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CLINTON LEADS OBAMA IN NH, ON ALL ISSUES

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DURHAM, NH – Hillary Clinton has expanded her lead over Barack Obama in the New Hampshire primary. Clinton leads her Democratic rivals on all top campaign issues.

These findings are based on the latest CNN / WMUR New Hampshire Primary Poll* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Four hundred sixty-nine (469) randomly selected likely New Hampshire Democratic primary voters were interviewed by telephone between December 13 and December 17, 2007. The margin of sampling error is +/- 5%.

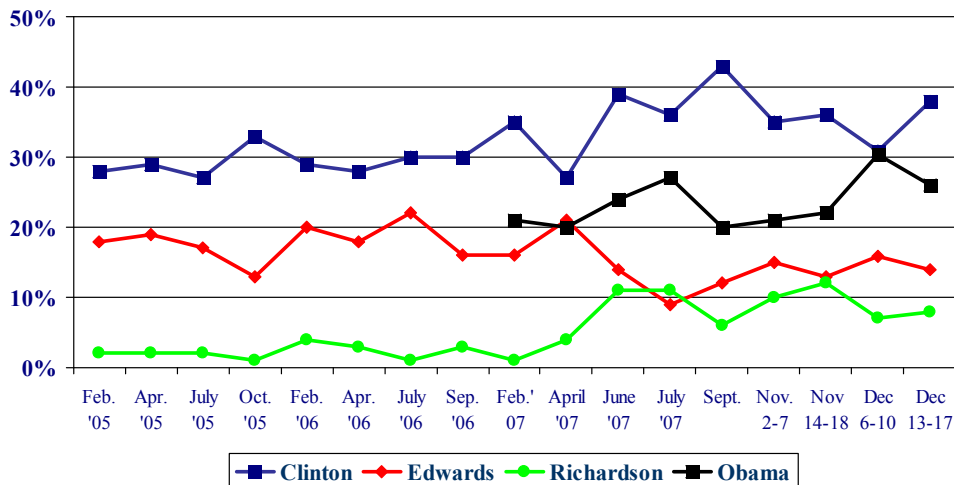
Democratic Primary

After a few difficult weeks, New York Senator Hillary Clinton has regained her lead over Illinois Senator Barack Obama. Clinton currently has the support of 38% of likely Democratic primary voters followed by Obama (26%), former North Carolina Senator John Edwards (14%), New Mexico Governor Bill Richardson (8%), Ohio Congressman Dennis Kucinich (2%), Delaware Senator Joe Biden (2%), some other candidate (1%), and 8% are undecided.

It is important to remember that New Hampshire primary voters have historically made up their minds very late. Currently, 38% of likely Democratic primary voters say they have not yet decided who they will eventually vote for, 31% have definitely decided and 31% are leaning toward a candidate.

Clinton's strongest support comes from older voters, those with lower levels of education and voters who say they have definitely decided who they will vote for. Obama gets his strongest support from political independents.

NH Democratic Presidential Primary – Likely Democratic Primary Voters

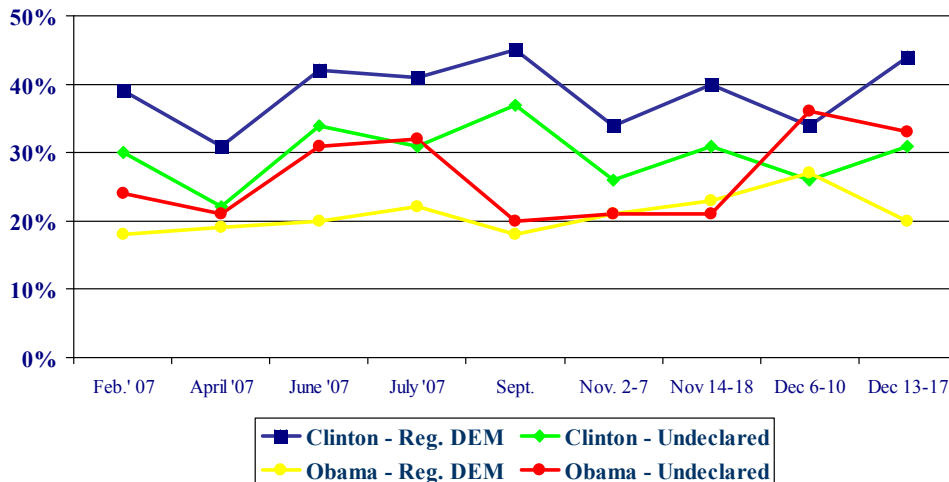

Undeclared Voters

Undeclared voters, often referred to as Independents, can vote in either the Democratic or Republican primary. Currently, 60% of undeclared voters say they plan to vote in the Democratic primary, a slight rebound from a week ago. Among those undeclared voters who say they will vote in the Democratic primary, Obama holds a narrow lead over Clinton by 33% to 31% with 17% favoring Edwards, and 8% supporting Richardson. In November, Clinton was leading Obama 31% to 21% among undeclared Democratic primary voters.

Issues

Throughout most of the campaign, the war in Iraq has been the most important issue in the eyes of likely Democratic Primary voters. For the first time, health care has equaled the War in Iraq as the most important issues in the campaign – 31% say health care is the most important issue, 31% say Iraq, 12% cite the economy, and 4% name foreign policy. As the surge in Iraq seems to be working, and as the number of dead and wounded Americans has declined.

When asked what the three most important issues are, 59% said that the war in Iraq is one of the three most important issues, followed by health care (58%), the economy (30%), and education (13%).

Likely Democratic primary voters were asked which candidate would do the best job handling important campaign issues. Clinton is seen as the candidate best able to handle all of the issues discussed. When asked who would best handle the War in Iraq, 31% named Clinton followed by Obama (20%), Edwards (9%), and Richardson (8%). Similarly, 33% think Clinton would be best able to handle terrorism followed by Obama (15%), Edwards (7%), Biden (7%), and Richardson (6%).

Looking at domestic issues, 40% think Clinton is best able to handle the economy followed by Obama (19%), Edwards (15%), and Richardson. Clinton is seen as being best able to handle health care (43%), followed by Obama (19%), Edwards (17%), and Richardson (4%). And 36% think Clinton is the candidate best able to handle Social Security followed by Obama (16%), and Edwards (11%).

By a narrow margin, Clinton is seen as the candidate best able to handle the environment (23%), followed by Obama (18%), Edwards (16%), and Richardson (10%).

CNN / WMUR NH Primary Poll Methodology

The CNN / WMUR New Hampshire Primary Poll is conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Four hundred sixty-nine (469) randomly selected likely New Hampshire Democratic primary voters were interviewed by telephone between December 13 and December 17, 2007. The margin of sampling error is +/- 5%. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of voters and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
