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CLINTON ALONE IN NH, NO GOP FRONTRUNNER

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DURHAM, NH – Although few voters have made up their minds about who to vote for in the 2016 New Hampshire Primary, Hillary Clinton remains the clear favorite among New Hampshire Democrats but the GOP still lacks a frontrunner. Republicans are now less likely to support Chris Christie because of the Bridgagate scandal.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and eighty-four (584) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between January 21 and January 26, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.1 percent. Included in the sample were 246 likely 2016 Republican Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 6.2%) and 205 likely 2016 Democratic Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 6.8%).

Two Years To Go ...

Although there are two years until the First in the Nation New Hampshire Presidential Primary, prospective Republican and Democratic candidates have been testing the waters here for presidential runs in 2016. While many of the candidates discussed in this poll will decide not to run, and others may enter who were not discussed, candidates who are the early identified frontrunners have typically won past New Hampshire primaries.

A Look Back In Time

The winner of the New Hampshire primary is typically identified far before the actual vote. In the February 2006 Granite State Poll, John McCain led the Republican field with 30% of the vote, followed by Rudy Giuliani (22%), Condoleezza Rice (17%), and Mitt Romney (9%). McCain would later win the 2008 New Hampshire Primary by a slim margin over Romney and secure the Republican nomination. In that same year, Hillary Clinton led the Democratic field with 29% of the vote over John Edwards (20%), John Kerry (17%), and Barack Obama (4%). Clinton would fight off a late surge by Obama to win the 2008 New Hampshire primary, although Obama would later win the Democratic nomination and the presidency.

In the February 2010 Granite State Poll, eventual Republican primary winner Mitt Romney held a large lead over Rudy Giuliani --47% to 13%. Romney maintained this lead and won the 2012 New Hampshire Primary by a wide margin on his way to the Republican nomination.

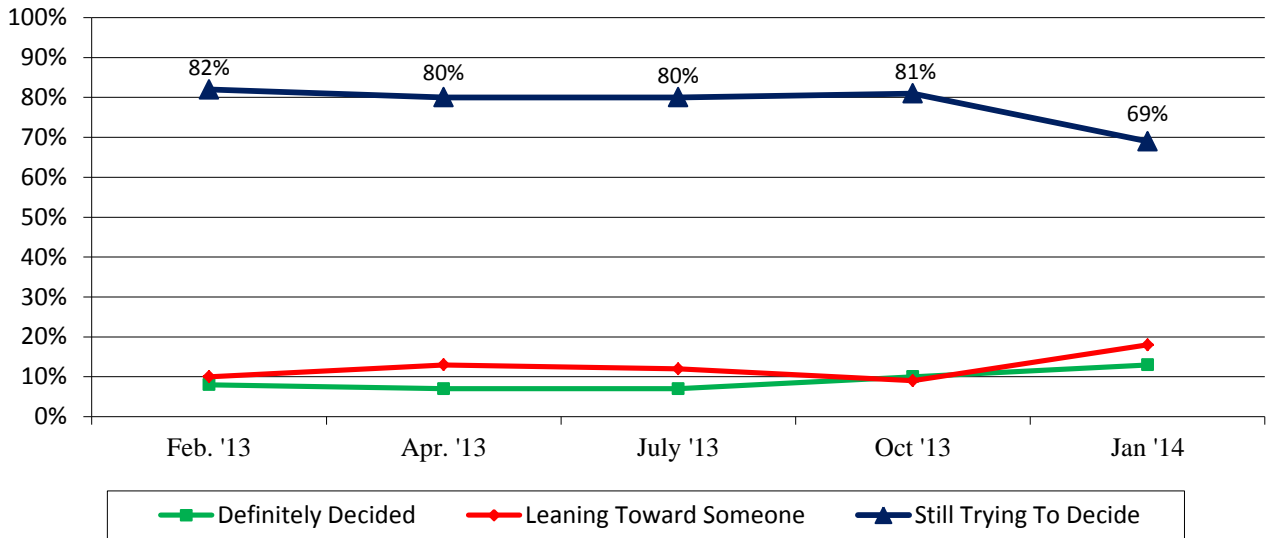
In 2016, Hillary Clinton is the clear leader among Democrats, but no Republican has managed to separate themselves from the field.

Decided on Primary Vote

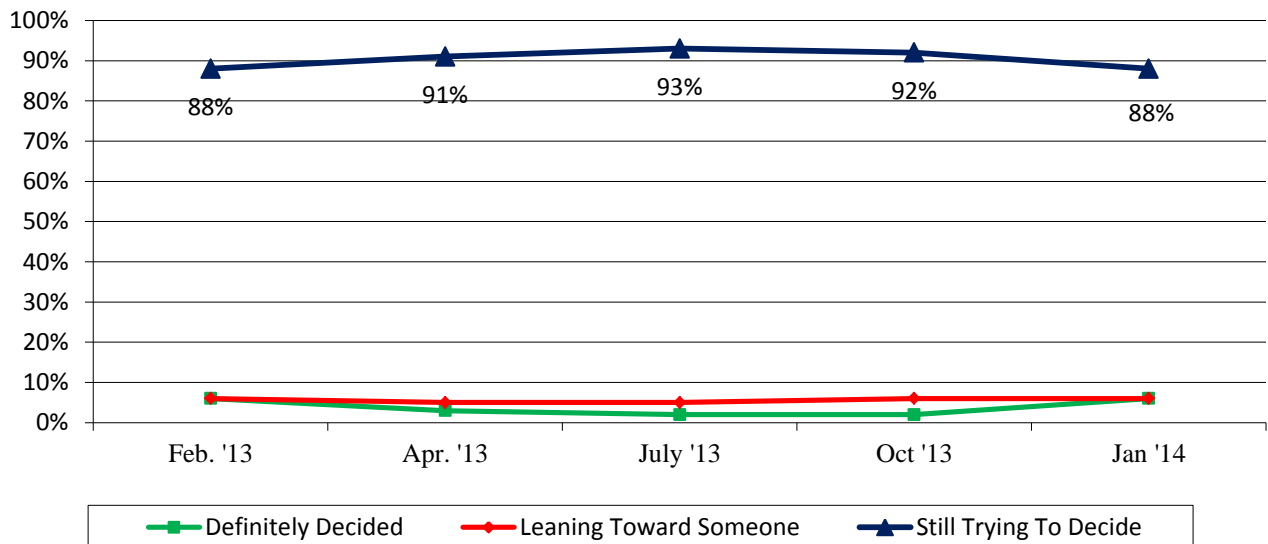
New Hampshire primary voters typically decide who they will vote for in the last weeks, or even days of the campaign and it is no surprise that very few voters currently have made up their minds about who they will support in 2016. Currently, only 13% of likely Democratic primary voters say they have definitely decided who they will support, 18% are leaning toward a candidate, but the great majority of voters (69%) are still trying to decide who to support.

Republican voters are even unsure than Democrats. Only 6% of likely Republican Primary voters say they have definitely decided who they will support, 6% are leaning toward a candidate, and 88% are still trying to decide.

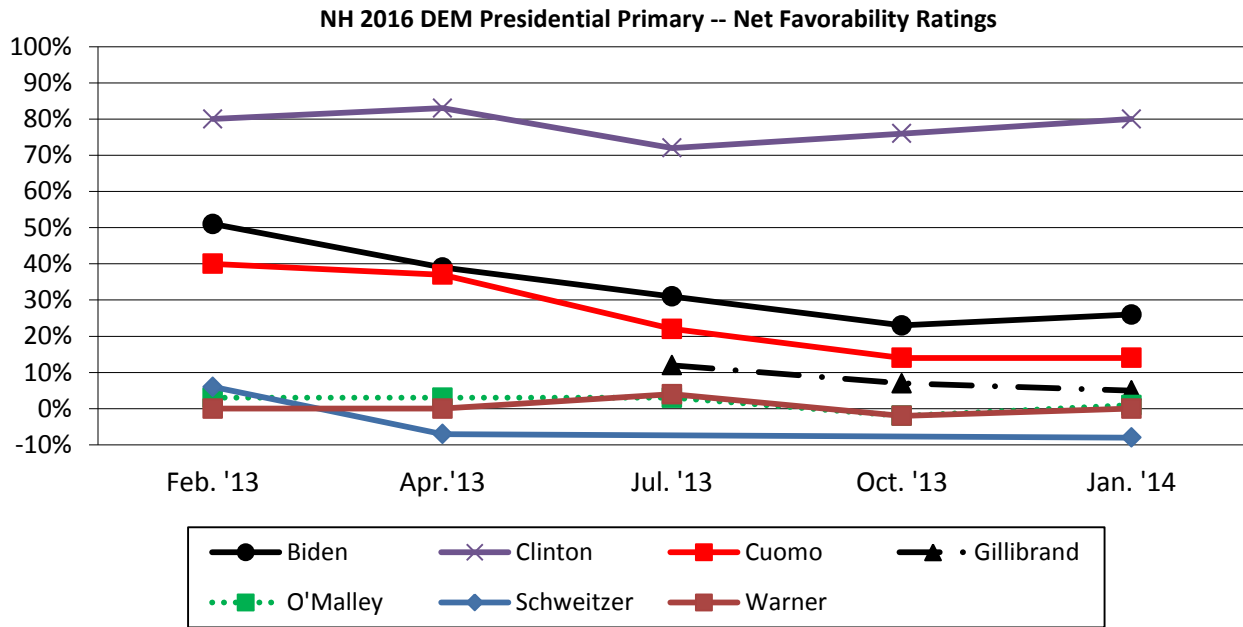
NH 2016 GOP Presidential Primary -- Decided On Vote



Democratic Favorability Ratings

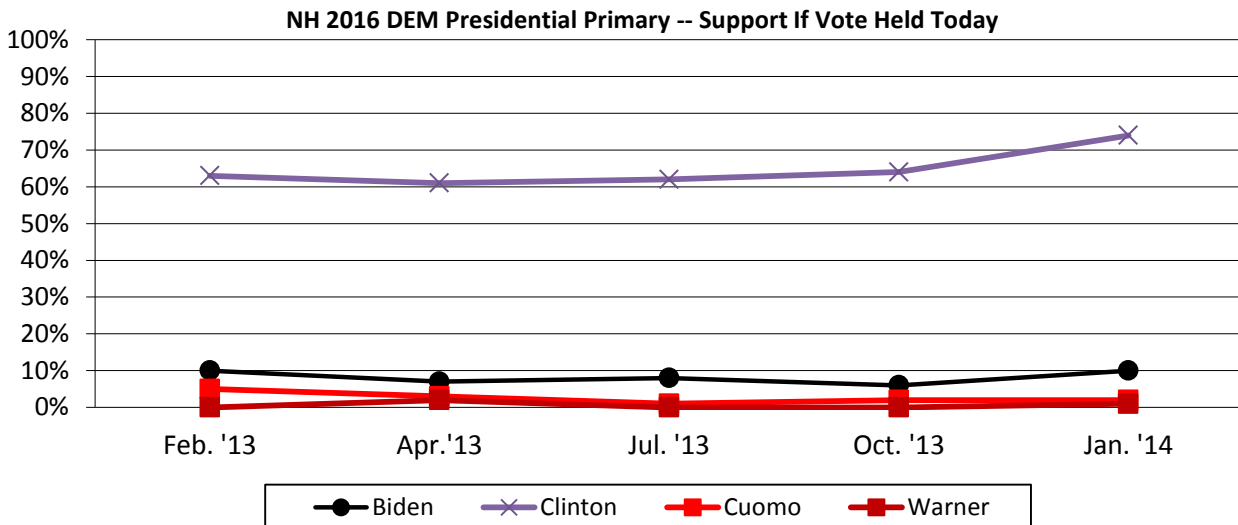
Former Secretary of State and 2008 New Hampshire Primary winner Hillary Clinton remains the most popular Democratic candidate by a wide margin. The great majority of likely Democratic Primary voters, 88%, have a favorable opinion of Clinton, only 8% have an unfavorable opinion of her, and 4% are neutral or unsure. Her net favorability rating, the percentage who have a favorable opinion minus those who have an unfavorable opinion, is an extremely high +80%.

The other potential Democratic candidates that have moderate net favorability ratings are Vice President Joe Biden (+26%) and New York Governor Andrew Cuomo (+14%). Meanwhile New York Senator Kirsten Gillibrand (+5%), Maryland Governor Martin O'Malley (1%), Virginia Senator Mark Warner (0%), and former Montana Governor Brian Schweitzer (-8%) are less well known and have much lower net favorability ratings.



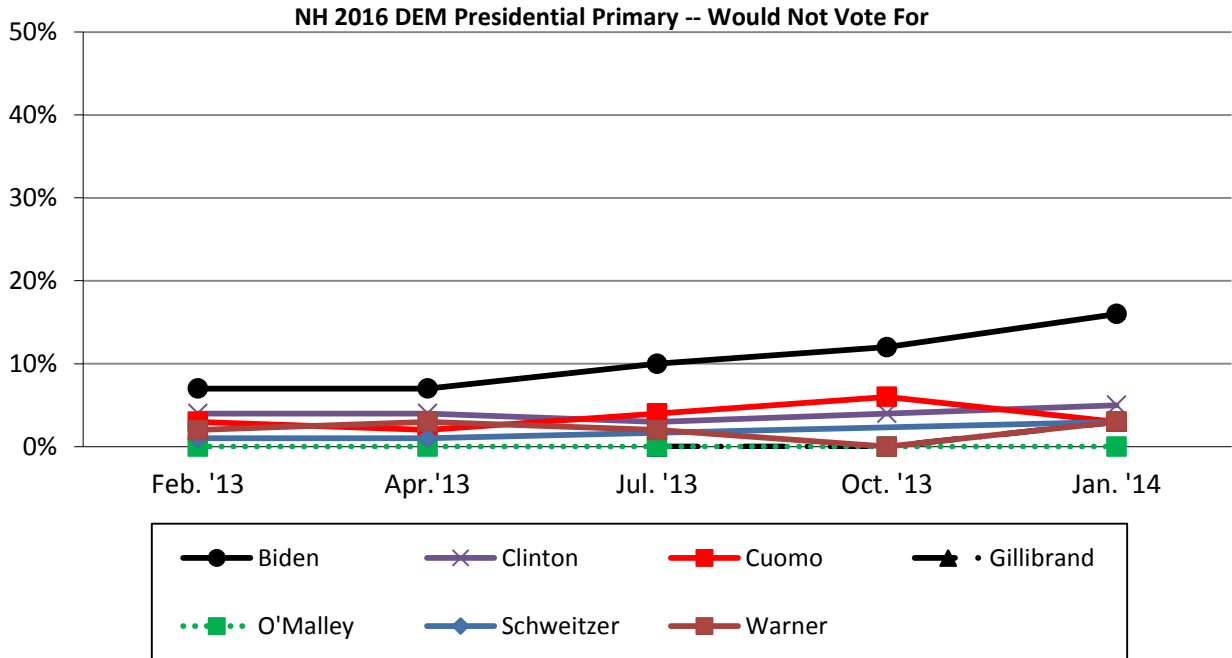
2016 NH Democratic Primary

Although the primary will not be held until early 2016, Clinton continues to be the clear favorite among Democratic voters. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 74% of likely Democratic Primary voters say they would vote for Clinton if the election were held today, 10% prefer Joe Biden, 2% prefer Andrew Cuomo, and 1% prefer Mark Warner. All other potential candidates mentioned received less than 1% support and 10% say they are undecided.



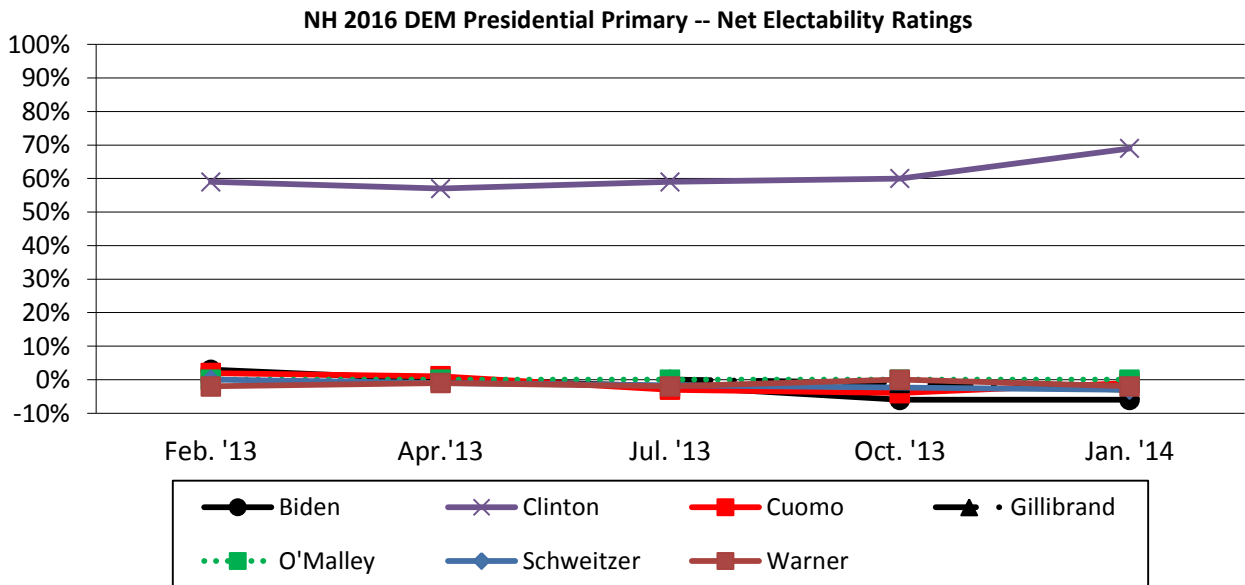
Most Unpopular Democrat Candidate

When asked which potential candidate they would NOT vote for under any circumstance, 16% of likely Democratic Primary voters say they would not vote for Biden, 5% would not vote for Clinton, 3% would not vote for Cuomo, 3% would not vote for Schweitzer, 3% would not vote for Gillibrand, 3% would not vote for Warner, 1% say they would not vote for some other candidate, 28% think that all of the prospective candidates are acceptable, and 37% are unsure.



Democrat Net Electability

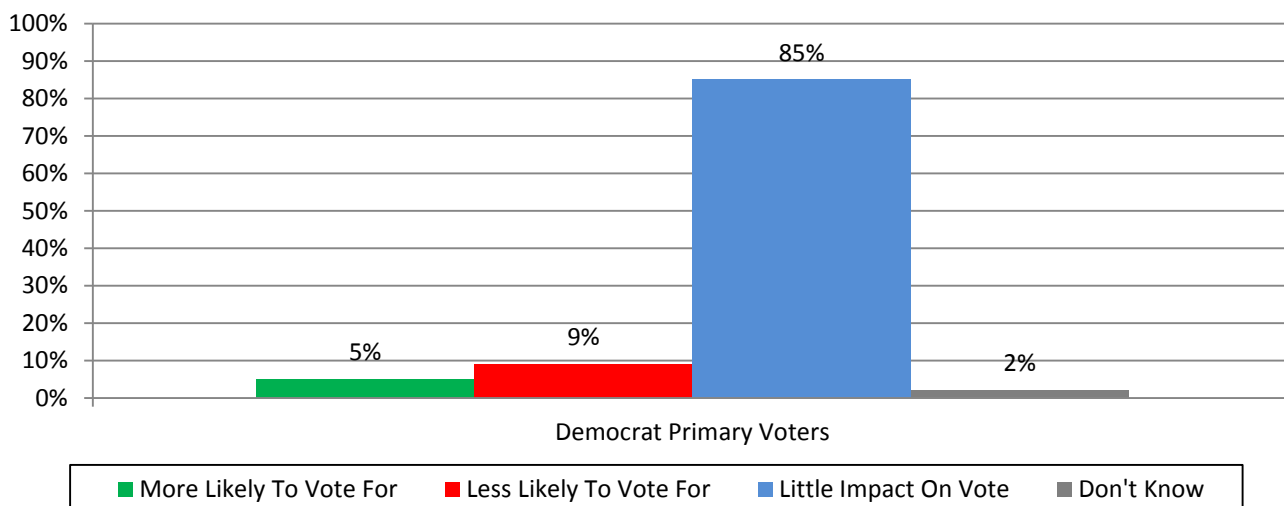
Clinton has a wide lead in net electability (the percentage who support a candidate minus the percentage who would not vote for that candidate under any circumstances) with +69%. O'Malley (0%), Cuomo (-1%), Warner (-2%), Gillibrand (-3%), Schweitzer (-3%), and Biden (-6%) all have either neutral or negative ratings.



Effect of Benghazi on Hillary Clinton

Clinton came under fire earlier this year for the September 2012 attack on the U.S. consulate in Benghazi, Libya that occurred when she was Secretary of State. Among Democrat primary voters, Clinton has been unaffected by Benghazi – 5% say they are more likely to vote for her because of her handling of Benghazi, 9% are less likely to vote for her, 85% say it will make little impact on their vote and 2% are unsure.

Does Benghazi Make You More Or Less Likely To Vote For Clinton?



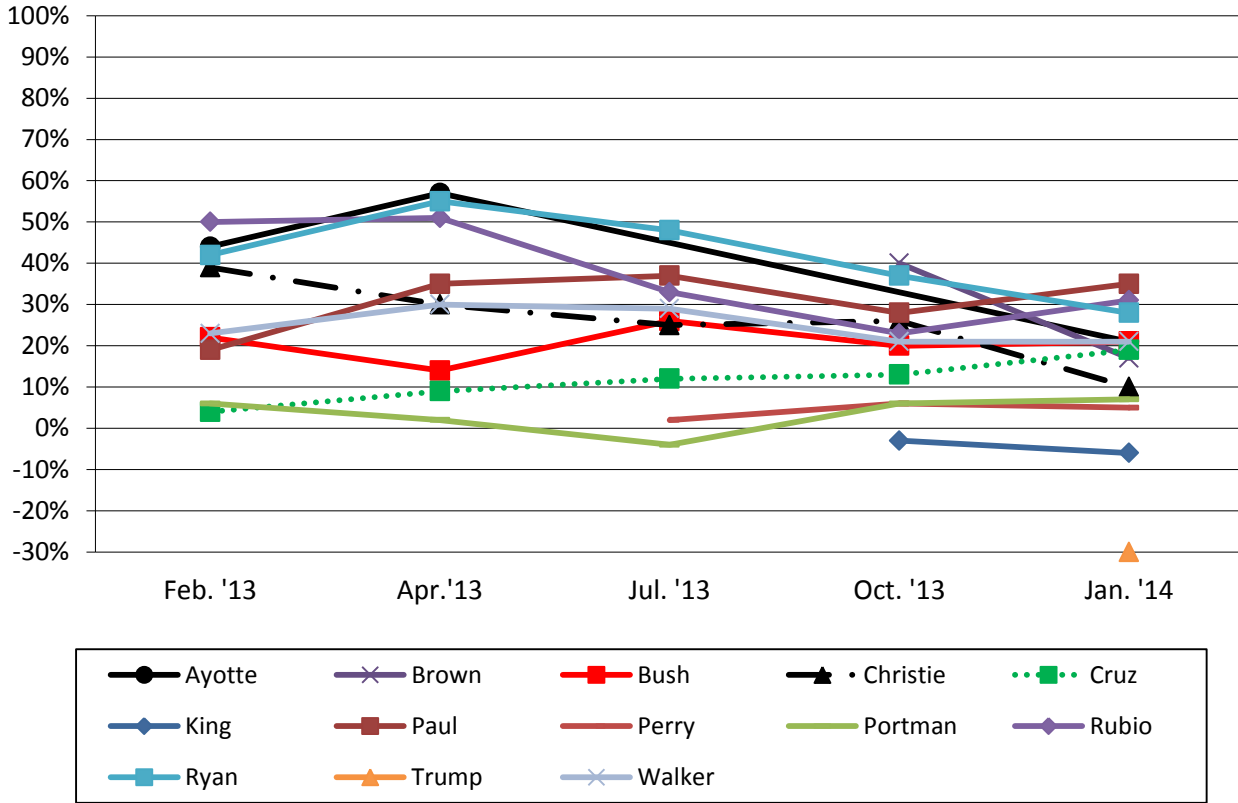
GOP Favorability Ratings

Typically, the Republican front-runner in New Hampshire is the candidate who finished second in the prior nomination struggle. Past examples include Mitt Romney in 2012, John McCain in 2008, Bob Dole in 1996, George H.W. Bush in 1988, and Ronald Reagan in 1980. But in this cycle, no Republican candidate is seen as having the "next in line" mantle. Furthermore, most of the Republicans who are considering runs in 2016 are largely unknown to Republican voters. Kentucky Senator Rand Paul narrowly tops the Republican field, perhaps building on his father Ron Paul's second place finish in 2012. Paul is viewed favorably by 49% of likely Republican Primary voters, 14% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 36% are neutral or don't know. Paul's net favorability rating is +35%.

Other GOP candidates with moderate net favorability ratings include Florida Senator Marco Rubio (+31%), Wisconsin Congressman Paul Ryan (+28%), New Hampshire Senator Kelly Ayotte (+21%), Wisconsin Governor Scott Walker (+21%), former Florida Governor Jeb Bush (+21%), Texas Senator Ted Cruz (+19%) and former Massachusetts Senator Scott Brown (+17%).

New Jersey Governor Chris Christie (+10%), Texas Governor Rick Perry (+5%) and businessman Donald Trump (-30%) have low net favorability ratings, despite most Republican Primary voters knowing them. Ohio Senator Rob Portman (+7%), and New York Congressman Peter King (-6%) have low net favorability ratings, but they also are not well known.

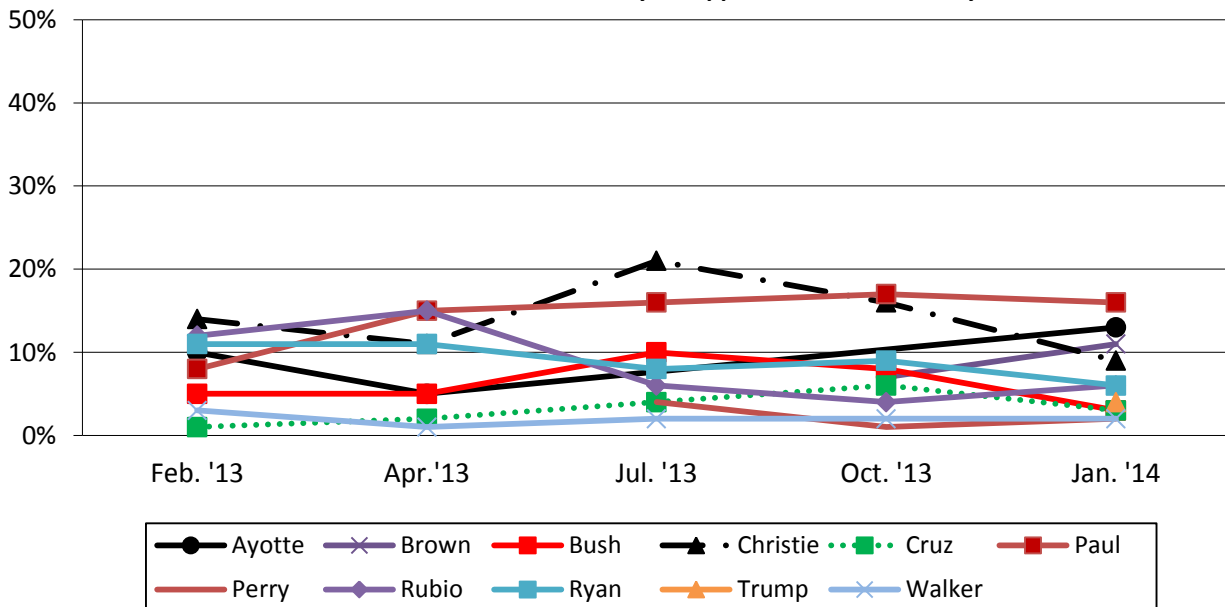
NH 2016 GOP Presidential Primary -- Net Favorability Ratings



2016 NH Republican Primary

If the election were held today, 16% of likely Republican Primary voters say they would vote for Paul, 13% would vote for Ayotte, 11% would vote for Brown, 9% would vote for Christie, 6% for Ryan, 6% for Rubio, 4% for Trump, 3% for Bush, 3% for Cruz, 2% for Walker, and 2% for Perry. All other potential candidates receive less than 1% support, and 21% say they are undecided.

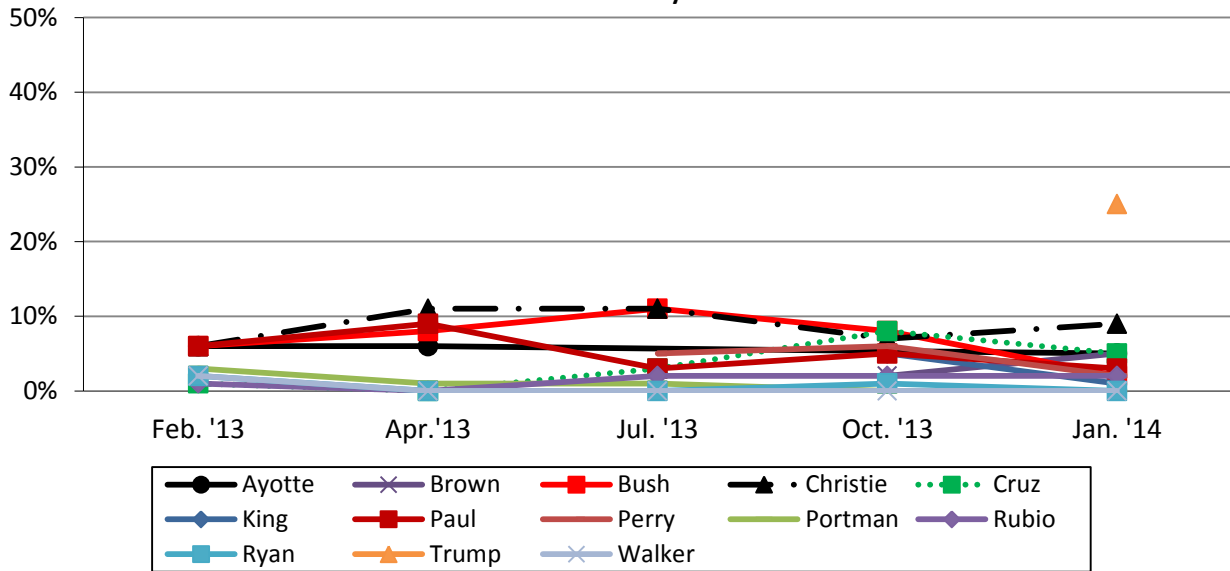
NH 2016 GOP Presidential Primary -- Support If Vote Held Today



Most Unpopular Republican Candidate

When asked which candidate they would NOT vote for under any circumstance, 25% of likely Republican Primary voters say they would not vote for Trump, 9% would not vote for Christie, 5% would not vote for Cruz, 5% would not vote for Ayotte, 5% would not vote for Brown, 3% would not vote for Paul, 2% would not vote for Bush, 2% would not vote for Perry, 2% would not vote for Rubio, 1% would not vote for King, 21% think all the prospective candidates are acceptable, and 19% are unsure.

NH 2016 GOP Presidential Primary -- Would Not Vote For

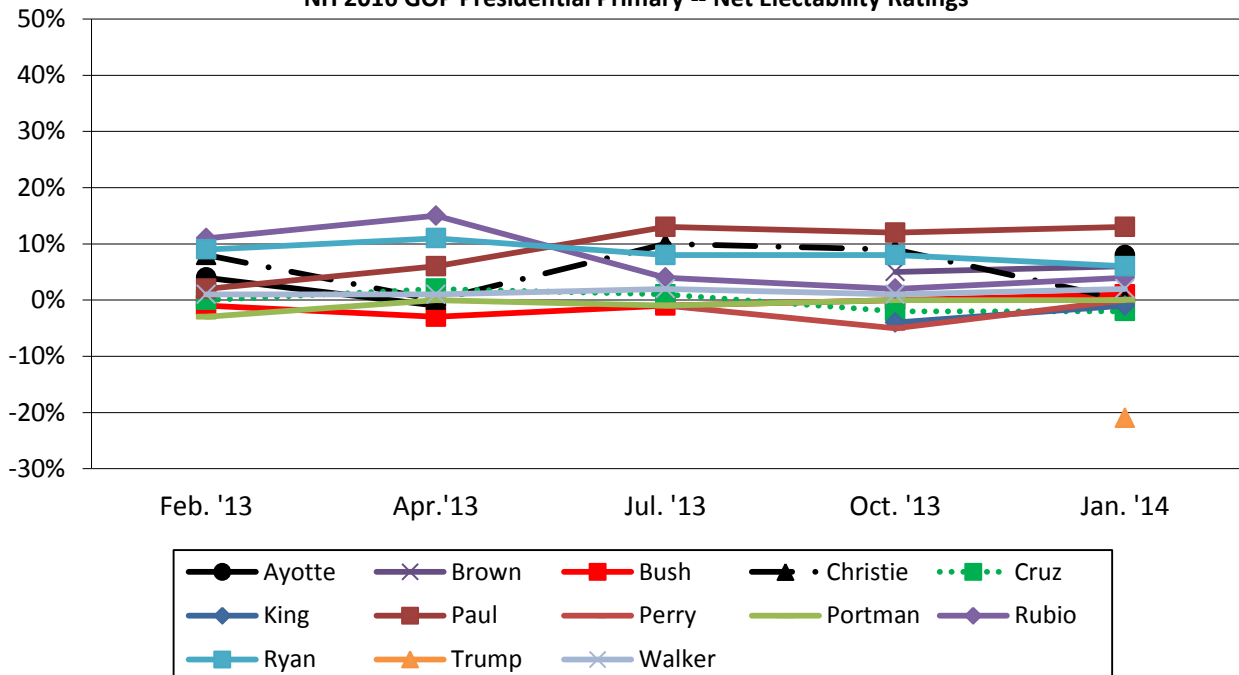


Republican Net Electability

When looking at electability scores, Rand Paul (+13%) leads the field while Ayotte (+8%), Ryan (+6%), Brown (+6%), Rubio (+4%), Walker (+2%) and Bush (+1%) also have positive net electability scores.

Christie (0%), Portman (0%), Perry (0%), King (-1%), Cruz (-2%), and Trump (-21%) have either neutral or negative net electability scores. Christie has seen his net electability drop nine points since October.

NH 2016 GOP Presidential Primary -- Net Electability Ratings

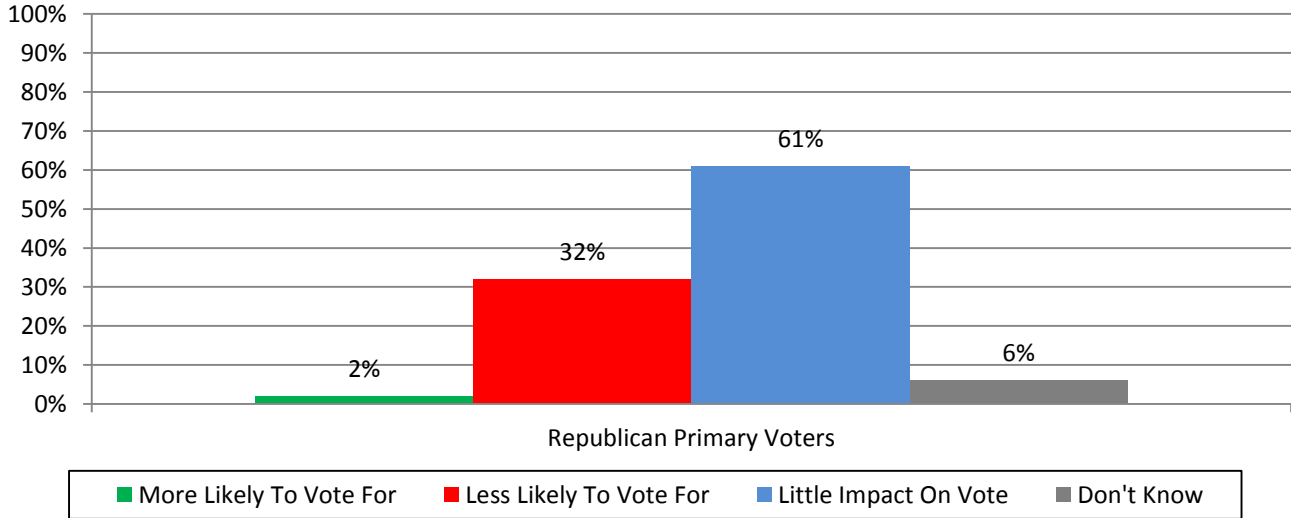


Effect of "Bridgegate" on Chris Christie

Chris Christie, who is thought by many pundits to be a leading contender for the Republican nomination, is under investigation after members of his staff closed lanes on the George Washington Bridge to punish a local mayor for not supporting him.

Republican Primary voters are less likely to vote for Christie because of the Bridgegate scandal –32% say they are less likely to vote for Christie because of Bridgegate, only 2% say they are more likely to vote for him, 61% say it will make little impact on their vote, and 6% are unsure.

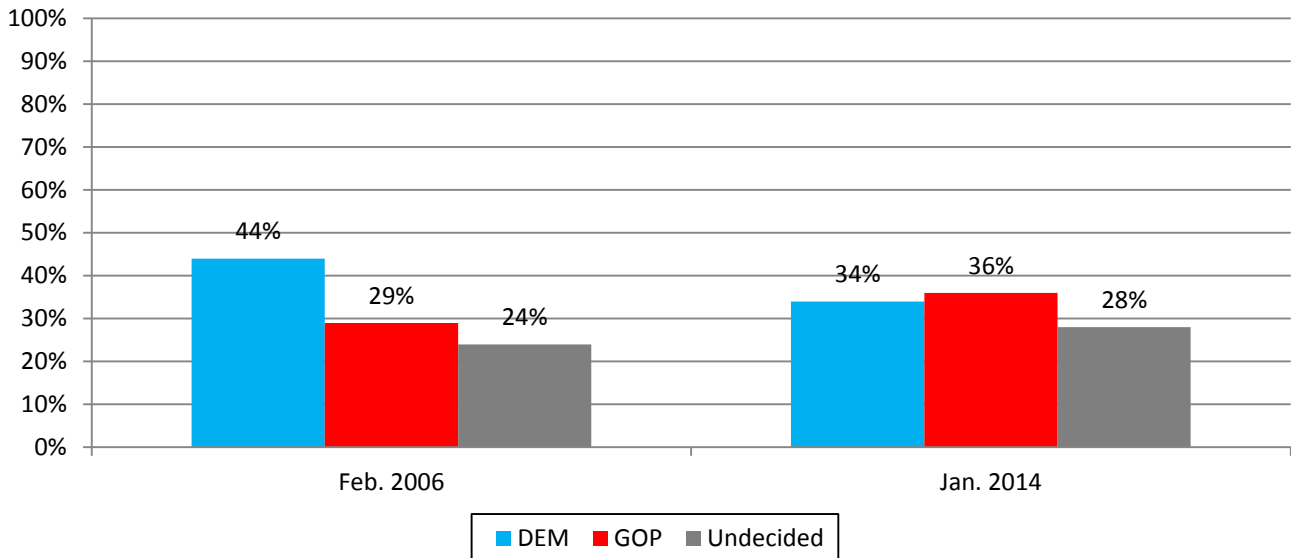
Does Bridgegate Make You More Or Less Likely To Vote For Christie?



Generic 2016 Presidential Election

And while the 2016 general election is nearly three years away, if the election was held today, 36% of New Hampshire voters say they would vote for the Republican candidate, 34% would vote for the Democrat candidate and 28% are undecided. At this same time in the 2008 cycle, 44% said they would vote for the Democratic candidate, only 29% would vote for the Republican candidate and 24% were undecided.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and eighty-four (584) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between January 21 and January 26, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.1 percent. Included in the sample were 246 likely 2016 Republican Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 6.2%) and 205 likely 2016 Democratic Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 6.8%).

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, age, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
