TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Warner in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Warner on Tuesday, the Eighth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,600.50 for State Aid construction and \$800.00 for State Aid maintenance.
4. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,128.00 for Trunk Line maintenance.
5. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for White Pine Blister rust in the town.
6. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the care of cemeteries.
7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for repairing and oiling School street, Mill street and Depot street.
8. To see what action the town will take in regard to allowing Sunday sports.
9. To see if the town will vote to install two (2) street lights on Bible Hill and appropriate money for the same.
10. To hear reports of officers of the town heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money on the notes of the town in anticipation of taxes.

12. To bring in your votes for election of Delegates at large, Alternate Delegates at large, District Delegates, Alternate District Delegates to the National Convention of the Democrat and Republican parties to be held for the purpose of nominating party candidates for President and Vice President of the United States.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

*Mrs. Harris was assistant in grades 5-6 during part of the fall term. She was on duty four days of the week for about 1½ hours in the forenoon. On account of the very large number of pupils in grades 1-2 Mrs. Nelson was hired to assist in that room and also to take the work that Mrs. Harris had in Grades 5-6. She served during the balance of the year for one-half day every day of the school week.

Miss Clark was at the High School only a few weeks in the fall term and then resigned on account of illness. Miss Coolidge after a short interim when Mrs. Glavin substituted as Domestic Arts teacher then took up this work for the balance of the year.

After the resignation of Mrs. Bigelow early in April Miss Abbiati and Miss Glancy were employed for the balance of the year, after a short period of substitution by Miss Parody.

On account of the several changes in the teaching staff of the High School the continuity of the work was broken up. The results in the departments affected were not satisfactory as they might have been otherwise. It was particularly difficult to find teachers for the domestic arts on account of the great scarcity of those trained for that work.

MEDICAL INSPECTION

The annual medical inspection was made by Dr. L. H. Cogs-well assisted by the school nurse, Miss Ruth Whitcomb, and re-ported as follows:

Number of pupils examined, 229; teachers, 9; cases, 10 per cent or more underweight, 56; defective vision, 10; defective hearing, 3; deformity, 1; defective teeth, 91; diseased tonsils, 48; adenoids, 12; pediculosis, 7; scabies, 1; unvaccinated, 23; excused by board of health, 10.

A dental clinic was held in March with Dr. McLaughlin as dentist, assisted by Miss Whitcomb.

In June a class of 21 was graduated from the Junior High School. All but two of this class entered High School in the fall term.

At the Graded School building and at Davisville School only a minimum of minor repairs will need to be made during the coming year. At the High School the half of the old shop left standing in the rear of the new addition might be repaired by the agricultural classes and used for metal working downstairs. Lumber could be stored overhead. The cost of this would be very small as enough old lumber is there for boarding up the end. There is already a cement floor under the old board floor. Two second-hand forges obtained from the U. S. army and installed in this building would provide for all the metal working required in the Smith-Hughes course.

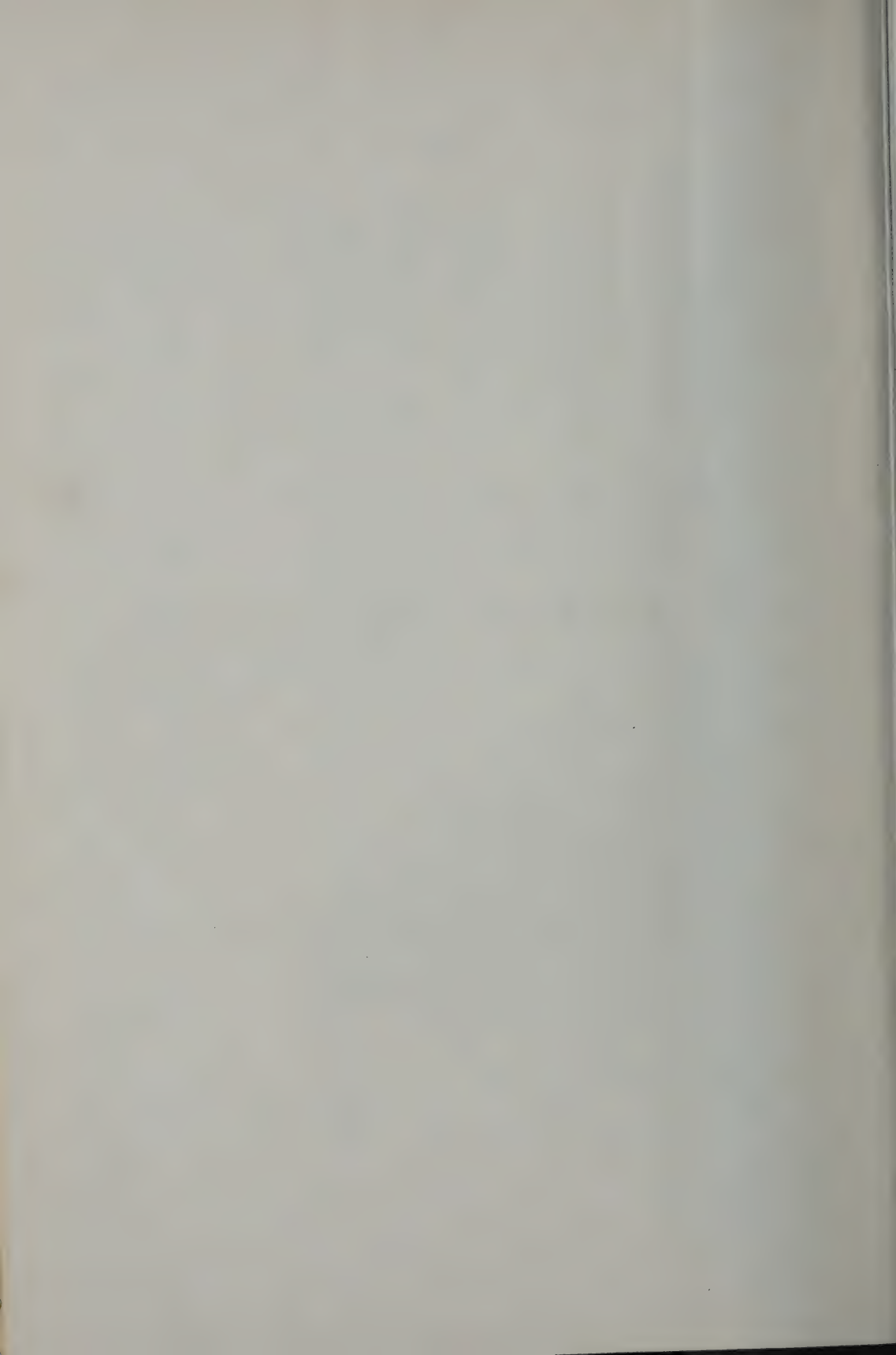

NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS

In accordance with the statutes (New Hampshire Laws of 1907, Chapter 147) you are requested to take measures to suppress the brown tail moth and the gipsy moth on your premises. The law declares these insects to be a public nuisance and orders their suppression by property owners. Suppression is enforceable by law up to a cost of one-half of 1% of the tax valuation of the property concerned.

Necessary measures must be completed on or before March 1.

This notice is sent to all property owners in accordance with instructions of the Division of Insect Suppression, of the State Department of Agriculture.

The Brown Tail Moth

This pest is present in numbers on apple and pear trees and on many shade trees. Through the winter it occupies webs as big as a hen's egg, attached to the tips of twigs. All such webs should be cut off carefully, gathered up and burned.

The Gipsy Moth

The gipsy moth is found through the winter in the form of egg-masses attached to the trunks of trees, stones, piazza posts, or other locations. Each egg-mass is $\frac{3}{4}$ to $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch long, is covered with fine hairs and is the color of chamois skin. Egg-masses should be painted with creosote. Scraping them off will not destroy them, because the eggs will hatch even though lying on the ground.

Obligation of Property Owners

If the insects described above are not suppressed on or before March 1, the duly constituted authorities have the right to enter upon property and to take such measures as may be necessary. The property owner will be liable for the expense in connection with such action within the limits prescribed by law.
