AS I SEE IT

bob osgood

WHAT HAS BEEN your most unforgettable square dance experience? We asked this question recently of a number of active square dancers from more than a dozen states and Canadian provinces, and we got answers ranging from "The first time we danced to Marshall Flippo," "The first time we went to a national square dance convention," "The first tour we went on with a group of square dancers," to "The first time we went to a square dance vacation weekend."

There's something particularly appealing about the "first" of anything we do. The first caller we ever danced to is often the one for whom we hold a very special spot in our hearts. The "first" club we joined, is indelibly marked in our memories as being full of great surprises and new experiences.

However, after doing a bit of thinking, almost all those we questioned expressed the idea that of all past experiences, the initial time spent in learners' classes ranks about the highest of all square dance memories. "Here we all were at the first night of beginners' class, none of us knowing each other and none of us knowing a thing about square dancing. By the middle of the evening, even the most skeptical among us realized that square dancing held some special fascination for us. As class time went on, we made friendships with people we had never known before. Many of these friendships have lasted us through the years."

One lady said in effect, "We felt so victorious when we found that we could do what the caller was saying. How exciting it was to buy our first square dance clothes. The more we danced, the less self-conscious we became and we even laughed at ourselves when we made a goof."

"Most of all," said another man, "we felt a great joy in moving to music, to all kinds of music, in squares, circles, lines, stars; you

name it, we danced it. The important thing to me was the fact that I had always felt that I could never dance and would never dance. Now I realized for the first time how important it is for us to dance and to enjoy ourselves with friends, regardless of their financial situation, their religion or their politics."



With preparations underway now for classes starting next month, it's a good time to think of our responsibility to the newcomers whom we'll be bringing into the classes. We'll be putting up banners, announcing on local radio shows and in the newspapers that "square dancing is fun." Sometimes what we mean is "Come in, learn how to square dance *as quickly as you can*, so that one day before long you can become a part of *our club*." Perhaps your square dance club is having growing pains and you need more members. This attitude is *not* unreasonable, but it may be where we are making a mistake.

It takes time to learn to be a square dancer. By this we don't simply mean it takes a lot of time to learn all of the movements, the 50 basics or the 75 basics. Of course, these do take time. However, there are two stages in the learning process that are more important than this. First, he learns to react automatically to the basic commands of the caller. For the new dancer, a movement such as right and left thru, or two ladies chain, can very well be the most difficult movement he will ever face during his square dance experience. Why? Be-

cause he has not yet learned how to react automatically and to the beat of the music. Once he has gained this skill and been allowed to practice the simpler movements over and over, he is ready for any basic or new movement that may come along. However, until this time of *automatic reaction* is captured, he is hesitant and unsure of himself. This is one of the two goals the new dancer must achieve in his initial classroom experience.

The second is just as important. There is an attitude which, if learned correctly in the first days of dancing, will support the dancer through all of his future square dance experiences. This attitude is a blending of friendliness, helpfulness, consideration and cooperation. Square dancing never has been, and never can be, a solo, independent dance. It is teamwork in action, a combining of personalities that allows each individual to blend his personality with those of the entire group. A new dancer who has become imbued with the "spirit of square dancing" stands a good chance of deriving the full pleasure the activity has to offer.



What this all boils down to is simply this. As we start classes in the 1974-75 program, let us think seriously about allowing time for the new dancer to gain the full pleasure and value from his beginner's class. Rushing through the learning period will only backfire later on with inadequately trained dancers.

If our goal is to bring into the activity well indoctrinated dancers, then let's realize that it not only takes time to learn 75 basics, but it also takes time to convert a non-dancer into a friendly, enthusiastic and considerate dancer.

If your goal is to cover the 75 "foundation" basics, allow 30 weeks if possible. That means that your new dancers starting this fall should be ready for a long life of club dancing by next April or May. It may seem a long way into the future now, but the reward of dancers with a "long life expectancy" is well worth the patience.

Square Dance Directories

ONE OF THE PRIME PURPOSES of square dance publications is to provide listings of places to dance. The more than 150 area publications provide an excellent service to

dancers and callers, with club and class listings within their specific readership area. There is virtually no square dance community which is not benefited at the present time by some form of directory or guide.

Back in the late 1940s when square dancing began to expand into "fad" proportions and square dancers and callers began to travel from one area to another, there grew a need for listings that would guide the out-of-town dancer to a place of square dance action. Since its earliest issues, SQUARE DANCING Magazine (Sets in Order) has provided monthly directories of "big events," festivals, roundups, conventions, etc. For the dancer moving into an area, another need arose — some form of directory which would guide the out-of-towner to the square dance club that would welcome him. Special news items and coverage in a nationally circulated publication did a part of the job.

Feeling the need for a different type of directory listing service, this publication in 1966 started what was to be an annual directory of square dance *information volunteers*. Men and women with a knowledge of square dance activities in their own area, who were willing to take the time to answer letters and phone calls and direct out-of-towners to a dance in the area, were selected and appeared under State, Province, and Country listings.

Hopefully, those selected have been impartial in their directory service, sending the visitors to more than just a single club or caller in the area. Because these services have been donated on a voluntary basis, we have asked that those asking for written information *send with their request a stamped, addressed return envelope*.

These directories in the past have appeared in the February issue of SQUARE DANCING. Then, during other months, we have run additional directories of current listings of dancer, caller and round dance leader associations and editors of square dance publications. In recent months it has occurred to us that one directory — one issue of SQUARE DANCING Magazine — might contain all of the directory information in one handy, easy-to-find format. What you have in your hands is the result. We hope it will be of help to all.

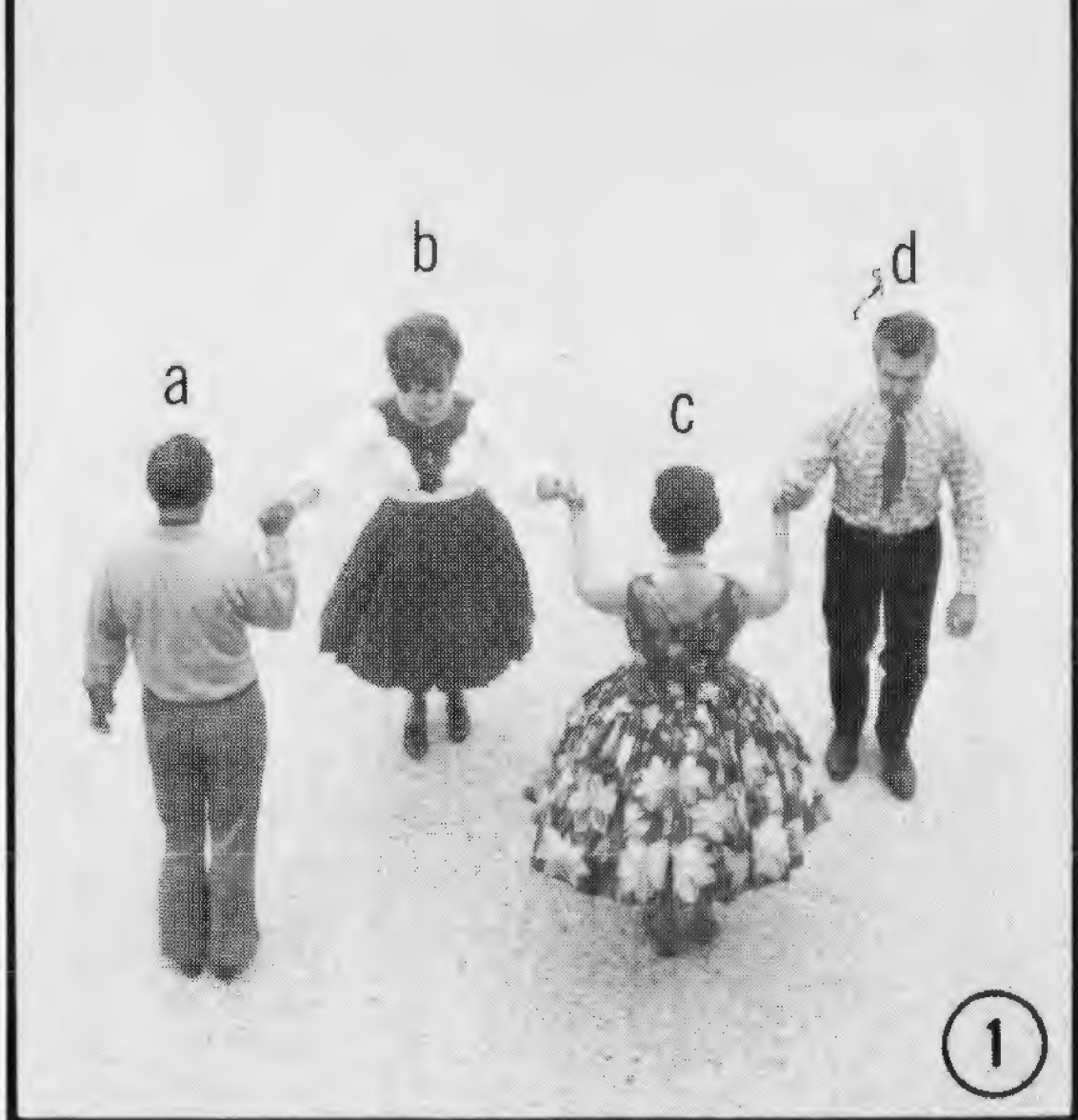

TRADE THE WAVE

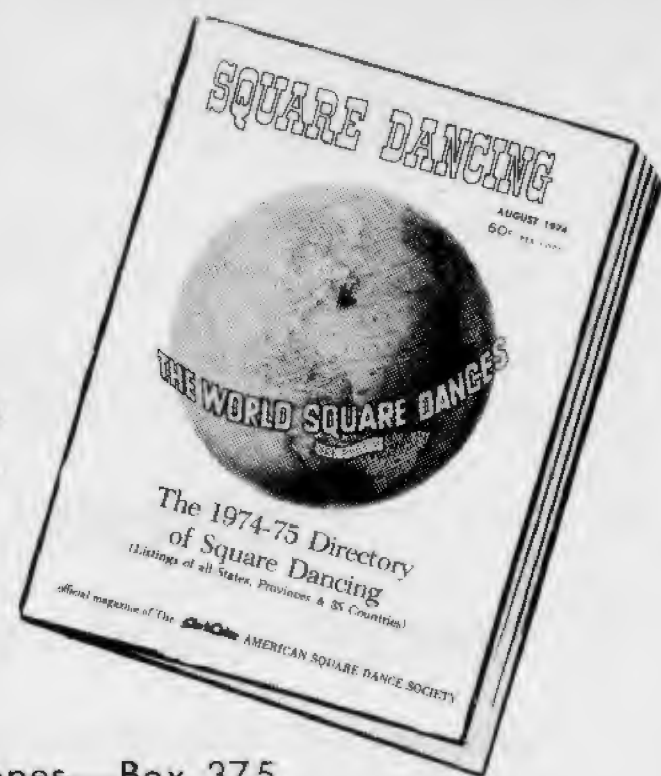
WE'VE BEEN DOING just about everything imaginable with the Ocean Wave and we selected this variation as possibly one that slipped by unnoticed. It's a perfectly understandable movement and is a good use of Trade.

From an Ocean Wave formation (1) each dancer will Trade, passing right shoulders with the person in the wave facing in the same direction. In other words, man (a) will trade with lady (c) while lady (b) will trade with man (d). On the call the dancers start forward (2), passing right shoulders with the person with whom they are Trading (3) and ending once again in an Ocean Wave (4). You will note that the righthand Ocean Wave has now changed to a lefthand ocean wave. Total time for the entire movement is four steps.

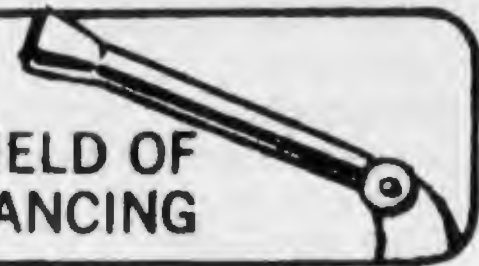

**MIKE
 BURNHAM**

Mike Burnham became interested in square dancing in the late 1950s following a one-night-stand at the local youth club. During this period square dancing was enjoying a big boom due, in part, to the Queen's (then Princess Elizabeth) participation in the activity during a visit to Canada. Having been involved in organizing functions for the youth club and local drama group, Mike naturally became interested in the overall square dance scene. While serving for two years in the Royal Air Force, Mike wrote features for the publication "Let's Square Dance" in the late 1950s and served as its Co-Editor with Tommy Cavanagh in the 60s. He also served as Public Relations officer for the British Association of American Square Dance Clubs. In 1963 Abbey Allemanders was born and Mike started calling under the guidance and encouragement of Tommy Cavanagh. Together Mike and Tommy have organized a number of special dances and weekend festivals, including the Woburn Festival (see SQUARE DANCING, November, 1972). Trained as an electrical engineering draftsman, Mike is now a Director in the family pharmaceutical business.

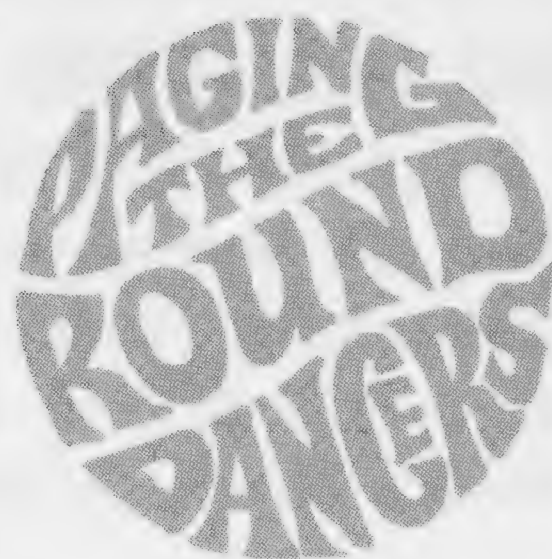
State Callers Association. He has over 30 years' calling experience with three still very active clubs.

Paul plays the organ in his spare time, pursues his studies as a research hobbyist on UFOs, or adds to his growing rock collection. Between calling jobs he occasionally fills a void by working as a finishing woodworker.

Much credit for the growth in popularity of square dancing in Massachusetts goes to Paul Pratt. UNDER THE INSTRUCTION of Harold Bacon, Dub and Clara Perry were introduced to "couple dancing" in 1953, when the "new" dances of the era were "Jessie Polka" and "Waltz of the Bells." Soon after this introduction Dub began to call for various square dance clubs and also to cue the rounds.

At that time all of the dances were with "live music" and if the dancers seemed to be enjoying the couple dance the orchestra would play it over and over, so most of the dances were memorized by the dancers and very seldom was cueing necessary. As more rounds

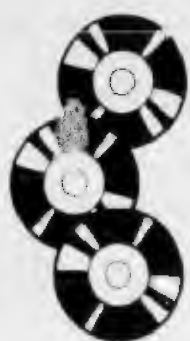

were written and danced it became necessary to teach them at the square dance clubs.

The new dance was first learned by Clara, who in turn taught it to Dub, and he then presented it to the dancers. After a few years of this arrangement it was decided that Clara should present the rounds, and so began a caller-round-dance-leader-husband-wife team, with Dub calling the squares and Clara teaching and cueing the rounds.

It was evident that the dancers needed basics and so their first class began in 1958

with a small group of dancers. Currently this finds the Perrys out three nights each week to accommodate the basic, intermediate and advanced dancers. Although Dub and Clara find it interesting and fun to teach Rounds of the Month and other dances to intermediate and advanced dancers, they find their greatest reward in teaching someone to dance who has never danced before.

In addition to the round dance classes, Dub teaches two square dance classes each week, calls for two local clubs and one workshop

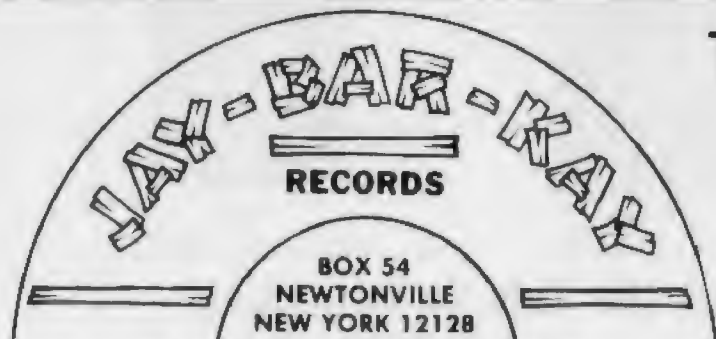

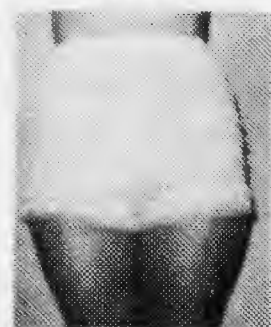

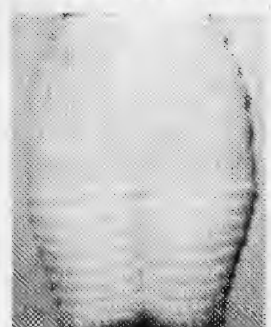

ing and supporting some definite guidelines. . . . I particularly commend the point on maintaining a strong thought on styling. I speak on this from personal experience because had I not given thought to Sets in Order's words of advice and "wisdom" on styling, or had I not have had a reference at all, I may not have even bothered! Further, I'm sure that emphasis on styling greatly improved my calling, in that I was calling much too fast. Now, with several years experience of considering styling as an essential part of dancing, not only am I calling smoother with better timing, but I am also more aware that the dancer enjoys and appreciates the fact that he/she is being better "developed." It is often easy to ignore a lot of little things in dancing, however I'm positive that all so-called "dedicated" callers can easily "conform" to set and proven standards. I know that I will be the first to accept such standards and will encourage others to do so as well.

HOW TO USE THE RECORD REPORT

To get the best possible analysis all singing calls are checked and rated by two sources. First, a rating is made by a square of dancers that actually dances to each record. The records are then sent to another reviewer who rates them on recording quality, instrumentation, clarity of commands, and body mechanics. The final "star" rating is based on a consensus of the reports from both. In all cases and unless otherwise noted, it may be assumed that singing calls are recorded in a medium range. In the case of hoedowns the key will be included.

Each report gives an analysis of the record and the dance. The shaded area in the chart indicates the voice range used by most recording companies. By comparing the voice range letters in each analysis with those on the chart, you should be able to determine the record's suitability to your voice. Occasionally a report will be starred (*) in which case you will find the call reproduced in the Workshop section of the same issue.

Some of the square dance records reported will have rating symbols at the end of the "Comment" section. These represent the opinion of the reviewing committee. Symbols used indicate as follows: ☆Average, ☆☆☆Above Average, ☆☆☆☆Exceptional, ☆☆☆☆☆Outstanding.

Some thoughts by Joe and Barbara on the subject of combination movements.



JOE: You'll quite frequently hear us referring to *basics* and *movements* as being two different objects. To us a *basic* is one of the 75 foundation terms that appear in the two Basic Handbooks and in the Caller/Teacher Manual put out by SIOASDS. Others we call movements or, in the case of new, untested material, "Experimental Movements."

BARBARA: Recently we have been impressed with what can be done with good directional calling. This is why we emphasize the use of the *basics* and sometimes appear to be critical of some of the non-descriptive *movements*. Today, however, we wanted to talk about combining movements and basics. We particularly have in mind the Tag (it can be a quarter, half, three-quarter, or partner Tag), Trade and Roll.

JOE: The combination can be worked from a large number of setups, but we'll take it from a two-faced line (A). Perhaps one day soon we can touch on some of the others. On the call Half Tag Trade and Roll, the Half Tag starts the routine with each of the dancers facing the center of his line (B) and at the

same time side-stepping slightly to the left (C). A Half Tag moves each of the dancers adjacent to another dancer and at this point they take near (right) forearms (D) and trade by turning 180 degrees.

BARBARA: Allowing four steps to complete a normal trade, the dancers will take approximately two steps, release armholds, and roll in the remaining two steps (E), turning slightly to face the person with whom they were trading (F).

JOE: This particular movement is fun if it is done smoothly and plenty of time is allowed for its execution.
