### CLINTON MAINTAINS NH LEAD

DURHAM, NH – Hillary Clinton continues to lead in the New Hampshire Democratic primary race. However, almost half of Democratic voters say they have yet to make their final choice.

These findings are based on the latest **CNN / WMUR New Hampshire Primary Poll**<sup>1</sup> conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Three hundred eighty-nine (389) randomly selected likely New Hampshire Democratic primary voters were interviewed by telephone between November 14 and November 18, 2007. The margin of sampling error is +/- 5.0%.

#### Democratic Primary

New York Senator Hillary Clinton has been the first choice among likely New Hampshire Democratic Primary voters for more than two years and continues to hold an edge over her Democratic rivals. Clinton currently has the support of 36% of likely Democratic Primary voters followed by Illinois Senator Barack Obama (22%), former North Carolina Senator John Edwards (13%), New Mexico Governor Bill Richardson (12%), Ohio Congressman Dennis Kucinich (3%), Delaware Senator Joe Biden (2%), Connecticut Senator Chris Dodd (1%), some other candidate (2%), and 10% are undecided.

Clinton gets her strongest support from women and voters with lower levels of education. Obama was not been unable to cut significantly into Clinton's lead and he has had the support of one in five voters since February. Obama's strongest support comes from voters with post-graduate educations. Support for Edwards has been between 10% and 15% in recent months. He is now essentially tied with Richardson.

When asked whether they would consider voting for one of the top three candidates, most Democratic voters said they would. Only 22% said they would not consider voting for Clinton under any circumstances, 22% said they would not vote for Obama, and 22% said they would not vote for Edwards. The fact that all three top Democrats are equally well liked means that the race is potentially volatile.

Democrats are also quite enthusiastic about the upcoming election with 68% saying they are more enthusiastic about this election than usual, 14% are less enthusiastic, and 16% say they are about the same. By comparison, only 46% of likely Republican primary voters say they are very enthusiastic.

However, almost half of likely Democratic primary voters (47%) say they have not yet decided who they will eventually vote for, only 24% have definitely decided and 29% are leaning toward a candidate. Clinton supporters are more likely to say they have definitely decided who they will vote for.

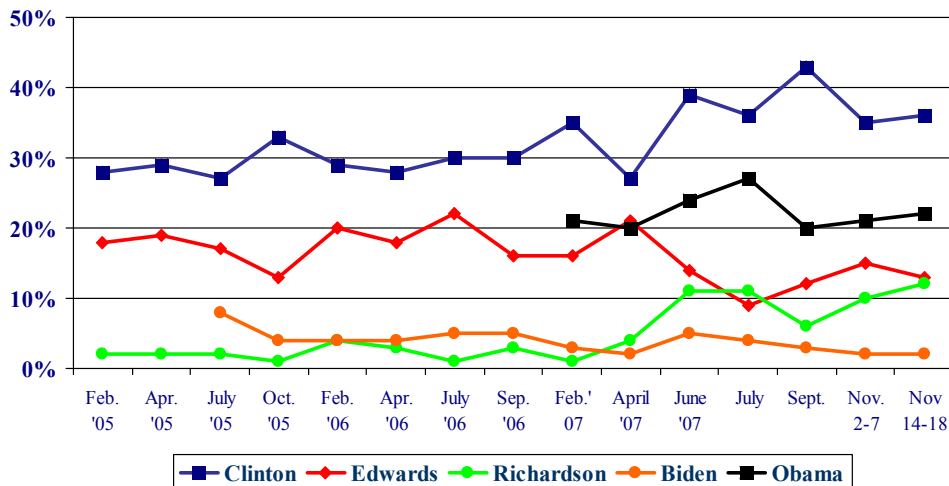
#### Undeclared Voters

Undeclared voters, often referred to as Independents, can vote in either the Democratic or Republic primary. Sixty-five percent of undeclared voters say they plan to vote in the Democratic primary, a figure that has been fairly consistent in recent months. Among those undeclared voters who say they will vote in the Democratic primary election, Clinton holds a smaller lead over Obama – 31% to 21%, with 16% favoring Edwards, and 11% supporting Richardson. Despite focusing much of his campaign effort on winning over undeclared voters, Obama actually does slightly better among registered Democrats than among undeclared voters – 23% to 21%.

### Candidate Qualities

Likely Democratic primary voters were asked several questions about characteristics of the Democratic candidates. Clinton is leading the field, in part, because she is perceived as being the inevitable winner of the Democratic nomination. Sixty-nine percent of likely Democratic primary voters believe Clinton will win the nomination, only 10% think Obama will win and 5% think Edwards will win the nomination. Half (50%) of Obama supporters, 61% of Edwards supporters, and 83% of Richardson supporters think Clinton will win the nomination.

Clinton is also seen as the candidate tough enough to stand up to the Republicans – 50% name Clinton, 13% name Obama, 10% name Edwards, and 6% name Richardson.

But a significant weakness for Clinton is that she is not viewed as the most honest and trustworthy candidate – 27% named Obama as the most honest and trustworthy, followed by Edwards (18%), Richardson (14%) and Clinton (13%). Only one-third (34%) of Clinton supporters said she is the most honest and trustworthy candidate.

### Issues

The most important issue to New Hampshire Democrats in the 2008 Presidential election is the war in Iraq, named by 41%, followed by health care (23%), the economy (10%), foreign policy (4%), and environmental issues (4%). When asked what the three most important issues are, 73% said that the war in Iraq is one of the three most important issues, followed by health care (62%), and the economy (35%).

Clinton is seen as the candidate best able to handle the war in Iraq, named by 27% of likely Democratic primary voters, followed by Obama (21%), Richardson (16%), and Edwards (10%). Clinton is also seen as best able to handle terrorism, named by 30% of likely Democratic primary voters, followed by Obama (13%), Richardson (13%), and Edwards (9%).

On domestic issues, Clinton is seen best able to handle the economy (38%), followed by Obama (17%), Edwards (13%), and Richardson (8%). She is also seen, by a considerable margin, as best able to handle health care – 53% name Clinton followed by Edwards (15%), Obama (13%), and Richardson (5%). Obama is viewed as best able to handle the issue of poverty in America named by 30% followed by Clinton (37%), Edwards (24%), and Richardson (5%).

### CNN / WMUR NH Primary Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest CNN / WMUR NH Primary Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Three hundred eighty-nine (389) likely 2008 Democratic Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 5.0%) were interviewed between November 14 and November 18, 2007. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of voters and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
