### NH SENATE RACE NARROWS, MOST VOTERS STILL TRYING TO DECIDE

DURHAM, NH – Former Governor Jeanne Shaheen has seen her once comfortable lead over incumbent Republican John Sununu shrink in recent months in the race for the U.S. Senate in New Hampshire. In the 1st District, incumbent Carol Shea-Porter trails former Congressman Jeb Bradley but leads the other Republican challenger, John Stephen. Second District incumbent Paul Hodes continues to hold comfortable leads over his Republican challengers. But it is still early in the campaign and almost three-quarters of voters say they are still trying to decide who to vote for.

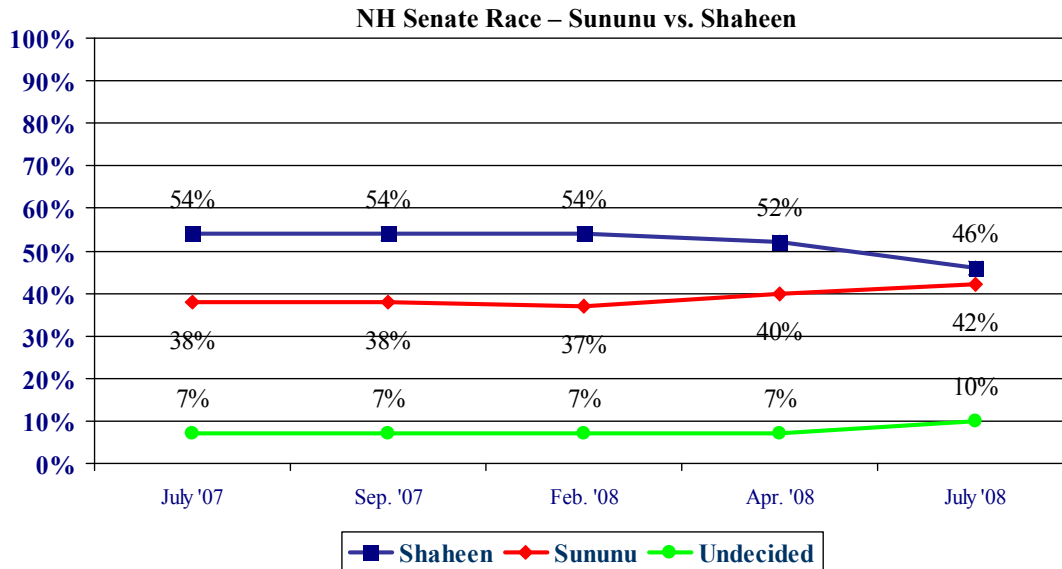
These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll**,\* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred (519) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by telephone between July 11 and July 20, 2008. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/-4.3 percent. Included was a subsample of 475 likely November voters (margin of sampling error, +/- 4.5%). Two hundred thirty-five (235) likely voters lived in New Hampshire's 1st Congressional District (margin of sampling error = +/-6.4%) and 240 lived in the 2<sup>nd</sup> District (margin of sampling error = +/-6.3%).

#### NH Senate Trial Heat

In a rematch of their 2002 race, Republican Senator John Sununu and former Democratic Governor Jeanne Shaheen are in what is shaping up to be a close race for U.S. Senate. Sununu has trailed Shaheen significantly over the past year but he has narrowed the gap in recent months. Shaheen currently receives 46% of the vote with 42% going to Sununu, 1% for some other candidate and 10% are undecided. Sununu had Shaheen trailed by 17% in February and 12% in April.

Shaheen runs strongest among Democrats, liberals, voters with high levels of education, young voters, and non-religious voters. Sununu runs strongest among Republicans, conservatives, older voters, and voters with lower levels of education.

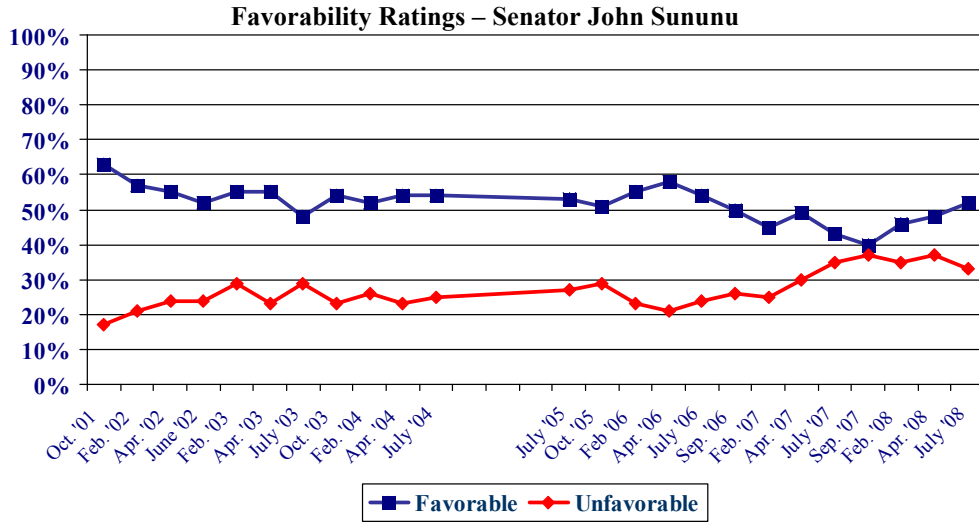
This race is very much up in the air as 22% of likely voters say they have definitely decided who they will vote for, 6% are leaning toward one of the candidates, and 72% are still trying to decide who to support.

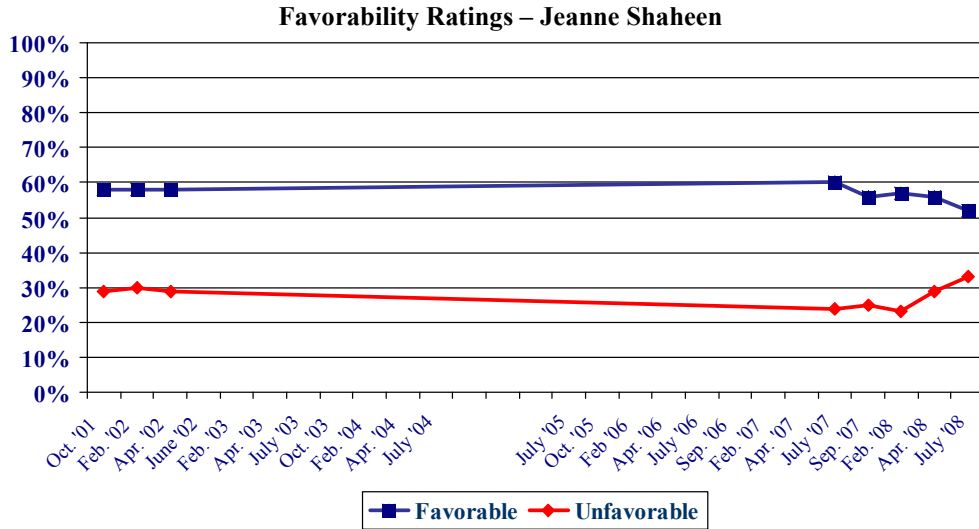
### Favorability Ratings - John Sununu

Currently, Sununu is viewed favorably by 52% of New Hampshire voters, 33% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 9% are neutral and 7% don't know enough to say. Sununu's net favorability is +19% and has been steadily increasing since last fall.



### Favorability Ratings - Jeanne Shaheen

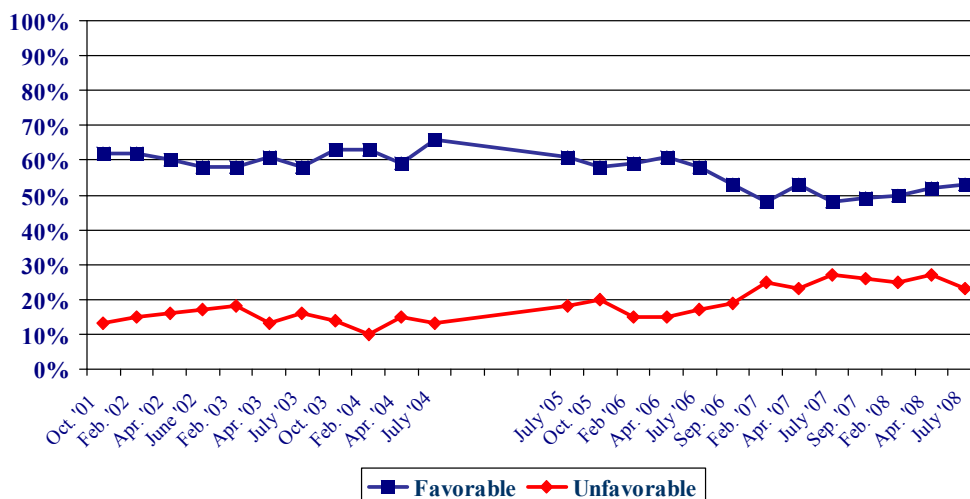
Shaheen was a popular Governor and is still popular today. Currently, 53% of New Hampshire voters have a favorable opinion of Shaheen, 31% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 9% are neutral, and 6% don't know enough about her to say. Shaheen's net favorability rating is +22%. Shaheen's favorability ratings have slipped over the past 6 months as the campaign has heated up.



### Favorability Ratings - Judd Gregg

Republican Senator Judd Gregg continues to be the most popular among New Hampshire's Congressional delegation - 53% of New Hampshire voters have a favorable opinion of Gregg, 23% have an unfavorable opinion, 10% are neutral and 13% don't know enough to say. Gregg's net favorability rating stands at +30 percent.

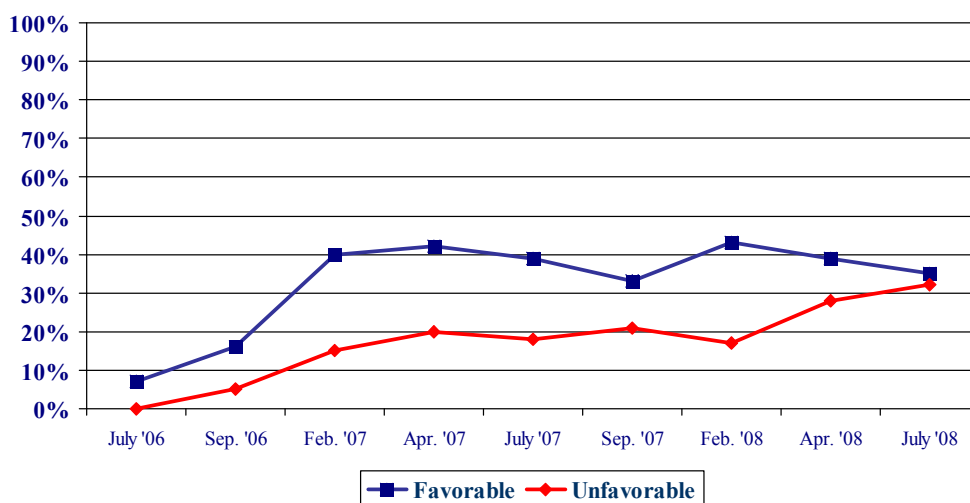
### Favorability Ratings – Senator Judd Gregg



### NH 1<sup>st</sup> District

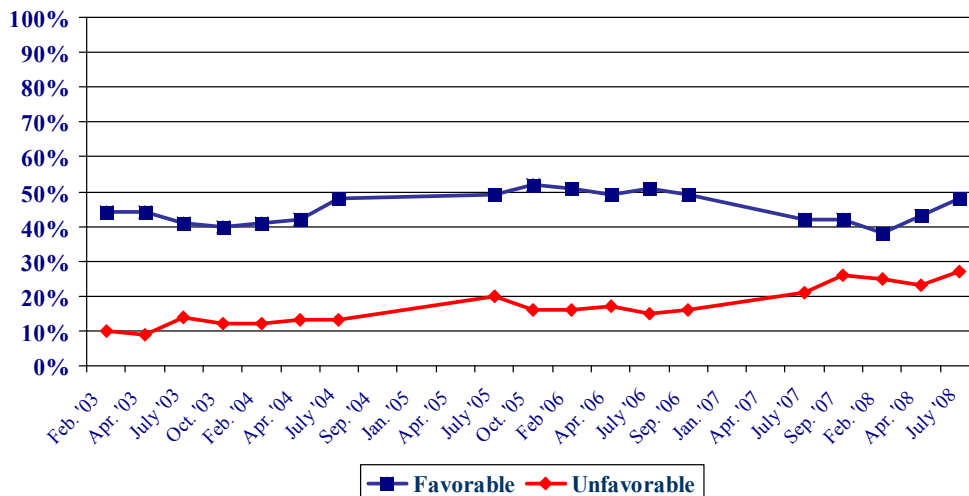
In New Hampshire's 1<sup>st</sup> Congressional District, Democrat Carol Shea-Porter is viewed favorably by 35% of 1<sup>st</sup> District voters, 32% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 9% are neutral, and 24% say they don't know enough about her to say. Shea-Porter's net favorability rating is +3%, down significantly from +26% in February.

### Favorability Ratings – Carol Shea-Porter NH 1<sup>st</sup> District



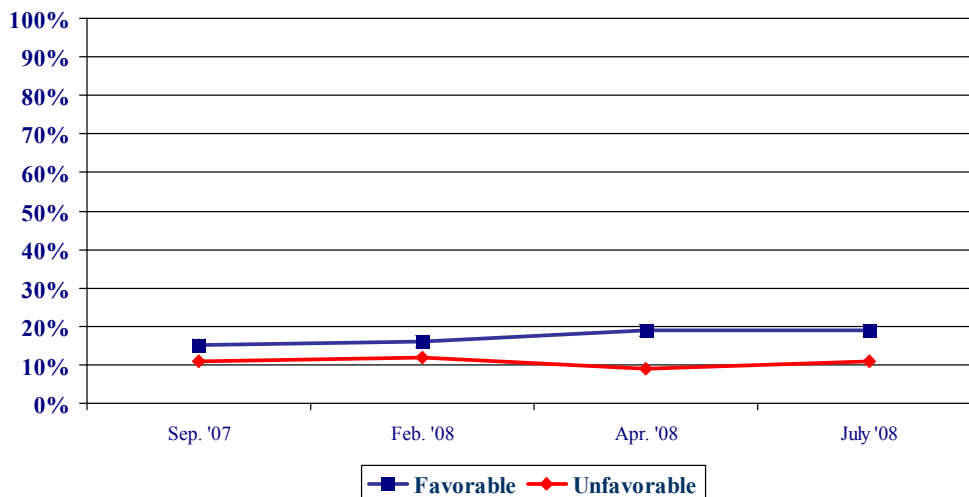
Former 1<sup>st</sup> District Congressman Jeb Bradley is running to regain the seat which he lost to Shea-Porter in 2006. Currently, 48% of 1<sup>st</sup> District voters have a favorable opinion of Bradley, 27% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 8% are neutral and 17% don't know enough about him to say. Bradley's net favorability rating in the 1<sup>st</sup> District stands at +21%.

Former Health and Human Services Commission John Stephen is also running for the 1<sup>st</sup> District seat and will challenge Bradley for the Republican nomination. Stephen remains considerably less well known than Bradley – only 19% of 1<sup>st</sup> District voters have a favorable opinion of Stephen, 11% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 8% are neutral, and 62% don't know enough about him to say. His net approval rating among 1<sup>st</sup> District voters is only +8%.

### Favorability Ratings – John Stephen NH 1<sup>st</sup> District



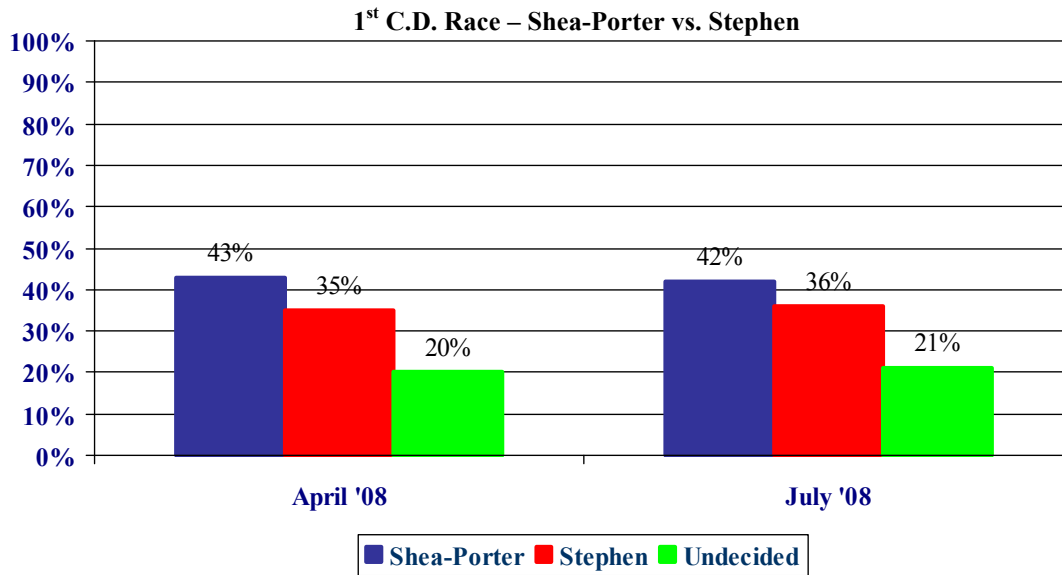
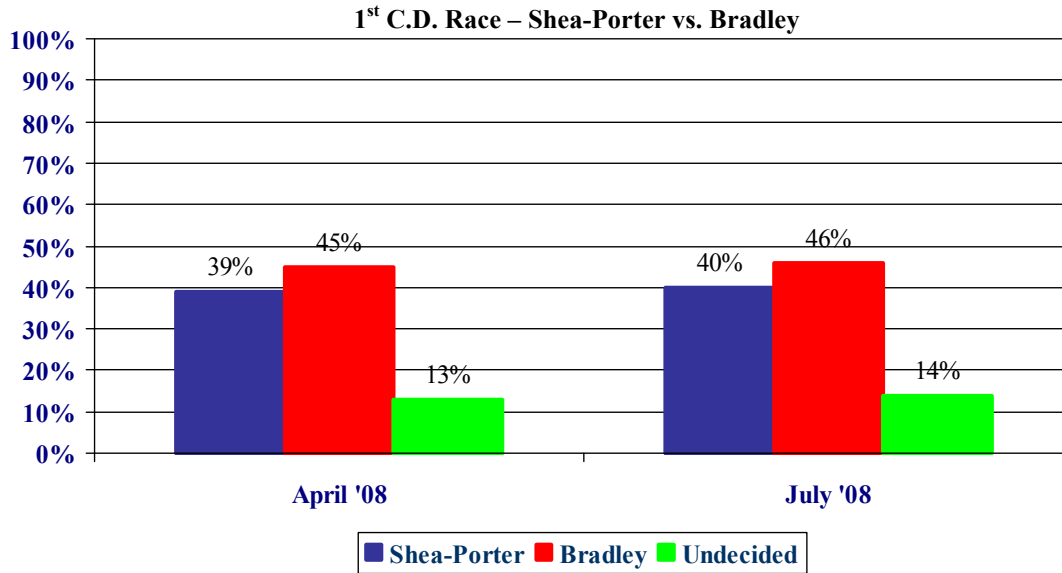
In trial heats between Shea-Porter and her two Republican challengers, Bradley continues to perform considerably better than Stephen. In a matchup between Shea-Porter and Bradley, 46% of likely voters in the 1<sup>st</sup> District say they will vote for Bradley, 40% say they will vote for Shea-Porter, 1% prefer some other candidate and 14% are undecided. This race is essentially unchanged since April.

Bradley runs strongest among Republicans, conservatives, older voters, and voters with lower levels of education. Shea-Porter gets her strongest support from Democrats, liberals, and young voters

There is a significant gender gap in this race with Bradley leading by 56% to 34% among men and Shea-Porter leading by 46% to 36% among women.

And while both Shea-Porter and Bradley hold most of their partisans, Bradley holds a 40% to 26% lead among 1<sup>st</sup> District independents.

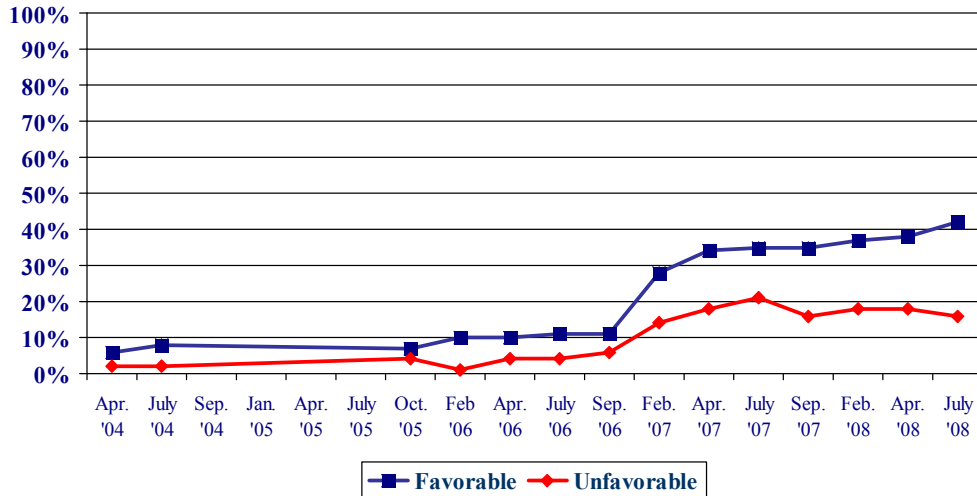
Shea-Porter does much better when matched against Stephen – 42% of 1<sup>st</sup> District likely voters say they would vote for Shea-Porter, 36% say they would vote for Stephen, 1% prefer some other candidate, and 21% are undecided. This race has remained unchanged since April.



## NH 2<sup>nd</sup> District

In the 2<sup>nd</sup> District, incumbent Democrat Paul Hodes remains popular. Currently, 42% of 2<sup>nd</sup> District residents say they have a favorable opinion of Hodes, 16% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 11% are neutral, and 31% say they know too little about him to say. Hodes' net favorability rating is +26 percent and has steadily improved over the past year.

**Favorability Ratings – Paul Hodes NH 2nd District**

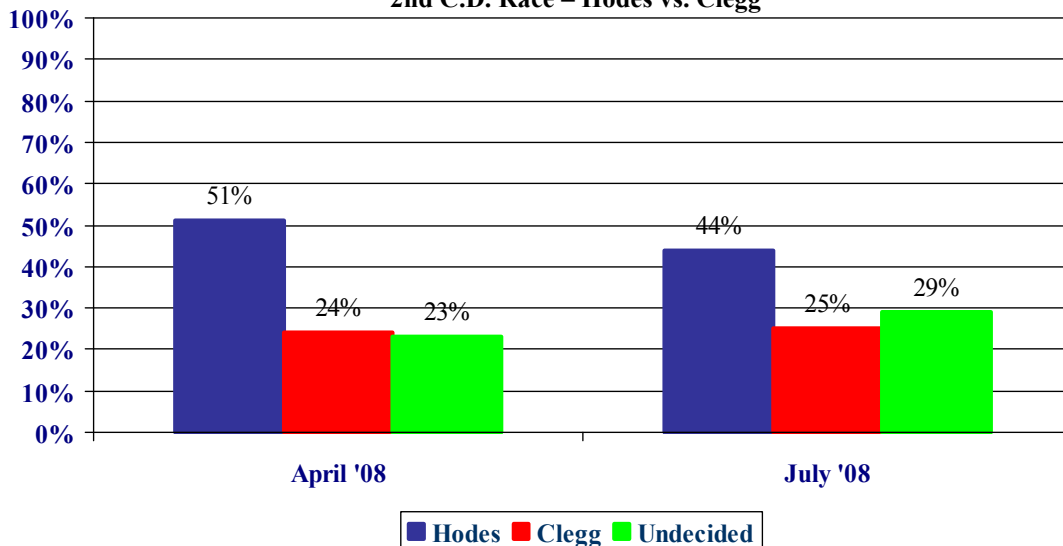


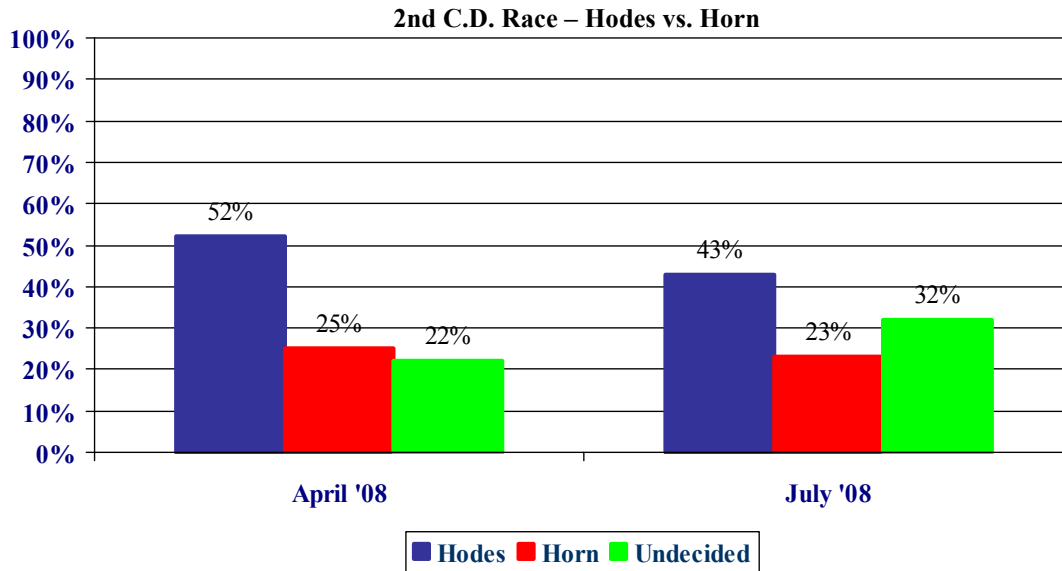
Several Republicans are contesting for the Republican nomination to face Hodes, the two who have raised the most money are Nashua journalist Jennifer Horn and State Senator Bob Clegg of Hudson. Both Clegg and Horn are largely unknown in the 2<sup>nd</sup> District. Only 14% of 2<sup>nd</sup> District voters have a favorable opinion of Clegg, 12% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 12% are neutral, and 62% don't know enough about him to say. Clegg's net favorability rating is +2%.

Similarly, only 9% of 2<sup>nd</sup> District voters have a favorable opinion of Horn, 4% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 11% are neutral, and 77% don't know enough about her to say. Horn's net favorability rating is +5%.

Because he is viewed favorably by 2<sup>nd</sup> District voters, and because his challengers are largely unknown, Hodes currently holds comfortable leads over both Clegg and Horn. Hodes leads Clegg by a 44% to 25% margin, with 3% preferring some other candidate and 29% undecided. Hodes leads Horn by a 43% to 23% margin, with 2% favoring some other candidate and 32% undecided.

#### **Granite State Poll Methodology**

Five hundred (519) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by telephone between July 11 and July 20, 2008. The sample was selected at random from all household in New Hampshire with a land-line telephone and a respondent was selected at random within each household. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/-4.3 percent. Included was a subsample of 475 likely November voters (margin of sampling error, +/- 4.5%). Two hundred thirty-five (235) likely voters lived in New Hampshire's 1st Congressional District (margin of sampling error = +/-6.4%) and 240 lived in the 2<sup>nd</sup> District (margin of sampling error = +/-6.3%). Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
