### NH CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION FACING TOUGH RE-ELECTION, SHAHEEN SOLID

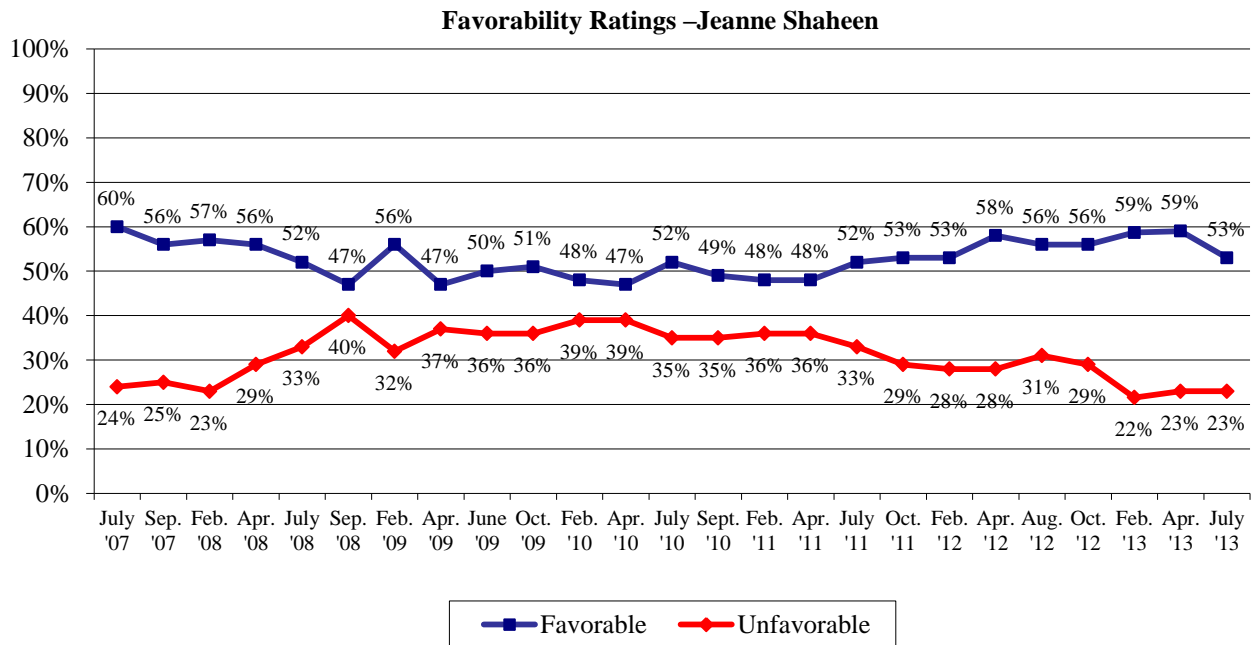
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DURHAM, NH – Pluralities of New Hampshire adults prefer someone else getting elected instead of incumbent Congresswomen Carol Shea-Porter and Ann Kuster. Senator Jeanne Shaheen remains popular and a plurality of Granite Staters support her re-election in November 2014. Senator Kelly Ayotte’s favorability has declined since April.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,\* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and sixteen (516) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between July 18 and July 29, 2013. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.3 percent. Included were 283 residents of New Hampshire’s First Congressional District (MSE = +/- 5.8%) and 233 from the Second District (MSE = +/- 6.4%).

#### Favorability Ratings – Senator Jeanne Shaheen

The senior member of the New Hampshire delegation, Democratic Senator Jeanne Shaheen has long been one of the most popular politicians in New Hampshire. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 53% of New Hampshire adults say they have a favorable opinion of Shaheen, 23% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 8% are neutral and 16% don’t know enough about her to say. Shaheen’s net favorability rating is +30%, which is down from +36% in April. She is viewed very favorably among Democrats (net +72%), favorably among Independents (+17%), but unfavorably among Republicans (-10%).

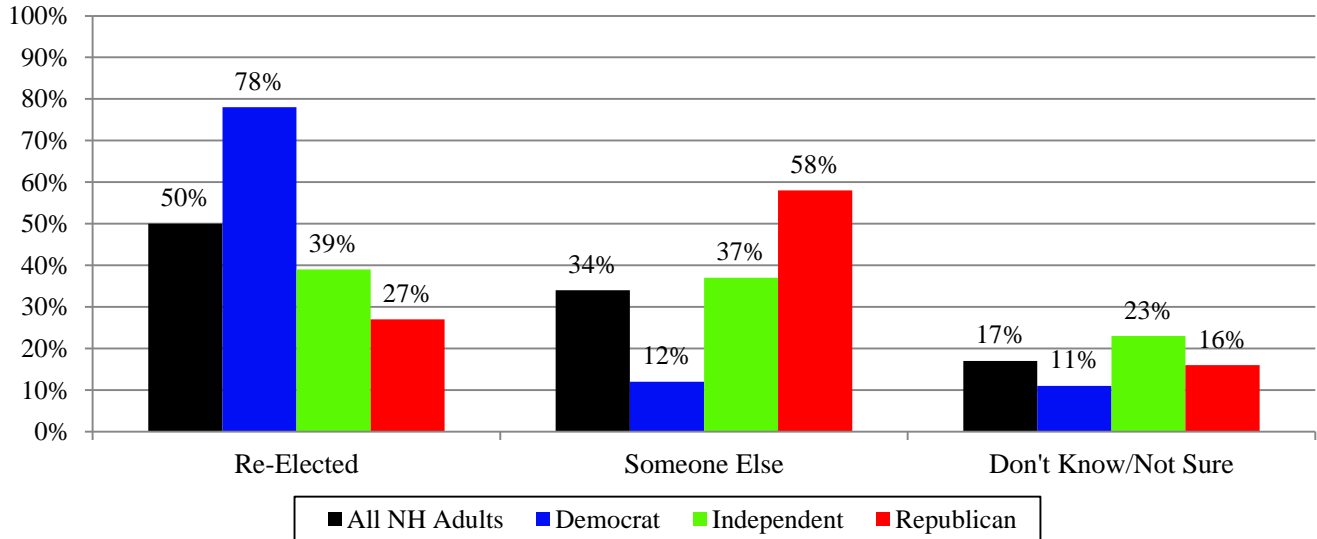

## 2014 U.S. Senate Election

Currently, 50% of Granite Staters think that Senator Shaheen should be re-elected, 34% think that someone else should be elected and 17% don't know or are unsure. Most Democrats (78%) support Shaheen's re-election, as well as 39% of Independents and 27% of Republicans.

### Should Jeanne Shaheen Be Re-Elected to the U.S. Senate?

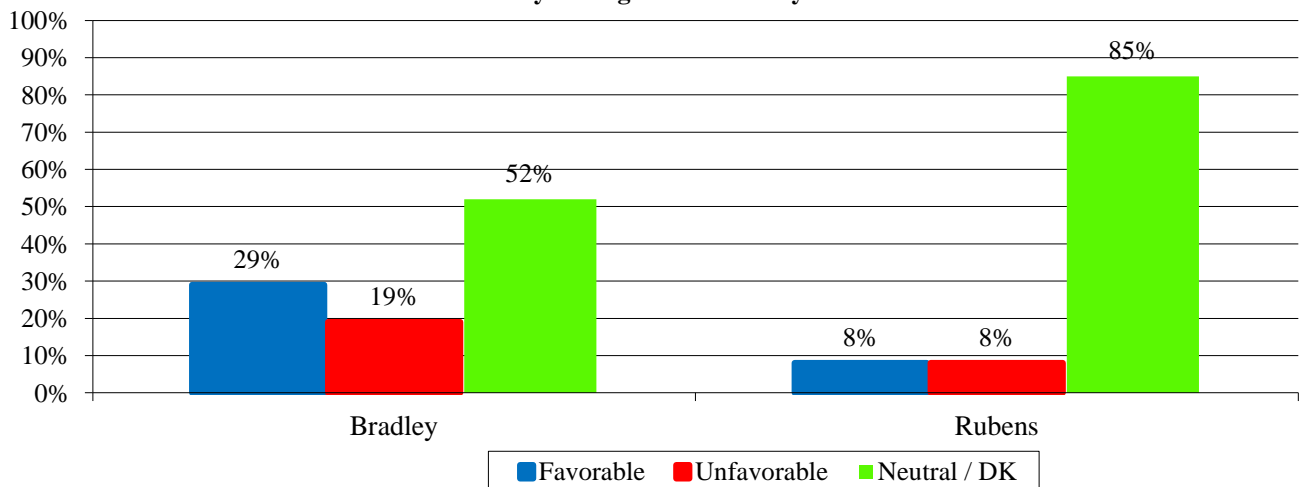


### Potential GOP Challengers for U.S. Senate

Two potential challengers to Senator Shaheen are State Senate Majority Leader Jeb Bradley (R-Wolfeboro) and former State Senator Jim Rubens (R-Hanover). Despite having held the 1<sup>st</sup> Congressional District seat between 2003 and 2007, only 29% of New Hampshire adults say they have a favorable opinion of Bradley, 19% have an unfavorable opinion, 6% are neutral and 46% don't know enough to say. His net favorability is +10%. Bradley is popular among Republicans (net +38%), and Independents (+16%), but unpopular among Democrats (net -15%).

Rubens is largely unknown in the Granite State. Currently, only 8% have a favorable opinion of Rubens, 8% have an unfavorable opinion, 8% are neutral and 77% don't know enough to say. Rubens' net favorability rating is 0%.

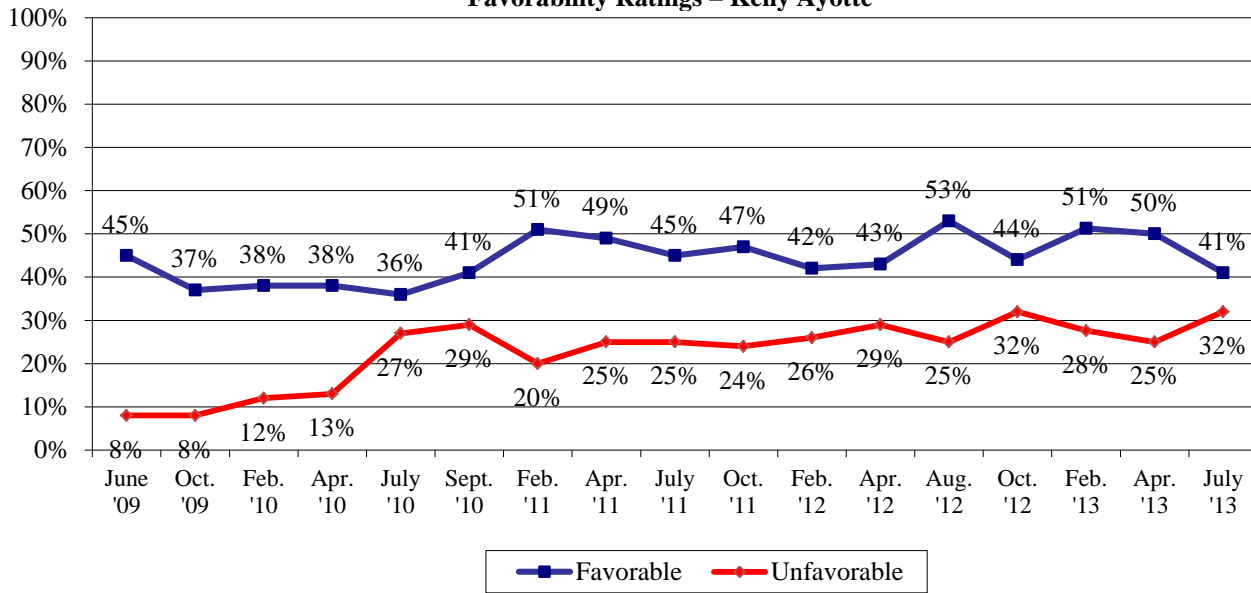
### Favorability Ratings – Jeb Bradley & Jim Rubens



### Favorability Ratings – Senator Kelly Ayotte

New Hampshire’s junior senator, Republican Kelly Ayotte, has seen her favorability rating decline since April. She voted against a bill that would expand background checks when buying firearms on the internet and at gun shows, and this drew millions of dollars of negative ads from gun control organizations, hoping to sway her vote. Her favorability rating has dropped somewhat since her vote. Currently, 41% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Ayotte, 32% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 8% are neutral and 19% don’t know enough about her to say. Ayotte’s net favorability rating is +9%, which is down from +25% in April. Her net favorability has declined across all political groups, but she remains very popular among Republicans (net favorability rating of +53%), popular among independents at (+18%) and very unpopular among Democrats at (-33%).

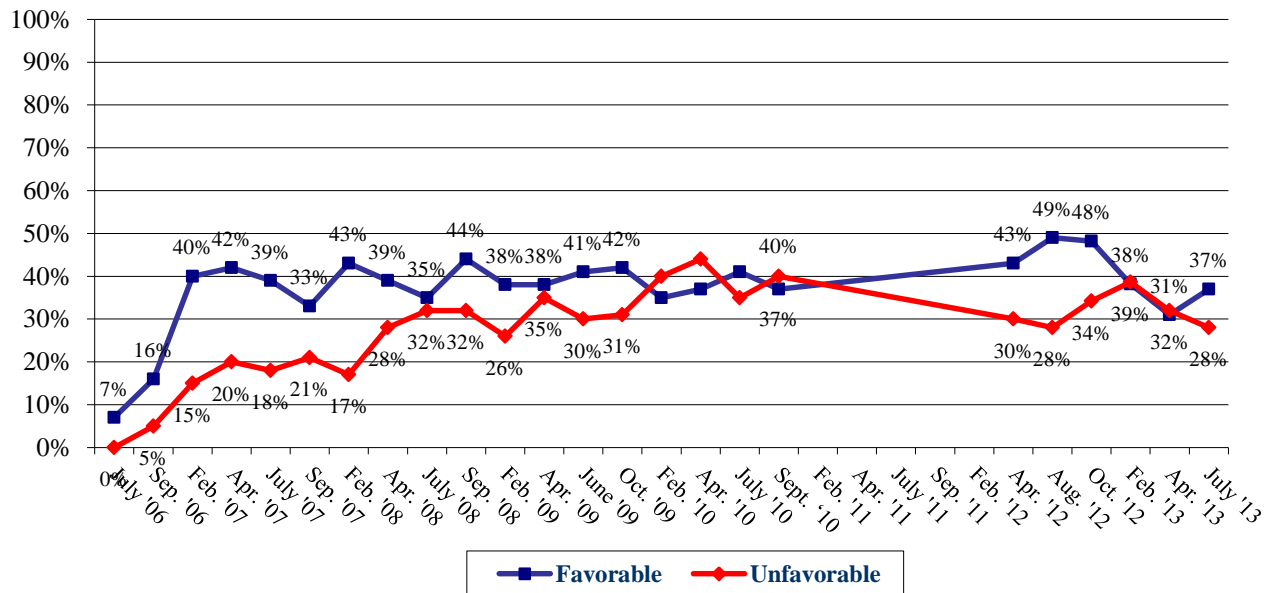
Favorability Ratings – Kelly Ayotte



### Favorability Ratings – Congresswoman Carol Shea-Porter

Democrat Congresswoman Carol Shea Porter has stemmed her recent favorability rating slide. Currently, 37% of 1<sup>st</sup> District adults have a favorable opinion of Shea-Porter, 28% have an unfavorable opinion, 6% are neutral, and 28% don’t know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is at +9%, which is up from -1% in April. She remains popular among Democrats (net +61%) but is unpopular among Independents (net -10%) and very unpopular among Republicans (net -34%).

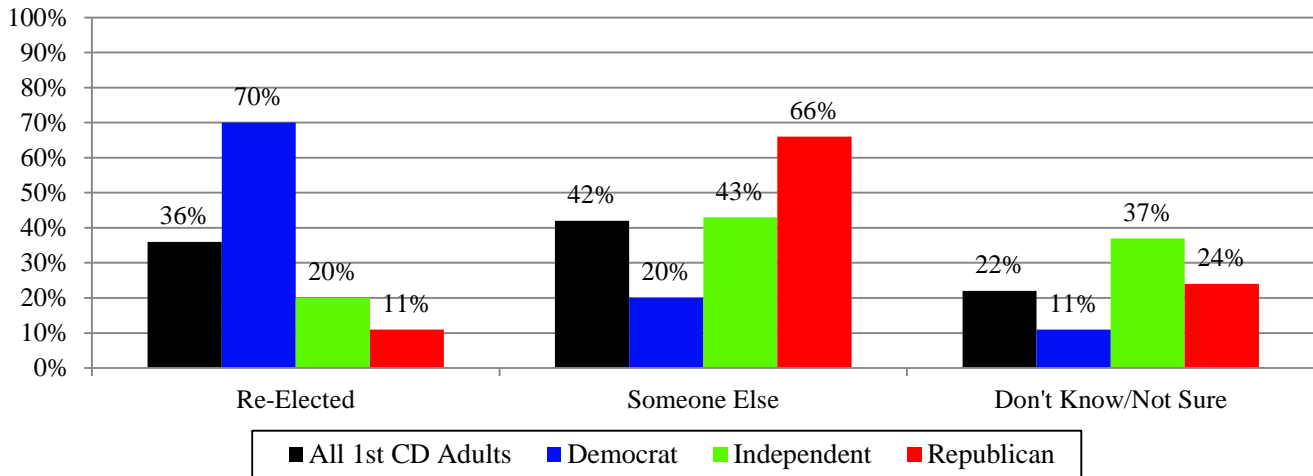
Favorability Ratings – Carol Shea-Porter NH 1<sup>st</sup> District



## 2014 U.S. Congress Election – 1<sup>st</sup> District

Currently, only 36% of First District residents think that Congresswoman Shea-Porter should be re-elected, 42% think someone else should be elected and 22% don't know or are unsure. Most Democrats (70%) support Shea-Porter's re-election while pluralities of independents (43%) and Republicans (66%) want someone else.

### Should Carol Shea-Porter Be Re-Elected To Congress?



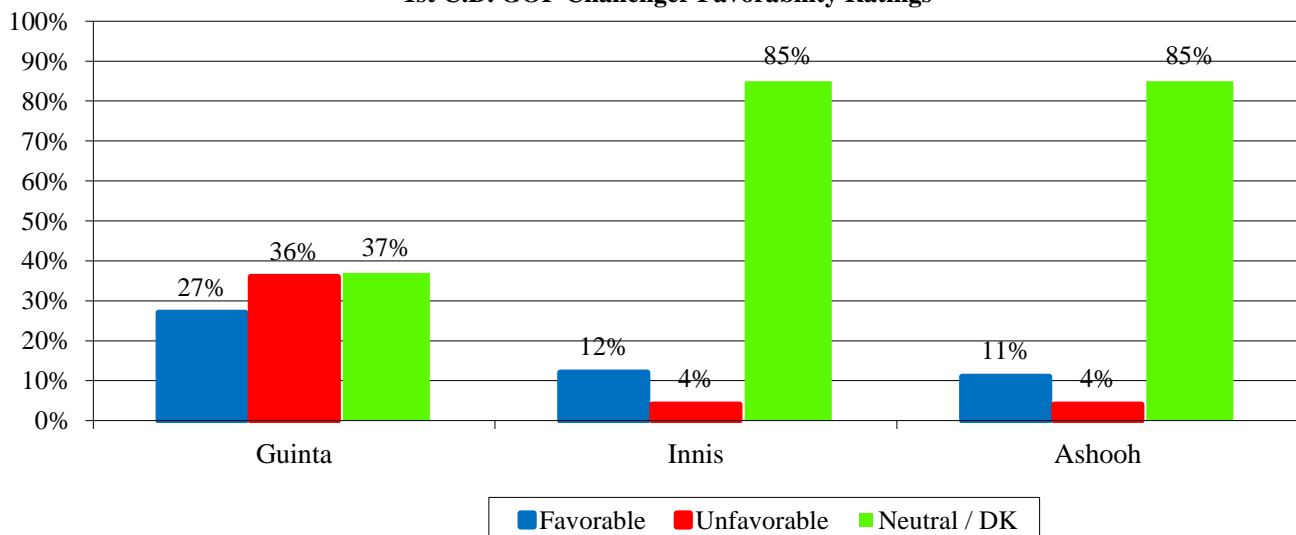
### Potential GOP Challengers for U.S. Congress – District 1

Three potential challengers for the 1<sup>st</sup> District seat are former Congressman Frank Guinta (R-Manchester) who held the seat from 2011 to 2013, businessman Rich Ashooh (R-Bedford) who ran for the GOP nomination in 2010, and UNH Business School Dean Dan Innis (R-Portsmouth). Guinta is the best known of these candidates, currently 27% have a favorable opinion of Guinta, 36% have an unfavorable opinion, 6% are neutral and 3% don't know enough to say. His net favorability rating is -9% in the First District. Guinta is very popular among Republicans (+32%), unpopular among Independents (net -5%) and very unpopular among Democrats (net -50%).

Despite running in 2010, Ashooh is largely unknown -- 11% of 1<sup>st</sup> CD adults have a favorable opinion of Ashooh, 4% have an unfavorable opinion, 6% are neutral and 79% don't know enough to say. His net favorability rating is +7%. Ashooh's net favorability rating is +16% among Republicans, +7% among Independents, and -1% among Democrats.

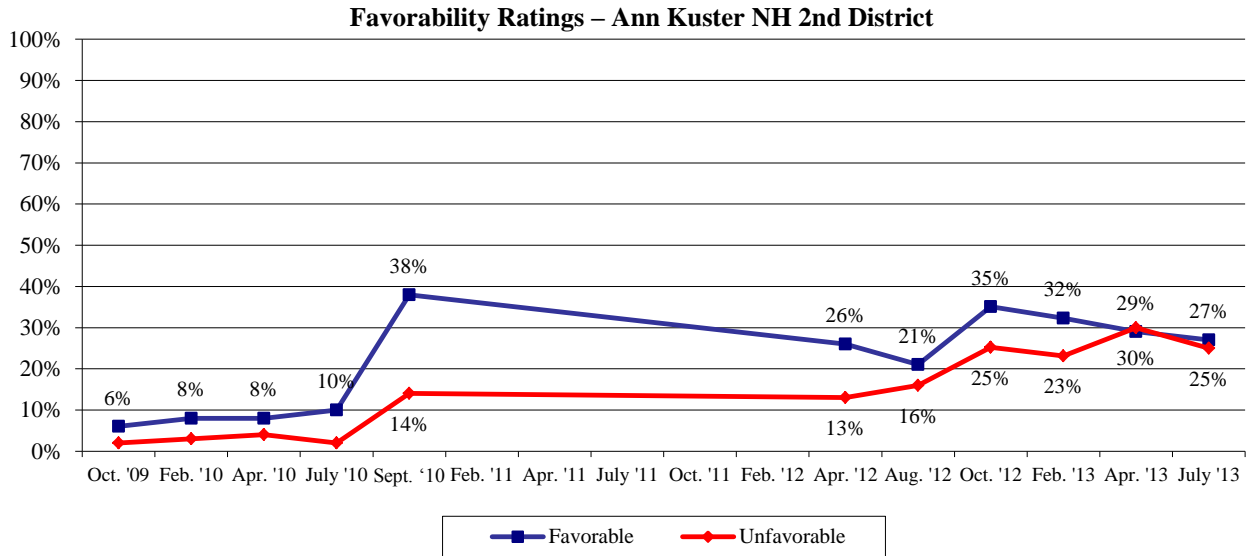
Innis is also largely unknown, but he has never run for office before. Currently 12% of 1<sup>st</sup> CD residents have a favorable opinion of Innis, 4% have an unfavorable opinion, 6% are neutral and 79% don't know enough to say. His net favorability rating is +8%. Innis is popular among Republicans (net +8%), Independents (+4%) and Democrats (+11%).

### 1st C.D. GOP Challenger Favorability Ratings



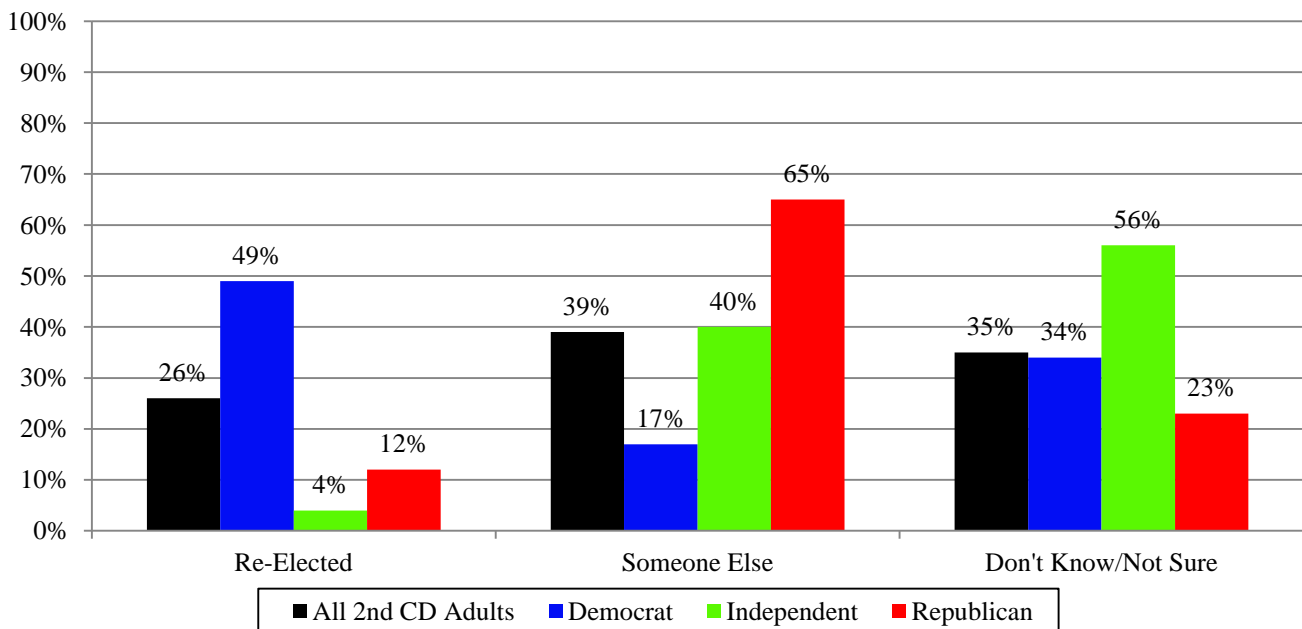
### Favorability Ratings – Congresswoman Ann Kuster

In New Hampshire’s Second Congressional District, newly elected Congresswoman Ann Kuster’s favorability ratings have continued to remain low. Currently, 27% of 2<sup>nd</sup> District adults have a favorable opinion of Kuster, 25% have an unfavorable opinion, 9% are neutral, and 38% don’t know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is +2%. She remains popular among Democrats (net +49%), but is unpopular among Independents (net -18%) and very unpopular among Republicans (net -41%).



Currently only 26% of 2<sup>nd</sup> District residents think that Kuster should be re-elected, 39% think someone else should be elected and 35% don’t know or are unsure. Only 49% of Democrats, 12% of Republicans and 4% of Independents currently support Kuster’s re-election. Most troubling for Kuster is that 17% of Democrats say they would like someone else.

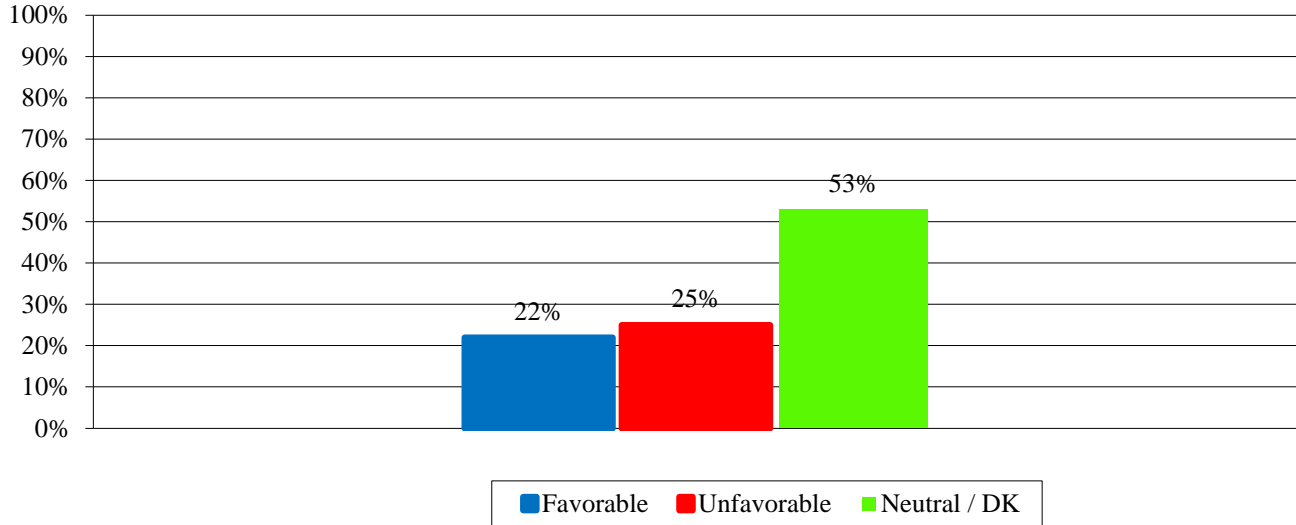
### Should Ann Kuster Be Re-Elected To Congress?



## Potential GOP Challenger for U.S. Congress – District 2

The main challenger to Kuster that has been discussed in the press is former Speaker of the House and current State Representative Bill O'Brien (R-Mont Vernon). Currently, 22% of Second District adults have a favorable opinion of O'Brien, 25% have an unfavorable opinion, 6% are neutral, and 47% don't know enough about him to say. His net favorability rating is -3%, but this is up significantly from -25% in April. O'Brien is popular among Republicans (net +18%), but independents are divided (net +3%) and he is very unpopular among Democrats (net -23%).

### **Granite State Poll Methodology**

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and sixteen (516) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between July 18 and July 29, 2013. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.3 percent. Included were 283 residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE = +/- 5.8%) and 233 from the Second District (MSE = +/- 6.4%).

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, age, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may sum to just above or below 100%. Respondent numbers in each demographic may not equal the total respondent number due to respondents choosing not to answer some demographic questions.
