## TOWN WARRANT

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Derry, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby instructed to meet at the Veteran's Memorial Building in said Town on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To elect one Selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Library Trustees, Trustees of the Trust Funds, Auditors, and all other necessary Town officials for the year ensuing.

2. To vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools, maintenance of the poor, for laying out and repairing highways, for building and repairing bridges, for the maintenance of trunk line and state aid roads, for the suppression of moths, for the police department and municipal court, for hydrant service and electric lights, for salaries of town officials, of the Board of Health, for the expense of town halls, for the support of libraries, for payment to the sinking fund, for state and county taxes, for the observance of Memorial Day, for aid to the Derry Visiting Nurse Association, for play ground purposes, for co-operating with the state and federal governments in control of the white pine blister and for all other necessary charges arising in said Town and pass any vote relating thereto.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of co-operating with the state in the permanent improve-

ment of its highways in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 84 of the Public Laws entitled "State Aided Highways" and pass any vote relating thereto.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes on the negotiable notes of the Town and pass any vote relating thereto.

5. To see if the Town will direct the Collector of Taxes to allow a discount to all persons paying their taxes within such period as the Town shall limit, to fix the rate of such discount, and pass any vote relating thereto.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars for the Derry band, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate not exceeding four hundred dollars for the purpose of rebuilding and repairing the sidewalks in East Derry, and pass any vote relating thereto.

8. To see if the Town will vote to install approved traffic control lights at the intersection of East Broadway with Birch Street and Crystal Avenue, and pass any vote relating thereto.

9. To see if the Town will authorize the Collector of Taxes to notify all persons whose poll taxes remain unpaid on September first, that if the same be not paid, with twenty cents for such notice, within fourteen days thereafter, the Collector will collect the same as provided by law, and pass any vote relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of one hundred fifty dollars to Derry Post, No. 1617, Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States of America, to be used to defray Memorial



Day expenses, and pass any vote relating thereto

11. To hear the reports of Agent, Auditors and Committees, heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

12. To appoint any necessary committee on any article embraced in this warrant.

## DERRY PUBLIC LIBRARY

To the Trustees of the Derry Public Library;  
The 26th annual report is herewith presented;

Another year has passed, again bringing us the duty to look backward and see what progress has been made.

The circulation of books which is the barometer of library service is still on the increase. This year a gain of 4.5% has been made or 2,408 more volumes have been circulated than in the previous year.

The Academy students are using the Hartford Reading list for their book reports and this has been helpful in suggesting desirable books. We already had a good proportion of the books on the list and have added others as the demand has increased. The Librarian has also assisted in making lists for the grammar grades and for special classes as the need has arisen, and in making the books easily available to the younger students.

In May, Mrs. Lena Howe, the first assistant was taken ill and had to give up her work. She has been unable to attend to it since and has been greatly missed, but the second assistant, Miss Edith Hall, has very acceptably filled the vacancy. Mrs. Ethel Morse and Mrs. Edith Little have also learned the work of the charging desk and have helped at rush times and substituted as needed. Miss Elizabeth Scribner, an academy student has also helped in the afternoons.

Your Librarian spent three months in travel last spring, visiting the Mediterranean countries and parts of Europe. Since coming back, she has endeavored to make her experience of benefit by interesting patrons in travel books by displaying pictures and postcards of the countries visited and by giving talks to the schools.

I would again emphasize our greatest need as outside police supervision. The inside discipline is much more difficult when children are running around the outside of the building, shouting and playing and often trying to attract the attention of those inside. The lawn and shrubbery is also being damaged by the unrestricted actions of those hanging about the outside of the building. Neither is it pleasant for those coming in, to have to pass between groups standing about the doorway, often smoking. The Librarian however feels that she cannot assume the responsibility of looking after those on the outside of the building and that this should be taken care of by the authorities of the town, as in other places. An occasional visit or two each week, would let those inclined to lawlessness, know that the place was being looked after and would, I believe have the desired effect.

Our greatest improvement in upkeep this year was in covering the children's room with an inlaid linoleum which adds greatly to the quietness and the appearance of the room. All the other floors were also cleaned and varnished, two coats being used where necessary.

The outside MacGregor Library sign was regilded and the front entrance painted.

We have purchased a new unit for the card catalogue case which will furnish all the room necessary in that line for some time. Next year new stacks will be needed.

In June the reading room was given over to an exhibit of spring flowers, sponsored by the Derry Woman's Club. This was visited and much admired by many of the townspeople.

To the Derry School Boards:

It gives me pleasure to present my tenth annual report as Superintendent of Schools. It is also gratifying to state that the work of the School Board is better organized and conducted than at any time during my term of office.

## ORGANIZATION

During the past year the work of the lower grades has been organized and conducted the same as in previous years. The work of the Junior High School has been reorganized somewhat. In previous years the practical arts courses were the center of the school activities. This was necessarily so with only four teachers. While the practical arts courses were thus organized, there seemed to be no way of organizing well the work of the rest of the children with only three teachers. With four teachers in addition to the practical arts teachers this condition has been remedied. A longer school day gives the pupils the benefit of a fuller use of the school plant. The special teaching has also been reformed so that the subject matter is of the same type as the seventh and eighth grade, but graded to the comprehension of the child. This reorganization appears to be working well. The key note in these grades is to adapt the subject matter so that all will have it according to their understanding and needs.

## SPECIAL ACTIVITIES.

To the Woman's Club and the Lions Club is given the credit of inaugurating the junior police, whose duty it is to safeguard their own fellow pupils. At first thought these police may not seem to be important, but they are held in the highest esteem by their fellow pupils. Their appointment is as a reward of ideals in citizenship and the capability to function in this capacity. These boys, attending to their duties, bring in to the school a practical phase of life that makes the school seem more real and a part of life. Upon these activities many important lessons in citizenship are drawn. This organization

of junior police is serving, not only to protect their own member from the peril of the street, but it is elevating child life to a higher plane.

We are also indebted to the Woman's Club for financing the conduct of the Milk Clinic.

The Parent-Teachers Association has provided milk for hot lunches at Oak Street, for which we express our appreciation.

Thanks is also due the Red Cross for a contribution of fifty dollars to the Dental Clinic.

### HEALTH REPORT

Dear Sir;

I herewith submit a report for the health-work in the Derry Schools for the year from February, 1930 to January, 1931.

The annual physical examinations are being made by local physicians. As many as possible of these defects discovered, are corrected after notice to the parents.

Many children have attended the nose, throat, eye and ear clinics at the Elliott Hospital at Manchester, and the orthopedic clinic at the District Nursing Association has been well attended.

A dental clinic was held by Dr. George Danforth in the spring. About seventy children were taken care of. Much more dental work is needed.

Three under-weight clinics were held in the Memorial Building by Dr. Robert Kerr, which were helpful in teaching mothers to care for their children.

Through the Red Cross we have had glasses, shoes and rubbers and aid for the Dental Clinic.



Milk is served to the children three months of the year, this being sponsored by the Derry Woman's Club. Hot lunches are served in the rural schools.

#### TESTING

Recent tests show that our pupils are strong in reading, language usage, history, geography and fairly well up in arithmetic. The weaker subjects were literature and physiology. It has been suggested that we check up the children's reading in the libraries and that when book reports are made in school, that the teachers and children go into greater detail concerning the biographies of the authors as well as the type of stories that are told. To this end the Hartford Reading List, The Winnetka and the Children's Reading List are suggested.

By correlating these tests with the mental ages of

the pupils, we have found that sixteen percent of our pupils do not work up to full possible achievement. These cases are not due to inefficient teaching, as might be expected, but many of these cases, if not all, are with us because we have previously had no adequate means of detecting them. Now that both the mentality and the educational age are rather accurately determined, such cases are properly understood by the teachers. These cases may be properly graded and stimulated to work up to their full capacity.

### CONCLUSION

I believe that in recent years we have cut down our school report unduely. I recommend that the School Board investigate carefully what topics should go into a report of a town of this population. The statistical reports are somewhat meager considering the amount we have on hand.
