TOWN WARRANT

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town officers.

Art. 2. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes:

- Section A. Town officers' salaries.
B. Town officers' expenses.
C. Election and registration.
D. Municipal court.
E. Town Hall and office expense.
F. Police department.
G. Fire department.
H. Health department.
I. Vital statistics.
J. Memorial Hospital.
K. Town maintenanc of highways (summer).
L. Town maintenance of highways (winter).
M. Libraries.
N. Town poor.
O. Memorial Day and other celebrations.
P. Soldiers' aid.
Q. Parks and playgrounds.
R. Damage and legal expense.
S. Interest.
T. State tax.
U. County tax.
V. Old age assistance.

Art. 3. To see what action the Town will take in regard to discounting taxes.

Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the blank inventories at the time they examine and appraise the property to be taxed.

Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire upon the credit of the Town the sum of \$60,000, if needed.

Art. 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate ac-

quired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds during the present fiscal year.

Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of "The Municipal Budget" act passed by the 1935 session of the Legislature.

Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to continue under the present or any other Budget System.

Art. 9. To see what action the Town will take with reference to "Zoning Regulations", as provided in Chapter 42 of the Public Statutes.

Art. 10. To see what action the Town will take with reference to the fund appropriated for the erection of a "Soldiers Memorial" at Redstone.

Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to elect one Road Agent or three Road Agents annually.

Art. 12. To see if the Town will vote to build the "North Road", so called, in Conway Village after it has been laid out, and raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money for the same.

Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire upon the credit of the Town, a sufficient sum of money to obtain Federal aid on any project for which application may be made; said project to be handled under the direction of a committee to be appointed by the Moderator.

Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for the construction of the Eaton Road, provided the State shall appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for the same purpose, it being understood that if the said appropriation is made by the State and the Town accepts said special aid, that the Town shall not be entitled to State aid for Class II roads.

Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to accept State aid for the construction of the Class II road known as the Eaton Road, and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$1,701.75; or will accept State aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$817.45.

Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote to have weekly band concerts during the months of July and August and raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to pay for the same, agreeable to a petition signed by R. L. Warren and others.

Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and establish the payment of Ten dollars (\$10.00) per day for a nine hour day or Nine dollars (\$9.00) per day for an eight hour day for 1½ ton trucks used in the construction and repair of highways, or other Town work, agreeable to a petition signed by Carroll E. Bryant and others.

Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to repair and tarvia the road from the watering trough at Kearsarge to the railroad tracks at Intervale Railway Station, and raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to pay for the same, agreeable to a petition signed by George W. Russell and others.

Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to tarvia the West Side road, so called, from the bridge near Walter Stevens' to the residence of Fred Hale, and raise and appropriate a sum of money for the same, agreeable to a petition signed by Charles W. Thompson and others.

Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to tarvia the road from the Bartlett town line to the Barrows place, so called, and raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to pay for the same.

Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money sufficient to tarvia Oak Street in North Conway, N. H., agreeable to a petition signed by Lilla B. Kellam and others.

Art. 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) to repair and extend the tar from Peterson's Brook to the junction of Davis Hill Road in Conway Center, agreeable to a petition signed by Leslie C. Hill and others.

Art. 23. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

LIBRARY REPORT

To the Citizens of Conway:

In January, 1934, the Civil Works Administration started grading the acre and a half of unimproved land that extended from the library lot proper to Wilder Street,

and from East Main Street to Sulloway Avenue. Many public spirited citizens helped complete this project with contributions of materials, labor, and money. The grading and draining of this lot have been satisfactorily finished, and, when this piece of ground is properly grassed over, it will be, as stated, in the 1934 report, "a foundation for a park that will add much to the value of this piece of town property."

This last year it has been necessary to make minor repairs in the Conway Public Library. The floors in the reading room and main hall are much worn. It will be economy to refinish them this year. As regards the library itself many books of outstanding value have been added. The new 1934 Webster's Unabridged Dictionary and the National Historical Atlas deserve mention. Mr. Clarence E. Eastman has sent fifty volumes of popular fiction. The Conway Woman's Club, Mrs. Ruth B. D. Horne, Miss Dorothy Eaton, Mrs. Errol Perry, and Mrs. Frank Simonds have each given a collection of worthwhile books. In the last two years, five hundred and thirty-nine books have been added to the library by gift or purchase. That number, for a country town, may appear adequate. But it has been necessary to discard five hundred and thirteen books, leaving, for a credit, twenty-six additions in these same two years.

It is the desire of the Conway Library Trustees to add each year a sufficient number of desirable books to creditably offset the number that is discarded. We aim to have the library proper as valuable a possession of the town as is the building that houses it.

At the Center Conway Library, Avan Littlefield has resigned as librarian. Mrs. Gertrude A. Snow, the present librarian, reports that books have been given by Miss Florence Tyler, Mrs. Mary Comstock, Carl Hatch, Vera Mudgett, Edith Sawyer, and the Conway Public Library. Muriel Garland has given "Wee Wisdom" and "Tiny Tower" magazines. These, the small children have enjoyed. A larger and better collection of children's books would add much to the value of this library.

In September, Miss Alice S. Pollard and her assistant, Miss Dorothy Eaton attended the 45th meeting of the New Hampshire Library Association which was held in Exeter. Miss Pollard also attended the conference of the Carroll County Librarians that was held in Tamworth. At this latter meeting, Miss Pollard was elected chairman of the Carroll County Library District. The next meeting of this library district will be held in the Conway Public Library.

This year, as in the past, the greatest need of the town libraries is good books. Of books, Miss Dorothy Annable, the Executive Secretary of our New Hampshire Library Commission, writes: "Roads to knowledge are, after all, as important as roads to market. In the ancient world, the Roman road was the symbol of civilization; in the modern world, when airways are so rapidly superseding expensive miles of concrete, the civilized state and nation cherish the roads to knowledge, built with books."

The North Conway Park Commissioners respectfully submit the following report for 1934:

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Conway:

School situations change somewhat from year to year but in general our main problems remain the same. Our obligations are to offer fair and equal educational opportunity, to maintain our school plant, to adjust our educational offering as far as we can to the needs of a changing society, and to do all this with due regard to our material and financial resources. Responsibility rests primarily with the school board and the superintendent but intelligent study and cooperation from all citizens are necessary.

This table which follows has some interest.

Most items of expenditure are fairly constant but costs of repairs and maintenance, insurance, and transportation vary considerably in different years.

The school at South Conway was closed this year and the pupils were transported to Center Conway. The arrangement has, we believe, been satisfactory. Four pupils are now being transported.

At the opening of school in September we found sixty-seven pupils in attendance at Center Conway. It was a physical impossibility to accommodate them in the two rooms already in use and as eleven of these pupils were beginners, it was not possible to provide adequate instruction with two teachers. The school authorities therefore fitted up a third room and engaged an additional teacher until there should be a change in the situation. This additional teacher will not be required when the registration of this school falls to fifty or less. The overcrowding, however, would have occurred even if the South Conway school had been kept open. Our policy next year will depend upon the situation in September.

Last spring a project for painting in school houses was approved by the C.W.A. and continued for four weeks when it was abruptly halted with about half the approved work completed. However, a considerable amount of painting was done at the high school and in the grammar schools at Conway, Center Conway and North Conway. The school district furnished materials to the amount of \$478 while the C.W.A. paid bills for labor in the amount of \$854.

Expenditures for the current year have been kept within the limits of the budget with the exception of items for transportation and for repairs. Extensive repairs to the boiler at the Conway Grammar school were necessary,

and there was some expense in fitting up the extra school room at Center Conway. The expense of the South Conway transportation was not included in the current budget. This item would have been taken care of by the saving of a teachers' salary at South Conway but the necessity for the extra teacher at Center Conway simply added again to our salary schedule, what we had expected to save.

As a part of our report we are including some interesting data and statistics of the Kennett High School, submitted by Headmaster E. W. McKeen. Much can be learned about the work of this excellent school by reading Mr. McKeen's report. We expect a considerable increase in registration next year. Looking ahead for five or ten years and judging by our present growth and by the experience of others, we shall soon reach a point where we shall have to furnish more room and more facilities to our high school. The economic situation which exists and will continue for many years is crowding our high schools with boys and girls who wish to go to school because they can find no jobs. That we have a responsibility is undisputed. We must furnish them room and we ought to extend the range of our educational offering beyond narrow academic limitations.

Much can be said in praise of the present status of our high school. The expansion of our curriculum along the lines of natural science, history, economics, and sociology has awakened interest in the practical problems of the individual and society. Any further expansion of our curriculum should be the opportunity to take theoretical and formal knowledge and use it creatively. In other words, household and mechanic arts should be an integral part of any high school program.

The burden of school support falls entirely upon the property tax. The maintenance of good schools has and does demand faith and courage on the part of those who wish to give our children some adequate preparation for life. Many ingenious plans of taxation have been devised

and put into effect for purposes less important than education, and now when we find ourselves taxed at every point and corner, we know that in the matter of school support we have been asleep at the switch. Each period of depression through which this country has passed has revealed the weaknesses of the prevailing methods of school support. The property tax from which the schools have derived most of their revenues has proved both inadequate and unfair during every crisis. During recent years those states have fared best which have provided adequate equalization funds built up largely from indirect taxes. One of the most important changes which should be secured by most states during the present period of reconstruction should be a revised and modern system of school finance.

I wish to express my personal gratitude to the school board, to the teachers, and to the parents and citizens, who in a fine spirit of cooperation are helping in our common task.
