REPORT OF LIBRARY TRUSTEES

During the past year 143 new books were purchased and of these 123 were fiction. The library now contains about 3000 volumes of which about 1800 are fiction. Five periodicals, namely *Harper's*, *Scribner's*, *St. Nicholas*, *Good Housekeeping* and *American* are provided for the reading room.

During the past year the library has been repaired and painted at a total expense of \$71.64. The catalogue cabinet has been doubled in capacity by the installation of an additional section; and this has made it possible to place the subject cards and author cards in separate cabinets. Some expenditures on the heating plant may be necessary during the coming year, and the interior walls of the library should be painted in the near future.

SCHOOL REPORT

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

To the School Board of North Hampton:

I hereby submit to you my fifth annual report as superintendent of your schools.

During the past year we have made comparatively little change in the administration of the schools. Owing to the absence of the fifth grade in the Little River District, it was thought advisable to retain the sixth grade in that school instead of transferring those pupils to the Centre school as last year.

We have retained our full corps of teachers unchanged from last year and their increased efficiency shows the wisdom of that action. We have tried in many ways to increase the efficiency of the instruction, and the effectiveness of the discipline and to secure an improvement in the spirit and morale of the school.

The school nurse, Mrs. Cooper, has continued to prove the value of her work and I am certain that no money spent for the schools brings larger returns than that paid for her salary.

I believe that both parents and pupils have continued to appreciate the attractive appearance of the school buildings on the outside and the improvements which have added so much on the inside to the comfort of the pupils.

The Reading room at the Center has been furnished with magazines and several volumes have been added to the library of the school.

Of the nine pupils who graduated from our eighth grade in June 1929, seven are attending high schools. At the present time this town has five seniors, five juniors, nine sophomores, and twelve freshmen, in five different schools.

The school population of North Hampton is not increasing. This is particularly true of the Little River district where the summer residents are crowding out the permanent families. I stated in my last report that when the number of pupils in the town decreased to such an extent that they all could be accommadated in the three schools at the Center, without over-crowding, it would be the part of ecomony to transport the pupils to the Center school.

Without taking into account the pupils who will not be promoted, the size of the grades next fall will be as follows: eighth grade 10, seventh grade 14, sixth grade 8, fifth grade 6, fourth grade 6, third grade 13, second grade 7, first grade estimated 8. This would assign 24 pupils to the Junior high room, 20 pupils to the Intermediate room, and about 28 to the Primary room. These numbers are not too large for the efficient work. In fact the addition of the pupils from the Little River school would add to the efficiency of the school rather than distract.

I am confident that if the parents of the Little River district should try this plan of transporting all their pupils to the Center school that the increased interest of the pupils in their school work would be so evident that the parents would not wish to_return to the former system.

Our present teachers have had both training and experience and because of that are doing efficient work. North Hampton can well afford to pay sufficient salaries to enable its School Board with electing new teachers to secure those who have had both training and experience.

North Hampton is fortunate in having for a School Board persons vitally interested in our schools.

I desire to express my appreciation of the co-operation of teachers, members of School Board and Citizens in making our schools more efficient.
