This leaves a total of 179 pupils residing in the district and attending public schools.

As the town at the annual meeting in March did not vote to raise money for the salary of a district nurse no follow-up work was done in the schools after that time.

It is our opinion that medical inspection without follow-up work by a nurse is of little value. It is possible for several neighboring towns to employ a school nurse together. In this way a few weeks of follow-up work may be done in each town with very little if any expense to the district. The state will repay all money spent in health work up to \$1.50 per pupil in state aided towns.

In June the following class was graduated from the second year



of the Junior High School:—James Carroll, Fannie Kelley, Francis Kinsherb, Margaret Kirk, William Roberts, Ruth Webster.

This school now has all the necessary equipment for the Domestic Arts, and Manual Training courses, as well as the course in General Science. It has the full approval of the State Department of Education.

During the year the work in Arithmetic and History as shown in the State Program was outlined more in detail and placed in the hands of all the teachers. This has proven helpful in many ways.

In the summer vacation the Graded School building, and the buildings at Burnt Hill and Davisville were refinished inside and put in good condition.

We appreciate the support and co-operation of the Board, the Parents, and the teachers in the work for the improvement of the schools.

# NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS

In accordance with the statutes (New Hampshire Laws of 1907, Chapter 147) you are requested to take measures to suppress the brown-tail moth and the gipsy moth on your premises. The law declares these insects to be a public nuisance and orders their suppression by property owners. Suppression is enforceable by law up to a cost of one-half of 1% of the tax valuation of the property concerned.

Necessary measures must be completed on or before March 20.

This notice is sent to all property owners in accordance with instructions of the Division of Insect Suppression, of the State Department of Agriculture.

## The Browntail Moth

This pest is present in numbers on apple and pear trees and on many shade trees. Through the winter it occupies webs as big as a hen's egg, attached to the tips of twigs. All such webs should be cut off carefully, gathered up and burned.

## The Gipsy Moth

The gipsy moth is found through the winter in the form of egg-masses attached to the trunks of trees, stones, piazza posts, or other locations. Each egg-mass is  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch long, is covered with fine hairs and is the color of chamois skin. Egg-masses should be painted with creosote. Scraping them off will not destroy them, because the eggs will hatch even though lying on the ground.

## Obligation of Property Owners

If the insects described above are not suppressed on or before April 1, the duly constituted authorities have the right to enter upon property and to take such measures as may be necessary. The property owner will be liable for the expense in connection with such action within the limits prescribed by law.
