

Dear Fellow Citizens:

As usual, your Selectmen will try to give you a picture of the Town's financial situation in condensed narrative form. The general pattern does not change much from year to year but some of the details filling in that pattern do. As usual, when we consider this year's proposed budget at Town Meeting on March 14th, by far the largest appropriation going to make up our tax rate for the coming year has already been determined at the annual Monadnock Regional School District meeting, a net amount of \$34,628.09 has to be raised for our share even after the application of State Foundation Aid.

To this must be added the net amount to be raised for Town appropriations of \$9,695.74 and the estimated amount to be raised for the County is \$1,700.00, making a total amount to be raised by property taxes of \$46,473.83. This is compared to the amount raised last year by property taxes of \$42,675.88.

As usual, we have held town appropriations to the same level as has prevailed for the last several years. Even though we are proposing an increase of \$450.00 in the overall highway expenditures to give long overdue pay raises, economies in other items have approximately balanced this amount.

The question which immediately comes to your mind as a taxpayer is, what will our share of the increased school district budget mean in taxes? Last year being a non-legislative year, we could predict your tax rate to you because all of the variables going to make it up were known. We predicted a drop of at least \$4.00 per \$1,000.00 in the tax rate and were pleased that it finally came out \$5.00. This year, as in any legislative year, it is a different story because the variables have not yet been acted upon by the legislature. These variables are the amount of Foundation Aid to be granted and the equalized property valuation percentages. We do know this much, Sullivan's percentage of

the school district population is up to 4.72% as compared to 4.33% last year. Since 50% of our bill to the school district is based on school population, our share of the cost over and above the increase already mentioned, would rise even though the 50% based on property valuation remained at the 2.96% of last year. As we have said, this last percentage figure is as yet unknown, but the chances are that it will be higher than it was last year.

The offsetting factor of this is our share of whatever amount the legislature appropriates for State Foundation Aid. As you are all no doubt aware, an increased appropriation is proposed but it should be pointed out that a good deal of the increase is taken up by increased school population throughout the State, and since the legislature never appropriates money enough to meet the Foundation Aid formula, our share depends on how we compare with our neighbors when it comes to slicing up the too-small pie. If we were to indulge in a guess at this point, it would be that our tax rate might have to go up slightly to meet the increased school costs.

The financial condition of the Town continues excellent and that is reflected in the favorable rate at which the Town can borrow money, which is among the lowest rates in the State. Our only indebtedness is our TRA note which, as you know, is almost completely funded by State TRA payments. At the end of this fiscal year, there will be only a balance of approximately \$650.00 to be paid, so that at next Town Meeting we can consider our next five-year road improvement project.

Through prudent business management of leaving no stone unturned to save or make a penny, we have come up with an operating surplus of \$2,989.34, which we hope you will vote into the capital reserve fund as you did with the surplus last year. As you know, our Town equipment each year gets nearer the time for replacement and by having money in the bank, we can get replacement

needs without putting an undue bulge in the budget in any one year.

All in all, we hope you will go along with the articles in the warrant as we have proposed them, particularly those in regard to appropriations because we feel that the budget as presented is best calculated to meet the needs of the Town for the current year. We hope also that you will take advantage of the last article of the warrant to discuss any matters of general or particular concern in regard to the administration of Town affairs so that we can best continue to serve you.

Minutes of the 1966 Meeting

Town meeting was opened by the Moderator, Wayne A. Wyman, at 7:30 P.M.

The Town Warrant was read by the Moderator.

Article 1

Election of Town Officers. See list.

Article 2

Motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,130.00 to defray town charges for the ensuing year was approved by voice vote.

Article 3

Motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,200.00 for Summer maintenance of highways and bridges, and for any construction for same was approved by voice vote.

Article 4

Voted to raise and appropriate \$4,200.00 for Winter maintenance of highways and bridges.

Article 5

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the general expenses of the highway department.

Article 6

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$404.19 for Town Road Aid, State share being \$2,694.58.

Article 7

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 to provide and maintain adequate Public Library service.

Article 8

Motion made that the Fire Department needed \$700.00. It was passed over. Another motion was made to appropriate \$550.00. It was approved by voice vote.

Article 9

Voted to pass over Article 9.

Article 10

Voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 11

Voted to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$200.00 for the ensuing year to contract with City of Keene for health services comparable of these received by Keene residents.

Article 12

Voted to raise the salary of Town Auditor from \$15.00 to \$30.00 a year.

Article 13

A motion to accept from the Sullivan Community Society the "Community Hall, funds and property" as a gift was approved by voice vote.

Article 14

Voted to accept the Benjamin F. Leighton Cemetery Trust Fund in the amount of \$100.00.

Article 15

Voted to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Conservation Commission.

Article 16

Voted to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Community Action Committee.

Article 17

Voted to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of new highway equipment, placing therein the amount of \$2,736.78 and designating the Selectmen as agents of the Town authorized to make withdrawals from said fund to carry out the purpose for which it was established.

Article 18

Voted to accept the reports of Agents, Auditors, and Committees as printed.

Article 19

Voted to authorize the Selectmen to explore ways to simplify the Town Report.

Voted to authorize the Selectmen to combine the Summer and Winter maintenance and the general expenses of the Highway Department into one group.

Voted the meeting be dissolved.

WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Sullivan in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Sullivan on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March next, at 7:30 of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be judged necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year.
- 3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money, including that sum required by law, as may be judged necessary, for Summer Maintenance of highways and bridges, and for any construction of the same, for the ensuing year.
- 4. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be judged necessary for the Winter Maintenance of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- 5. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be judged necessary for the General Expenses of the Highway Department.
- 6. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$401.45 for Town Road Aid in order to receive the full State share of \$2,676.32.

- 7. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be judged necessary to provide and maintain adequate Public Library service or to supplement funds otherwise provided.
- 8. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be judged necessary for the operation of the Fire Department and the purchase and maintenance of equipment.
- 9. To authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to add to the capital reserve fund, for the purpose of purchasing new highway equipment, the amount of \$2,989.34, the same being the operating surplus of the fiscal year 1966, and to designate the Selectmen as agents of the Town authorized to make withdrawals from said fund to carry out the purposes for which it was established.
- 11. To accept the reports of Agents, Auditors, and Committees as printed in the Town Report.
- 12. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting and to listen to opinions of a purely advisory nature in regard to the conduct of town affairs for the ensuing year.
