


TOWN WARRANT  
THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of Derry, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby instructed to meet at the Veterans' Memorial Building in said Town on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To elect one Selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Library Trustees, Trustees of the Trust Funds, Auditors, and all other necessary Town officials for the year ensuing.
2. To vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools, maintenance of the poor, for laying out and repairing highways, for building and repairing bridges, for the maintenance of trunk line and state aid roads, for the suppression of moths, for the police department and municipal court, for hydrant service and electric lights, for salaries of town officials, for the Board of Health, for the expense of the town halls, for the support of libraries, for state and county taxes, for the observance of Memorial Day, for aid to the Derry Visiting Nurse Association, for play ground purposes, for co-operating with the state and federal governments in control of the white pine blister and for all other necessary charges arising in said Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.
3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of co-operating with the state in the permanent improvement of its highways in accordance with the provisions of Chapters 84 and 85 of the Public Laws entitled "State Aided Highways", and pass any vote relating thereto.



4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes on the negotiable notes of the Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.

5. To see if the Town will direct the Collector of Taxes to allow a discount to all persons paying their taxes within such period as the Town shall limit, to fix the rate of such discount, and pass any vote relating thereto.

6. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue as open highways and make subject to gates and bars the following roads, viz:

a. The road leading from Cummings' place on the Hampstead Road Northerly to the highway leading from Lore Eaton's place to Walnut Hill.

b. Also the Highway leading from the Hampstead Road at the school in District No. 6 Northerly to the highway leading from the Lore Eaton place to Walnut Hill.

c. The cross road leading from the Waterman Hill Road near the residence of Anna Rogers to the Hall's Village Road, so-called.

d. Also that portion of the highway leading from Millard Miltimore's to Windham Junction which lies between the residence of Millard Miltimore and the farm of Lore Frost.

e. Also that section of the Londonderry Turnpike, so-called, lying between the intersection of said Turnpike with the English Range Road and the intersection of said Turnpike with the Auburn Road.

7. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds, and pass any vote relating thereto.

8. To see whether beer or other lawful alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under Chapter 99, Section 22 of the Public Laws of 1933, and pass any vote relating thereto.

9. To see if the Town will vote to install a fire hydrant at the end of Wilson Avenue, and pass any vote relating thereto.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to compensate Fred Bunker, a former employee of the Town, for an injury received by him while employed as such, and through no fault of his own, and pass any vote relating thereto.

11. To see if the voters will vote to have a section of drain constructed on High Street to remedy unsanitary conditions on a section of that street, and pass any vote relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars, or any portion of said sum, for the purpose of advertising and giving publicity to the natural industrial advantages of the Town of Derry, and pass any vote relating thereto.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate to purchase a small parcel of land in East Derry for the East Derry Fire Department, and pass any vote relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eight Hundred Dollars, or any part thereof, for the repair of Jefferson Street, Cedar Street, Everett Street and Hillside Avenue, and pass any vote relating thereto.

15. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, and Committees, heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.



16. To appoint any necessary committee on any article embraced in this warrant.

## BOARD OF HEALTH REPORT

The general conditions as a whole are good, but there are some things of vital importance to our Town. The sewer we have not got as yet, but we hope to be able at some future time to report that a favorable vote has been taken on this most vital matter. The cesspool, has had its day or should have as it does not provide even a safe way to dispose of our sewerage. There are many that are casting out filth upon the surface, contaminating lawns, cellars and in some cases polluting the family water supply. If something is not done soon, some of our beautiful summer resorts will be the means of severe illness and possible death to many. All wells wherever the public take water from should be carefully tested by our State Laboratory of Hygiene and any recommendation made by them, adopted.

The careful screening of all out-houses should be done so that flies may not contaminate the food of those living in home or their neighbors. Keep the fly out and you will be happy. The placing of decaying matter near or in buildings should not be, neither the throwing of unsightly rubbish in back yards and littering up the streets with flying papers. Don't throw your waste on side of highways whether near your own buildings or on some road. The fines will be collected if this condition continues and offenders hailed into court. We need an incendiary plant of modern type to take care of all this waste that is thrown on the Town Dump. The smoke and odor from burning such material is most unbearable to the tax payers and others who are obliged to smell it. The caretaker does all in his power to keep it in good condition. The rats find feed and there are many and if they leave and enter homes may bring disease and death.

There have been some cases of scarlet fever, measles,

but no epidemic, and it is a wonder in these days when people travel to so many places and visit that there is not more. We have not had a single case of typhoid fever for some years and those that we had were brought in by those recovering from it. That certainly speaks well for our water supply and the handling of foods by our merchants. There has been much work done by the nurses both, town and state, to help us in our work of health and I can but speak in highest terms of those valuable services.

I wish to thank all for their kindness and helpful assistance during my term of office.

## Report of the Trustees.

The trustees record with sorrow the loss of two faithful and efficient members, Howard G. Moody and Dr. Joseph C. Tappan. In their death, the board has lost members of real value.

During the present period of readjustment the public has turned to the haven of the library for entertainment and improvement. The following reports of the librarian and treasurer contain all essential information regarding the manner in which the library has met the demands of its patrons.

## LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

To the Trustees of the Derry Public Library;  
The 29th annual report is herewith presented;

Again we stop for a glance backward to see what has been accomplished the past year and if our efforts are meeting the demands of the public.

The usefulness of a library is not shown by the number of books on its shelves but by the number of books circulated. In this particular our library ranks high, for while our books number only about 10,000 our yearly circulation is 70,000 averaging a turnover of the books seven times. The worn condition of the volumes also speak of their use. As a whole our books receive good treatment, by comparing the records of other libraries I find our books circulate more times than the average before they are rebound or discarded. Almost all our fiction is bought in a re-enforced binding, we have also repaired over 600 volumes at the library.

We again report an increase in circulation. This year it is 4998 volumes or 6%. The increase is wholly in the adult section in fact the juvenile circulation is slightly less than last year. I believe this is because less outside reading is being required of the grade pupils. More pupils are using the encyclopedias and the usual request is for some article that can be copied rather than for longer selections which must be taken home and read.

The capacity of our rooms is often taxed in the early evenings by the young people, many of whom come for want of any other place to gather. As far as this does not interfere with the more serious work of the library it is permitted but often our patience is taxed to the utmost to maintain a quiet room for those who wish to read.

The Reading room was used by the Derry Woman's Club in their annual Flower shows. It has also been used several evenings after Library hours for a Current Events Class, also sponsored by the Woman's Club and the basement is still being used by the Derry Band for their rehearsals. We feel that in these ways the library is taking its place as a community center and making its influence felt in social betterment as well as adult education and entertainment.

During November, Book Week was observed with a display of nearly one hundred Children's Books, which the next week were put into circulation, your librarian also spoke before the Parent-Teachers association on the subject of Children's reading.

In the summer 58 grade pupils entered the Vacation Reading Club and of these 39 completed the course and were awarded certificates which were presented to them in their school rooms.

A state-wide drive was made in September for books and magazines to send to the C. C. Camps. The

patrons of this library responded to the appeal in a gratifying manner and over 100 suitable books as well as magazines were donated for this purpose.

Your librarian attended the annual meeting of the New Hampshire Library Association held in Peterboro and also a neighborhood meeting held in Salem.

Miss Edith Hall, the assistant has been a most capable helper in the work of the library especially in helping the Junior High students with their reference questions and school projects.

REPORT OF LIBRARIAN

To the Trustees of Taylor Library,

The 56th annual report is herewith presented;

Since its establishment in 1878, Taylor Library has been opened regularly on Wednesday afternoons and Saturday afternoons and evenings, but on the first

of May, 1933, a change was made from Wednesday to Tuesday afternoons with the addition of one hour Tuesday evenings. This evening hour was discontinued in the coldest weather but will be resumed in the spring.

This arrangement seems to accommodate most of our patrons and will be continued for the present.

The usual Library activities have been carried on during the year, assisting the Academy and Junior High scholars in their reference work; a vacation reading club and story hour for the younger children and supplying the best books possible for our readers young and old.

The number of borrowers and the circulation have increased steadily. The increased demand for non-fiction has been notable. Our genealogical shelves have been enriched by the loan from Molly Reid Chapter of 55 volumes of D. A. R. Lineage Books.

We have posted on our bulletin board, The Church Reading List; The Grange Reading List and The Century of Progress Reading Lists. Credit will be given by the Division of University Extension to readers of lists and blanks for reports will be furnished.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board of Derry:

The following report covers all school transactions for the year from July 1, 1932 to June 30, 1933.

FINANCES: A summary of these transactions is shown in table A. Column I records the total payments for this last complete school year which ended June 30, 1933. Column II shows similar payments for the first seven months of the current year with careful estimates for the five remaining months up to June 30, 1934. Column III is the budget for the next school year which will begin July 1, 1934 and end June 30, 1935. This budget furnishes the information upon which the tax-levy for next year has been estimated.

COMPARATIVE DATA: Table B, derived chiefly from table A, is a summary of costs, revenue, etc.

From table B, the following facts are obtained:

For the two years ending June 30, 1931 and June 30, 1932, the total expenditures for school purposes averaged almost \$78,000 per year: The corresponding average for the two year period, which will end June 30, 1934, will be about \$62,500, an annual reduction of \$15,500.

The budget for next year calls for expenditures of approximately \$60,000. This promises a reduction of at least \$18,000 from the 1931-1932 average.



These last figures are not the result of guesswork, but are conservative estimates, carefully made. The actual savings may be one or two thousand dollars more than the \$18,000 above stated.

Table B also shows the actual and estimated tax-levy for the five years involved as well as the cash on hand on June 30 of each year.

STATE AID: There is another factor which enters into this problem and prevents an even greater reduction of the tax-levy: I refer to the matter of State Aid: For the years 1931 and 1932, Derry received nearly \$2,000 annually as State Aid: In 1933, this source of revenue failed, thus causing a corresponding increase in the tax-levy.

IMPROVING PLANT AND EQUIPMENT: During the current year, substantial and much needed repairs and improvements have been made. For example: The gravel roof of the Floyd School has been thoroughly recovered and new flashing used wherever needed. The Oak St., West Side and Floyd Schools have been repainted outside and have had the interior woodwork and floors cleaned and mostly revarnished or rewaxed. In the Oak St. School, a room has been renovated, refitted and newly equipped for the Domestic Arts Department. The basement in this same school has been rearranged and fitted up for an extension of Manual Training which up to this year, has been limited to elementary wood working.

MECHANIC ARTS. In this new metal-working shop, there is now in use, an up-to-date Reede and Prentice Motor-driven 16 inch Engine-lathe, a Cincinnati Universal Milling Machine with Vertical Attachment, a 44 inch bed-planer and a 20 inch back-gearred drill.

This equipment makes possible, the teaching of a very wide range of metal working. At the same time,

a speed lathe has been installed in the wood shop, thus making cabinet work of a higher grade possible and also opening the way for a much needed course in pattern-making and moulding.

For the past twenty-five years, it has been my belief that the eighth grade is the place to develop manual skill into a much higher type of constructive activity than is usual in the average "Manual Training" shop.

There is no good reason why superior cabinet making should not lead at once into pattern-making, nor is there any lack of capacity on the part of eighth graders, who possess mechanical ability and have the so-called "constructive imagination", to successfully handle the bed-planer, engine-lathe, milling machine, and drill. This belief has been confirmed by results this winter.

Not every pupil is competent to master the metal working arts, nor should all attempt it, but by means of the seventh-grade wood work, those pupils who do have the constructive-sense well developed, should be discovered, and these should be permitted to select the more advanced lines of wood and metal work. This is a practical kind of "guidance" in education which can render great service to pupils, parents and the community.

There was never more need of the good old Yankee gumption, than today: There is no longer much of the home shop-work which 50 to 100 years ago developed resourcefulness in boys on the farms, consequently, if Yankee inventiveness and ingenuity are to be preserved, the school will have to furnish the opportunity.

The Derry public schools are today in a position to provide its boys with exactly as good facilities for Mechanic Arts training as are the city schools. This is as it should be, for Derry is preeminently an industrial town.

In the Domestic Arts room, the girls have equal opportunities for practical work in cooking and sewing, work which leads to more advanced courses in home management, etc.

**STANDARDIZING THE GRADE:** The most difficult problem has been that of increasing the efficiency of the teaching: The requirements for promotion from grade to grade have been made more rigid and while there is much yet to be done, the number of failures in the freshman and sophomore years in Pinkerton has been very appreciably decreased.

Table C is furnished by Principal Bell. It shows that while industrial conditions have decreased freshman enrollment from 105 to 84, graduations during the same time have increased from 36 to 58 and total enrollment has increased from 250 to 276. At the same time the losses from the freshman class have dropped from 27 to 7, and of these, lack of preparation has accounted for 13 in 1929 and none in 1933.

One of the most reliable indications of the efficiency of a school is the number of its enrolled students who

stay through and graduate. Certainly table C indicates that Pinkerton is increasing its holding power and that a diminished enrollment in the freshmen class is accompanied by a remarkable increase in total enrollment and graduates.
