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CONGRESSIONAL RACES IN GRANITE STATE REMAIN CLOSE

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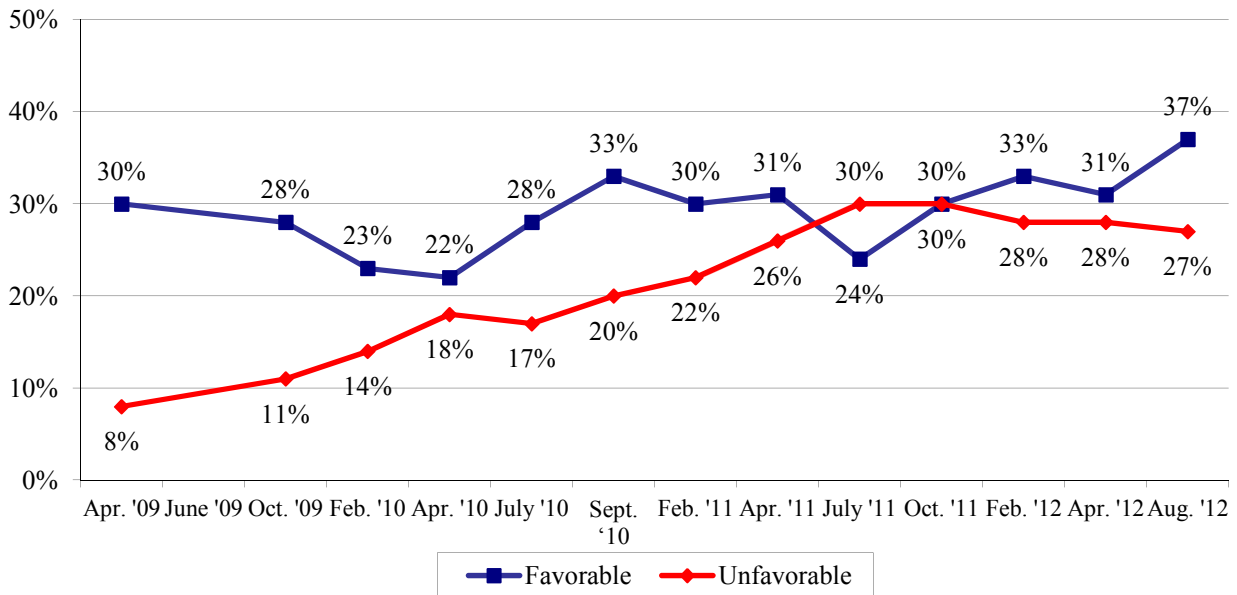
DURHAM, NH – The races in New Hampshire’s First and Second Congressional Districts remain very close. Senators Jeanne Shaheen and Kelly Ayotte are both viewed favorably among New Hampshire adults.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred eighty-one (581) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between August 1 and August 12, 2012. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.1 percent. Included was a subsample of 258 likely voters in the NH First Congressional District (margin of sampling error +/- 6.1%), and a subsample of 284 Second Congressional District likely voters (margin of sampling error +/-5.8%).

First Congressional District – Frank Guinta

Republican Frank Guinta, who represents New Hampshire’s 1st Congressional District, has seen an improvement in his favorability ratings in recent months. Currently, 37% of 1st District adults have a favorable opinion of Guinta, 27% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 5% are neutral and 31% don’t know enough about him to say. Guinta’s net favorability rating, the percentage who have a favorable opinion of him minus those who have an unfavorable opinion, stands at +10%, up from +3% in April. Among Republicans, his net favorability rating is at +52%, +28% among Independents, and a low -36% among Democrats.

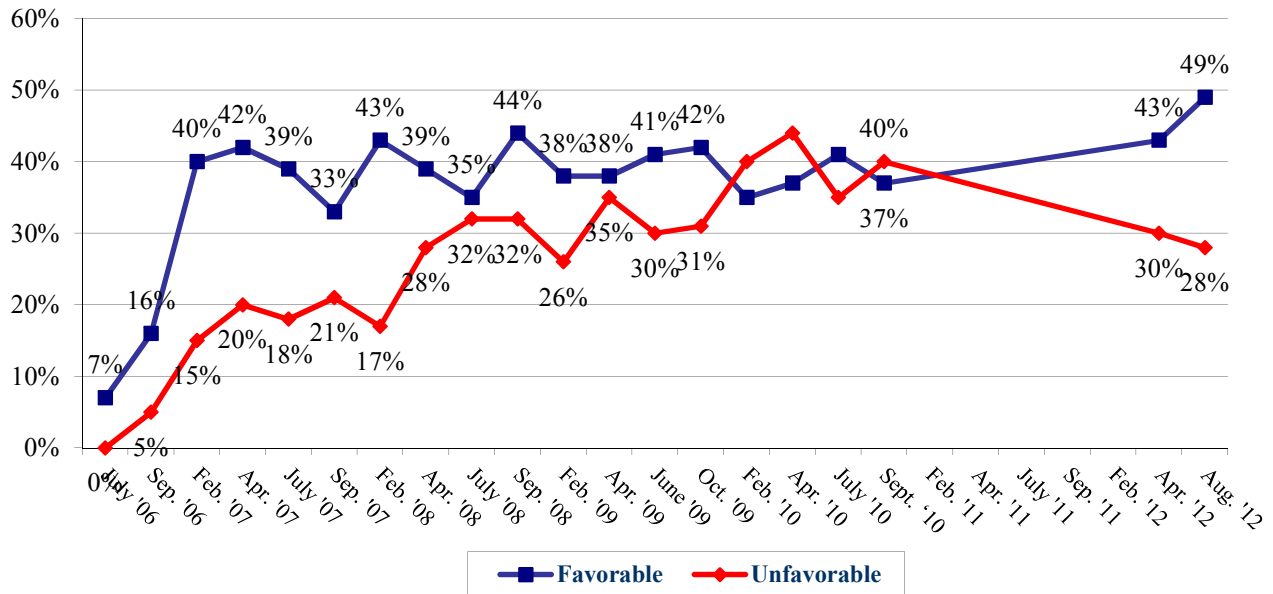
Favorability Ratings – Frank Guinta, NH 1st Congressional District

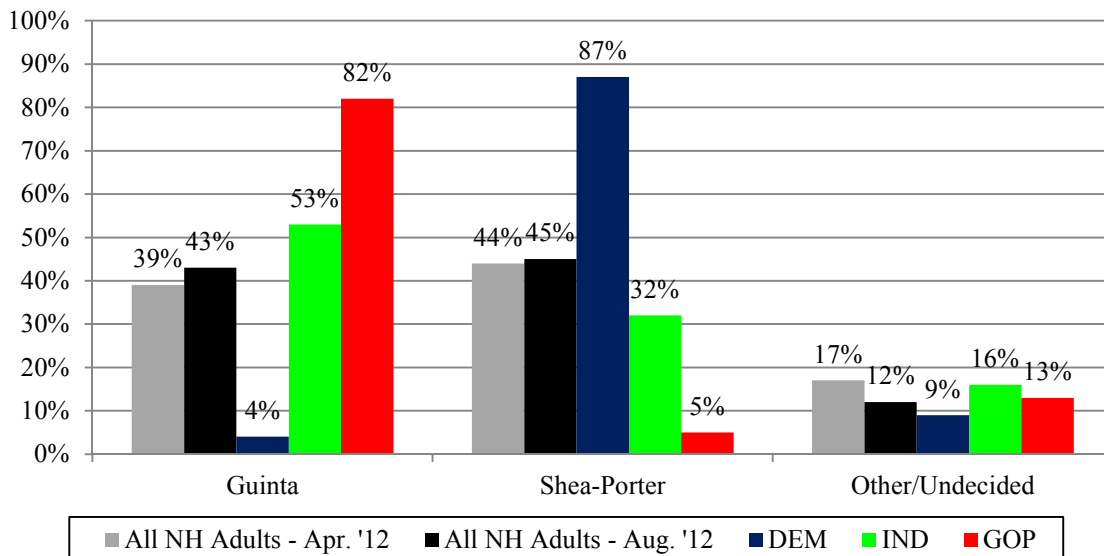
Guinta's Democratic challenger for the 1st Congressional District seat is Carol Shea-Porter, the woman he defeated in 2010. Shea-Porter has also seen her favorability rise in recent months. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 49% of 1st District residents say they have a favorable opinion of her, 28% have an unfavorable opinion, 5% are neutral, and 18% are unsure. Shea-Porter's net favorability rating is +21% overall, up from +13% in April. Shea-Porter's net favorability rating stands at +75% among Democrats, +19% among Independents, and -37% among Republicans.

Favorability Ratings – Carol Shea-Porter NH 1st District



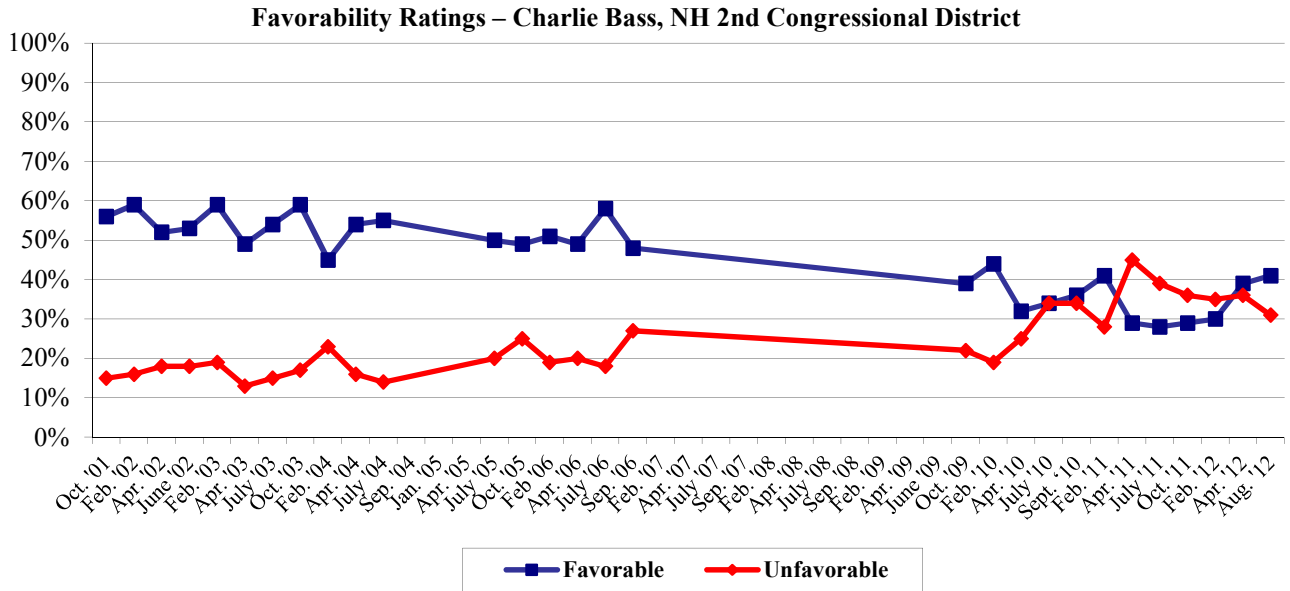
Guinta won the 2010 election by 12 percentage points, but the 2012 elections looks to be much closer. Currently the race is essentially tied with Shea-Porter favored by 45% of likely voters, Guinta with 43%, and 12% are undecided. This is largely unchanged since April. Guinta holds a nearly 20 percentage point lead among political independents, 53% to 32%.

(Likely 2012 General Election Voters)**

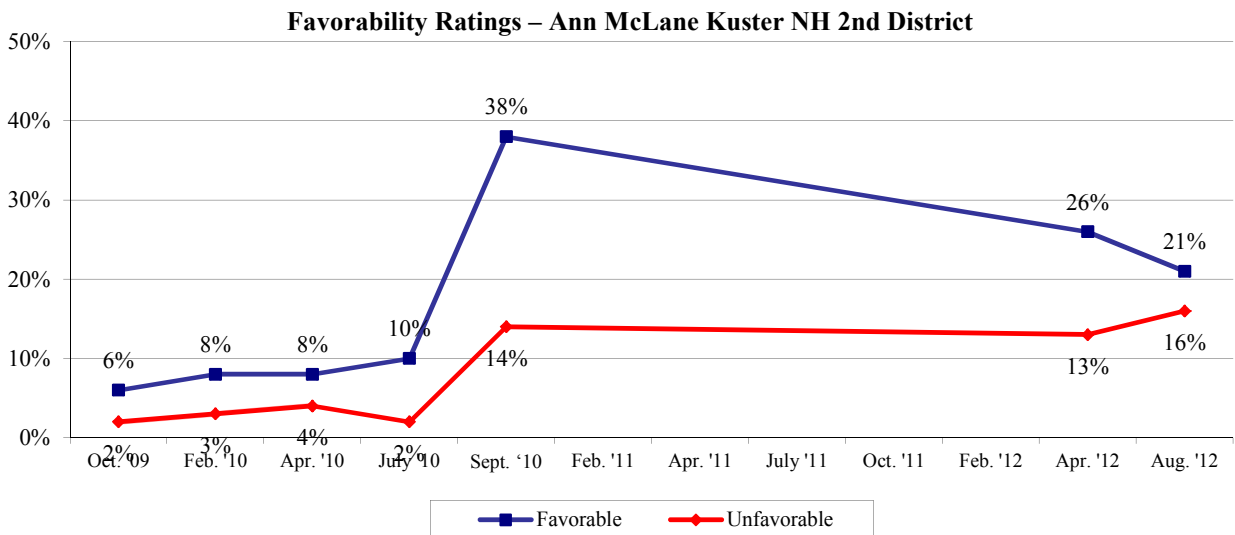


Second Congressional District – Charlie Bass

Second Congressional District Republican Charlie Bass favorability ratings have inched up in recent months. Currently, 41% of 2nd CD residents have a favorable opinion of Bass, 31% have an unfavorable of him, 6% are neutral and 23% don't know enough about him to say. Bass's net favorability rating is +10%, up from +3% in April. His net favorability rating among Republicans is +49%, +15% among Independents, but remains very low among Democrats (-38%).

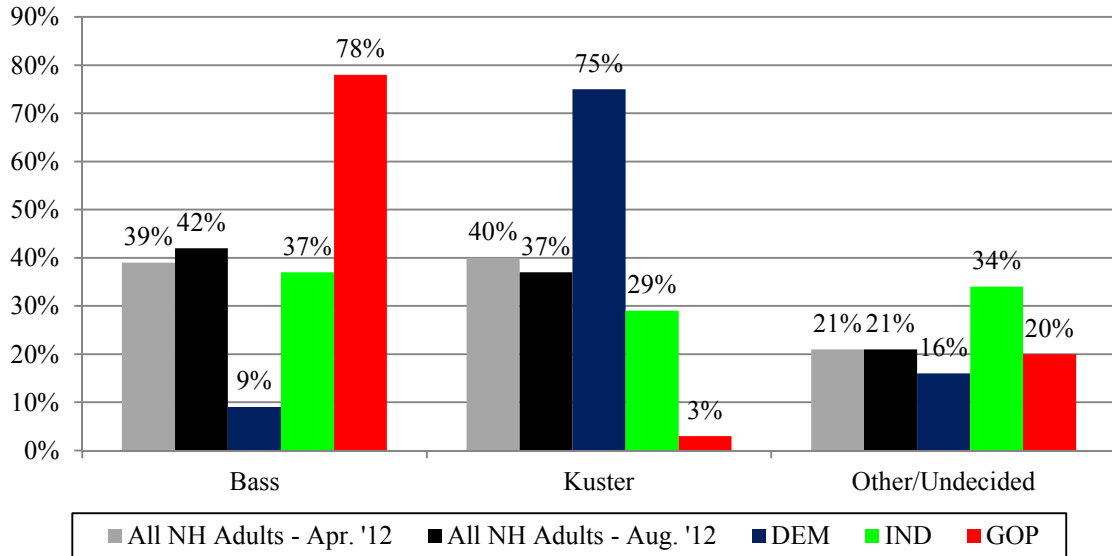


Bass is also facing a rematch with his 2010 opponent, Concord attorney Ann McLane Kuster. Despite losing by only 2 percentage points in 2010, Kuster is not as well-known as Bass. Currently, 21% of Second District adults have a favorable opinion of Kuster, 16% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 1% are neutral, and 61% don't know enough about her to say. Kuster's net favorability rating is +5%, down from +13% in April; +40% among Democrats, +9% among Independents, and -27% among Republicans.



Like the First CD, the race in the Second CD is essentially tied -- 42% say they plan to vote for Bass, 37% support Kuster, and 21% remain undecided.

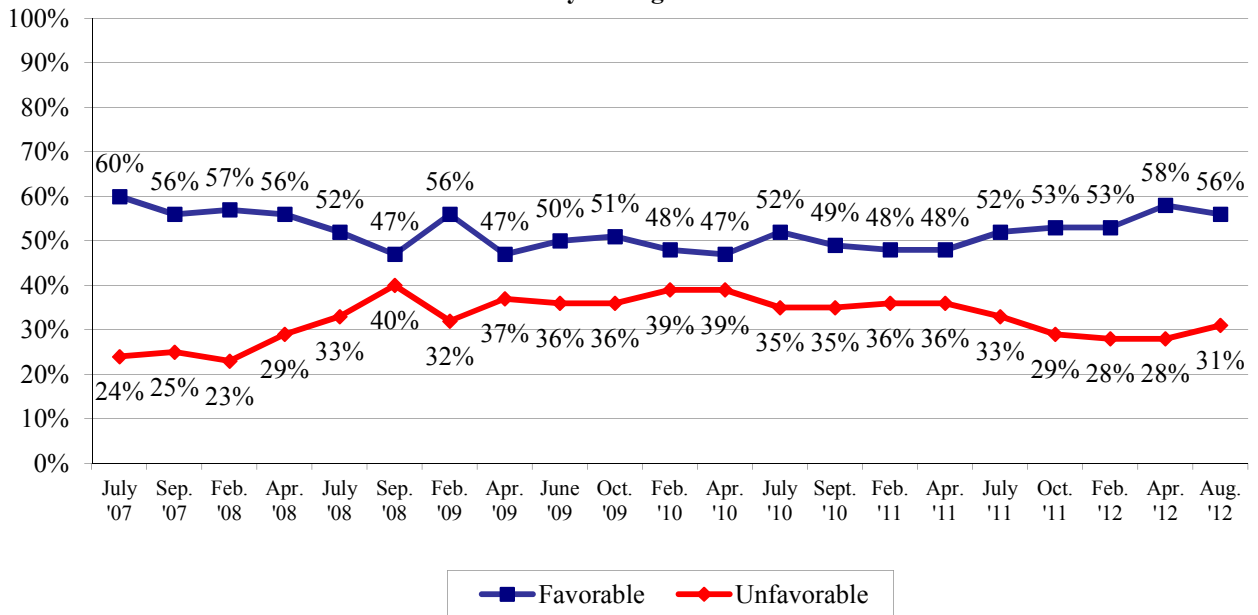
**November 2012 General Election - Bass vs. Kuster

Favorability Ratings – Senator Jeanne Shaheen

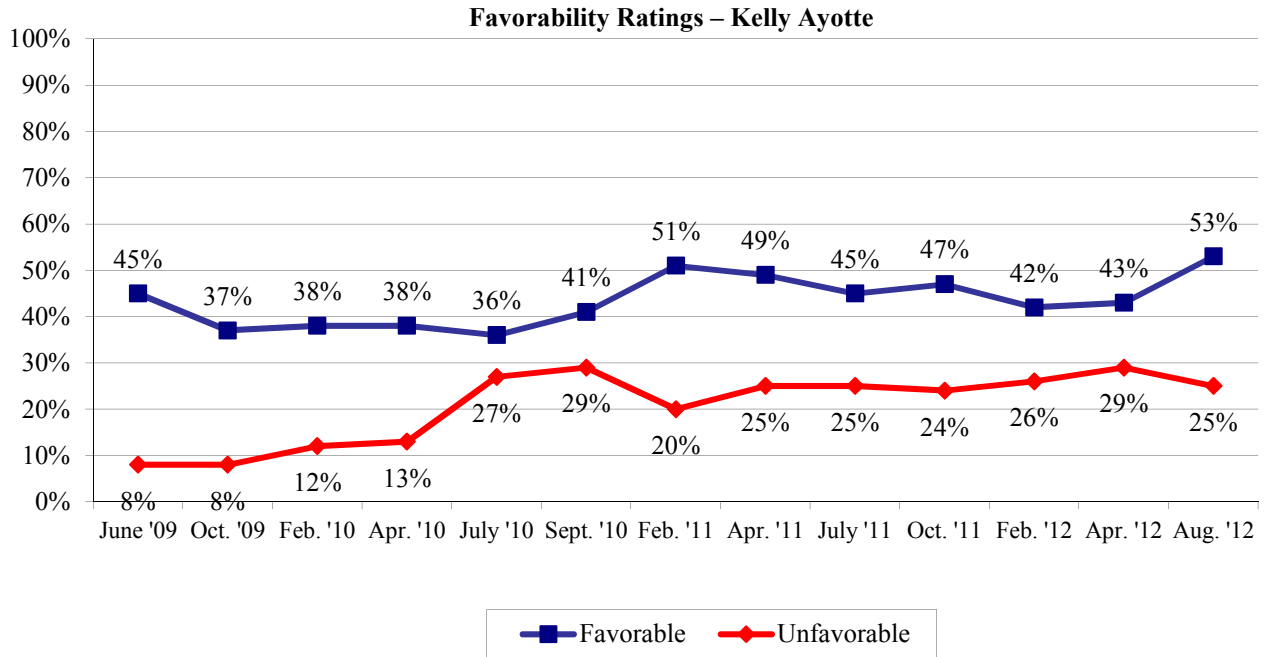
Democratic Senator Jeanne Shaheen has long been one of the most popular politicians in New Hampshire. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 56% of New Hampshire adults say they have a favorable opinion of Shaheen, 31% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 4% are neutral and 9% don't know enough about her to say. Shaheen's net favorability rating is +25%, down slightly from +30% in April. Shaheen is viewed very favorably among Democrats (net favorability rating of +80%), favorably among Independents (+27%), and unfavorably among Republicans (-29%).

Favorability Ratings – Senator Kelly Ayotte

The favorability ratings of New Hampshire’s junior senator, Republican Kelly Ayotte, have climbed in recent months after having remained stable for more than a year. Currently, 53% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Ayotte, 25% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 5% are neutral and 18% don’t know enough about her to say. Ayotte’s net favorability rating is +28%, up from +14% in April. Among Republicans, her net favorability is +76%, +18% among Independents, and -18% among Democrats.



Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred eighty-one (581) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between August 1 and August 12, 2012. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.1 percent. Included was a subsample of 258 likely voters in the NH First Congressional District (margin of sampling error +/- 6.1%), and a subsample of 284 Second Congressional District likely voters (margin of sampling error +/-5.8%).

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may sum to just above or below 100%. Respondent numbers in each demographic may not equal the total respondent number due to respondents choosing not to answer some demographic questions.
