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ROMNEY KEEPS LEAD, McCain CLAIMS SECOND SLOT IN NH

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DURHAM, NH – Mitt Romney has managed to keep his lead in the New Hampshire Republican primary although John McCain has moved past Rudy Giuliani into the second position. And while Mike Huckabee continues to campaign strongly in Iowa, he has not yet broken through on in New Hampshire. But almost half of Republican voters say they have yet to decide who they will eventually vote for.

These findings are based on the latest **CNN / WMUR New Hampshire Primary Poll*** conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Four hundred eleven (411) randomly selected likely New Hampshire Republican primary voters were interviewed by telephone between December 13 and December 17, 2007. The margin of sampling error is +/- 5%.

Republican Primary

Despite heavy advertising by the three top candidates, former Massachusetts governor Mitt Romney is holding on to a double digit lead over his nearest Republican rival in New Hampshire. Currently, 34% of likely Republican primary voters say they will vote for Romney, 22% say they will vote for Arizona Senator John McCain, 16% say they will vote for former New York Mayor Giuliani, 10% support former Arkansas Governor Mike Huckabee, 5% back Texas Congressman Ron Paul, only 1% prefer former Tennessee Senator and actor Fred Thompson, 1% Colorado Congressman Tom Tancredo, 1% prefer California Congressman Duncan Hunter, 1% support some other candidate and 8% say they are undecided.

Support for Romney has been steady in recent weeks and McCain and Giuliani remained locked in a tie for second. Huckabee, who has shown surprising strength in Iowa, has moved past Paul into the 4th slot.

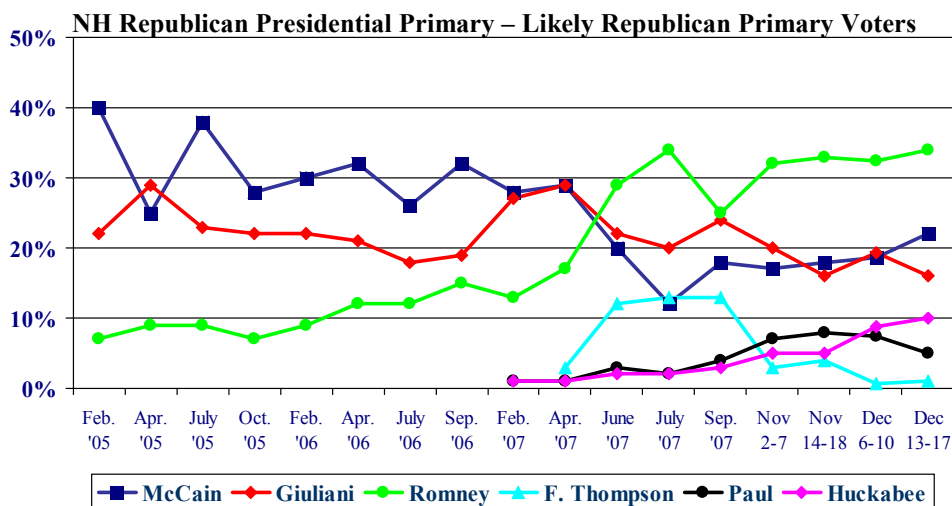
It is important to remember that this poll reflects current levels of support and that the race could change dramatically in the coming weeks. Only 22% of likely Republican primary voters say they have definitely decided who they will vote for, 33% say they are leaning toward a candidate, and 45% say they are still trying to decide who to support.

Romney's strongest support comes from upper income voters. McCain gets his strongest support from voters with lower levels of education. Giuliani's strongest support comes from younger voters.

Undeclared Voters

Undeclared voters, often referred to as Independents, can vote in either the Democratic or Republic primary. Currently, 60% of undeclared voters say they plan to vote in the Democratic primary, a slight rebound from a week ago. Currently, Romney holds a slim lead among undeclared voters with 30%, 25% prefer Giuliani, and 23% favor McCain.

Issues

Throughout most of the campaign, the war in Iraq has been the most important issue in the eyes of likely Republican primary voters. For the first time, other issues have surpassed the War in Iraq as the most important issues in the campaign – 15% say illegal immigration is the most important issue, 15% cite the economy, and 13% say the war in Iraq, 10% cite homeland security, and 8% mention health care. It is important to note that only 5% named abortion and only 1% named gay marriage as the most important issue, a reflection of the lack of social conservative voters in New Hampshire.

When asked what the three most important issues are, 37% said that the war in Iraq is one of the three most important issues, followed by the economy (31%), illegal immigration (30%), health care (29%), and homeland security (17%).

When asked which candidate is best able to handle these issues, Romney does best on domestic issues. Almost half of likely Republican primary voters (48%) say Romney is best able to handle the economy, followed by Giuliani (16%), and McCain (10%). Similarly, 43% think Romney is best able to handle taxes followed by Giuliani (17%) and McCain (11%). Romney is also seen as the candidate best able to handle illegal immigration – 37% name Romney, 19% name Giuliani, and 16% name McCain.

McCain is named as the candidate best able to handle the war in Iraq (38%) followed by Giuliani (20%) and Romney (17%). Giuliani is named by 38% of likely Republican voters as the candidate who can best handle terrorism, followed by McCain (32%) and Romney (14%).

Republican voters are split on the issue of abortion – 23% think Romney is the best able to handle abortion, 12% named Giuliani, 11% name Huckabee, and 7% name McCain.

CNN / WMUR NH Primary Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Four hundred eleven (411) randomly selected likely New Hampshire Republican primary voters were interviewed by telephone between December 13 and December 17, 2007. The margin of sampling error is +/- 5%. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of voters and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
