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ROMNEY STILL LEADS GOP FIELD IN NH

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DURHAM, NH – Mitt Romney is maintaining his lead over Rudy Giuliani and John McCain in the New Hampshire Republican primary. And while Mike Huckabee is doing well in Iowa, he has not caught on in New Hampshire. But more than half of Republican voters say they have yet to decide who they will eventually vote for.

These findings are based on the latest **CNN / WMUR New Hampshire Primary Poll*** conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Three hundred fifty-four (354) randomly selected likely New Hampshire Republican primary voters were interviewed by telephone between December 6 and December 10, 2007. The margin of sampling error is +/- 5%.

Republican Primary

As the campaign enters its final month, Former Massachusetts governor Mitt Romney is holding on to a double digit lead over his nearest Republican rivals in New Hampshire. Currently, 32% of likely Republican primary voters say they will vote for Romney, 19% say they will vote for McCain, 19% say they will vote for Giuliani, 9% support former Arkansas Governor Mike Huckabee, 7% back Texas Congressman Ron Paul, only 1% prefer former Tennessee Senator and actor Fred Thompson, 1% Colorado Congressman Tom Tancredo, 1% support some other candidate and 12% say they are undecided.

Support for Romney has been steady in recent weeks and McCain and Giuliani remained locked in a tie for second. Huckabee, who has shown surprising strength in Iowa, has moved past Paul into the 4th slot.

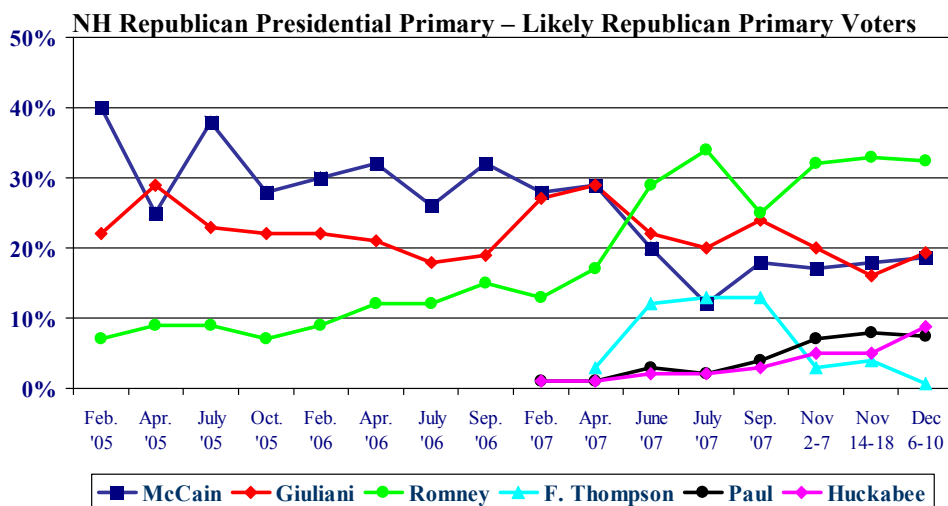
“Giuliani has ramped up his New Hampshire campaign in recent weeks, but this increased effort has yet to show any impact on the race,” said Andrew Smith, Director of the UNH Survey Center.

It is critical to remember that this poll reflects current levels of support and that the race could change dramatically in the coming weeks. Only 15% of likely Republican primary voters say they have definitely decided who they will vote for, 30% say they are leaning toward a candidate, and 55% say they are still trying to decide who to support.

Undeclared Voters

Undeclared voters, often referred to as Independents, can vote in either the Democratic or Republican primary. Throughout most of the past year, almost two-thirds of the undeclared voters said they planned to vote in the Democratic primary. But this has changed in the latest poll where only 54% say they will vote in the Democratic primary and 46% say they will vote in the Republican primary. Currently, Romney holds a slim lead among undeclared voters with 33%, 24% prefer Giuliani, and 22% favor McCain.

Candidate Characteristics

Republicans now think Romney has the best chance of defeating the Democratic nominee in November – 38% think Romney has the best chance in November, 30% think Giuliani does, and 10% name McCain. The percentage thinking Romney can win has increased significantly from 21% in September.

Romney is also seen as the candidate with the right experience to be President, named by 32%, 26% say McCain has the right experience, and 24% think Giuliani has the right experience. McCain was named by 32% in September.

Romney is seen as the candidate who best represents the values of Republicans like themselves, named by 32%. McCain is named by 21% followed by Giuliani (13%), and Huckabee (10%).

And despite attempts by several candidates to paint him as a flip-flopper, Romney is named by 27% of likely GOP primary voters as the Republican who is most likely to keep the same position on important issues, followed by McCain (24%) and Giuliani (16%).

Giuliani is viewed as the candidate most likely to unite the country (25%) followed by Romney (21%) and McCain (18%).

Republicans are divided over which candidate is most believable – 25% name Romney and 25% name McCain, followed by Huckabee (13%) and Giuliani (12%).

Republicans are also divided over which candidate is most likeable – 25% of likely Republican primary voters say Giuliani is most likeable, 24% name Romney, 18% name Huckabee, and 10% say McCain.

Similarly, Republicans are split as to which candidate is least likely to act like a typical politician if they are elected – 18% name Romney, 18% cite McCain, 14% cite Huckabee, 11% name Paul, and 9% name Giuliani.

Finally, 17% think that McCain has spent the least time criticizing other candidates followed by Huckabee (16%), Romney (14%), Paul (8%), and Giuliani (6%).

CNN / WMUR NH Primary Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Three hundred fifty-four (354) likely 2008 Republican Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 5%) were interviewed between December 6 and December 10, 2007. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of voters and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
