SHAHEEN LEADS GOP CHALLENGERS IN RACE FOR NH SENATE SEAT

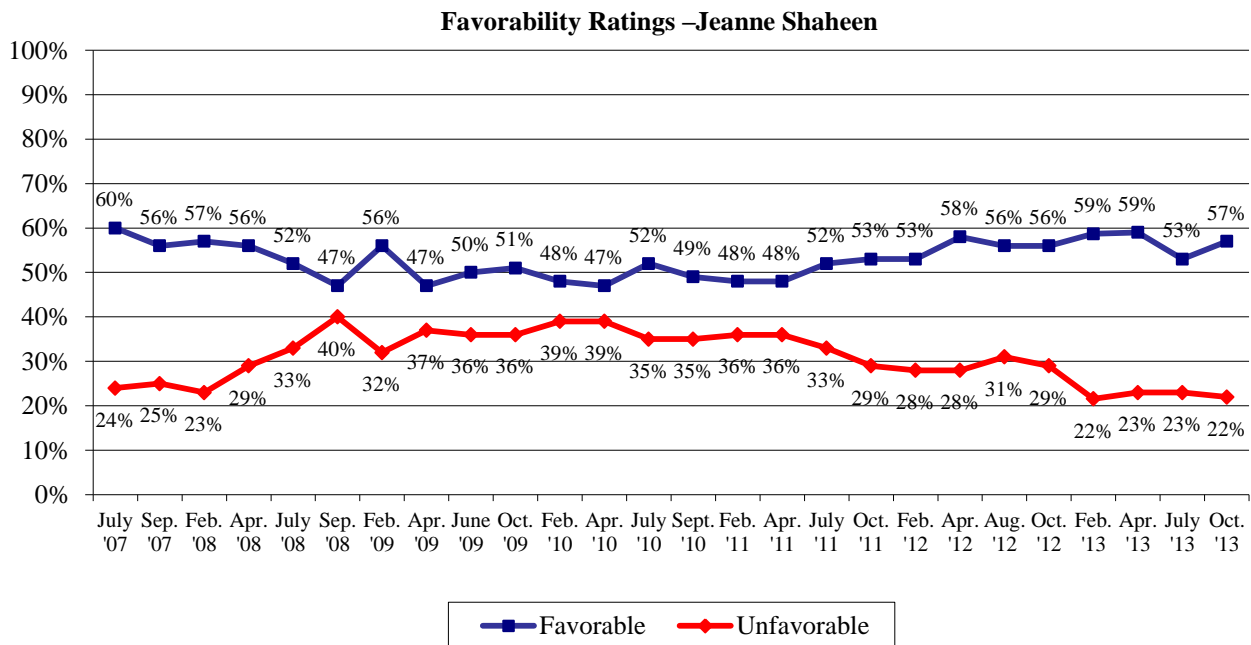

DURHAM, NH – Senator Jeanne Shaheen remains very popular in the Granite State and currently enjoys large leads over potential Republican challengers in her 2014 re-election bid. Senator Kelly Ayotte’s favorability ratings are unchanged since July.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Six hundred and sixty-three (663) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between October 7 and October 16, 2013. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.8 percent.

Favorability Ratings – Senator Jeanne Shaheen

The senior member of the New Hampshire delegation, Democratic Senator Jeanne Shaheen has long been one of the most popular politicians in New Hampshire. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 57% of New Hampshire adults say they have a favorable opinion of Shaheen, 22% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 6% are neutral and 15% don’t know enough about her to say. Shaheen’s net favorability rating, the percentage who have a favorable opinion of her minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion, is +35%, up from +30% in July. She is viewed very favorably by Democrats (net +76%), favorably by Independents (+29%), and only somewhat unfavorably by Republicans (-10%).



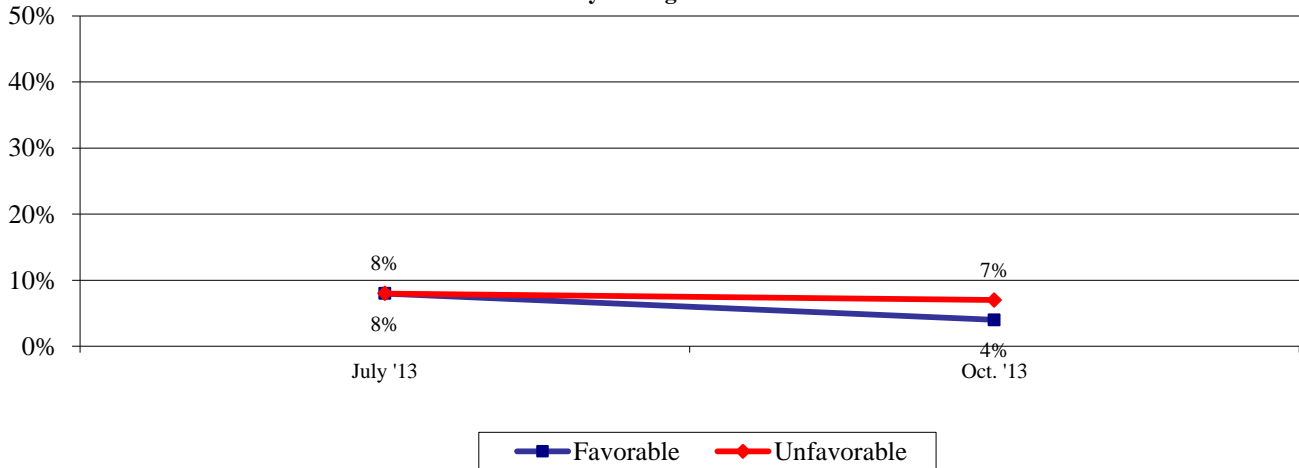

Potential GOP Challengers for U.S. Senate

Two potential challengers to Senator Shaheen are former State Senator Jim Rubens (R-Hanover) and former Congressman Charlie Bass (R-Peterborough). Rubens has already officially announced his Senate run while Bass has hinted at running.

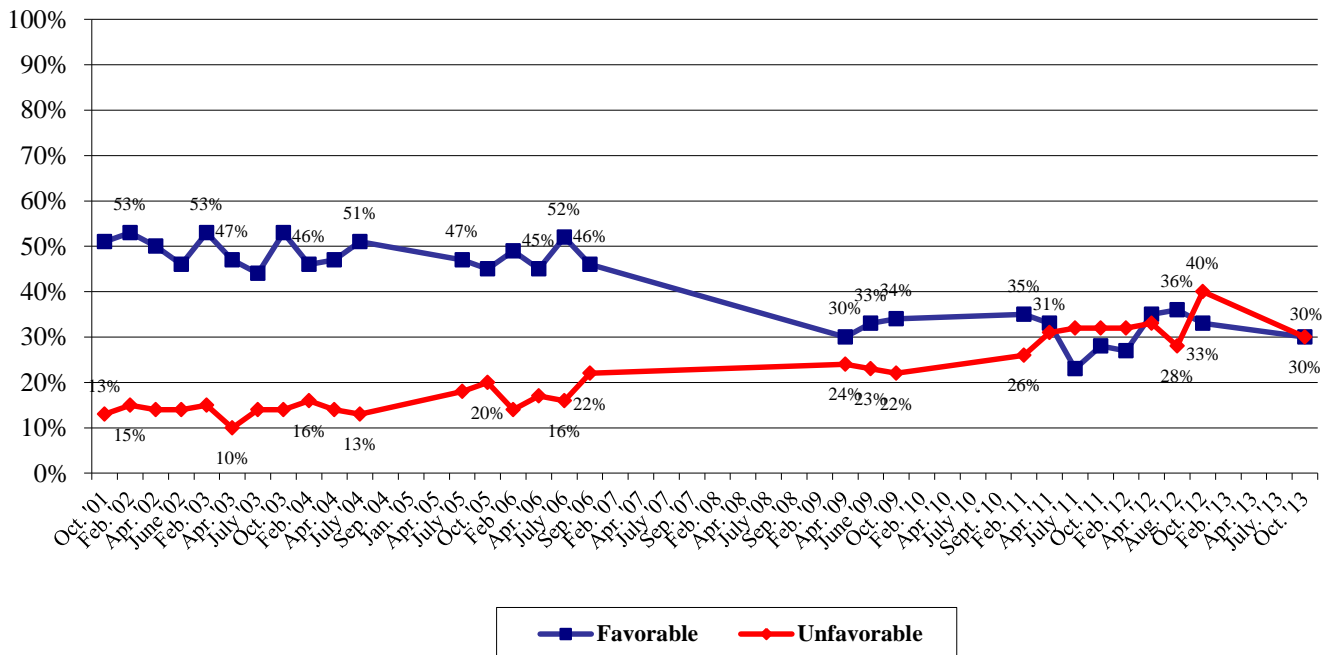
Rubens remains largely unknown in the Granite State. Currently, only 4% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Rubens, 7% have an unfavorable opinion, 7% are neutral and 82% don't know enough to say. Rubens' net favorability rating is -3%.

Favorability Ratings - Jim Rubens



Bass, who served seven terms in Congress, is much better known than Rubens. Currently 30% of New Hampshire adults say they have a favorable opinion of Bass, 30% have an unfavorable opinion, 9% are neutral and 31% don't know enough to say. His net favorability is 0%. Bass is popular among Republicans (net +33%), somewhat popular among Independents (+5%) and unpopular among Democrats (net -27%).

2014 U.S. Senate Election

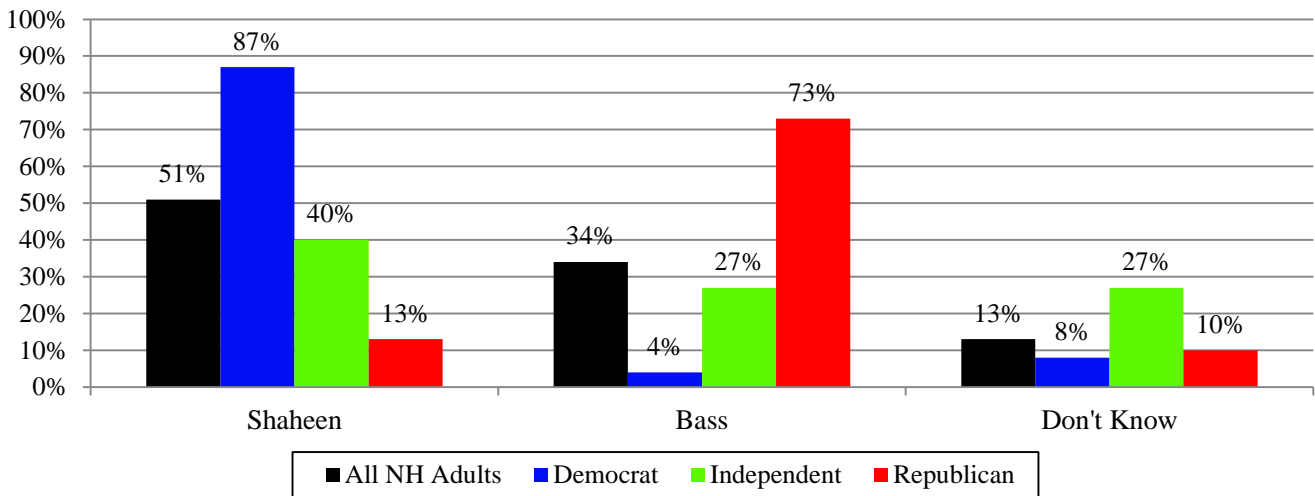
Very few voters have decided who they will vote for in the 2014 U.S. Senate Election. Only 6% of likely voters say they have definitely decided who to support, 7% are leaning towards someone, and 87% are still trying to decide.

In a matchup between Shaheen and Bass, 51% of likely voters would vote for Shaheen if the election were held today, 34% would vote for Bass, 2% support someone else, and 13% are undecided.

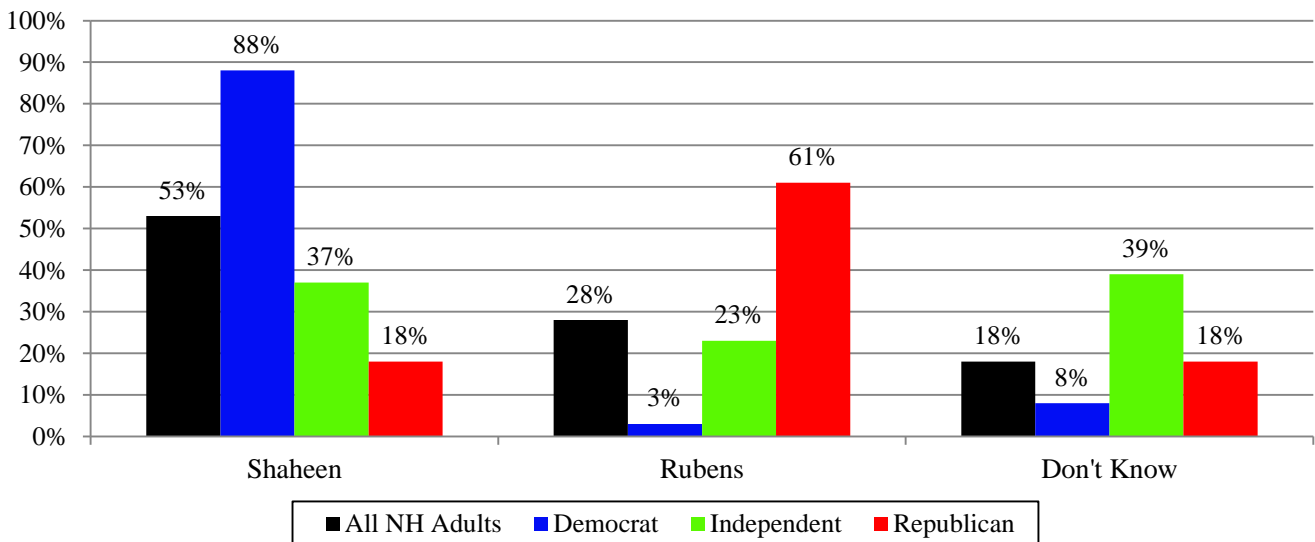
If Rubens were the Republican nominee, 53% of likely voters would vote for Shaheen, 28% would vote for Rubens, 1% support someone else, and 18% are undecided.

As would be expected in hypothetical matchups this early, Democrats and Republicans largely support their party's candidate while many Independents are undecided. Currently Shaheen holds sizeable leads over both Bass and Rubens with Independent voters.

US Senate - Shaheen vs. Bass



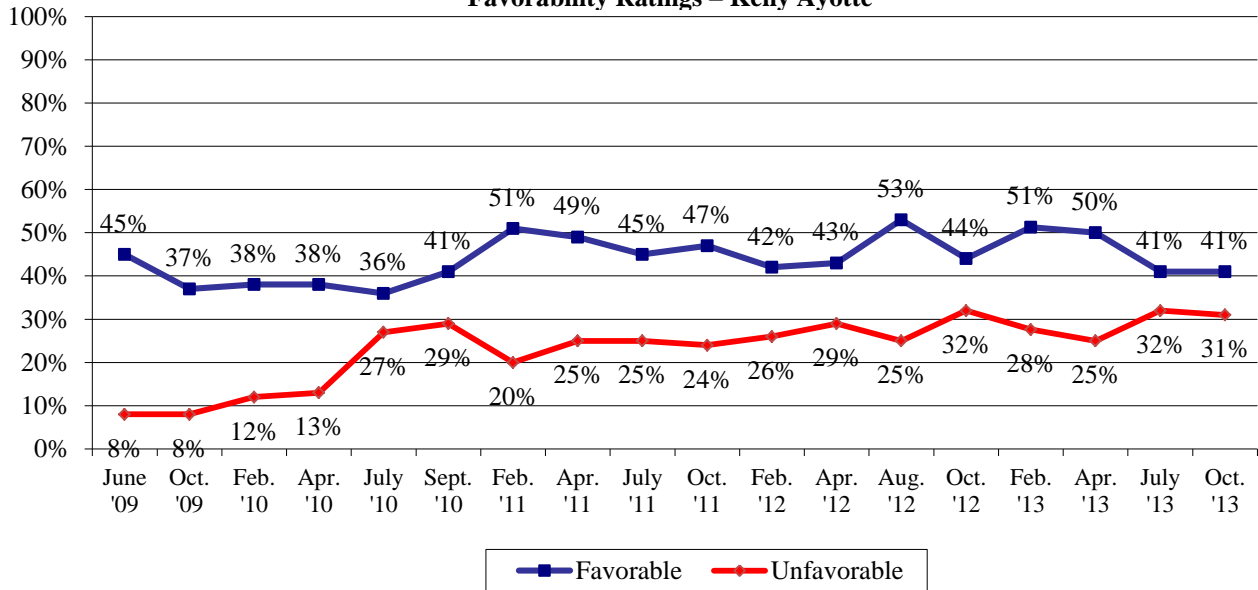
US Senate - Shaheen vs. Rubens



Favorability Ratings – Senator Kelly Ayotte

The favorability ratings of New Hampshire’s junior senator, Republican Kelly Ayotte, have remained steady since July. Currently, 41% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Ayotte, 31% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 8% are neutral and 21% don’t know enough about her to say. Ayotte’s net favorability rating is +10%, which is up from +9% in July. She remains very popular among Republicans (net favorability rating of +52%), popular among independents at (+21%) and unpopular among Democrats at (-26%).

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Six hundred and sixty-three (663) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between October 7 and October 16, 2013. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.8 percent.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, age, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may sum to just above or below 100%. Respondent numbers in each demographic may not equal the total respondent number due to respondents choosing not to answer some demographic questions.
