Report of the School Board.

We are required by an act of the last Legislature to file our report with the selectmen on or before the first day of August, instead of March as heretofore. Therefore in order to bring about the required change, this report is from March to August, 1895.

The board, in visiting the schools of the district during the spring term, found in almost every instance that the schools had been remarkably successful and the work done was very gratifying to all parties. Of the twelve teachers employed, only one was without previous experience. They have all shown commendable interest in the discharge of their work, gaining the respect and confidence of the pupils. Many instances of affection and good will were apparent toward them, by those who were under their direction. How much better it is to have such pleasant relations existing between teachers and scholars than to have the coolness and indifference which has sometimes prevailed.

During the term the teachers held meetings once in two weeks and methods of instruction in the different branches of school work were presented and commented on. It is hoped that this association will continue its work at the commencement of the fall term, as we think much good will come from this interchange of views.

We believe that the children of this town would receive greater benefit from their school days if parents and others would spend more time in visiting the schools. In that way teacher and parents become better acquainted, and the complications and disturbances which arise and retard the progress, might be averted. Teachers and pupils need the sympathy, encouragement and assistance of parents, who by frequent visits get a knowledge of the school work, of the teacher's labors and interest, and can thereby better appreciate what is being done for the education of the children.

In compliance with the demands of the new law, the schools in the several divisions of the town held interesting and appropriate patriotic exercises in their schoolrooms, the last regular session prior to Memorial day. Some of the teachers entering more into the spirit of the requirements, proposed to and did

raise quite respectable sums of money with which to purchase flags. It is the opinion of the board that the observance of the day with patriotic exercises will inculcate a love for the glorious stars and stripes and the nation as a whole.

The number of children in town between five and sixteen years of age, as reported to us by the truant officer, from his enumeration in the month of April, is, boys: 100; girls, 88. Whole number of schoolars in attendance the past term, 173.

All the facts concerning the schools may be obtained from the appended table.

Simonds Free High School.

The work of the high school has been carried on with gratifying results during the past year. The average attendance has been about sixty; the number who have attended from other towns is fifteen.

A larger number of applicants than usual attended the examinations for admission. Twenty-six of them were admitted. This class as a whole is made up of good material. But it is well understood by teachers that it takes considerable time to bring into harmonious subjection to systematic instruction, young scholars who have been taught apart, by different teachers, and moulded by widely differing influences.

The prescribed courses of study, which in their scope compare favorably with the courses pursued in high schools generally, have been followed with only slight deviations. And the thorough manner in which all the work of the school is done, should be satisfactory evidence that the school is fulfilling its mission as an institution of higher education.

The class that was graduated last June numbered twelve. These students had given proof of their ability in their examinations and graduating exercises, and since graduation, have done themselves credit and reflected honor on their instructors and their alma mater by maintaining themselves worthily in the practical affairs of life.

Mr. J. M. Barton has charge of the school as principal, now for the third year, and his work in the school shows the wisdom of continuing in service a competent, conscientious and progressive teacher. While the matter of discipline and the general control of affairs in the schoolroom devolve upon the principal, the work of instructing classes is of the same importance whether it is done by principal or assistant. Miss Mabel D. Hancock is filling the position of assistant with ability and the results of her work will always be prized by those who have received her instruction. She is filling the position for the second year.

The statement that "All men are born free and equal," may be true so far as "The rights of liberty and the pursuit of happiness" are concerned; but to say that all are born with equal capacities for acquiring knowledge, is absurd. Science has revealed that in all the myriads of things that exist, God has created no two objects, animate or inanimate, exactly alike.

The influences which determine and circumscribe the limits of education are not all shut in the schoolroom with the scholars. To leave pre-natal influences and inherited qualities out of the question, and deal with those, only, over which the individual may have some control, we find the condition in which the scholar enters the schoolroom daily, modifies his susceptibility to cultivation. In this matter the influences of home play their part. The best results in mental training are obtained when all the physical organs are acting harmoniously in a normal condition. This condition is modified by habits: cleanliness, clothing, food, ventilation and sleep have their influence and are matters for scholars and parents to look after, and if properly attended to on hygienic principles will become an important factor of the influences that educate.

The Lyceum has prospered during the year and has received encouragement from the interest shown in it by our citizens.

The SIMONDS ECHO, now in the third year of its publication, is an educating influence not to be passed as of little importance. To conduct it, the editors take upon themselves a large amount of responsibility and labor that they could drop, but for their industry, and ambition to place their school in the front rank of schools of its kind. Do not the citizens of this town, the alumni and others to whom the influences of the school extend, owe their support to the SIMONDS ECHO?

Our high school is an institution to be cherished by our people. By its beneficent teachings many boys and girls have been, and hundreds yet to come will be broadened in their ideas of life and in their capacities for happiness.
