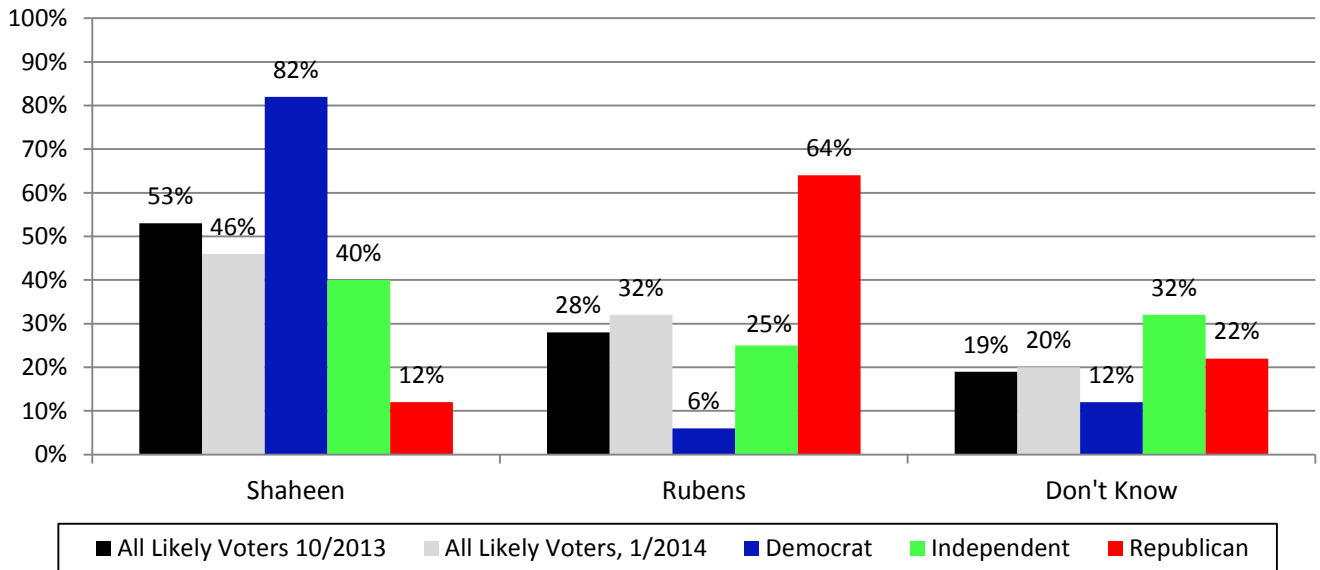
If Smith were the Republican nominee, 47% of likely voters say they would vote for Shaheen, 36% would vote for Smith, 2% support someone else, and 15% are undecided.

If Rubens were the Republican nominee, 46% of likely voters say they would vote for Shaheen, 32% would vote for Rubens, 1% support someone else, and 20% are undecided.

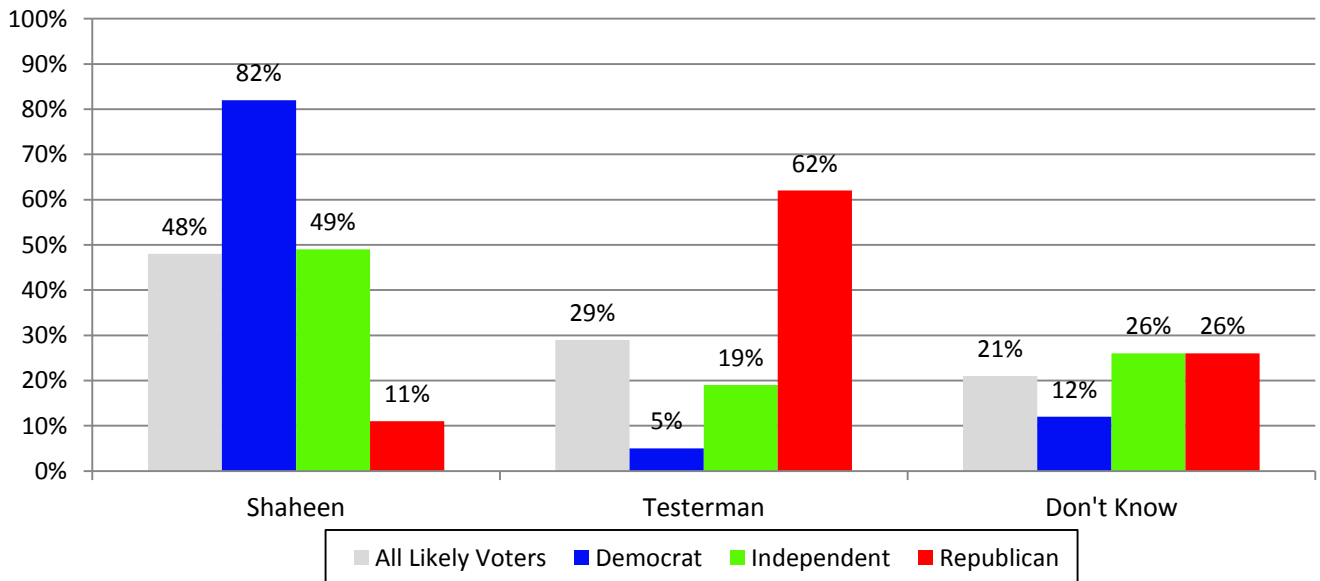
US Senate - Shaheen vs. Rubens



And if Testerman were the Republican nominee, 48% of likely voters would say they would vote for Shaheen, 29% would vote for Testerman, 2% support someone else, and 21% are undecided.

As would be expected in hypothetical matchups this early, Democrats and Republicans largely support their party's candidate while many Independents are undecided. Currently Shaheen holds sizeable leads over all four challengers among Independent voters.

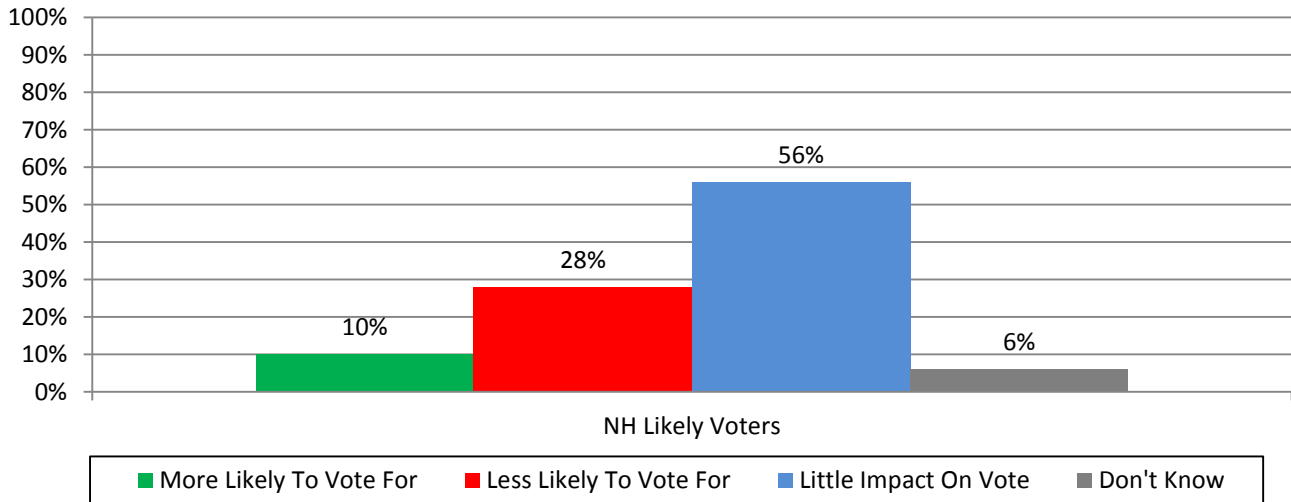
US Senate - Shaheen vs. Testerman



Impact Of Scott Brown Being Former Massachusetts Senator

It's very uncommon for a U.S. Senator to move to another state and run for Senate there. The last time a senator was elected from two states happened in the 19th century. Brown's tenure as a senator from Massachusetts is not welcomed by New Hampshire residents, even by many Republicans. Only 10% of likely voters say they are more likely to vote for Brown because he was a senator from Massachusetts, 28% are less likely to vote for him, 56% say it makes little impact on their vote, and 6% are unsure. There is a partisan divide on this question – 42% of Democrats and 30% of Independents are less likely to vote for Brown but even 11% of Republicans are less likely to vote for him.

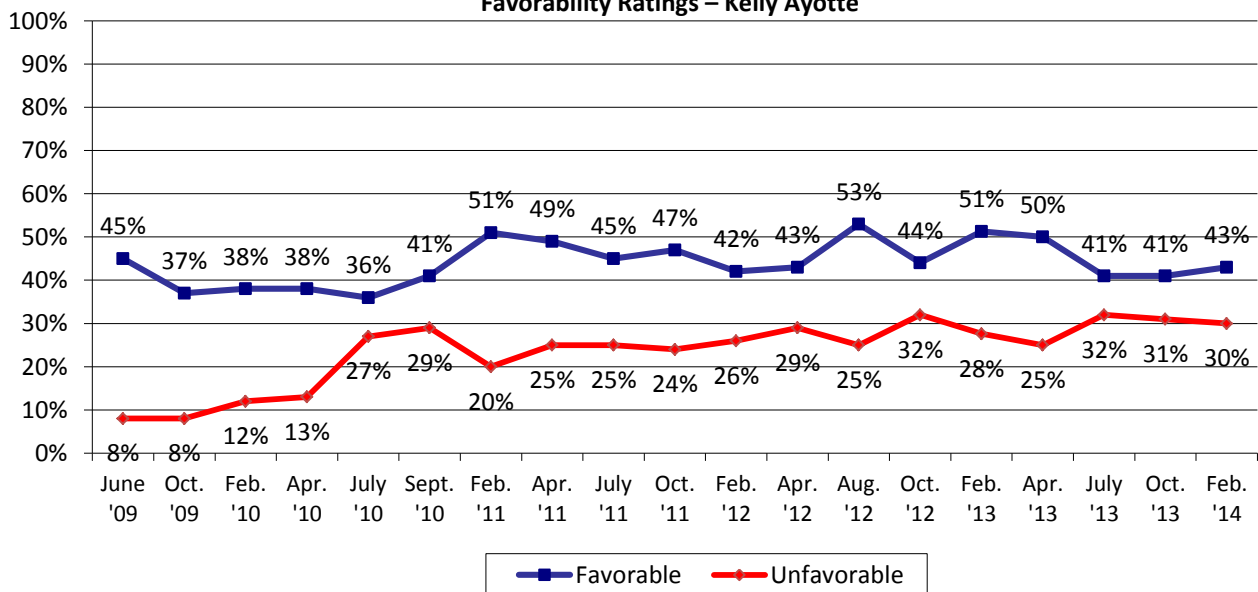
Does Being Former Mass. Senator Make You More Or Less Likely To Vote For Brown?



Favorability Ratings – Senator Kelly Ayotte

The favorability ratings of New Hampshire's junior senator, Republican Kelly Ayotte, have remained steady since October. Currently, 43% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Ayotte, 30% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 10% are neutral and 18% don't know enough about her to say. Ayotte's net favorability rating is +13%, which is up from +10% in October. She remains very popular among Republicans (net favorability rating of +48%), popular among independents (+21%) and unpopular among Democrats (-22%).

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and eighty-four (584) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between January 21 and January 26, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.1 percent.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, age, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may sum to just above or below 100%. Respondent numbers in each demographic may not equal the total respondent number due to respondents choosing not to answer some demographic questions.
