SHAHEEN AND AYOTTE REMAIN POPULAR

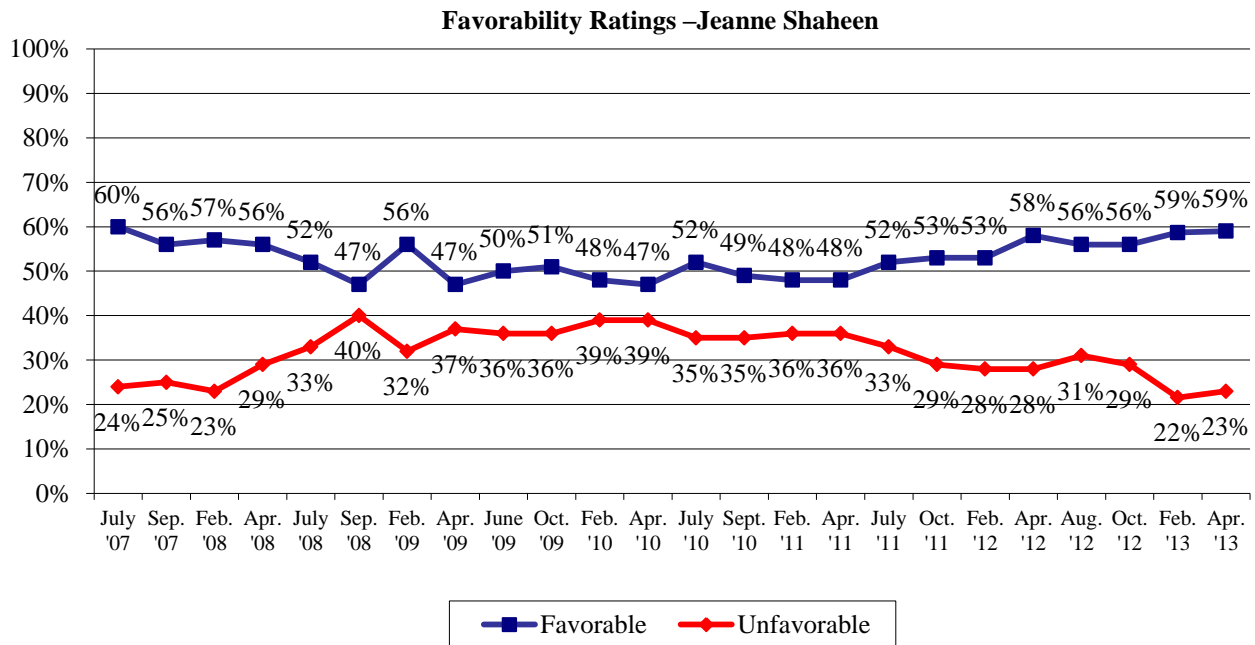

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DURHAM, NH – The popularity of New Hampshire’s two senators, Democrat Jeanne Shaheen and Republican Kelly Ayotte, remains steady. The popularity of 1st District Congresswoman Carol Shea Porter and 2nd District Congresswoman Annie Kuster continues to decline following their elections in November.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and seven (507) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between April 4 and April 9, 2013. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent. Included were 227 residents of New Hampshire’s First Congressional District (MSE = +/- 6.5%) and 276 from the Second District (MSE = +/- 5.9%).

Favorability Ratings – Senator Jeanne Shaheen

The senior member of the delegation, Democratic Senator Jeanne Shaheen has long been one of the most popular politicians in New Hampshire. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 59% of New Hampshire adults say they have a favorable opinion of Shaheen, 23% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 6% are neutral and 12% don’t know enough about her to say. Shaheen’s net favorability rating is +36, unchanged from her +37 rating in February. She is viewed very favorably among Democrats (net favorability rating of +77%), favorably among Independents (+35%), but unfavorably among Republicans (-14%).

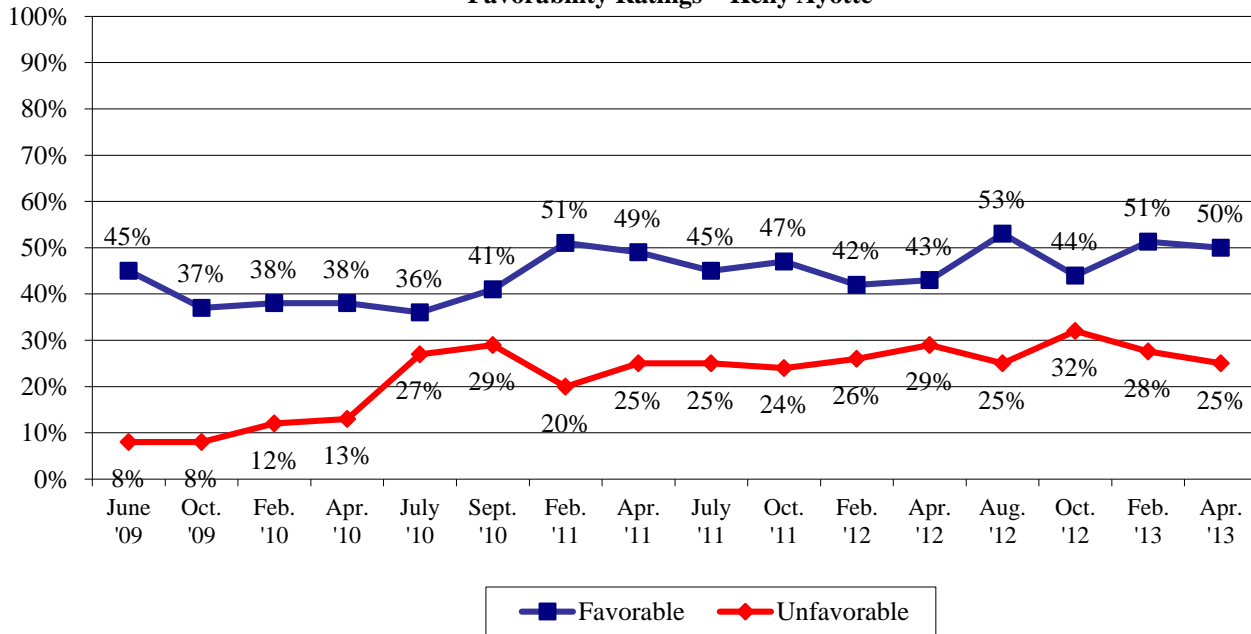

Favorability Ratings – Senator Kelly Ayotte

New Hampshire’s junior senator, Republican Kelly Ayotte, has also seen her favorability rating largely unchanged since February. Currently, 50% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Ayotte, 25% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 9% are neutral and 16% don’t know enough about her to say. Ayotte’s net favorability rating is +25%, up from +23% in February. Her net favorability remains high among Republicans at +74% and low among Democrats where it is at -21%. Her net favorability rating among Independents has also stayed steady at +38%.

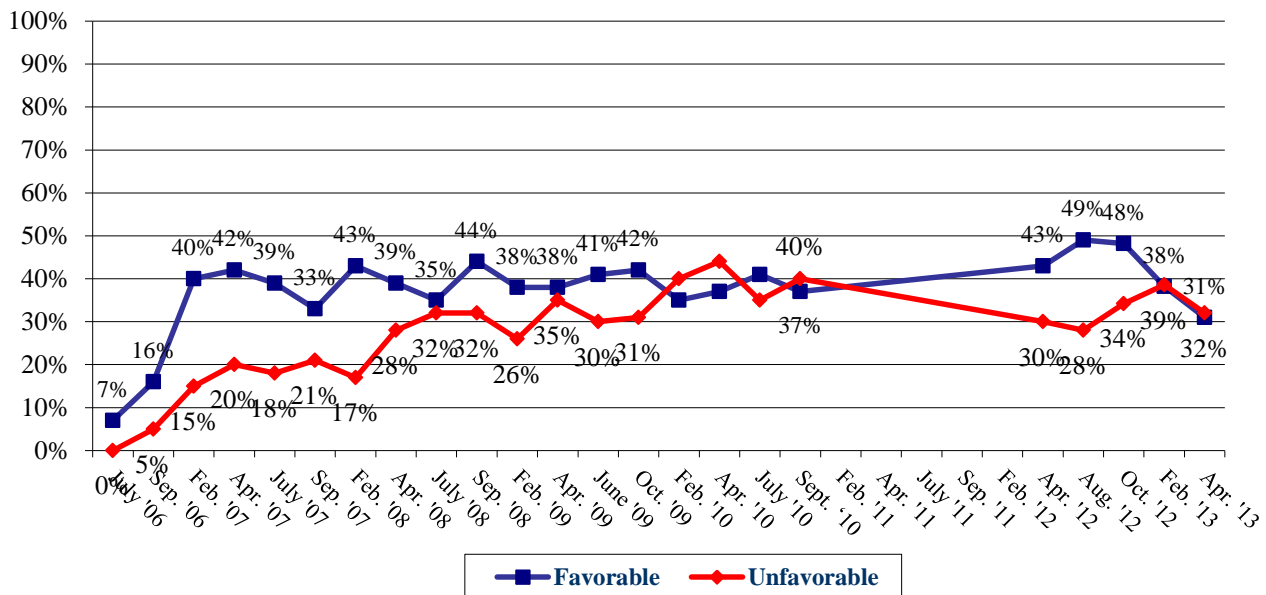
Favorability Ratings – Kelly Ayotte



Favorability Ratings – Congresswoman Carol Shea-Porter

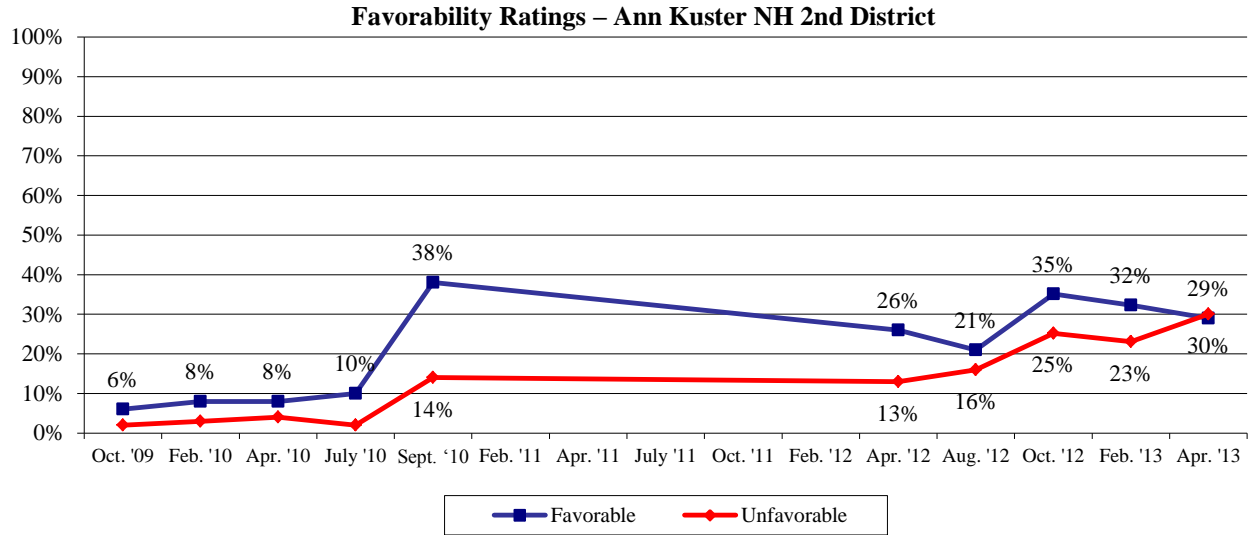
Democrat Congresswoman Carol Shea Porter has seen a decline in her favorability ratings since being re-elected to Congress in November. Currently, 31% of 1st District adults have a favorable opinion of Shea-Porter, 32% have an unfavorable opinion, 11% are neutral, and 26% don’t know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is at -1%, which remains the same since our last poll in February. She remains popular among Democrats (net +45%, down from +64% in February), but she is very unpopular among Republicans (net -45%) and unpopular among Independents (net -8%).

Favorability Ratings – Congresswoman Ann Kuster

In New Hampshire’s Second Congressional District, newly elected Congresswoman Ann Kuster’s favorability ratings have also been declining since she was elected in November. Currently, 29% of 2nd District adults have a favorable opinion of Kuster, 30% have an unfavorable opinion, 8% are neutral, and 34% don’t know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is -1%, which has dropped from +9% in February. She remains popular among Democrats (net +43%), and very unpopular among Republicans (net -51%). She has lost ground among Independents where her net favorability rating has dropped to -12% from +9 in February.



Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and seven (507) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between April 4 and April 9, 2013. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent. Included were 227 residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE = +/- 6.5%) and 276 from the Second District (MSE = +/- 5.9%).

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may sum to just above or below 100%. Respondent numbers in each demographic may not equal the total respondent number due to respondents choosing not to answer some demographic questions.
