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### CLINTON & OBAMA IN DEAD HEAT IN NH

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DURHAM, NH – Hillary Clinton's lead over Barack Obama has evaporated in recent weeks and they are now deadlocked in the New Hampshire primary. However, almost half of likely Democratic primary voters say they have not yet decided on who they will finally vote for.

These findings are based on the latest **CNN / WMUR New Hampshire Primary Poll**<sup>1</sup> conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Three hundred seventy-eight (378) randomly selected likely New Hampshire Democratic primary voters were interviewed by telephone between December 6 and December 10, 2007. The margin of sampling error is +/- 5%.

#### Democratic Primary

New York Senator Hillary Clinton has led the Democratic field in New Hampshire since 2005, by as much as 23 percentage points as recently as September. But her lead over Illinois Senator Barack Obama has all but disappeared in recent weeks. Clinton currently has the support of 31% of likely Democratic primary voters followed by Obama (30%), former North Carolina Senator John Edwards (16%), New Mexico Governor Bill Richardson (7%), Ohio Congressman Dennis Kucinich (3%), Delaware Senator Joe Biden (1%), Connecticut Senator Chris Dodd (1%), and 10% are undecided.

Clinton had been getting some of her strongest support from women. As recently as mid-November, Clinton held a 42% to 21% lead over Obama among women. This has collapsed to a narrow 33% to 28% in the most recent poll. Similarly, Obama has gained support among men. In mid-November, Clinton led Obama among men 28% to 23% while Obama now leads Clinton among men by a 33% to 27% margin.

It is important to remember that New Hampshire primary voters have historically made up their minds very late. Currently, almost half of likely Democratic primary voters (44%) say they have not yet decided who they will eventually vote for, only 24% have definitely decided and 32% are leaning toward a candidate.

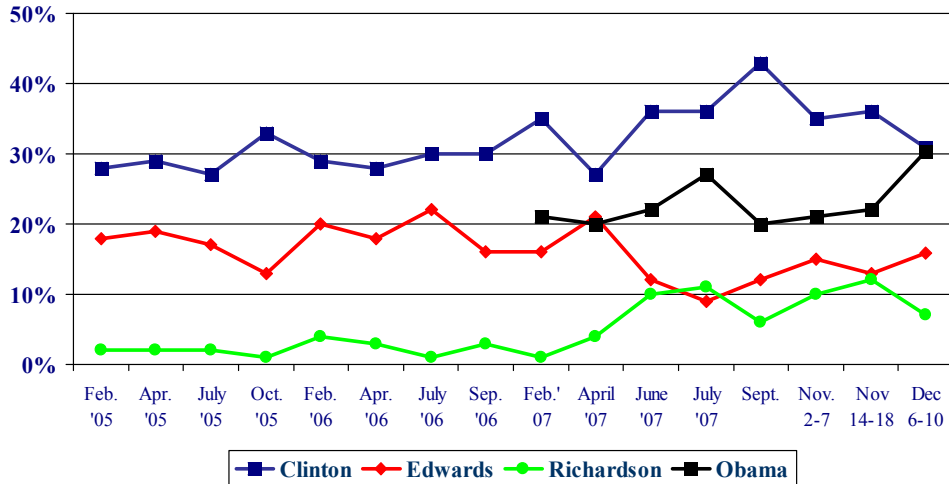
#### Undeclared Voters

Undeclared voters, often referred to as Independents, can vote in either the Democratic or Republic primary. Currently, 54% of undeclared voters say they plan to vote in the Democratic primary. This is a significant change from mid-November when 65% said they planned on voting in the Democratic primary. Among those undeclared voters who say they will vote in the Democratic primary election, Obama now leads Clinton by 36% to 26% with 14% favoring Edwards, and 5% supporting Richardson. In November, Clinton was leading Obama 31% to 21% among undeclared Democratic primary voters.

### Candidate Qualities

Likely Democratic primary voters were asked several questions about characteristics of the Democratic candidates. Clinton has been leading the field, in part, because she is perceived as being the Democrat who has the best chance of defeating the Republican candidate in November. Forty-nine percent of likely Democratic primary voters believe Clinton has the best chance of defeating the GOP candidate in November, 22% think Obama has the best chance, and 8% think Edwards has the best chance.

Clinton is also seen as the candidate with the right experience to be President – 44% name Clinton, only 11% name Obama, 10% name Edwards, and 8% name Richardson. Clinton holds a slight advantage as the candidate most likely to keep the same position on important issues – 27% name Clinton, 22% name Obama, and 14% name Edwards.

A significant weakness for Clinton is that she is not well liked by Democratic voters. Forty-three percent think Obama is the most likable candidate followed by Edwards (22%) and Clinton (12%). This has been one of Obama’s strengths throughout the campaign.

Another strong point for Obama is that he is viewed as being the most believable candidate – 30% say Obama is the most believable candidate followed by Clinton (19%) and Edwards (18%). Obama is also seen as the candidate least likely to act like a typical politician if he is elected. Obama is named by 31% on this measure followed by Kucinich (16%), Clinton (12%), and Edwards (10%). And Obama is also seen as the candidate most likely to unite the country (36%) followed by Clinton (19%) and Edwards (14%).

Democratic primary voters are divided over which candidate best represents the values of people like themselves with 28% naming Obama, followed by Clinton (26%), and Edwards (18%). Democrats are also split as to which candidate has spent the least time criticizing other candidates – 17% name Obama, 17% name Richardson, followed by Clinton (14%) and Edwards (12%).

### CNN / WMUR NH Primary Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest CNN / WMUR NH Primary Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Three hundred seventy-eight (378) likely 2008 Democratic Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 5%) were interviewed between December 6 and December 10, 2007. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of voters and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
