


TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Derry, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby instructed to meet at the Veteran's Memorial Building in said Town on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To elect one Selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Library Trustees, Trustees of the Trust Funds, Auditors, and all other necessary Town officials for the year ensuing.

2. To vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools, maintenance of the poor, for laying out and repairing highways, for building and repairing bridges, for the maintenance of trunk line and state aid roads, for the suppression of moths, for the police department and municipal court, for hydrant service and electric lights, for salaries of town officials, of the Board of Health, for the expense of the town halls, for the support of libraries, for payment to the sinking fund, for state and county taxes, for the observance of Memorial Day, for aid to the Derry Visiting Nurse Association, for play ground purposes, for co-operating with the state and federal governments in control of the white pine blister and for all other necessary charges arising in said Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of co-

operating with the state in the permanent improvement of its highways in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 84 of the Public Laws entitled "State Aided Highways", and pass any vote relating thereto.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes on the negotiable notes of the Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.

5. To see if the Town will direct the Collector of Taxes to allow a discount to all persons paying their taxes within such period as the Town shall limit, to fix the rate of such discount, and pass any vote relating thereto.

6. To see if the Town will vote to direct a reduction of at least twenty per cent in the salaries and wages of all town officers and employees, in all departments, excepting the chief of police and day laborers, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To see if the Town will vote to approve an ordinance relating to Observance of the Lord's Day as adopted by the Board of Selectmen February 18, 1932, a copy of which is annexed to this warrant, and pass any vote relating thereto.

8. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, and Committees, heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

9. To appoint any necessary committee on any article embraced in this warrant.

TOWN OF DERRY

In the Year of Our Lord, One Thousand Nine Hundred and thirty-two.

AN ORDINANCE
RELATING TO OBSERVANCE OF
THE LORD'S DAY

BE IT ENACTED, By the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Derry:

Section 1. It shall be lawful to conduct sports or games, in connection with which admission is charged or donations are made or accepted, after one o'clock in the afternoon, on the Lord's Day, within the Town of Derry, but only after a license to conduct each such game or sport shall have been granted therefor by the Board of Selectmen, and a license fee of \$1.00 paid for each amateur game and such a fee for each professional game as shall be fixed by said Board of Selectmen.

Section 2. It shall be lawful to conduct sports or games, in connection with which no admission is charged and donations made or accepted, within the Town of Derry without license.

Section 3. It shall be lawful for motion pictures, lectures, concerts and dramatic or vaudeville performances to be held upon the Lord's Day, in the Town of Derry, but not before six o'clock in the afternoon, but in the case of any such entertainment, in connection with which admission is charged or donations are made or accepted, a special Sunday license shall be obtained therefor, from the Board of Selectmen. For each Sunday the license fee shall in no instance be less than \$1.00. Said license may be issued to apply to one or more specified entertain-

ments or may apply to all Sunday entertainments, conducted by the applicant, during a specified period of time, and all such licenses shall be subject to revocation at the will of the Board of Selectmen.

Section 4. It shall be lawful to serve meals and to furnish supplies, service and repairs required by automotive apparatus, on the Lord's Day, within the Town of Derry. It shall also be lawful to sell the following named articles on the Lord's Day, within the Town of Derry, in addition to those permitted to be sold by Chapter 335, Section 5 of the Public Laws:—Fruit, confectionery, ice-cream, soft drinks, foods fully prepared for consumption and in perishable form, tobacco in its various forms, flowers, newspapers, periodicals and toilet necessities, but no person shall sell any such articles until he shall have obtained a permit so to do from the Board of Selectmen at a fee of \$1.00 per year, payable in January, which permit shall be revocable at the will of said Board of Selectmen.

Section 5. It shall be unlawful to conduct roller-skating rinks, miniature golf courses, recreational or amusement enterprises without first obtaining a license therefor and the fee for the same shall be \$5.00 for each Sunday for each concession. Said license shall be revocable at the will of said Board of Selectmen.

Section 6. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

The Board of Health respectfully submit the following report.

The health conditions for the past year have been quite normal with exceptions. There has been the usual number of cases of Measles and Scarlet fever and the infection was in many cases brought in to our community from outside towns and cities. There has been some cases of Influenza and some have been quite sever in results. There is no cause for alarm at the present time. There exists a tendency to dump refuse where it does not belong and the placing of filth and decomposition in every nook and corner must cease as experience teaches

it brings about very dangerous conditions. The Town has a place to put all your refuse and please do not let it accumulate about your premises and above all do not dump it upon your neighbor's property or beside our highways. The teachers of our schools and school nurses have been of great assistance to us in their health inspections and care of those who were in their custody for which we are very appreciative. Our water supply has maintained a healthy condition and reports from State Board are very satisfactory. Our sewer conditions could be greatly improved and the sanitation made more efficient but the conditions of affairs do not permit a system of sewers to be installed. I want to thank all committees for their good work in aiding those of our community who have been placed in unpleasant circumstances because of no incomes for their honest labor. It has been a most potent factor in keeping their health, and it has been greatly appreciated.

I want to thank all for their help and courtesies during my term of office.

During the past year the library has shown its usual healthy growth, more people becoming acquainted with its facilities each year.

The report of the Librarian covers clearly the work of the library and is herewith submitted.

To the Trustees of the Derry Public Library,

The 17th annual report is herewith presented:

The wide spread depression in our country is evident everywhere, the library being no exception but with our institution it has worked contrary to most others for here it has increased our work. The circulation has mounted steadily and again and again we have reported gains. Our circulation for the year is 14 per cent larger than last year, a gain of 8,608 volumes, which totals for the year 61,256. While a large part of this can be laid to the unemployment in town, we must also give credit to juvenile department which is a natural growth. The increase in this department is 2,418 a percent equal to that of the adult department.

This large circulation makes it inevitable that a large number of books will be worn out. We have had to withdraw 647 volumes and as we were able to add only 859 our net increase is but a little over

200. In consideration of this situation I trust that our appropriation will continue as last year.

There have been added 403 new names to our list of patrons, 100 more than last year. More names were also discontinued but there is a small net gain.

The routine work has been carried on much as usual. Lists of new books have been prepared and distributed. Assistance has been given to classes and societies using special reading lists. Children's Book Week was observed in November and during the summer Vacation Reading Club was formed. In September 52 pupils received diplomas for completing the course by reading ten prescribed books in this club. All the public schools in the village have been visited and a survey made of the number using the library which showed a gratifying record. An exhibit of flowers, grown in Derry gardens, was held in the Reading Room. This was under the management of the Derry Woman's Club.

The woodwork on the outside of the building was painted last summer and the floors received their yearly coat of varnish.

New book stacks have been added which will meet our needs for some time. We are also indebted to Mrs. Benj. Adams for a bookcase which we are using to advantage in the storage room in the basement.

The presence of an officer about the building has greatly improved the orderliness of the rooms. By actual count we often have 250 in the library during one evening, most of these coming in the first hour and a half. Such a large number composed primarily of young people under 18 years needs considerable supervision and Mr. Warren the officer assigned to us has competently given this.

Through the kindness of the Trustees Miss Edith Hall the assistant librarian attended the summer sessions of the New Hampshire Library School held at Durham. This privilege was much enjoyed by her and has helped in her understanding of the library work. Your Librarian was also given the opportunity of attending the American Library Association held at New Haven, Conn. where she enjoyed the contact with others of the profession and heard addresses from many noted people. She also attended the N. H. Library Association held this year at Hanover.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Derry School Boards:

FINANCIAL REPORT

In the foregoing pages will be found all of the essential facts relating to the financial affairs of the School District of Derry. The arrangement is in a more condensed form than usual.

Table 1, consisting of three columns is a summary of last year's (July 1, 1930 to June 30, 1931) actual transactions, the current Year's (July 1, 1931 to June 30, 1932) probable transactions, and next year's (July 1, 1932 to June 30, 1933) estimated budget.

Payments. The first "total" in each of these columns, namely, \$76,013.75, \$81,466.47, and \$72,322, shows the actual costs of public school education for last year, the probable cost for the current year and the estimated cost for next year.

Receipts. In these same columns under the side heading "receipts" the footings designated the Total Deduction, are as follows last year \$1,154.07, this current year \$8,815.94, and next year \$3,342.87. These sums consist of "cash on hand, if any, State Aid, Dog Tax, Interest, etc., and include every item of income except that which is derived from the annual tax levy.

The Tax Levy. In the two columns representing last year's and the current year's transactions the "tax levys" are definitely known amounts namely \$69,599.50 and \$70,020.96 respectively and each of these when added to its corresponding "Total Deductions" gives the "Total Available Resources" for the year under consideration. The difference between "total available resources" and "total pay-

ments" gives "cash on hand" or the "deficit", as the case may be, for the year.

It must be remembered that only the column on the left side of this table shows a completed year. The middle column is for the current year which was only half completed when these "probable" results were forecasted. If the total expenditures exceed \$78,836.90 as they may do, there will be a small deficit of perhaps \$1000 to \$1500. It is possible although hardly probable that this may be entirely wiped out by June 30, 1932.

The Budget. The third column is the budget for the year from July 1, 1932 to June 30, 1933 and it is from this that the tax levy of March 1932 must be determined.

By a very careful study of the essential factors involved and by numerous conferences with the School Board as a whole and each of its members individually, I have drawn up and revised a budget which is in harmony with a State wide effort to economize at every point where such economy will not decrease the efficiency of the schools.

The "total payments" estimated for the next school year are \$72,322.00. The total deductions are estimated at \$3,342.87. The difference, which is the required Tax Levy is \$68,979.13.

The table as arranged makes it possible to compare side by side each item of expense and income and to see at a glance just where and how the total payments of the last year have been reduced or increased in the estimated items of next year.

From a professional point of view I have no hesitation in saying that \$72,322.00 is a sufficient sum to fully maintain the splendid efficiency of your schools.

On page 91 this report may be found completed financial transactions of last year beginning July 1, 1930 and ending June 30, 1931 and on page 92 a corresponding estimate or budget for next year beginning July 1, 1932 and ending June 30, 1933.

These items are arranged in a different order from those in Table 1 but the totals are identical.

In conformity to the prevailing tendency this year I have omitted much unessential detail. These details are available to all in the books kept at the Superintendent's office.

The Derry Village School District financial summary needs a word of explanation because of its relatively small tax levy.

The average cost for "School Support" and "Other Statutory Requirements" for last year (ending June 30, 1931) was \$6,559.37 and the probable cost for the current year (excluding permanent improvements for which there was a special appropriation) appears to be \$6,575.03. The "Total available resources" last year amounted to \$10,492.01 and for the current year (excluding the special appropriations above mentioned) these resources will amount to \$10,971.92.

In each case there is an unusually large cash balance at the end of the year.

The Auditor's certification shows a cash balance of \$2,385.35 on June 30, 1930 and of \$3,932.64 on June 30, 1931: The probable balance for June 30, 1932 seems to be \$4,499.14. It is obvious that the tax levy for the two last years, has averaged about \$1,000.00 larger than necessary each year.

The result is that on July 1, 1932 the district will have in cash and other non-tax-levy items at least \$4,500.00 of resources as an offset to \$5,787.00 of

estimated expenditures. This would leave only \$1,287.00 to be raised to balance the budget.

Under the State law, however, the least that can be raised is \$3.50 on each \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation, a rate which will be apt to yield nearly \$2,500.00, or substantially \$1,000.00 more that is required.

The small tax levy for 1932 is of course temporary but from present conditions it is likely that a future tax levy of \$5,500.00 to \$6,000.00 will meet all normal requirements.

I cannot conclude this report to the Derry School Boards without expressing my personal regret that there should have been occasion for anyone to carry on the work which my long-time friend Carl Cotton so fully understood and so ably managed.

Not Derry alone has suffered loss but the State as a whole has been deprived of one of its most competent School Superintendents.
